Electric blanket causes bedroom fire

A fire that badly damaged a bedroom and caused extensive smoke damage to the first floor of a house in Norton, near Malmesbury, was caused by a fault in an electric blanket. Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service was called to the property at 9.10pm on Saturday 23 March after fire broke out in a first floor bedroom. Five crews from Malmesbury, Chippenham (two), Tetbury and Cirencester tackled the blaze supported by an Incident Command Vehicle and crew from Stratton St. Margaret. The British Red Cross Fire Victim Support Unit also attended from Westlea Fire Station to provide welfare and assistance to the occupier.

Eight firefighters wearing breathing apparatus used two hose reel jets to extinguish the fire, which was contained to the room of origin due to the early warning provided by smoke detectors fitted throughout the house. Firefighters also used a mechanical fan to clear the smoke from the property. Following a fire investigation, the cause of the fire has been identified as a faulty electric blanket. Station Manager Wayne Jones said: 'While the electric blanket, which we believe started this fire, was not particularly old it is important that they are regularly checked for signs of wear. This can cause a breakdown of the structure and lead to incidents such as this. Wear can be caused in a number of ways such as through folding when not required, or regular use. If there are signs of wear you should refrain from using the blanket.'

Neighbourhood Watch

We now have a new coordinator for the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in Sherston. This has been dormant for a while and we now find that we are short of a few road coordinators. These are listed below. If you feel you can take one of them on please let me know. It may be that some road coordinators, who are out during the day, share their area with somebody who is around during the day and can keep an eye out for anything strange.

To get the system running efficiently it is necessary for all the road coordinators to have as many e-mail addresses as possible. This makes it simpler for them to notify people of messages. It is essential for a road coordinator to have an e-mail address where they can just press a button and pass a message on, as we cannot expect people to go round on foot putting notes through letterboxes. Messages can be given to people without e-mails in this way, this but not a whole road.

To this end I would be grateful if anybody who wishes to receive the Neighbourhood Watch information sends in their e-mail to the address below.

If you do not have an e-mail address and wish to receive the updates please put your name, address and telephone number on a piece of paper and hand it in to the Post Office. This will ensure that your road coordinator has all the information necessary to pass the messages, where relevant, to you.

Sherston is a village that does not have a lot of trouble but it is always a good idea to be vigilant. For additional coverage relevant notices will be put on the notice board in the Post Office. We will also be holding a meeting in the Village Hall. The date and time of this will be in the Cliffhanger and on the Village Hall and Post Office noticeboards.

The roads that do not have coordinators with the necessary e-mail access are

Gaston Lane (Lower) Brook Hill
Cliff Road Knockdown Road
Green Lane Manor Close 22-41
The Tartars 1-21, 36-39 Grove Road

If you have not already done so please let me have your e-mail address as soon as possible and we can get the scheme up and running. Just send an e-mail with the subject NHW to beryl@clampton.com.

If anybody has any useful further suggestions please contact me and let me have them.

One further point is that we have been given the following information from the central Neighbourhood Watch organisation. If anybody wishes to know more about this I have all the necessary information.

We are pleased to announce that we have secured free Public Liability Insurance for all Neighbourhood Watch and Home Watch schemes across England and Wales to enable volunteers to carry out their roles. The policy starts from the 1st April 2013 and will run until the 31st March 2014.

The policy covers any scheme registered with an Authority recognised or verified by the Neighbourhood and Home Watch Network. This includes the police service, the local authority or constituted NHW Associations. There will be no need for each police force or NHW Association to register with the policy holder (NHWN) or the broker (Towergate Insurance). In an event of a claim it will be for the Scheme or Association to evidence how they are recognised as a NHW Scheme or Association in line with local policies and procedures or within their constitution.

What is covered?

If any of your activities cause injury to third parties or damage to third party property the insurer will cover claims arising for up to £5 million per claim occurring during the insured period.

The insurance applies for activities which are undertaken with your full knowledge, authority and under your control in line with good practice procedures and adhering to all relevant local policies and practices.

The erection and maintenance of signs and posters, including whilst erecting, is covered providing that the lower edge of the sign is not less than 2.1 metres above the footway.

Neighbourhood and Home Watch events, street parties and Neighbourhood and Home Watch stands at other peoples events are covered provided they are not prohibited by any exclusion criteria

The cover is also for other Wider Watches, Junior NHW and Speed Watch, if incorporated into a NHW Scheme or Association and local policies and practices are adhered to

There is no age restriction (upper or lower) placed on the cover

A parent's journey to pre-school

Mornings are rather stressful in our house. If the children aren't dressed by eight, I know I am going to be late. I try my best to squeeze in milk, breakfast, hair, teeth, vitamins, odd glove hunting, missing shoe searching, and getting everyone togged up for the journey ahead - all in the next 45 minutes. If I'm super-organised (and everyone is compliant), I can even unload the dishwasher (a rare event).

Anyway, so we are now all ready to leave the house and set off for Busy Hands Pre-School. My three children are all three years old so I'm still training them to walk carefully along roads and to stop at appropriate places. We stop at each road, hold hands and 'stop, look and listen'. It is an eventful journey from Strongs Close to the village hall for a number of reasons. One being that shifting three three-year-olds anywhere is hard work and I'm trying hard to teach my children about road safety all along the way.

At nine o'clock in the morning, the lowered kerb on the corner of Manor Close and Knockdown Road generally has a car parked across it so we cross where we can. We then tend to make it relatively unscathed to Green Lane and the junction between Court Street, Knockdown Road and the Sopworth Road.

I announce, 'What do we need to look out for here?' 'Dog poo and fast cars, Mummy.' Eyes to the ground then, as we have yet to walk along that stretch without having to dodge something dubious.

Sensible walking now helps us to end up safely at the point where Court Street splits outside the hairdressers. It is here that my stress levels reach their peak. Hopefully no one has trodden in poo or fallen over, so we start to walk along the last part of Court Street opposite the old post office where there are two white lines marking a pedestrian pathway. Yes, I said a PEDESTRIAN pathway, not a place for cars to park! Unfortunately, more often than not, there is a car parked on this pedestrian pathway so I have to walk in the middle of the road with my children up to the High Street. As you can imagine, at ten past nine this is a busy time and there is a lot of car activity. Seriously, my children and I are being put in the path of oncoming cars; this is not a good experience.

Our goal is almost in sight! Crossing the High Street by the tree to the Post Office sounds simple but our last challenge is to hope that nobody has parked right across the white lines outside the post office forcing us to walk on the main road for the final 20 yards.

We eventually arrive at Busy Hands and my stress levels can go down, we have arrived safely.

Generally, three-year-olds are very much in to what's right and what's wrong, so they often ask me why people are parking in the wrong places or why there is dog poo on the ground. I find it difficult to answer them

Please, I ask that you take time to consider where you park your car and consider the needs of everyone in this village. I have a dog and I have never found it difficult to clear up his mess so please, please keep my children's shoes poo-free.

Walk on the wild side

It's all change - as usual

For me, this is the most exciting time of the year, with the countryside emerging from the winter, the trees turning to green and migrating birds arriving in large numbers and starting to nest. We also have a large number of birds leaving for Scandinavia, such as fieldfares and redwings.

March has been cold so the bird migration may well be a bit delayed this year. Many of the birds taking up summer residence around the village will have spent the winter in the Mediterranean or West Africa and aim to time their return to ensure there is

plenty of food (ie insects) around when their chicks hatch in May and beyond. With the poor harvest of wild berries this winter, please keep your bird feeders topped up.

Among the first to arrive will be the chiffchaffs - one of a number of the little brown jobs that duck and dive along our hedgerows and field boundaries (see picture) and are common along the Cliff (just listen for their distinctive song which sounds just like their name!). A number of blackcaps (which look similar except for a black or brown cap) were here over the winter but these will migrate north for the summer, with new ones arriving from the south.

Every so often, an unexpectedly large number of a species of bird or insect arrive either in the autumn or the spring, such as the waxwings we saw last winter, known as an irruption. This year we may well get a large number of black-fronted wallabies, which arrive in the area every few years because of the mangold harvest. It takes quite some time for them to migrate here as it's not easy hopping all the way from Australia and they need to be good swimmers. You may find them building nests in your chimney!

Work on Grove Wood has been completed for a few years; the hazel coppice will be allowed to grow before it will need to be cut again. One of the last tasks this year was to open up parts of the footpath by removing some large shrubs to encourage more butterflies and birds, such as marsh tits. If you get a chance, please let me know which butterflies you see in Grove Wood this summer.

For those who like an early start, I will be running a Dawn Chorus walk on Saturday 4 May. Meet outside Stretchline on the road to Luckington at 4.15am (that's not a typo!). This will take place if the weather is OK. Please let me know if you plan to



join me either by email (geoff_carss@hotmail.com) or by phone (840995). Please wear stout shoes, warm clothes and bring a torch. We should be finished by 6.30am so you may have a little wait for the shop to open ...

At a well attended public meeting in the Village Hall on Saturday 23 March about 70 residents discussed the major elements and geography of potential development in and around the village for the next fifteen to twenty years.

The meeting, which included an exhibition and a workshop, was led by two independent consultants. After a fascinating introduction which examined our village from an outside point of view, the meeting was divided into five separate groups to consider the

work done so far and produce their own ideas on how the village could evolve.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF SHERSTON

The village is an ancient settlement, first mentioned by Ethelred Ealdorman of Mercia in the 9th Century. It is considered to be one of the oldest boroughs in the country.

Sherston is a classic example of a small compact purpose-built market town. The informal layout of the village preserves to a large extent the form of the original borough, centred round its wide High Street which once served as a market place. The distinctive character of Sherston owes much to this historic layout and to the predominant use of local


stone. There are a number of significant buildings, including some of 3 storeys and civic buildings reflecting the relative wealth and significance of Sherston in the past. The village has expanded considerably in recent years with significant "modern" phases of development taking place just after the war, in the 1970s and again in the early 2000s (see map below). These developments have added more suburban street layouts around the historic centre, with varying degrees of consideration given to the essence of Sherston's character.



There has been a considerable amount of development in and around the village over the last 70 years. We have estimated that there have probably been about 250 or more houses built over this time period – at least 80 of these in the last 15 years. It is interesting to note that the population of the village is still today lower than it was in the mid 1800s – see population graph below. Agricultural change meant that rural settlements declined for


many years. Over the last 70yrs increased personal mobility has allowed more people to commute for employment or retire to the country. Sherston today is attractive to local people who want to stay, and also to others wanting to move into an established rural community on a permanent or occasional basis. Our local population is skewed toward more older and less younger people than the national average.





The Parish of Sherston covers an area of approximately 1712 hectares and has a population of about 1500 persons. In addition to the village itself, the parish contains two smaller hamlets – Willesley and Pinkney – together with a large amount of agricultural land.

Sherston has always had local employment. Whilst many still work in the Parish there has been a significant reduction in businesses in recent years. This is particularly true of shops which have halved in number to seven since 1980. The largest employer, Stretchline Mill, has reduced its workforce from 100 to 35 within the last five years. That said there are many small businesses now operating throughout the Parish, often based in either converted farm or other buildings (notably at Pinkney Park where there are now 16 small businesses) as well as individuals and businesses working from home.

Until recently commercial premises in the High Street have generally been converted to residential use once they fall out of use - the most recent being the butcher's shop. The main exception to this rule being the decision by the Parish Council in 2011, with the backing of the entire community,

to purchase a redundant Victorian School on the High Street and to convert this into a range of business units – all of which are now fully let.

The village now has two main shops, including a thriving Post Office/Stores. It has two pubs. It has a new and thriving school at the western edge of the village.

Sherston today has close working and shopping relationships with Malmesbury and Tetbury, and good road access to the M4, Swindon or Bristol, although main roads largely avoid the village itself. There is a limited bus service and railway service at Kemble. Most people in the village rely on the private car as their main means of access.

As part of the Neighbourhood Plan, we have the opportunity to take stock of Sherston's story of change up to now, and to draw lessons from the past that may help guide us into the future.












• A general constraints map for the entire Parish;




