### Rattlebone Fire







In the early hours of Tuesday 18 March a major fire took place at the village's Rattlebone Inn. Manager, Gavin Hunt, who was sleeping in the pub at the time, escaped on being woken by smoke alarms.

Over 10 fire engines attended the scene with crews from three counties including Malmesbury, Chippenham (2), Corsham (2), Stratton, Tetbury, Nailsworth and Yate (2). Fortunately they were able to contain the fire but not before considerable damage had been caused to the roof and upper floors.

The Rattlebone has been closed since the fire resulting in no pub being open in Sherston at all following the closure of the Carpenters Arms late last year whilst a new tenant is being sought.

Thankfully it seems that the Rattlebone will soon be open for business with the ground floor being rapidly refurbished and ready to trade again as early as the Easter weekend. Major repair works to the rest of the building especially the roof are however likely to take many months.

In a valiant effort to bring beer back to the village without delay landlord Jason Read, manager Gavin Hunt and all the staff have constructed a Pop up Pub by the name of 'The Charred Stump' in the skittle alley which will be open on Friday evening 4 April and all day Saturday 5 April. Why not pop along and raise a glass or two by way of thanks to our Fire Service which undoubtedly saved the Rattlebone from almost certain complete destruction on 18 March?







#### Coast to countryside

Miranda Krestovnikoff, television presenter on Coast, Celebrity Masterchef contestant, a regular on The One Show, President of the RSPB and an avid scuba diver is coming to Wild Sherston.

### CBeebies film at Sherston school



In March a small group of children from Oak class had the opportunity to learn how children's TV programmes are made. They were involved in the filming of a pre-production pilot for a programme that could eventually be seen on CBeebies. It involved scenes in the Cliff area and at the school pond.

Linda Tate is the Development Producer of the BBC's Natural History unit, Children's Department and is responsible for coming up with new programme ideas. 'We filmed a taster tape of a programme to show to the CBeebies commissioner, if she likes it and can give us money to make it, it could go to a series. It's based on different habitats so we used rivers and ponds for the pilot.'

Seven reception children were involved in the filming and Polly Gould (Year 2) did a voice-over for an animation sketch. The footage is now being edited and should be available to show in school soon.




#### Jumble success

### How well is your broadband working?

It's not meaningful to look at national 'league tables' for providers – it really can be a postcode lottery, but in a small community, you really can see what's good and

results with other local users to see if there's a better option for you.

### Gambian Link

During February half-term, two teachers from Sherston Primary School, Lara Farahar and Tessa Leatherland went on a study trip to The Gambia. It was Lara's second visit and Tessa's third visit to Gunjur, a very traditional village on the coast. The visit never fails to have an impact – both personally and professionally – and develops awareness of global issues, consequently developing understanding of the relevance of the global dimension in school.

Tessa and Lara were two of 10 teachers from Wiltshire, each staying with a family and experiencing village life firsthand. They helped with jobs around the compound, including preparing food and collecting water from the well. They were both welcomed into the homes of the families that they stayed with and were overwhelmed with the generosity and friendliness of the Gambian people.

Sherston Primary School has a strong link with Siffoe Lower Basic School, the link is primarily for both the schools to learn about each other's cultures and to develop an awareness of global issues. Both schools regularly share projects and Tessa is currently doing a comparison of the River Gambia and the River Avon with her Year 3 class. Sherston schoolchildren

raised some money to buy maths resources and a parachute for the children at their link school, and the children thoroughly enjoyed the parachute games that Tessa and Lara played with them and the teachers were very grateful for the maths games.

Busy Hands Pre-School has a link that was started last year with Tarud preschool in Gunjur. Lara and Tessa visited the school and took out a number line and photos



of the children from Busy Hands with their favourite toy. The children at Tarud pre-school chose toys from their classroom to show the children at Busy Hands. Lara then took her Year 4 class up to Busy Hands to share the photos she had taken at Tarud pre-school. Her Year 4 class then taught the pre-schoolers a song from Gambia and read a multicultural story to them.

Few people return from the study trip untouched by it and it takes some time to assimilate the experience. Both Tessa and Lara are keen to return but, more importantly, they are applying to the British Council to get funding for the link teacher in Gambia to come to Sherston and experience life here.



#### James Qualifies for British School's Biathlon

Sherston Primary School's sporting reputation continues to gain momentum with a raft of sports successes.

James Hulme (Y5) has qualified for the 2014 British Schools' Modern Biathlon Championships, due to be held on the weekend of 5/6 April. The biathlon consists of a 50m swim at the London Olympic Aquatics Centre and an 800m run on the Olympic Concourse.

British Schools' Biathlon Championships is the first event to be held at the Olympic park since the 2012 Olympics.

To be selected James had to attend a number of regional qualifying competitions and is one of 145 boys in his age group due to compete in April.

James took time out of his training schedule to tell us more about it:

#### How does it feel to represent Sherston school at this national event?

It is a great experience and I feel really proud because I am also representing my village. Everyone is always really excited for me when they hear I am running especially when it is for GB. Once someone asked me for my autograph – it was epic!

#### How often do you have to train?

I swim twice a week and I run whenever someone will take me. My dad cannot keep up with me so he asks others to help.

#### Have you always enjoyed running or is it a relatively new hobby?

I started running last February at a school's cross country. I had never run competitively before but I have loved it ever since.

#### How many qualifying competitions were there and what were they like?

I qualified at Millfield and got through to the Individual British Championships which were in Solihull. I stayed in a hotel and the whole experience was amazing but very nerve-racking. From that I then qualified for the School's Championship at the Olympic Park which was a massive surprise as I did not know that there was even one.

#### Who is your sporting hero?

Well actually I have two: Mo Farah and Owen Farrell. I cannot believe that I am going to run where Mo Farah has run and last year I got to play on the same Saracens pitch with Owen Farrell. These were both my ambitions so I am very lucky to have achieved these already.

#### Why is sport a good thing for young people of your

Sport keeps you fit and healthy. It also makes you realise how bad things like smoking are. I hold breath even if I see a cigarette as it could take four seconds off my time just by breathing it in. So sport makes you think about being healthy.

#### What kind of sport would you like to see more of in Sherston?

I would like to see more running and athletics at school.

Do you have to eat something special before you do a big run? What about afterwards - what's on your mind? What's the first thing you do when you've reached the finish line?

I always have a pasta meal and a hot chocolate the night before. When I am running I always sing a song in my head and always hope to get a new PB. I run against myself and not the other people. I know that sounds strange, but it is about improving my technique and the only person I want to beat is me.

The first thing I do after finishing is look for my mum and then I drink a bottle of Lucozade.

## Clutter, Gardens Wiltshire GOOD NEIGHBOURS and Repairs!

There always seem to be jobs to do in and around the house, whether it's tidying the garden, house maintenance or de-cluttering. Are you dreading the arrival of spring and all it entails with tidying up the garden?

Finding a trustworthy and reliable tradesperson to help with these tasks isn't always easy. Where do you look? There are hundreds of tradespeople listed in the phone directory, but who are they? Are they reliable? Are they trustworthy?

Some answers may be:

- 1.Use someone who comes recommended by family, friends or a local group.
- 2.Age UK and Wiltshire Council have trusted traders lists (I can give you details).
- 3.Ask for references or evidence of previous jobs they have completed.
- 4. Make sure they provide a business or home address and phone number to contact them, not just a mobile phone number.
- 5.Don't respond to people who casually offer services at your doorstep they may not be genuine.

If you're de-cluttering your home or replacing large items of furniture etc, disposal can be a problem. It won't necessarily fit into your recycle bins!

- 1. 'Freecycle' is a free online service where you can advertise and give away your unwanted items and the items are collected by the recipient.
- 2. There are a number of independent agencies that can carry out repairs to the home inside and out. They will remove large items of furniture from your home for a small charge.
- 3. Wiltshire Council will remove large furniture items from your doorstep for a fee, reduced if you are on means-tested benefits.
- 4. 'Waste Not Want Not' will collect large items of furniture that can be resold in their Chippenham shop. They don't charge for collection.
- 5.Dorothy House and British Heart Foundation have a free collection service for most furniture and electrical goods, which they will sell in their high-street shops.



## New support groups for unpaid carers in Wiltshire

A new group and training programme to help support unpaid carers across the whole of Wiltshire is to be launched this month.

Carer Support Wiltshire, which supports over 8,000 carers, has updated and extended its support group programme with informative groups, café drop-ins, specialist meetings and helpful training to try to reach as many of Wiltshire's 47,500 carers as possible.

In our consultations, carers told us that they would like better quality advice and information at the groups they attend; they would like groups to run monthly, and that they would like the opportunity to socialise with other carers and share experiences and advice.

There will be structured groups that will run once a month in six areas which will provide bitesized training, high-quality advice and information regarding the caring role.

Carers Cafés will run in 12 towns across the county and will be a place where carers can come together to share information and advice, and socialise.

Carer Support Wiltshire will also be running bimonthly specialist groups for carers of people with mental health problems and parent carers.

One carer who recently attended a group for the first time said: 'It was a nice friendly group. You don't have to talk about the serious side of being a carer, but for me it has been a lifeline to have regular contact and advice.'

Alongside the groups, carers can access a wide range of free training opportunities to help them in their caring role, including first aid, dementia care, manual handling and money management.

#### **April 2014**

Spring has well and truly arrived. There may still be a nip in the air but the blossom and new leaves are looking stunning and (apparently) we can look forward to a hot summer. Anyone who has walked through Grove Wood will have seen masses of emerging bluebells and wood anemones, promising another stellar performance this month and hopefully into May. Last year's delayed spring produced a stunning and simultaneous riot of blue, white and fresh green so let's hope the display lasts until Wild Sherston in a few weeks' time.

Sharp eyes will also have noted that several new trees have appeared, thanks to grant funding and to the welcome efforts of Noel Banks and his Cotswold wardens. We have added numbers of English oak and hawthorn, wild cherry, wild crab apple, wild pear, field maple and native hawthorn to the existing mix. Expect some pretty spring flowers in years to come. Meanwhile Martin Rea and Heather Tallis spent one Sunday morning planting several contrasting shrubs, including viburnum, dog rose and wild honeysuckle. They will just get better with time and will brighten up path edges.

The Parish Council has funded the purchase of an additional six trees, all around six feet in height, namely a pear, small-leafed lime, crab apple, hazel, gleditisia and dawn redwood. 





#### Pneumococcal Vaccine

Pneumococcal infections, at their worst, can cause permanent severe brain damage, or even kill. They tend to be most serious in children, older people and people with certain long-term health conditions.


That's why these groups are offered a pneumococcal vaccination on the NHS. It's a simple and safe vaccine that can prevent pneumococcal infections.

Pneumococcal infections are caused by the bacterium Streptococcus pneumoniae and can lead to pneumonia, septicaemia (a kind of blood poisoning) and meningitis.

#### Who should have the pneumococcal vaccine?

A pneumococcal infection can affect anyone. However, some people need the pneumococcal vaccination because they are at higher risk of complications. These include:

- all children under the age of two;
- adults aged 65 or over; and
- children and adults with certain long-term health conditions, such as a serious heart or kidney conditions.



People over 65 only need a single pneumococcal vaccination which will protect for life. It is not given annually like the flu jab. If you are in this age group or in either of the other groups and have not had your vaccine, please enquire at the surgery and book an appointment.


