Last month I went out to The Gambia for my third visit to stay with a family in the coastal village of Gunjur. I first went out to The Gambia on the self-funded trip in 2008 with the global education charity, The Marlborough Brandt Group. I started up a link with Sherston C of E Primary School and Siffoe Lower Basic School. Over the years, there has been a representative from Sherston going out almost every year and Gambians coming here to the village. Nine years later, we have a very strong bond with our friends in The Gambia.

It is always lovely to go back to Siffoe School and to



in 2008, the school was in desperate need of resources, and the classrooms had grey walls and very little on them. I remember the school library with a few books, most of which were damaged. While the school still has no electricity or running water, it now has solar panels and an exciting new build which enables infants to join the school. It was lovely to see whitewashed walls with colourful displays, creating a stimulating learning environment.

Whilst the school is still in desperate need of basic resources like pencils and paper, the main aim of the

link is a learning partnership and therefore, I spend time talking to the children in both Siffoe and Sherston, sharing projects that help us to learn about and celebrate our differences and similarities.

I am always welcomed with so much enthusiasm and eagerness to find out about life in the UK. Indeed, I have the same response from the children at Sherston School who love looking at the photos and artefacts that I return with.

WE WILL REMEMBE **THEM**

Lance Corporal 24122 Thomas William Dickenson

2nd Batt Duke of Edinburgh's Wiltshire Regiment Who died Monday 9th April 1917

Remembered with Honour, Wancourt British Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France France

Thomas died on Easter Monday when, in a blinding snowstorm, the Battle of Arras began.

This battle was made famous by the Canadian divisions who captured Vimmy Ridge that Monday on a battlefield which is preserved to this day.

To the south, however, the British were less successful. Thomas Dickenson fell near to the village of Henin-le-Cojeul.

Thomas was originally buried in Henin Military Cemetery, just to the north of the village. After the war, bodies from this cemetery were moved to the larger cemetery at Wancourt.

Many graves had been destroyed by later actions and Thomas Dickenson's was one of these. This is why he is remembered on a special memorial within this cemetery inscribed 'known to be buried in this cemetery'.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 9 April.

Update on the Neighbourhood Plan

The separate professional focus group attached to the village Steering Group has been undertaking further work to address some of the concerns raised at the consultation meeting in January and, in particular, how the Neighbourhood Plan can best meet the needs of the community. A key concern is the potential impact of increased traffic around the proposed site on the safety of pedestrians, school children, and equestrian, agricultural and private users of the village highways and how this may influence alternative solutions to the proposed site. Other considerations are how to deliver ease of access

and mobility from the High Street to a new surgery so that it is inclusive for all members of the community, and how the character of the village can be best enhanced by a new development whilst respecting the principles of the adjacent conservation area and our green belt. Alternative funding options for the scheme have also been progressed to achieve the best possible outcomes for the neighbourhood, with a focus on the new surgery, pre-school and upgrades to the community sports amenities with a different housing development solution. There will be more details in the near future.

Knockdown Road Sports Ground

The Sherston Neighbourhood Plan (NHP) is currently being put together by our Parish Council. This Plan isn't just about future housing requirements. It covers a wide range of issues that affect the whole community. Back in March 2013 two key objectives of the NHP were defined relating to sport and recreation. These were that we should retain and enhance our existing sports facilities and that support would be given for the provision of new-build sports and leisure facilities in and around the village.

If the NHP is accepted we will have the surety of permanent locations for sports and leisure activities in the village. This would open up opportunities for finance from Sport England, local partnership funding and allocations from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) – the latter arising from the building of the new houses. Significant funding could allow us to do a major redevelopment of the Knockdown Road Sports Ground and provide facilities such as all-weather multi-use pitches, floodlighting, a running track, and changing rooms with showers.

So far, the easy part has been talking to individuals to gather ideas and identify all the many sports that residents enjoy or currently take part in - either within or outside the village. This has been done over the last year or so but the lists need constant updating to ensure that all sports, age groups and abilities are included. What we need now is for individuals to come forward and promote their own particular sport, activity or group. In addition to people with a direct sporting interest, a project like this would also need expertise in planning, funding, financial control, project and club management, and ongoing maintenance. We would also need to work closely with the Parish Council which owns the site. The Sherston Old School Community Company (SOSCIC) has shown that the village probably has most of these skills on our doorstep – so there is room for some optimism here.

The Tanners Hill Leak

Good news for anybody wondering if or when the problem of the Tanners Hill leak will be solved.

We're reliably informed by the water company that new technology is now available which will make the spillage flow uphill without the use of a pump. Extensively tested in Bolivia, this technology – based on a technique known as gravitational hyperaxalotherapomorphy* – has successfully been used to divert water from low-lying reservoirs for residential



Volunteers (like you?) give a few hours per month, either on a regular or ad-hoc basis, to offer transport for isolated people to attend various appointments, often health related, but sometimes shopping or social events. The Link scheme gives a mileage allowance to its drivers for motoring costs. Is this something YOU could help with? It is not an onerous task and it's something that can be fitted in around our busy lives, but it makes such a huge difference to the users of the scheme.

Or are you an organiser?

LINK schemes are all about putting people in touch with people. As such, a key LINK scheme role is that of the coordinator. Taking calls from people needing transport and putting them in touch with LINK scheme drivers is the main thing that's involved so if you like talking to people then this might be the ideal role for you. Could you support this role even for just a few hours per week or month?

Volunteers are wonderful and make the world go around. We all volunteer from time to time, so how about trying something new? Call me for a confidential chat to find out what it's all about. If you wish to take it further, I can put you in touch with your nearest LINK Scheme – between us we can make a difference!

Meanwhile (after I have washed my car!), as ever, I am around for general help and support on a

wide variety of issues, including transport, mobility and safety around the home and reducing the feeling of loneliness. Give me a call on 07557 922020 and leave a message. I will get back to you as soon as possible. Or email me on ellen. blacker@wiltshire.gov.

Walk on the wild side

Spring has sprung

The last days of March have been bliss! With a number of long sunny days and temperatures around 15 degrees, nature is really get stuck into spring. Leaves are in bud, catkins almost over, lawns getting their first cut of the season and numerous birds are now singing.

Over the winter only the robins sing to hold on to their territories.

Over the past few years, a few individuals of some species of birds are staying over the winter, although most of them migrate to various parts of Africa. The chiffchaff is a small warbler (little brown job) that breeds here and migrates to West Africa for the winter, but a few individuals remain here. The males are already calling around the village with their distinctive chiff... chaff two-tone song usually at the top of trees. The ones calling may be ones that overwintered here, with the bulk of them arriving over the next two/three weeks along with many other species such as the house martin.

A number of species of butterfly overwinter as adults and these are out and about with the warm weather. On the Cliff today there were a number of small tortoiseshells (see picture) feeding, and the males were showing their very territorial behaviour where they spiral up in the air around one another although sometimes there could be three or four.

Over the past two years, a number of boxes for barn owls, tawny owls, blue and great tits, house sparrows and bats have been put up around the village with a number being put up recently in Grove Wood (thank you to whoever did that!).

Some 85% of barn owls nest in next boxes we have provided as there are so few 'natural' places left to nest as any old dead trees are cut down. I had the wonderful experience to follow a barn owl hunting alongside a very quiet country lane near the village for about five minutes at dusk. Very special.

Finally, I am planning to run a Dawn Chorus walk on Saturday 29 April starting at 5.00am (that's not a typo!). If you are interested, can you let me know via email (Geoff_carss@hotmail.com) or phone (840995). It will be subject to some half decent weather.

I am now beginning to organise the teams of people who will help to carry out this big undertaking. Many of them have been faithfully collecting for years and will do so again this year, but I am always looking for new helpers. Could you be a Christian Aid volunteer this year? People are needed to deliver and collect donation envelopes during Christian Aid Week. You could just visit the five or 10 houses closest to your home; if a good number of people would do that it would make such a difference.

This collection has been going on for many years, more than 25 I think, in the parishes of the old Sherston Group, before being extended to the whole of the Gauzebrook Group when that was formed. Some people have asked me whether it isn't an outdated way of raising money, but Christian Aid Week remains the single largest annual fundraiser for Christian Aid. We have raised around £3,500 each year in Gauzebrook for the past few years and this is a considerable support to the work of Christian Aid. More details are now emerging about Sir James Dyson's plans for the 517-acre site he has acquired at Hullavington. Perhaps the most surprising of these is that far from being decommissioned, the 1250-metre asphalt runway 05/23 is to be extended and upgraded to accommodate aircraft as large as the Airbus A330.

Cliffhanger can exclusively reveal that this is because the former RAF training facility is to be redeveloped into a commercial airport. When construction is complete, in 2021, Hullavington International Airport (HIA) will have an annual capacity of up to 4.5 million passengers.

A new Chinese-built elevated monorail, crossing the M4 at Junction 17, will transport passengers from the airport to Chippenham station in 10 minutes, connecting with a new non-stop service to Paddington. 'International passengers will be able to reach the centre of London within two hours of touching down at Hullavington,' said a spokesman for the airport's public relations team, which will soon begin a marketing campaign using the slogan, 'Fly Higher from HIA!'

Passengers with early departures will be pleased to hear that Mandarin Oriental is planning to open a new five-star hotel on the site of the Murco garage. Facilities at the state-of-the-art airport, meanwhile, will include a well-stocked duty free shop and a first-class lounge.

Dyson himself, who is a noted Brexiteer, is


understood to have insisted that there will be no direct flights between HIA and the EU. Instead, he is said to have opened negotiations with several airlines outside Europe for the fiercely-contested right to launch new services linking Wiltshire with the world.

Emirates, Cathay Pacific, Royal Air Nepal and Aerolineas Argentinias are all said to have expressed an interest in flying into Hullavington on a daily basis. *Cliffhanger* understands, however, that the only carrier to have drawn up firm plans to launch a new service into HIA is the new low-cost Intercontinental airline, BrexitAir. Its inaugural flight, BX1417, will depart Hullavington daily at 20.05, arriving in Singapore the following day at 17.15, offering convenient connections to several South-East Asian and Australian destinations.

Promotional fares to Singapore for North Wiltshire residents inconvenienced by the noise of commercial aircraft will begin at £199 one-way*, said Dolly Saporifa, BrexitAir's chief representative in North Wiltshire. She added that by 2025, BrexitAir will also operate daily services from Hullavington to Hong Kong, Sydney, New Delhi, Johannesburg, Vancouver and the Falkland Islands. 'While Bristol will focus on European flights, Hullavington will be the West Country's Intercontinental hub by 2025,' she explained.


