


Sherston Boules & Carnival 2015

This will then be on permanent display in the Church helping to keep his memory alive. Sherston Millennium Celebration



The speaker at our July meeting was Mary Hinton, the hedgehog warden for the Tetbury area (Tel. 07870 378207). Last winter 29 rescued hedgehogs (erinaceous europaeus) were housed in Mary's converted garage and she brought along one named SWR (so called after the school where it was found) who has now put on a lot of weight and is ready to be released. We were asked to provide a shallow dish of water in our gardens and as hedgehogs move from garden to garden to make sure there is a small hole in a wall or fence. If you have a garden pond always make sure that there is an escape route from the water and please always check bonfires before lighting. It is not normal behaviour for a hedgehog to be out during the day, it may be sick so please call the warden for advice.

After the centenary excitements of June, we have a quiet couple of months. The speaker in August is Alison West of the Sue Ryder Organisation and in September John Sylvester will be telling us about the police in the 19th century.

Edmund Ironside Lecture

About 85 people attended the talk on 27 June in the church. David McDermott, a specialist in Early Medieval History from Winchester University, enlightened us on the background and lineage of Edmund and the background to the Battle of Sherston 1016. Roland, an associate of David, wore replica clothing and armour of the period to set the scene of the battle. We hope that there will be a follow up lecture next year, by another historian, as part of the 1016 celebrations.

All proceeds from the evening were given to the church.

Holy Cross Church makes room for the future

After a long period of planning, and much-needed patience in the face of frustrations and delays, work finally began on Thursday 23 July to redevelop the north aisle of Holy Cross Church. When it is finished, there will be a much larger open space in the north aisle, floored in oak, and a new servery. These changes have been designed to allow much more flexible use of the church. It will soon be possible to have services in a greater variety of styles and for the children to have their own special area in the north-west part of the church. We hope that work will be completed in time for this year's Harvest Supper, which will in future be able to take place in much greater comfort. Similarly, the increased space will greatly improve the environment for the Arts Festival and offer a muchimproved venue for future events. At the same time as these changes are taking place, the central area of the church will remain exactly as it is

While the work is underway, the main part of the church will still be open every day as usual, although obviously the north aisle will be closed off, meaning that the kitchen and toilets will be unavailable. Despite this, we hope that the Coffee Shop will be able to continue in the vestry, as it is such a valued social hub for many people. The building firm that is carrying out the work is experienced in working in churches and will ensure that the church will be fully available at weekends so that all services will go ahead as usual

The clergy, churchwardens and Parochial Church Council sincerely hope and pray that this work will herald a renewal in the life of our village Church and enable it to continue to play a central role in the community in Sherston.

The Ramblers have today launched our most ambitious campaign ever to protect and improve our glorious paths in England and Wales. Please join us!

Taking part is a walk in the park – or the hills, the countryside or the woods. Perhaps it's a wonky bridge or a locked gate; a flooded path or fallen tree. You tell us about it and we'll then try to fix the problems that you find. We'll also celebrate the wonderful things you see – like beautiful views and amazing wildlife, and together we'll keep our paths open for everyone to enjoy.

You can get take part and get in touch with us in a variety of ways. On Ordnance Survey Explorer maps of England and Wales, everywhere is divided into 1 km grid squares. To take part, pick one of these squares and walk every footpath in it. Read our quick guide on which paths to walk. We have an app for smartphones that makes picking and walking your square simple and fun. You can follow yourself on your phone as you walk.

While you walk highlight any path problems you encounter – and the wonderful things you see. You can upload photos and share your experiences on Facebook and Twitter. Which square you pick is up to you. You could scale our highest peaks, wander along the beach, or picnic in the woods. Spend time with friends, plonk yourself into nature, and all the while protect our glorious paths.

If you don't have a smartphone, no problem. Simply use our web version to pick your square and print off a map. After your walk you can come back and upload your findings until 31 December 2015. Phew! What a scorcher!

We wait all year for some nice hot weather, and when it finally arrives we are full of warnings about the health risks. There is no doubt that prolonged high temperatures can cause premature deaths. Those most at risk are the very young, the elderly and the seriously ill.

There is plenty of advice on NHS Choices about staying safe in the summer heat at www.nhs.uk. Much of the advice seems obvious, but it is important to be aware of the dangers of dehydration, overheating, heat exhaustion and heatstroke.

During a heatwave, make sure you:

- Listen to alerts on the radio and TV about keeping cool.
- Avoid unnecessary travel.
- Visit or phone people who are less able to look after themselves, such as older neighbours, relatives and friends, and people with health conditions or mobility problems.
- Stay inside and in the coolest room in your home as much as possible, and splash yourself with cool water.
- Keep rooms cool by using shade or reflective material outside the glass; if that's not possible, have light-coloured curtains and keep them closed (metallic blinds and dark curtains can make the room hotter).






Next up was Serena Williams versus Victoria Azarenka.






Pipeline Archaeology

At the end of June Border Archaeology hosted a reception for those whose land was affected by the Bristol Water pipeline replacement project and a well-attended public presentation of the archaeology along the route of the pipeline between Tolldown and Shipton Moyne.

The Border Archaeology team responsible for investigating the land in and around the pipeline's route gave villagers an enjoyable and fascinating insight into the activities in our area from prehistoric times to the present day. John Hillier, who remembers the original iron pipe being installed when he was a lad of 5 years old, certainly enjoyed the evening!



The beautiful flint arrowhead was found to the NE of Luckington along the Sherston Road. It is a barbed and tanged arrowhead (the tang is the central shaft used for attaching to the arrow and the barbs are the points on either side) and it is from the Early Bronze Age, approximately 4000 years ago.







At Easton Grey there were a number of exciting finds related to the nearby Roman site at Whitewalls, including a likely brooch pin, coins dating from the rule of Carausius 286–293 AD and from the rule of Gloria Exercitus 330–335 AD.



A more recent find included a 'Poole's patent bonding roof tile' produced at James Tanner's brickworks at Luckington Road, Acton Turville between 1860 and 1900. Tanner's brickworks was in this location from at least 1868 until 1900 when it moved to Hebden Farm, and was known as the Luckington Potteries, which remained in business until 1945.





The Border Archaeology team were certainly enthusiastic about their work and answered many questions from residents, including 'Did you find any skeletons?' (no!) and the audience wondered why the team couldn't have dug a much larger area and potentially found more, but the investigations were limited to the area immediately around the pipeline.

It was a great evening that allowed residents to gain a better of understanding of the history of our village. What will we find when we next dig the vegies in the allotments or our back gardens?

Four hours make a big difference

Four hours a fortnight make a huge difference to the frail and elderly in the Malmesbury area.

For these four hours, spent at home and costing nothing, are all that are needed to fill a vital coordinator vacancy for Malmesbury and District Link.

Link, a team of volunteer drivers, offers lifts to GPs' surgeries, chiropodists, dentists and hospital outpatient departments. The service is aimed at the most vulnerable and is available to all regardless of means.

But Link drivers need a team of volunteer coordinators to take clients' phone requests and then contact the drivers to arrange the journeys.

A co-ordinator vacancy has now arisen for every other Monday morning. 'But the co-ordinators can be flexible and there tends to be quite a lot of swapping around with the days,' said Link chairman Christopher Blount. At 9.00am the duty co-ordinator diverts the Link line to their home phone then takes calls from clients wishing to make an appointment. The line is open until 1.00pm when it is diverted back to its resting place.

The data relating to clients and drivers is all on Dropbox, which is a cloud technology data base and is therefore always backed up.

By referring to the Dropbox files, the co-ordinator phones around drivers preferably living close to the

client to find one able to take on the trip. Alternatively, the co-ordinator emails drivers and waits for a response.

'It might well be that it is the next day's co-ordinator who ties the thing together,' said Christopher.

'Obviously the co-ordinator needs to be comfortable with using a computer but no special skill is required and full induction training will be given,' he added.



Rail engineering works from 1 to 31 August 2015

As part of the work to modernise the Great Western main line this summer, major engineering work will significantly affect rail services throughout Wiltshire. So if you are travelling further afield by rail over the summer, the following will be of interest.

From 1 August, the railway from both Chippenham

and Trowbridge to Bath will be closed. Rail services between Bath and Trowbridge, and Bath and Chippenham will be replaced by buses and coaches from 1 to 31 August

Rail services between Trowbridge and Salisbury (and further south) will continue, but the timetable may change slightly.

Do check your journey plans in advance as some of the train and replacement bus times may change on a weekly basis throughout this period. Also the buses are likely to be slower than the trains and there's likely to be more traffic on the roads.
