# Private 24133 Verney Saunders

Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment)

Died aged 25

August 23 July 1916

Son of Alfred and Margaret Saunders, Sherston, Wiltshire

Remembered with Honour,

Thiepval Memorial to the Missing, Somme, France

The 1st Wiltshire Regiment captured Lemberg trench on 22 August in a lightning attack with few csualties. They held on to the trench until 24 August 1916 when, along with the 3rd Worcestershire, they attacked and took the Hindenburg Trench. Both of these trenches were to the south of the village of Thiepval.

Verney Saunders was killed in action on 23 August 1916 while helping to take the trenches. He has no known grave but is remembered, alongside the many other soldiers who lost their lives at the Somme, on the Thiepval Memorial to the Missing.

Bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 23 August.



# CC4C Bike Ride in aid of Horse Boy Foundation UK





This summer, six friends are planning a bike ride with a difference. The 11-year-old girls have decided to cycle an impressive 75 miles from Hungerford to Bristol, in the hope of raising £5,000 for the inspiring charity Horse Boy Foundation UK which helps children and families living with autism.

CC4C (Children's Challenge 4 Charity) was set up in 2013 by two boys Ben and Thomas. Now Amelia Fuller (Ben's sister, and a former pupil at Sherson Primary School) and five of her friends – Jessie Llewellen Palmer (also a former pupil at Sherston Primary School), Alice and Izzy Playne, Rosie Roche and Beth Tuke-Hastings – hope to complete the epic bike ride and help a group of children and their families facing challenges every day of their lives.

The girls have been training hard for the bike ride and hope to complete the 75 miles in two days. They also plan, if possible, to do a portion of the challenge on ponies!

All the girls are excited to try and raise much needed funds for Horseboy. 'We are doing this challenge to raise money for Horse Boy so that ten families with autistic children can go to a Horse Boy Camp,' said Amelia. 'If we manage to raise £5,000 up to ten families will get to go on holiday for the first time ever, which would be fantastic!' Jessie added.

Horse Boy uses a tried and tested '6 stage' system of horse therapy to help children with autism ranging from back riding to simply being near and in physical contact with the highly trained horses. The effect of being on or simply close to the horses is truly amazing



with many of the children able to communicate, relax and laugh for the first time.

The girls like the idea of helping families living with autism. 'It would be really great to raise the money to help the children communicate and have more fun,' said Rosie. They are all excited and a little bit nervous about the bike ride itself: 'It will be such hard work but we won't give up and we will be proud of ourselves at the end,' Alice said.

# Sherston Senior Club



Several months ago, Steve Ellis of Gemini Outdoor suggested the idea of a Gauzebrook Gallivant, a 21-mile walk, mostly off road, visiting all the Gauzebrook churches as a way of raising funds towards the future salary of Becky Fisher, our highly valued children's worker. It was such a joy to be able to experience such beautiful and varied countryside.

After a lot of planning and hard work, including several pre-walks and a lot of path clearing, the walk occurred on Saturday 9 July with 30 walkers participating in at least one leg and 10 walkers – plus two dogs – completing the whole circuit. 



# Sherston Church Kneelers

Back in the 1980s and 1990s a project was undertaken to produce new kneelers for Sherston Church. It was initiated by Mary Edwards and meetings were held in her house The Old Vicarage, twice a week, an afternoon and an evening one. Heather Martin was the designer and teacher for those people who had never done anything like this before. The project went on for a few years, about 40 people did at least one, and the most any one person did was 13. Gwen and Bill Mason undertook the mammoth task of assembling them and stitching the corners. Over two hundred were made in two styles – a pattern, and a picture. The pictures were all different and illustrated everything from birds and wild animals, to bellringing and boules.

A few years later, the altar rail kneelers were made by a small group working on a large embroidery frame.

Now we don't have as many pews in Church, some of these kneelers are redundant, and the P.C.C. feel that they ought to go somewhere where they can still be used. It is proposed that some might be very useful
