# Sherston School Parking

At least 15 parents have written to John Thomson, Wiltshire Council's councillor for Sherston, about their concerns over dangerous parking on the roads by Sherston Primary School at the start and end of the school day. They're asking for immediate changes to make it safer for parents and children crossing by the school and also, in the long term, for a specific drop-off and pick-up area to be built as part of any future housing development next to the school.

A range of issues have been expressed by parents including: parked cars blocking junctions; vehicles overtaking cars waiting for children to cross; an increasing number of parents driving straight on to work who need to be able to drop off their child(ren) by car; more children coming in from outside the village which means more parents trying to park; and the need for safer access both to the school and the new surgery when more houses are built.

Mr Thomson initially responded to parents saying that he would ask the police to visit the school and that he would talk to the parish council about a possible 20 mph speed limit at pick-up and drop-off times. More recently, he has been able to identify funding for a crossing patrol, providing that someone can be found to fulfil this role. Wiltshire Council's officers have now visited the school at the beginning and end of the day and their report will feed in to any future discussions.

The school meanwhile is updating its travel plans and has distributed leaflets to parents, offering suggestions such as 'park and stride' (whereby parents park elsewhere in the village and walk the remainder of the distance to school), a 'walking bus', where parents take it in turns to walk a group of children to school, and car-sharing.



### **Sherston Cubs**

A HUGE well done to Sherston Cubs who won the North Wilts District six-a-side Football Tournament on 24 June – and this was despite having only five players (no reserve)!

There were eight teams from the district taking part and we won our matches 7-0, 11-0 and the final against Crudwell 8-1. (Yes, that's right – they conceded only one goal all day!

A big thank you to Neil Witchard who, not only lent us a kit, but was also a fantastic coach for the day. Neil said: 'I would just like to say a massive well done to the boys on Saturday. In fact if there is a badge for just teamwork, they earned it on Saturday as the five of them did the work of eight cubs! The boys got to choose their player of the day which unanimously went to Josh Oxtoby, who got his own special medal along with the winners' one that they all received.

### Guardsman 17965 James Chappell

1st Batt Grenadier Guards

Who died aged 26 Sunday 5th August 1917

Son of Worthy and Cetha Chappell, Sherston, Wiltshire Remembered with Honour, Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres

James Chappell was killed during the third battle of Ypres. He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial to the Missing at Ypres.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 2pm on 5 August.

### Private 23586 Edward Victor Sainsbury

5th Batt Princess Charlotte of Wales'

Royal Berkshire Regiment

Who died Thursday 9th August 1917 Remembered with Honour, Monchy British Cemetery, Monchy-le-Preux, Pas de Calais, France

Monchy-le-Preux formed a small salient in the German lines in the Arras sector until 11 April 1917 when the British captured it. The lines finally settled east of Monchy.

The battalion diaries for 9 August say: 'Enemy trenches from Bit Lane to Stirrup Lane were subjected to 13 hours' bombardment.

'The enemy trenches were raided along the whole front bombarded by 35th Bde.

The operation was successful, 89 prisoners being captured and a large number of enemy killed.

Casualtites: 1 O R killed, 6 O R wounded.'

Clearly the single OR killed that day was Edward Victor Sainsbury.

### Private 240605 Archibald Harry Merchant

1st/5th Batt Gloucestershire Regiment

Who died aged 21, Thursday 16th August 1917 Son of Harry and Rosa Merchant, Church View, Sherston, Wiltshire

Remembered with Honour, Tyne Cott Memorial, Zonnebeke, West Vlaanderen, Belgium.

'A Good and Brave Soldier' - The phrase occurs in a letter to the relatives of Pte Archibald Harry Merchant of Sherston whose death in action on August 16th - the day on which he completed his three years' service with the colours - is deeply regretted.

Young Merchant enlisted as early as August 15th 1914 but he went into the Gloucestershire Regiment. He was a conscientious soldier and very popular and was recommended for a commission when the Hun shell cut short his fair life.

The sergeant wrote: 'I do not know how to express the sorrow of poor Bert's fellow comrades in the Signal Section and myself in your sad loss. He was held in such high respect by all of us; he had utter contempt



of any danger.

He was killed by a shell, which wounded his company officer at the same time, while doing his duty in a manner worthy of a good and brave soldier during an attack in which the battalion was engaged.

No words are too high in his praise and I sincerely trust you will find consolation in the fact that he suffered no pain, his death being instantaneous.

Allow me, on behalf of all the signal section, to express our very deepest sympathy and sorrow in your sad loss and bereavement'

North Wilts Herald, 31 August 1917

Archibald Merchant would have been killed in the third Battle of Ypres, better known as the Battle of Passchendaele.

The Tyne Cott memorial where he is commemorated contains more than 35,000 names of missing men who fell in the Ypres salient. It is situated in the cemetery of the same name and is the largest military cemetery in the world. More than 70 per cent of the burials are of unknown British soldiers.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 16 August.

One of her funniest moments was when she was helping out with Year 3 on their residential trip with a few other teachers on a cliff side walk. 



Immunisation is one of the most successful and cost-effective public health interventions and a cornerstone of public health. High immunisation rates are key to preventing the spread of infectious disease, complications and possible early death among individuals, and to protecting the population's health and immunity.

The MenACWY vaccine, which is offered to school year 13s, should be taken up preferably before going off to university in the new academic year. All young people remain eligible for this vaccine in a catch-up programme up to their 25th birthday. If you are in this age group and have not had the vaccine, please contact the surgery and use this as an opportunity to check that all other vaccinations, such as MMR, are also up to date.
