Jubilee Diamond tree







The Tree Council is donating 60 trees to communities that could show that they would be planted in the centre of their community and that children would be involved in the project to commemorate our Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The idea is that children will see the tree grow to maturity in 60 years and take pride in their tree, showing it to future generations. The project also nods to the link between trees and the formation of diamonds from carbon from trees planted millions of years ago. By planting trees we are planting diamonds in the raw with hope for the future.

I am pleased to say that Sherston's application for a tree has been successful and we are about to take delivery of an oak sapling that will be planted on the Recreation Ground near the Golden Ash planted for the Queen's Golden Jubilee (let's hope it survives). The project is being taken on by Sherston Scouts under the leadership of Riaan van Rooyen who will be digging the hole and overseeing the planting with help from the older Explorer Scouts.


Every stage of the planning and planting is being recorded in words and photos and will be sent to The Tree Council, which plans to make a presentation of all 60 records to the Queen next June on the anniversary of her Coronation. There will also be pages on its website for an online version which will also be accessible by smartphones from a special plaque in front of the tree.

It would be great if anyone in the village had some royal connection as tenuous as having been born, christened or married on the day of the Accession or Coronation to come forward and take part in the planting.

We already have a Diamond Jubilee Tree in the village, commonly known as the Jubilee tree, which was planted in 1897 to commemorate Queen Victoria's reign. This has already survived for 115 years but has not grown to a great size due to it having been planted on a large rock which has effectively 'bonsaied' it. A similar tree was planted in Easton Square at the same time and is now huge. Let's hope ours grows to be enormous.

The planting ceremony will be on Sunday 16 December at 12noon

Malmesbury Rural – Update from PC Mike Tripp

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself as the new beat manager for the area. I have spent a large part of my police career based in the Malmesbury area and after a year away working in Swindon I am excited to be back and looking forward to meeting the residents on my new patch. With regards to incidents in the rural area, we have unfortunately had a rise in dwelling burglaries and although numbers are low, it is important to bring this to the attention of all residents. Vigilance and willingness to report any suspicious activity is always required, and I am confident that with these actions along with increased police patrols we can reduce further incidents.

I have held consultations across the rural area since my arrival and it is very clear that the rise of dwelling burglaries is the main concern amongst residents. Malmesbury Rural's priority for the next quarter will be to increase police visibility and reassurance within the community. I will be working closely with my colleagues, specialist units and bordering forces with the aim of achieving this.

On a different note and as we all know too well, winter is now on its way and of course that brings difficult driving conditions, especially on the country lanes. Allow extra time for your journey and prepare your car before driving off by clearing your windscreens.

Korky Paul inspires children at Sherston School

The world famous and award winning illustrator Korky Paul stood in front of pupils in Year 5 with a pair of gold underpants on his head. They burst into laughter as he read from his book 'Sir Scallywag and the Golden Underpants', the story of a small six year old boy, Scallywag, who has to overcome a giant to find King Colin's missing underwear.

Korky Paul may not be a familiar name to adults, but his illustrations of children's books, such as 'Winnie the Witch', 'The Fish Who Could Wish', and 'Aesop's Funky Fables', are magical; highly detailed, drawn in pen and ink with watercolours. Korky still likes to 'get messy', but admits that he's had to move with the times and invest in digital software, although he's reluctant to use it.

His real name is Hamish and he was born in Zimbabwe in 1951 into a family of seven children. At an early age he was scribbling cartoons. He went to Durban School of Art, and worked for an advertising agency before his big break in 1976. He was living in Greece when he was asked to illustrate a series of books which aimed to teach children to speak 'the Queen's English'. And so his career began. 'Winnie the Witch' won the Children's Book award in 1987 and has been published in over 10 languages.

The Friends of Sherston (FSS) booked Korky nearly a year ago, such is his popularity, but he was well worth the wait. Every class had a 40 minute workshop, and Korky drew a creature based on ideas suggested by the children. Joseph Clegg recalls the 'gruesome seamonster' which Korky came up with for Year 6. 'It was great fun...apparently it usually takes him about five days to draw a picture for a book, so imagine how long it takes him to illustrate the whole thing!' Joseph was also picked as a brave volunteer, and Korky drew him as 'Joseph-O-Saurus Rex', complete with a bar of chocolate, his favourite food.

The day finished with a book sale organised by the Yellow Lighted Bookshop, a first for this FSS committee, which was pleased to support a local independent store. It went so well that a donation of





£155 was given to the school for children and teachers to spend at the Tetbury shop.

Since that memorable Thursday, there have been all kinds of mysterious rumours in the village of teachers cancelling scheduled lessons so that pupils could draw, of children poring over the pages of 'Winnie the Witch' looking for the face of Korky Paul hidden in his own illustrations (he's there, it's true), and of a rise in cases of parental harassment. Pupils are drawing their mums and dads over breakfast, long-nosed, chickenlegged, red-necked and eating toast.

'What did you think of Korky Paul?' I asked my son on the walk home. 'Even better at drawing than Rufus' he said. He thinks Rufus is the best in his class, so there could be no higher praise from an 8 year old boy

Soscic members' meeting

he meeting held on 12 November at the British School Room was extremely well attended. The main points made at the meeting were:

All construction work (including work to the former playground area at the rear of the building) has now been completed – both on time and below budget.

The surface of the yard to the rear of the Old School is fragile – it was not originally constructed to accommodate vehicular traffic. This area is for use by cars and light vehicles only. The area immediately adjoining the Old School is specifically restricted to use by the tenants of the Old School. This area will in due course be delineated. The rest of the yard now belongs to the Village Hall. None of the yard is to be used for general parking.

SOSCIC will shortly be erecting a sign on the front of the building (to replace the existing black notice board) giving details of all of the occupants.

Confirmation was given that all of the units are now fully let and that the final occupants (Shear Class) were hoping to begin trading from their unit before the end of January (after completing some necessary shop-fitting works).

Members and villagers were thanked for their generous support given to the various fund-raising events and initiatives over the last 18 months. Members were advised that some £24,000 had been raised by a combination of individual donations and events during this period – in addition to the £50,000 received from the Prince's Countryside Fund. Whilst some additional fund-raising is required to complete the project it is hoped that we should achieve our target by the end of the year – assisted by the forthcoming Winter Ball and the sale of a painting kindly donated by Neil Forster.

Sherston Neighbourhood Plan Neighbourhood Area Designation Application

An application for the designation of the Parish of Sherston as a "neighbourhood area" (for the purpose of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan) has been received from Sherston Parish Council.

Comments on this application can be made during the consultation period starting from 9.00am 3 December 2012 until 5.00pm on 17 January 2013.

Why are we consulting?

In order to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan, the first formal stage is to designate the actual "neighbourhood area". In this particular case the Parish Council has to formally apply to Wiltshire Council to designate a neighbourhood area, state its reasons and submit a map of the proposed area. Following receipt of the application, Wiltshire Council must consult for at least six weeks before making a decision. The Parish Council submitted such an application following a decision made at the Sherston Parish Council Meeting held last month.

At the expiry of the consultation period Wiltshire Council will consider the comments received in determining the application to ensure that the area is appropriate. The decision will be published on the Council's website and in a later version of The Cliffhanger.

Food Waste Digesters at Discounted Prices

To help divert food waste from landfill, Wiltshire Council is working in partnership with Great Green Systems to encourage residents to compost food waste in their gardens using specially designed food waste digesters known as Green Johannas and Green Cones. Patented and unobtrusive, the units accept all types of cooked and uncooked household food waste including meat and bones, reducing the contents to either nutrient-rich compost or water, depending on the model used.

Similar in appearance to a traditional garden composter, the units are currently being heavily subsidised by Wiltshire Council. Whilst stocks last, a Green Johanna, for producing nutrient rich compost from household food waste mixed with green garden waste, is currently available for £25 instead of £108.90, whilst a Green Cone for disposing of food waste only is being offered for £20 instead of £79.50. Prices include delivery.

TREEtalk

December 2012



The trees have done their best to cheer us up after a very wet and cold summer with a glorious display of autumn leaves. The Grove Wood team has started clearing and coppicing in the last section of the wood. Many of the trees planted by the children from Sherston School have enjoyed the rain and are flourishing, but so are the brambles and nettles. Help on Sunday mornings to work in the wood will be much appreciated.

You will have heard of the problems of ash dieback disease which so far has not been identified in our area. This is a serious disease of ash trees caused by a fungus called chalara fraxinea. This causes leaf loss and crown dieback and can lead to tree death although some can recover and some are immune. For identifying the symptoms and reporting if you suspect you may have spotted it go to www.forestry. gov.uk/chalara. There is a video and a pictorial guide to help with identification and more information, with instructions on how to report it. The legislation on restrictions to importation of ash trees is also explained. Advice from Westonbirt Arboretum is that if people who have visited woodlands in infected areas should clean the mud off their boots, pushchairs etc. before visiting the arboretum and walking in the countryside. Let's hope we don't see it here.

The Tree Council invited applications for Diamond Jubilee trees that they were giving to suitable applicants. We have been lucky enough to have

been chosen to have one to be planted in the Recreation Ground. The scouts led by Riaan van Rooyen are overseeing the planting.

Walk on the wild side



Where have they all gone?

In the 1950s there were some 30 million Hedgehogs in the UK. Today there are about half a million! (That's a drop of about 97%)

Apparently there has been little research into the reasons why but there are some obvious causes. As we all know Hedgehogs are often killed on the road, killed by dogs and maybe poisoned by eating slugs who have themselves eaten Slug Pellets (although there seems to be limited evidence for this).

With the changes to the way in which our countryside is being managed means there is less food for them but there has also been a increase in their major natural predator – the Badger. With very strong claws and being carnivorous they can easily kill and eat a Hedgehog.

Even in the past 10 years the times I have seen Hedgehogs less and less often (when was the last time you saw one?) One appeared in my drive in May, the last one before that was about 2 years ago when I found one in the garage in some distress not being able to walk so I took it to a wildlife rescue center in the Cotswold Water Park.

On a more positive note the Little Egrets are back and can often be seen on the Sopworth Road near



the river. Thank you to a number of people who let me know in particular to Frank Hatt who advised we shan't have to get Edith Piaf to sing No Egrets!

In addition there are a number of Marsh Tits in Grove Wood. These are basically like a Blue Tit but black and white as you can see from the photo, quite hard to spot so next time you are in Grove Wood just

pause for a couple of minutes and see what turns up.

Don't forget to feed the birds and be careful about disturbing hibernating Hedgehogs...

Safe Drive Stay Alive Roadshow

The Safe Drive Stay Alive Roadshow is based on powerful personal testimonies designed to make the audience aware of the nature and extent of the personal tragedy and suffering that a road traffic collision can and does cause.

The most hard hitting road safety presentation you will ever experience. It has been shown to more than

3,000 military personnel and 7,500 young people in Wiltshire each year and now available to the general public. Minimum age 15.

Firefighters, medics, police officers, bereaved parents and people who have been directly involved in road traffic collisions recount their stories, often in heartbreaking detail.

Safe Drive Stay Alive is a Wiltshire and Swindon road safety initiative coordinated by Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service and Wiltshire Council.

Ian Hopkins, road safety development manager at Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service, said: "The presentation is hard hitting and upsetting, but we make no apology for that. The speakers are real people who have experienced the horror of road traffic collisions, whether as a member of the emergency services, as a victim or as a parent who has lost a child.







THE ANCIENT ORDER OF SHERSTON MANGOLD HURLE

One of our more military members of the Ancient Order spends much of the winter months reading through old manuals on the arts of soldiering. He finds this particularly comforting whilst suffering withdrawal symptoms from sowing and nurturing his mangold crop for the next season's hurl.

Our member recently gave a fascinating lecture on the place of the humble mangold in improving the swordsmanship of the British cavalry at the end of the 18th century. A packed audience in the Carpenters Arms sat enthralled as the full story of Major – General John Gaspard Le Marchant (1766 - 1812) was revealed.



Editorial controls of the Cliffhanger restrict me from giving full justice to the entire three hour and forty three minutes of the lecture, which was punctured by many members visiting the bar, but essentially Le Marchant introduced a new light cavalry sword in 1797 which





was so successful that it was in use for the next fifty years. In addition he wrote a manual the 'Rules and Regulations for the Sword Exercises of the Cavalry' in which the following is recommended –

'The drawing cut is made best with a curved sword, and is executed by placing the edge of the sword on the object and drawing it over until it is severed. A good large mangel-wurzel is capital practice. Place the root loose on a table, stand at arm's length from it, lay the edge of the sword lightly on it, and slice the root by repeatedly drawing the sword over it. This is very difficult, although it looks easy enough, and is sure to jar the arm from the wrist to the shoulder the first time or two, while the sword slides off it as if the root is cased in polished steel, however a little practice will soon overcome this difficulty. This cut is much used by the Sikhs'

Suffice it to say a number of members left the lecture not only slightly unsteady on their feet but also determined to re-enact the exercise at next year's Hurl. I am already preparing the necessary risk assessment demanded by the Order's insurers.
