

Sherston 1016 Christmas Vouchers your help please

Sherston 1016 is a small group of villagers, who get together with the aim of raising funds to provide some Christmas cheer to the most needy within the parish. We run a number of successful fund-raising events each year, the annual fireworks display, the village hall book sales, the Boules weekend crêpes stall, the Tug of War, and the Pancake race to name just a few.

The Christmas vouchers are appreciated by many and will be distributed over the weekend of the 21 December. But we always have a problem identifying villagers who have become eligible under the current criteria – over 65 or widowed. If you are eligible and do not receive a voucher or know someone else who doesn't, please let us know – details below. Also those that do not wish to receive a voucher in future please let us know.

We will be including a form with the vouchers for the recipient to fill in which will help us improve our distribution and make the most effective use of the funds collected. These can be returned to the Post Office where a box will be available to place them in.

This year, any recipients who wish to return their vouchers please place them in the box at the Post Office - the value will be donated to the Wiltshire Air Ambulance and other local good causes. (This replaces the box that used to be in the Church porch.) By returning the vouchers the recipient will be removed from our list so helping with our aim to better distribute our funds.

We would also be very happy to hear suggestions about anyone else who would benefit from some help even if they don't fall within the current criteria.

Remembrance Week at Sherston School

Sherston Primary School spent much of the first week of November focusing on WW1 as we mark the 100th anniversary of the Great War.

On 11 November the school observed a minute's silence at 11.00am. There was an assembly that touched on some of the locals from the village's Roll of Honour and Year 6 attended a service at the Sherston War Memorial where a poppy had been placed to remember every person who gave their life during the War.

Later in the week, James Gray MP joined headteacher Mr Bowditch and members of Year 6 at the local churchyard looking at the graves of the village's fallen heroes who they'd been studying at school. James Gray is planning to visit all the graves of Wiltshire's war heroes throughout this year. He was accompanied by Richard Broadhead, a local historian who is behind the website http://www. wiltshiresoldiers.co.uk/ which allows people to search for the records of over 12,000 servicemen who lost their lives during the Great War.

The children were in reflective mood as they studied the graves and discussed what they had learnt about the local people. 'If they didn't fight for us, we might not be here today,' said Beth. Oscar added, 'it's only fair to remember the people as they fought for us in the war.'

Mr Bowditch invited James Gray to come back to the school to look at the display of the Year 6 homework; research and stories about their own families during the War.

Emma showed James Gray a WW1 ensign flag. She explained: 'My great great grandfather was in the Merchant Navy and was promoted to Captain of the ship, when the boat was sunk he saved the ensign and kept it under his life jacket'.

James Gray commented, 'It's an absolutely wonderful display, by focusing on your own ancestors you understand the truth of what actually happened - it is a great way to learn and to bring history to life.'

Pupils and parents give generously to Operation Christmas Child 2014



Sherston Primary School has now been supporting Operation Christmas Child for 23 years – and this was a bumper year, with 185 boxes donated.

In the early days, headteacher Nick Bowditch, with Mary Clements and many village volunteers even hosted the founder, Dave Cooke, with his drivers and convoy who were en route to Eastern Europe. They stayed overnight in the new scout hut and were given breakfast in the school hall after a hilarious game of footie on the rec as a warm-up! The founders say they will never forget the role Sherston played back then.

Operation Christmas Child is now the largest global children's Christmas charity and increases its giving annually. More than 100 countries now receive the gifts given by over 60 other countries.

On Thursday 14 November, Sherston pupils brought their 185 filled boxes to the British School Room. Mary and Roger Clements, two of the longserving co-ordinators of the programme, showed the pupils the recent Operation Christmas Child film and answered questions about the journey that their gifts make around the world. 'The children do identify immediately with the idea of children not having toys,' Mary said. 'We talked in assembly about the reasons behind this around the world. In some countries we used to find children would keep the wrapping paper to decorate their walls, they also love to have the pictures of the person who made the box. They'd always want us to have something of theirs in return – even a single prized flower from a vegetable patch.'

Pupils were concerned about what happened if there weren't enough boxes to go round. 'We often have to reassure the children that this won't happen. The volunteers are very careful to ensure that no child leaves without their Christmas box – the preparation starts in June to make sure boys get a boy box and girls get a girl box. It's a long and complicated process but worth it when you see the smiles on their faces.'

Thank you to pupils Adam and Euan who shared their thoughts about the project: 'Filling shoeboxes like these gives poor children a chance to be happy, and it gives us a lot to think about,' they said.

Letter from the time of the Great War

Sheila Cutcher has very kindly given us access to family letters written from the front, such as this one: An extract from a letter written by Gunner HG (Harry) Stowell to his sister, Mabel, dated 14 January 1917. Headed simply 'France'. Harry had lied about

his age to join up in 1914 and was 16¹/₂ when he wrote this.

We had quite a good time here at Xmas with the aid of a neighbouring canteen and extras from parcels we managed quite a decent tuck-out. The menu card was as follows, (only drawn and gaily decorated)

Soup QO (otherwise known as Quaker oats) Fish Brislings en Huile (sardines) and salmon Entrée Crab, Tongue, and Sauce de H P Dessert Ananas de----- (Name)

Sweets Gateaux de Noel (otherwise Xmas cake)

Cigars nuts and oranges

Some feed eh! The table was a few empty boxes with a few clean sandbags for a cloth. And we managed to cram 18 into our dugout to take part on the repast! The evening was voted a complete success by everyone. Glad to hear you had a decent time at home in spite of the war.

Sherston Post Office -Get Ready for Christmas!

Opening Times

We are pleased to serve you any time between 7.00am and 6.00pm Monday to Friday, and from 8.00am and 1.00pm on Saturdays. No other post office in the vicinity will offer this service. The only time we would recommend you avoid is between 4.00pm and 5.00pm each day when businesses usually call.

Posting Abroad Weighty Problem

If possible, avoid sending items over 2kg abroad or it could cost you dear. A cheaper option could be to 'split' the parcel or choose something lighter, eg:

Don't guess the weight of your parcel or use scales that are not fully reliable. If your postage is wrong, it could result in problems with your delivery or you paying too much.

Size Matters

Even if the weight is less than 2kg, to qualify as a 'Small Parcel' the combined 'length' plus 'width' plus 'depth' of your parcel must be less than 90cm (3 foot) AND the longest side less than 60cm. Anything outside would have to go via Parcelforce and could result in you paying considerably more (see above).

Value for Money

Standard air mail postage only carries compensation of £20 and nothing for cash. If you send a high-value item or cash, please request either 'Tracked or Signed' to obtain appropriate compensation cover and additional comfort that it will reach its destination. Typical cost of this service is an extra £5.00.

Prohibited Goods

Prohibited and restricted goods span many everyday items. When considering gifts, please do not send body sprays, nail varnish, perfumes and aftershaves. A full list is available at the counter. If you are in doubt, ask.

Posting within the UK - Valuable Gifts

First- and second-class post only carry compensation of £20. 'Signed For' provides cover up to £50 but without tracking. Increased cover and end-to-end tracking can be arranged for 'Special Delivery' and 'Parcelforce'. Special Delivery is the only service that provides compensation for cash or gift vouchers.

Size and Weight Matters

The cost of a 'Small Parcel' up to 1kg is only £2.80 second class. The cost of a 'Medium Parcel' weighing 1.9Kg is £8.00. If the parcel weighs 2.1kg, the cost increases to £12.98 – a huge difference! For a 'Small Parcel' think of a large shoe box as a rough guide. Better still, ask at the counter for guidance.



all summer. The key issue, which is quite localised, is the river banks being broken down by cattle and consequently the river flows more slowly and the river bed gets covered in silt. This means the stones that insects and small fish need are covered up.

Dr Mark Everard, who you may remember from the river walk at WildSherston, showed a great example near Stretchline where the streams join together. The Sopworth branch was overgrown with water cress forcing the water into a narrow flow while the Luckington branch was relatively wide and slow flowing. Just picking up a few stones near the water cress produced all kinds of small insects, while it wasn't possible to see any insects in the Luckington branch. If there aren't any small insects then the fish aren't present which means there is less for the kingfishers to eat - and who would want to be without the kingfishers (and the little egrets!)? Hopefully a project will develop to improve the stream banks and increase the diversity of what lives in the streams. Watch this space.

Two Hairy Men

Keep a look out during December for two of your fellow villagers getting hairier by the day! Ask them what they're doing and you could get some information which might save your life.Persuaded by me, my husband Jim Robinson and our long-time friend Paul Rutter are taking part in the Decembeard fundraiser run by the charity Beating Bowel Cancer. I have a very personal interest in this charity as exactly three years ago I was waiting to hear what my future would be after a diagnosis of bowel cancer. After a very worrying Christmas, I finally found out in January 2012 that my treatment had a good chance of success and I have now been in remission for two years.

Beating Bowel Cancer supported me throughout the tough treatment I underwent and I want to do something to make sure that help is there for other people who need it. As it says in the charity's magazine, 'Can't grow a beard? Encourage your family and friends to get involved' so, being unable to grow a beard myself, I have duly 'encouraged' Paul and Jim and we're all now asking for your support in this fundraising effort. Go to www.justgiving.com/ jimsbeard or www.justgiving.com/paulsbeard31 to donate and to follow their progress or speak to them in person.



And what about that life-saving information I mentioned at the beginning? When I was first diagnosed I took to the internet for information. Before I decided to stick to just the Beating Bowel Cancer website for its good factual information and support, I discovered that the most up-to-date figure then for five-year survival of bowel cancer was less than 50%. That really scared me, but I realised that most of those who did not survive long had late diagnoses for a variety of reasons.

Bowel cancer does not get the publicity of other cancers, such as breast cancer, although it is the second most common cause of cancer death in the UK (Cancer Research UK). People do not like going to the doctor to talk about their bowel motions and a lot of people throw away the screening test, which is sent to all 60-74 years olds, because they find it all a bit nasty. Recognising the symptoms and early diagnosis can save your life, so when you see one of the two Hairy Men with their Decembeards just think about what they're doing. Yes they're raising funds for Beating Bowel Cancer but for that month they'll also be a reminder to the people of Sherston to be aware of this cancer – take the screening test if it's offered and talk to your doctor if you have symptoms.

Thanks in advance for your support and remember Real Men Grow Beards. (I wonder who asked me to include that!).
