The Parochial Church Council (PCC) tries hard to keep the churchyard well kept and a fitting place where the people of our village can remember their friends and family members in dignified surroundings. If the problem of fouling continues, the PCC will be forced to consider banning dogs from the churchyard so that it can be kept in a proper state. With your cooperation a ban will not be necessary. Church Yard History

Some of you may already know that Sherston PCC has been working, for several years, to produce an accurate plan of the entire churchyard. To help with this, an old Burial Register, which was first used in 1877, has been retained in the church. In the New Year, this is going to be taken to the Wiltshire and Swindon History Centre (WSHC) in Chippenham and will go into their archives for safe storage, along with all the other old parish registers from Sherston.

If you would like a chance to see the Burial Register before it goes to WSHC, it will be on display in Holy Cross Church on Saturday 14 January from 10.00am to 12.00noon. If your family has lived in Sherston since the late 19th century, you may like to see any information about them which is in the Register. If you know that members of your family lie in the churchyard, you may be able to help us fill in some of the blanks in the information that the PCC holds.

Although all the records at WSHC are available to the public, you will often only get to see them on microfilm because repeated handling of old written materials can lead to damage. On this occasion you will have the chance to see the Register itself, but in order to best preserve it visitors will not be able to handle it themselves. A copy of all the information in the Register should be complete by January and you will be able to look through that in search of information. Someone will also be on hand to find particular entries in the Register and show them to you. This will be a unique occasion to look into the history of our village and its people. Do come along and see what you can find out.

A new Preschool for Sherston?

Sherston is a village that attracts many families but, despite its many facilities, is currently lacking a preschool. We are hoping to rectify this by gathering the necessary support and funding to build and operate a new preschool.

First and foremost, we must consider the best interests of the children in terms of their care and education. We intend the new preschool to be based on a self-sustaining business model with extended hours and wrap-around care. It will be a professionally managed facility, with the background support of a committee to allow the preschool to be run in a sustainable way. It will be based in a purpose-built setting that provides a modern, stimulating and fun environment for the children of Sherston and the surrounding areas to embark on their early years education.

We are aiming to offer the following services:

- Daily core hours of 9.00am to 3.00pm
- Breakfast club available to preschool and primary school age children
- After-school club available to preschool and primary school age children
- Holiday clubs available to preschool and primary school age children

Where will it be?

It is commonly understood that preschools tend to thrive when they are closely associated with, and are in proximity to, their feeder primary schools. We believe that a permanent location in close proximity to Sherston CofE Primary School will be most advantageous.

The upcoming Sherston Neighbourhood Plan (see sherston.org.uk for further information) incorporates a site for a preschool within its plans. We are supportive of the village plan and optimistic that if the current Sherston Neighbourhood Plan proceeds, this will facilitate our aims to be situated in close proximity to the school.



What are we doing to move things forward?

We are liaising closely, and building strong relationships with the school and the Parish Council, which are both in support of our proposals. We also have a business case under way. We are having monthly meetings with a core team of people interested in moving this project forward.

Do we have your support?

Whether you have young children, older children, or no children we would be grateful for your support.

We have produced a short survey for the purposes of market research and to ascertain local levels of support. Christmas Bonding with Jigsaws




What better way is there to close the age gap than to piece together a jigsaw puzzle? Everyone can join in as and when, and it can be an absorbing and fulfilling Christmas project.



November Round-Up

The visiting speaker for our November meeting was Paul Jupp. Paul, who now runs his own company called 'Meadow in my Garden', explained that his passion for wildlife had started as a young boy with The Readers' Digest Book of British Birds and that one of his key objectives was to encourage as many people as possible to take part in planting wildflowers to encourage wildlife and maintain/reinstate the natural biodiversity of our landscapes. Paul gave us some staggering figures about the loss of species in the UK over the past 40 years (more than 50%) and that one in ten UK species are currently threatened with extinction. All of us will have noticed that we don't see as many hedgehogs (who, incidentally, were roaming the earth with the dinosaurs) as we used to, but that's not surprising when we learnt that their numbers have declined from the tens of millions in the 1950s to less than one million today.

Paul's talk was accompanied by some beautiful birdsongs and some lovely slides of wildflower planting, not just large-scale meadow planting but also small areas on kerbsides, roundabouts and in gardens. As Wiltshire residents, we were cheered to know that our county is one of the best natural areas in the UK for wildflowers. Paul has been providing surplus seeds to schools to encourage children to experience the pleasures of gardening. Along with other volunteers, he has planted up some roundabouts and kerbsides with wildflowers, which has, no doubt, brightened up many a commute and trip to the shops.

Size Matters

Even if the weight is less than 2Kg, to qualify as a "Small Parcel" the combined "length" plus "width" plus "depth" of your parcel must be less than 90cm (3 foot) AND the longest side less than 60 cm. Anything outside would have to go via Parcelforce and could result in you paying <u>considerably more (see above)</u>.

Valuable Gifts

Standard air mail postage only carries compensation of £20 and **nothing** for cash. If you send a high value item or cash please request either "*Tracked or Signed*" to obtain appropriate compensation cover and additional comfort that it will reach its destination. The cost of this service starts at only £3.00.

Prohibited Goods

Prohibited and restricted goods span many everyday items. When considering gifts, DO NOT send body sprays, nail varnish, perfumes and aftershaves. Some countries (e.g. Germany) do not accept any items containing a lithium battery. A full list is available at the counter. If you are in doubt, ask.

.... sadly, not folks! After two truly amazing Boondocks Festivals the team have decided to take 2017 off



Sherston School Forest Club

Sherston School Forest School Club has been helping to spread the message about the link between storm drains and our rivers and pollution by working with the Bristol & Avon River Trust and participating in their 'Yellowfish' project. We were pleased to welcome Harriet Alvis (an ex-Sherston pupil) to a recent session and she explained to the children how any waste entering outdoor drains can go directly to the nearest stream, river or lake, causing pollution and killing aquatic wildlife. To raise awareness in the village, the children enthusiastically marked storm drains in the vicinity of the school with painted yellow fish and we put up explanatory posters.

We then set off to the Sherston Avon for the children to become citizen scientists by assessing phosphate and nitrate levels in the water. The children collected river samples to use in colour dip tests and awaited the results. Many children were very excited to see their samples turn a very bright shade of pink!

Harriet explains: 'Phosphate and nitrate are essential for plant life and healthy rivers. However, too much can cause excessive algae and plant growth, which can smother rivers, reducing oxygen in the water and therefore biodiversity. This is known as eutrophication. Nutrients can come from waste-

Using the simple colour dip tests, the children found low levels of phosphates but higher than normal (and higher than the nearby Luckington Brook) levels of nitrates. These results will help Bristol Avon Rivers Trust to better understand how nutrients vary across the Sherston area in the future and help to direct future water quality improvement works. Thanks to the Bristol Avon Catchment Partnership and the Halpin Charitable Trust for funding BART's work in the area.'

Thank you to Harriet too, for a really fun and informative afternoon, from which the children went home to pass on the important message that storm drains link directly to rivers. Please remember, only rain down the drain!






