If anybody has any dog or cat food or bird food, newspaper or donations for them they can let me have this and I can deliver it.



Sherston Boules weekend is no doubt just a distant memory as Christmas is nearly upon us and we are getting ready for the big event. Most of you will be cosying up to an open fire, practising your Christmas carols and preparing the mince pies in readiness for the season of goodwill, however, in our 'local' way, Sherston Boules is a great goodwill event. Not only is it a weekend of fun, frolics and socialising but a huge local fundraiser for our village groups and societies. This year we are pleased to confirm that we are distributing a record £8000 back into the local community with over 20 groups benefiting from the weekend's events and fundraising.

# Walk on the wild side



Your chance to help save a rare species (in Sherston AND it's really easy...) You may not know this but within a few miles of Sherston are the last colonies in

the UK of a very rare species – and I very much doubt you have ever heard of it.

The national 'Back from the Brink' project, funded by the National Lottery, aims to save some of the most endangered plants, insects, birds etc in the UK.

The species in question is the Barberry Carpet Moth and there are only 11 colonies left on the UK with six just south of here around Hullavington and one at Westonbirt so its national stronghold is all around us but not in Sherston - we need to fix that!! The Barberry Carpet moth used to be a far more common species in Britain and was widespread over southern England and found as far North as Yorkshire. It definitely won't eat your carpets as its sole native food-plant is Common Barberry (Berberis vulgaris) which is no longer a common plant. Remaining colonies of the moth have become isolated from each other, populations have reduced, and the moth has become far more vulnerable to local extinctions.

The Common Barberry bush is an attractive plant with beautiful orange/red berries and attractive autumn colours. The bushes grow slowly and ideally need some aftercare so that they don't get swamped by competing vegetation. They do have spines like their cultivated cousins (so may not be good in a garden with children) and left to grow large they can reach 7 or 8 foot tall in hedgerows but it is possible to keep them much smaller. Chester Zoo are growing the bushes (so you don't even have to buy them!!) and ideally Butterfly Conservation want to plant Barberry in clumps of at least three plants so that in the future these plants would be capable of supporting a small colony of the moth.

The moth is capable of dispersal but they want to ensure that new plantings are less than a kilometre from each other in order to provide plenty of new areas or 'stepping stones' between the existing colonies. The plan, lead by the Project Officer from Butterfly Conservation - Fiona Haynes, is to start planting out the young bushes over the autumn and winter months. If you enough space for at least three plants please get in touch with myself or Fiona and we can supply the plants and help plant them.

#### **Antibiotics**

There has been a lot in the news recently about use, or over-use of antibiotics. Research has shown that GPs are under enormous pressure from patients to prescribe antibiotics when they think they need them for illnesses such as coughs, colds and sore throats which can get better by themselves, or by using over the counter medicine available from a pharmacy.

Taking antibiotics encourages bacteria to become resistant, meaning the antibiotics may not work when you really need them to and can put you and your family at risk of a more severe or longer illness. Antibiotics are essential to treat serious bacterial infections, such as pneumonia, meningitis and sepsis. The danger is that antibiotics no longer work for some infections and this situation will only get worse with excessive and inappropriate use.

The advice is to take antibiotics as instructed and finish the course if they are prescribed for you, never save them for later use or share them with others. Listen to your doctor and only take antibiotics when you need to, advises Wiltshire CCG.

### **NHS** Healthchecks

As we get older, we have a higher risk of developing conditions like high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes, kidney disease or dementia. Your free NHS Health Check can spot early signs and help prevent these happening to you, which means you'll be more likely to enjoy life for longer. If you are in the 40-74 age group without a pre-existing condition we will invite you for a free NHS Health Check every five years. If you receive an invitation it is worth spending 20 minutes taking advantage of this very worthwhile free service.

### Our Appointments are Changing

As you will be aware, pressures in General Practice on appointments are increasing and none so fast than the demand for appointments.

In response to this, at the Tolsey we are trying a new method on some days to make sure patients that do need to be seen urgently/on the day, can be seen in a safe and timely fashion, and ease the pressure on staff, GPs, nurses and admin.

In November, we introduced a triage clinic run by one of the GPs on Monday and Friday mornings.

If you ring up asking for an emergency or sameday appointment, your details will be taken by a receptionist and the GP will then call you back to deal with your request.

### This may be that:

You will be given a same day MORNING appointment with a GP

You will be given an appointment to see another health care practitioner

You will be triaged and given an Amber appointment to be seen the same week

You will be triaged and offered a Green routine appointment

Your problem will be dealt with over the phone

The colour assigned to these appointments is part of a traffic light system that is being introduced in several other practices nationwide.

Green routine appointment – your problem does not need to be dealt with as an emergency or soon. Our routine appointment wait with any GP is usually 2-3 weeks.

Amber appointment – these appointments are held back and only released two days beforehand to allow problems that need to be dealt with within seven days, but not necessarily as an emergency

Red appointment – these are reserved for urgent problems that need to be dealt with on the same day





### What does this mean for you?

If you ask for a same-day appointment you will need to give our receptionist an idea of why it is urgent. You may be asked to wait for a call back from a GP – and we NEED TO BE ABLE to RING YOU BACK - you must ensure we have your correct phone number, and that you have a strong signal if on a mobile, or stay close to your home phone. If you want to be seen urgently, you will be offered a morning appointment, whether you are at work, at school, or planning a shopping trip!

Non-urgent appointments. Amber appointments will be offered because the problem needs to be dealt with soon. Reasons do not include 'because it is convenient for you to be seen quickly' or 'because you have forgotten to book a routine appointment'.

Green appointments. Unlike many other surgeries who have a wait of more than four weeks, we can offer routine appointments within 2-3 weeks. Please think ahead, book ahead and then actually attend your routine appointment. If you consider that is a long time, just think how far ahead you have to book haircuts, dogs into kennels, and dental appointments – this is no different.

We welcome any feedback once these changes are under way, as we head into the busiest time of year for General Practice.

### Winter Fuel Grants

Hello! December again – where has the year gone? With winter clearly on the horizon, our thoughts turn to colder weather and how to keep warm. Many health problems are triggered or worsened by cold weather: dry skin and cold hands and feet are annoying, aching joints, colds and sore throats are almost expected, but serious, life threatening conditions such as asthma, norovirus and heart attacks are also exacerbated by the cold weather. The advice, of course, is to wrap up warmly and keep the heating going at home, which can be expensive. There is much that can be done to help with the costs of heating - switching supplier for electricity and gas or joining an oil purchasing consortium. Prevention is better than cure, so could your home use better insulation? For those who are really struggling with costs, small grants are available. Applications start mid November and the criteria are:

To be eligible for a grant someone must;

- be considered to live in fuel poverty (spend more than 10% of their annual household income on fuel to keep their home warm and in a 'satisfactory' condition)
- be in receipt of eligible means-tested benefits And fall into one of the categories below;
- be pensionable age and affected by fuel poverty
- Letting and managing properties in your area

We are pleased to serve you any time between 7.00a.m. to 6.00p.m. Monday to Friday and from 8.00a.m. to 1.00p.m. on Saturday. The only time we would ask you avoid is between 4.00pm and 5.00pm each day when we tend to be very busy, give priority to businesses with urgent post and you are likely to encounter queues.

### POSTING ABROAD Weighty Problem

Sending items over 2kg abroad could cost you dear. A cheaper option could be to 'split' the parcel or choose an alternative lighter gift e.g.

### Size Matters

Even if the weight is less than 2Kg, to qualify as a 'Small Parcel' the combined 'length' plus 'width' plus 'depth' of your parcel must be less than 90cm (3 foot ) AND the longest side less than 60 cm. Anything outside would have to go via Parcelforce and could result in you paying considerably more (see above).

#### Valuable Gifts

Standard air mail postage only carries compensation of £20 and nothing for cash. If you send a high value gift, sentimental item or cash please request either 'Tracked or Signed' to obtain appropriate compensation cover and additional comfort that it will reach its destination. The cost of this extra service starts at only £3.15.

### **Prohibited Goods**

Prohibited and restricted goods span many everyday items. When considering gifts, DO NOT send body sprays, nail varnish, perfumes and aftershaves . Some countries (e.g. Germany) do not accept any items containing a lithium battery. A full list is available at the counter. If you are in doubt, ask.





### A magical stroll around Sherston



Wreaths were laid in memory of the fallen by: Councillor John Matthews, Sherston Parish Council, Captain Asong AGC (SPS), on behalf of 9 Regiment Royal Logistic Corps, Lieutenant Colonel Linda Evans RAMC,

Holy Cross Church Candi Williams Tarling, Congregational Church Jamie Wallace, The Sherston Scout Group Freya Milne, 1st Sherston Guides Bethany Potter, 1st Sherston Brownies Alice Stevens, 2nd Sherston Brownies Sherston Occasional Community Choir, conducted by Trudi Baker, sang 'Be Still My Soul' to the Sibelius tune Finlandia during the laying of the wreaths.

At the end of the service 90 Sqn RLC followed by the youth organisations marched past and Councillor John Matthews, Chairman of Sherston Parish Council, took the salute.

Thanks go to all those who helped to prepare for this village ceremony and honoured the memory of those who have gone before us. The excellent sound system was provided by David Shephard and operated by Mike Whatley. We thank the 1st and 2nd Sherston Brownie Units, 1st Sherston Guides, the 1st Sherston Scout Group and Sherston Whitewalls Explorer Scout Unit, 90 Squadron RLC, the Sherston Band of Ringers, the Sherston Community Choir, the stewards, organised by Sqn Ldr Jim Robinson; Nigel Freeth, Lt Cdr Christopher Morgan RN Wg Cdr Dr Pamela Pickthall, Susan Robinson and John Smith. Graham Instrell managed the closure of Church Street and the traffic.

The collection for the Earl Haig Fund amounted to £700.

# Snow White Sell-Out!



October half term bought panto week to Sherston. Oh yes it did!! Adults and children alike were captivated by Sherston Drama Group's production of Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs, written by Alan P. Frayn and skilfully directed by Sue Lehrer and Tahiti Van Rooyen.

Kind hearted Snow White, played with sensitivity by Emma Smee, fell remarkably quickly in love with the dashing Prince Ferdinand upon his arrival from 'Farawasia'. 




