
World War 1 and Remembrance

Still thinking of Home




Two Minutes of Silence

WI Report



I am certain many of us have travelled through Exeter St David's railway station but I wonder how many of us know that it was at that station that the idea of Penguin Books originated?

Our speaker at our November meeting, Barry Edwards, shared with us his knowledge of the early history of Penguin books and enthused us with his passion for the books. He is an avid collector and, to date, has a collection of 1,440 of the first 1,500 books published by Penguin.

An experienced publisher, Allen Lane, founder of Penguin Books, having tried to buy a book at the station for a journey from Exeter to London, spotted a gap in the market for good quality books at affordable prices. His publishing experience and his belief that literature should be available to all encouraged him to set up the business. In 1935 Penguin published ten titles on the same day at 6d (2.5p) a book - at that time a hardback book cost 7s (35p)- with a print run of 20,000 books for each title. Within a year Penguin had printed 3,000,000 paperbacks across a range of titles. Distribution of the books extended beyond the traditional bookshops to Woolworths, who had committed to a significant regular order from Penguin, and to WH Smith, hence books were then becoming readily available at railway stations.

We are all familiar with the orange and white cover with the Penguin logo but initially book covers were blue and white, then diverging into different colours -green/white, cerise/white, grey/white, yellow/white - to denominate the classification of the books, eg crime, travel, politics, etc. The advent of WW2 brought challenges with regards to the supply of paper for book publishing and during that time Penguin set up overseas publishing operations and also produced books with fewer pages by using smaller font sizes. After the war Penguin continued to expand its range of books and publish new authors. Its success in 1960 in winning the court case regarding the publishing of Lady Chatterly's Lover by DH Lawrence gave an added bonus of sales of over three million copies of the book that year.

On 6 December our thoughts turn to Christmas when Cherry Hubbard will be visiting us to tell us about a Tudor Christmas. Members will be marking the New Year on 17 January with a lunch.

Sherston Remembrance Day Service



Blue skies and a temperature eight degrees above last year's boded well for this year's Remembrance Service commemorating the centenary of the WW1 Armistice. Leading up to 11 o'clock, 730 people assembled in Church Street for Sherston's fifth outside Remembrance Service. Led by 90 Squadron Royal Logistic Corps, from Buckley Barracks, commanded by Major Richard Gardner MBE followed by Sherston's uniformed organisations and service veterans, the parade marched along the High Street to take their positions in front of the War Memorial at the lychgate. Before the service, the Sherston Band of Ringers started proceedings by ringing half-muffled as the Union Flag flew over the tower. The Rector, Revd Christopher Bryan, led the service assisted by Pastor Andrew Williams-Tarling of the Congregational Church and the Revd David Miller of the Methodist Church. Roger Whitehouse, the verger, carried the cross.

Following the two-minute silence, Lieutenant Colonel Nick Grant-Thorold recited The Exhortation, Captain Henry Jodrell and Imogen Bathie (a member of the Sherston drama group) read names of servicemen of Easton Grey and Sherston who died in past conflicts. Private Bryant of 9 Regt RLC recited the Kohima Epitaph and Bryn Holding dramatically recited Laurence Binyon's poem 'For the Fallen' in its entirety.

The address was given by Andrew Williams-Tarling. After the prayers, Tamsin Kennard led the singing of 'Keep the Home Fires Burning' accompanied by the Sherston Occasional Community Choir. Tamsin, a professional singer and singing coach is married to Bryn, a professional actor and director: he who recited the poem. They live in Sherston.

It's official - Sherston is a 'Caring Community'!

We've always known it, of course, but Sherston is now officially a 'Caring Community' following the village's takeover of the Caring 365 homeless shelter in Bristol!

In fact, Sherston is the first-ever Caring Community, as our takeover was part of a pilot scheme developed by Caring in Bristol (https://caringinbristol.co.uk/), which runs the shelter, where a community takes over a homeless shelter in Bristol for a whole week. And 'takeover' means just that - we not only needed to provide all the frontline crew to run the shelter for a week, but we also needed to raise the funds to pay for it!

Running the shelter involved having three Sherston volunteers staying in the shelter every night, meaning we needed to fill a total of 21 'shifts'. Now that's quite an ask for a small village but guess what? We smashed it! More than 40 villagers stepped up to do an overnight stint so, in the end, we had to leave some of the team at home!

We also smashed the fundraising! The cost of running the shelter for a week is £1,500 so that was our target, but money is still coming in and we have already raised over £3,000! A massive thank you to everyone who has helped and contributed.



As part of the project, the Caring In Bristol team came out to Sherston to deliver the training needed. Two days later, the first team of Sherstoners was in deepest Brizzle keeping 15 people safe and warm for the night. Caring 365 is a 'pop-up' shelter in a church hall that hosts a playgroup and yoga during the day, but when it gets dark and cold it's transformed into a welcoming place where people in need can get somewhere warm to bed down and a nice cuppa.

Meanwhile, back in the village, some of the younger members of our caring community were getting involved in fundraising activities too, including a sponsored sleepout on the rec - yes, in November! - (see opposite for more details on junior fundraising).

Of course, no Sherston event would be complete without a slot on the BBC and this one was no



exception, with both BBC TV and Radio featuring the ground-breaking initiative dreamt up by Sherston's Gemma Waldron and Dave Shephard. Both are long-time volunteers at the shelter and 'pitched' the idea to the charity which now intends to roll it out to other communities, companies, clubs or any other group of caring individuals.

So, if you have a company, community or a club or just a bunch of mates who might want to run their own takeover, then grab Dave or Gemma or drop an email to caring@oldbellhouse.com and you too can become a caring community.



The week was a great success from all sides and, as Dave said to the BBC: 'The best bit about the whole week is ordinary folk realising that they aren't powerless in the face of the big problems of society ... The project slogan is "it's time to stop making excuses and start making a difference" and that's exactly what Sherston has done!'

From our youngest sleeper, Reuben (6), to the rest of the 13brave children, everyone was genuinely amazing. As the temperature dropped, they wrapped their blankets a little closer and made it through the night. We all learned how lucky we are to have a safe house to go home to and, in the process, raised over £750 so that



some of Bristol's homeless can have a warm bed this winter.

Polly said, 'It was really fun sleeping out with my friends but it would be horrible and difficult to have to do it every night, and on my own. So it was good to raise some money for the shelter.' While Lucy said, 'It's not something everyone does every day and I now realise how hard it must be to be homeless. It was an extraordinary experience."


The final day was aeroball (a kind of basketball on trampolines) and problem solving and then it was time to come home.



Sherston Brownies: Remembrance Parade

The Sherston Brownies were proud to join the Remembrance parade in the village last month. As it was marking the centenary of the end of the First World War, the Brownies wanted to mark the day in their special way. One hundred poppies stood proud in the churchyard overlooking the parade, each carefully made by a Brownie who marked it with a name of a fallen soldier from Sherston, giving meaning to this generation of Brownies. As the girls read out the names, they became sensitive of how many men individual families lost. They crafted the poppies by upcycling bottles and painting them red before cutting out a leaf to write the soldier's name on, creating a vibrant display. The Brownies marched on the Sunday parade through the village with the Sherston Scouts, Cubs and Guides to the church to join the rest of the village for the Remembrance service. Two Brownies laid the wreath in honour of the soldiers who gave their lives for us. The Owls were very proud of all the Brownies who took part.



Tetbury Camera Club: Every picture tells a story



There is little doubt that most of us will have heard the comment that 'every picture tells a story' but, unlike many idioms or sayings, where it originated, what prompted it or who first conceived it now seems to be lost in time. One thing's for sure though, it's a saying that is as relevant today as it ever was. It sprang to mind a few weeks ago when Tetbury Camera Club had a fine evening of entertainment and inspiration with a visit from Worcestershire-based photographer Darren Leeson.

Darren's forte is street photography, which for anyone who hasn't come across the term before refers to outdoor picture-taking that is often 'gritty' in style and content. To use Darren's words, 'although my interest in photography is wide-ranging, I have a strong passion for the real and surreal stories and theatre of the street.' During the evening he entertained with a varied selection of images, showing shots such as the mobile diner picture (above). It is obviously firmly closed for business, despite its open-all-day signage!

Despite the apparent simplicity or naivety of street pictures, they are not as simple to take as they might look. Although they are out there to be captured at any time of the day or night in rural as well as urban settings, not everyone can see them. For most people, it isn't easy to be bold enough to just snap a shot of someone they don't know, or to walk up to

someone they've never seen before and ask if they can photograph them.

Among the hints and tips Darren offered on the best way to capture street shots, there were a couple that are easy for virtually anyone to follow: always take a camera with you!

Darren almost never leaves home without one of his cameras. Another comment he made was that using a small unobtrusive camera makes you look more like an amateur and tourist, so people are less likely to be watching what you're doing. One of the cameras he uses is about 10 years old, rather bashed, looks well-used and sports a simple-looking small lens acquired from an auction site. Leave the larger long-length lenses for other photographic projects.

Another tip was to watch what's going on around you. If you don't look, you won't see. There are always pictures to be taken, you just have to spot them.






