

Precept

The Parish Council has now set the precept for 2013/14 which will be included in residents' council tax bill from Wiltshire Council issued during March. The parish precept is essentially the annual amount the Parish Council requires to undertake its functions.

Setting the precept has been somewhat more complicated than usual due to recent changes in local government financing, including the reduction in council tax benefit. The basis next year for calculating Wiltshire parish councils' precept is about 15% lower than the previous year. Wiltshire Council has received a grant from central government to make up some of the shortfall for local councils, supplemented, where necessary, by Wiltshire Council's own funds. The impact on Sherston is fortunately nil. For 2013/4, the parish council originally budgeted for the same precept (£22,400) as the previous year. This has now changed to a precept of £20,920 and a grant of £1,480. The council tax for the parish remains unchanged at a Band D rate of £31.42. The future direction of local government financing will continue to be a contentious issue.

We started our new year programme on 8 January with our Annual General Meeting, followed by a quiz and bingo. The officers and committee remain unchanged – Joan Butler as our President, Helen Quirk as Secretary, Liz Bell as Treasurer and myself as Chairman.

The parish council is now in the process of ordering two new pieces of play equipment for the Rec. This follows consultation with young people via Sherston Scouts - the idea being to provide equipment suitable for those aged 11-18.



The consultation revealed a very strong preference for an aerial zip wire with an aerial swing as a runner up. Accordingly these two pieces of equipment will be installed within the next couple of months in readiness for the summer.

The double zip wire will be placed running parallel to the wall adjoining Green Lane at the Scout Hut 'end' of the Rec with the aerial swing being near the existing equipment

The costs are in the region of £16,000 net and this being financed by a very generous donation of £10,000 from the Mark Doyle fund with the balance coming from a planning gain payment due to the parish council from a development in the village sometime ago.

A very special musical evening in Sherston Church - 7 February

On Thursday 7 February, 'The Gentlemen of Bristol Cathedral Choir' - the Lay Clerks and Choral Scholars - will be coming to Sherston.

They will be singing a Cathedral-style Evensong at 7.30pm, and then there will be a short break before they begin a concert at 8.15pm, which will include a wide variety of musical styles, from traditional choral through to popular and perhaps even 'barbershop'. The title will be 'From Plainsong to Pop'.

All are very welcome to come along, whether to the Evensong and/or to the concert. There will not be tickets but there will be a retiring collection to be shared between the Parish Church and the Bristol Cathedral Choir. There will also be refreshments available.

A little more information about 'The Gentlemen of Bristol Cathedral Choir'. Prior to the dissolution of the monasteries by Henry VIII an Augustinian priory had been in operation on College Green in Bristol since its foundation by Fitzhardinge of Berkeley. In 1542 the disused buildings were established as the Cathedral and six 'singing men' were set up to sing the new post Reformation services. The current Lay Clerks are the successors of those six and still carry out the same functions of singing the services during the week and at weekends. In recent years Choral Scholarships have been offered to young men who sing with the Cathedral Choir whilst they are pursuing academic studies in the City.

Ring out the old, ring in the new

As tradition demands, the Sherston Band of Bell Ringers rang out the old and rang in the new at the turn of the year. 2012 was rung out half muffled, a year where the Band rang for The Queen's Diamond Jubilee and the start of the London Olympics. On solemn occasions the bells are rung half-muffled, a leather pad being strapped to one side of the clapper ball. The bells provide a distinctive effect sounding strident and soft alternately.

Shortly before midnight the muffles were removed and the hour was marked by the bells being 'fired' 12 times. Firing is when all the bells are rung at the same time creating a distinctive and loud noise. The bells were then rung normally with call changes.

The defibrillators are coming

It might sound like the title of a second rate sci-film, but it is an important life-saver for the parish. There are various potentially fatal heart rhythm problems that can occur, and which require prompt response if the patient is not to die or suffer problems from oxygen starvation to the brain. Automated External Defibrillators are now available, which can be used by someone with little or no training and can potentially save a life.

They are commonly placed in shops, offices, airports and stations, and more and more they are being placed in villages where medical support might take some time to arrive.

We have now acquired three from a charity called Community Heartbeat; they have been paid for by a mix of public donations and money from trusts. The Parish Council would like to thank everyone who has contributed to this important facility for the community.

One will be placed on the outside wall of the Rattlebone's skittle alley, one adjacent to the phone box in Pinkney, and one by the notice board in Willesley. Although they are designed to be used without training (the machine directs the user what to do), we will be running a couple of brief training courses. I would encourage everyone to come if possible - we will be arranging dates soon.


Rural Treats - an Art and Ceramics Exhibition at Westonbirt Arboretum



A walk on the wild side

Spring is on its way already

Our wildlife is incredibly resilient to the seasons and all that can happen, if given enough time to recover. This winter, so far, has given us a good covering of snow and even more rain but, in spite of this, some local residents already have spring on their mind.

Our local common frog and common toad will be spawning soon, with lots going on in February. Other local residents getting ready are our local grey herons which can be regularly seen along the Cliff. Herons breed in groups (called heronries) and egglaying can start during February, although March is more common. Given that there are about 13,000 breeding pairs of herons in this country, heronries aren't very common but one you can visit nearby, with an observatory, is at Lower Moor Farm, near Oaksey. It's run by the Wiltshire Wildlife Trust and I have heard that you can sometimes see otters in the

lake between the observatory and the heronry.

With spring on the way, it's time to get those nest boxes built and out in the garden so here are a few tips:

- place them in sheltered locations out of prevailing wind, rain and direct sun,
- don't put them near bird feeders,
- ensure, if possible, that predators can't get access, especially cats,
- mix open-fronted nest boxes and ones with holes to attract different birds, but don't put them too close together, and
- try and get them up by mid- to late February when birds start to inspect possible nesting sites.

And please keep feeding the birds. We have seen an influx of birds from northern Europe as natural food supplies there are low. Waxwings are around in reasonable numbers (although I haven't heard of any

in the village) and this year we do have blackcaps. These birds migrate to southern Europe in the autumn but this winter we have blackcaps arriving from further north. The photo is a male blackcap (the females have a mid brown 'cap') that arrived last spring. If you do see any on your feeders, please let me know on 840995 or geoff_carss@hotmail.com.

And finally for those with an interest in birds: there is one, possibly two, green sandpipers overwintering on the Sherston branch of the Avon, upstream of the Cliff.

Sherston Living Churchyard

After a break of a year I hope to re-start work in the churchyard this spring, with the twin aims of continuing to keep it a fit resting place for the dead while also making it a haven for wildlife.

The first session of the year will be on Saturday 9 February from 2.00pm to 4.00pm, weather permitting. The work planned is to clear some of the undergrowth which has invaded the wooded area over the past year. This area has been planted with spring flowers and by February the snowdrops and primroses should be flowering, but unless some clearance is carried out the wood anemones and bluebells will be choked and will not be able to follow on.

The snowdrop is often linked to Candlemas on 2 February. This day, when the flowers were said to first come into bloom, is 40 days after Christmas and is the day on which the infant Christ was presented in the Temple in Jerusalem. On 2 February churches traditionally blessed the candles which were to be used there over the coming year and thought of the symbolism of light in their faith – Jesus Christ, the Light of the World.

A medieval legend tells that snowdrops were given to Adam and Eve as a symbol of hope after



their expulsion from the Garden of Eden. After the delights of the Garden they were in despair at their first experience of winter, fearing that it might never end. An angel appeared and transformed some snowflakes into snowdrops as a sign that the end of

The sight of the first flowers of spring will soon have a similar encouraging effect on us. Dress warmly and come to the churchyard to see the snowdrops and join in with the work and you will definitely feel better! I hope to see you there.



Doctor's Bag

The Tolsey Surgery by Judy Sharp

Care Quality Commission

You may have heard about the need for GP Practices to be registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) from April 2013. This is to ensure that people can expect services to meet essential standards of quality and safety that respect their dignity and protect their rights.

The Tolsey Surgery took part in a pilot study to test the compliance methodology CQC will use to monitor these services. As a volunteer, we were one of the first surgeries to be inspected by the CQC. This involved an inspector spending the day at the surgery speaking to the practice manager, a GP, reception staff and patients. The inspector also spoke to John Buckley, the Chairman of our Patient Participation Group, FOTS. We are pleased to report that we were found to be fully compliant in all areas inspected. The report is available to view at the surgery or online through our website.

Tolsey Surgery Patient Survey 2012 Results

Our Patient Survey was completed by patients at the surgery, online and at various other places in and around Sherston to gain the opinions of as many patients as possible. 180 Surveys were completed, 11 less than the previous year.

The high degree of satisfaction was maintained and we are pleased that over 90% of our patients will still recommend us to new residents. All the other results were very similar to those of last year.

Carers: A new section for carers was introduced as we are working hard to improve our service in this area. Only 43.2% of those who answered this question said they were aware of our Carers Register. However, 92.3% said their needs were understood by the doctor or nurse.

Booking Ahead: Last year 41.6% said it was very easy to book ahead, this has now gone up to 48.6%. However, we obviously still have some work to do to inform patients of the facility to book up to 8 weeks ahead as over 60% said they did not know.

Booking Methods: In the 2011 survey, we asked how you prefer to book appointments. Although the majority book by phone, 22.2% said they would like to book online. We have now introduced an online booking system and nearly 8% of patients are now routinely using this method of booking. As online booking becomes more popular, it will reduce demand on the telephone making it easier for those who are not able to book online.

Sherston Doctor Takes Jungle Challenge



In just a few months, Dr Pip Pettit is undertaking an eight-week sabbatical as an expedition medic to support the volunteers on the Raleigh International Expedition to Borneo.

We caught up with her to find out what it's all about, and started with the obvious question ... why is she doing it? Dr Pettit told us, 'I have an opportunity for a sabbatical from general practice this year, and have always wanted to use my medical skills to help those less fortunate than myself.'

Since 1984, Raleigh expeditions have inspired 30,000 young people from all walks of life and nationalities to be all they can be, helping them develop new skills and friendships and make a difference to communities and environments across the world. The 'venturers' (volunteer teams) are aged between 17 and 24 and Raleigh particularly encourages disadvantaged young people from the UK to take part.

Dr Pettit explained, 'I will be there as a volunteer, using my medical skills to support the venturers in remote areas of Borneo jungle from base camp, as well as acting as a project lead on the expedition sites. It will be a challenge both medically and physically. I have to hone up my skills in fracture and wound care, jungle medicine and emergency evacuations. All venturers and volunteers are expected to make a donation to Raleigh International in order to take part – it's all part of the challenge. The money I raise is donated to charity, and personally I fork out for my own costs, flights and of course, all the vaccinations.'

Why Borneo?

Despite its vast wealth of natural resources, Sabah, in North Borneo, is currently the poorest of Malaysia's states. Many people there live below the poverty line, and 21% of Sabah children have never attended school.


Raleigh has been working in Sabah on a mix of community and environmental projects, to raise the quality of life of indigenous communities, and assist with marine conservation and sustainable forestry. Dr Pettit said, 'By volunteering in Borneo I'm going to be living and working among rural communities on projects to improve health and educational services, helping to make a genuine difference.
