# Bridges – light at the end of the tunnel?

After months of little or no information being forthcoming from Network Rail regarding reopening dates for the Fosse Bridge and Badminton Overbridge it would appear that 18 April has been set to finally resolve this whole sorry saga of delay.

After tremendous pressure by Wiltshire Council via John Thomson the cabinet member responsible for Highways and local parish councils led by John Buckley of Luckington & Alderton Parish Council Network Rail are at last communicating with weekly reports as to progress on completing the new bridges which are now running over three months behind schedule.

The new date of 17 April is still a fair way off and in the meantime local businesses continue to suffer loss of trade whilst residents have lengthy diversions to follow often on very damaged minor roads costing them both time and extra fuel. Time will tell if the bridges are open in accordance with Network Rail's published completion date. Further delay could well

impact on Badminton Horse Trials in May and whilst those will go ahead regardless of the bridges situation there will be even greater traffic disruption and loss of local trade should Network Rail have failed to reopen the bridges by then.

# Precept 2014/5

Following last month's article the parish council has now set the precept for the next financial year in the increased sum of £25,747 from the present £22,400. The precept will be included in individual council tax payers' bills issued by Wiltshire Council towards the end of March. The precept element for a Band D council tax charge will increase from £31.42 to £36.46 pa.



### Tetbury Art Society's Roy Baker Memorial Lecture



On Tuesday 18 March, we have the next annual public lecture to be held at The Orchard Room, Highgrove House by kind permission of TRH The Prince of Wales and the Duchess of Cornwall. The Prince of Wales is President of the Society.

This year's lecture is based on the art of the silversmith and particularly the work of the Hart family from Chipping Campden, gold and silversmiths. The workshop is the last operating remnant of the Guild of Handicraft\* which C R Ashbee established in 1888. George Hart was a silversmith with the Guild when it moved to Chipping Campden in 1902. From 1912 he took on the running of the workshop, joined in 1930 by his son Henry. This tradition is now carried on by his grandson David, along with Derek Elliott, and William and Julian Hart.

We will hear more on the background history, the design and making of private commissions and presentational ware and the Hart Silversmiths Trust, by David and Trish Hart. We hope to have some examples of their work on display. All will be illustrated with a PowerPoint display.

\*Frank Hatt, our resident playwright, wrote a play about the Guild and had the following to say when he heard of the lecture.

'When I learned that this year's Roy Baker Lecture was to feature the Hart family of Chipping Campden, it brought back a bundle of happy memories. In 2002 my play, Against the Grain, toured several venues in Gloucestershire as part of a celebration of the Guild of Handicraft's migration from London's East End to Chipping Campden in the North Cotswolds. It was a community play, involving over 30 actors and a choir numbering almost as many. The director was Jo Bousfield of the (sadly defunct) Dr Fosters Theatre Company. Besides her and myself, there was a fully professional production team, but nearly all of the performers were amateurs. Among them, to my delight, were four members of the Hart family, whose forebear, George Hart, was one of the original band of craftsmen who settled in Chipping Campden in 1902. The family embody a rich and vibrant tradition. It's an inspired choice for the 2014 lecture.'





# Ofcom seeks volunteers to help analyse the state of 'Digital Britain'

Ofcom – the UK's communications regulator – is looking at how well Digital Britain is working and is inviting broadband users across the UK to have their internet connections analysed as part of this project. Ofcom has appointed Bath-based company, Actual Experience, to perform this analysis.

Broadband connectivity and speed (or lack of it) in rural areas is an important issue with an emerging 'digital divide' between faster internet speeds in cities and large towns and slow speeds in villages, hamlets and farms. The more people from rural areas who sign up for this project, the greater the insight Ofcom will have into the state of broadband in those areas.

Signing up only takes a few minutes and you'll be asked to install a small program that will take regular measurements of your internet connection while your computer is switched on. It does not monitor anything that you do on your computer, nor anything that you do on the internet. You'll also get access to a dashboard that will show you how well your broadband is performing throughout the day.

# Making a clean sweep for safety

Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service is reminding local householders to make sure that their chimneys are fire-safe.

Winter is now upon us so to keep yourself and your family safe from fire, you should take care to have your chimney swept regularly depending on what fuel you burn. If the worst should happen, a smoke alarm can give you the extra time you need to escape in a house fire – make sure you test yours regularly.

Regular maintenance of your chimney will depend on the fuel you burn:

- Smokeless coals: at least once a year
- Wood: up to four times a year
- Bituminous coal: twice a year
- Oil: once a year
- Gas: once a year

If you have a real fire, you should always:

- use a fireguard to protect against flying sparks from hot embers;
- make sure embers are properly put out before you go to bed; and
- keep chimneys and flues clean and well maintained.

Properties with thatched roofs are particularly vulnerable in the event of a chimney fire. Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service has developed a thatch information pack for householders, which includes a range of advice on making chimneys as safe as possible. ## Flooding

People are advised to continue to drive safely as recent heavy rainfall has caused a build-up of surface water and rivers to burst their banks, flooding roads and properties across the county.

Teams from Wiltshire Council are already out in force, dealing with flooded roads and properties. People who see a blocked road are being asked to report it, although it may take some time for the team to reach minor roads.

If people wish to report a highway issue, they can call Clarence on 0800 232323. The latest road closures and issues are on the Emergency Notice page of the Wiltshire Council website. Updates on road conditions are given through the council's @ WiltshireWinter twitter account. People can follow this for up-to-date information during any adverse weather.

Details of flooding issues can be found on the Environment Agency website.

There is also a Public Health England leaflet which contains guidance on flooding.

Advice regarding sandbags is available on the Wiltshire Council website.

# Walk on the wild side

#### New developments...

Over the past couple of years a number of people have expressed an interest in knowing more about our local nature – the trees, flowers, bees, birds – and how to learn more. This got me thinking about how to help people learn about our fantastic local nature in a fun and interesting way using local expertise and ensure that children have a great opportunity to really get involved. Wild Sherston is the

result and is planned for 16 to 18 May when there will be a weekend of talks, walks, hands-on sessions for children and maybe the odd very small celebrity (maybe).

The programme is still just being finalised but it will be something like:

Friday 16 May: speaker in the evening on a wildlife topic of general interest.

Saturday 17 May: lots of activity in the village hall and church, with six/seven talks on subjects such as identifying local birds, bats, butterflies, flowers and what to do if you find an injured animal or bird. A number of local and national societies will have stands and lots of experts including Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, Butterfly Conservation, Avon Valley River Trust, a wildlife refuge, British Trust for Ornithology, Forest School and the RSPB. There will be a programme of activities for children and maybe some wild animals to see.

Sunday 18 May: a number of walks around the village some focused on particular topics, such as wild flowers, butterflies and birds, as well as a nature trail for children.

The request for help building nest boxes will result in an outbreak of new homes in February but, given their size, they won't need planning permission! A number of people, as well as the Scouts, are building a variety of boxes including some for barn owls, little owls and house sparrows. The owl boxes will be put up in local trees and barns (if we can use one) and the house sparrows, who have communal nests, will have new housing in the centre of the village. Next month should see some pictures of people up ladders trying to attach heavy bits of DIY to trees!

Finally, a picture of a local resident which you don't often see this close – if you do see a sparrowhawk it's often just a blur.

# Are you a carer?

This month I am writing again about the role of carers. Did you know that it is estimated that more than 10% of the UK population are carers? That's almost two million people in the 2001 census. It's thought that many more people out there are also carers, but do not see themselves as having that role.

'In sickness and in health' is part of the marriage service and many people feel that their caring role within the marriage is just part of the marriage. This may be the way you feel, but your role is recognised by the authorities, which feel that all carers should be recognised for their important role – no matter what the circumstances.

Defining a carer is difficult as 'caring' can take many forms. Basically, a carer 'is someone who, without payment, provides help and support to a partner, child, relative, friend or neighbour who could not manage without their help. This could be due to age, physical or mental illness, substance misuse, eating disorder or disability' (Carer Support Wiltshire definition). Caring can take many forms, including helping with personal things, such as getting someone dressed, helping them move about or giving medicine or helping around the home with shopping, laundry, cleaning and cooking. A carer may also help and support by filling in forms or managing money.

For people of working age, the Carer's Allowance is the main benefit for carers. If you look after someone who gets a disability benefit, for at least 35 hours each week, you could qualify. Carer's Credit is available to people who provide care for a disabled person for 20 hours or more each week, where they do not currently receive the Carer's Allowance. It is a National Insurance credit that helps carers build

up qualifying years for the basic State Pension and additional State Pension.

Finance and money are often a concern. Take the opportunity to have a benefits check to make sure you are claiming everything that either you or the person you care for are entitled to: Personal Independence Allowance or Attendance Allowance, Carer's Allowance or Carer's Credit for the carer, council tax discounts and discounts on fuel bills if you receive certain benefits.

For carers who are of pensionable age, the Carer's Allowance is not payable, but there are one-off benefits that you may be entitled to. Contact me for more details.

A carer's assessment is a way of identifying your needs as a carer. It looks at your role and how being a carer affects you; how much Caring you can realistically do and what extra help you may need.

The Carer's Emergency Card is an initiative run by Wiltshire Council. It will identify you as a carer and, in the event of an accident or emergency, contact will be made with those you care for to ensure their safety and wellbeing. It is credit card size to fit in a wallet or purse.

Carers are entitled to a Carer's Library Card which entitles you to borrow books from libraries for six weeks instead of the usual three. Carers and those they care for may also apply for the Home Library Service. This service is provided by volunteers who work with you and library staff to deliver books, talking books and DVDs fortnightly or monthly to the carer's home.

# Great War centenary

This will enable as many people as possible to attend irrespective of their faith or belief. A formal road closure order from Wiltshire Council will be required and already the parish council and the church are working together to make the necessary application.

An excellent suggestion has been made by Sherton's bell ringers who propose to ring the bells on the 100th anniversary of the death of each man from the parish who fell through the conflict – 36 in all. The first man who fell was Private 10376 Algernon Daniel Neal of the 7th Service Battalion Gloucestershire Regiment on Wednesday 2 September 1914 aged 21. He was the son of Daniel Niblett Neal and Anne Neal of Willesley. It is not currently known where or how he died. The 7th Service Battalion was one of the famous Pals battalions which were raised from local catchment areas.

## Wiltshire Air Ambulance



It with great pleasure that we provide you with this news update on the future of the Wiltshire Air Ambulance helicopter.

Wiltshire Air Ambulance Charitable Trust has this year signed a 10-year contract with Heli-Charter Ltd for a new helicopter. The charity has selected a Bell 429, which is the world's newest and most advanced light twin-engine helicopter in service. This will be the first Bell 429 to operate as an air ambulance in the UK

The new helicopter will be built in Canada and fitted out with the most recent Aerolite equipment to meet the highest helicopter emergency medical service (HEMS) specification. The autumn will see a period of testing and training for the crew so that the new air ambulance is set to go live by 1 December.

The charity is confident that it will provide Wiltshire with one of the best emergency service aircraft available anywhere in the world.

Paramedics and other medical support will still be provided by South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (@swasFT), with whom the charity enjoys a close, efficient and effective working relationship.

As Wiltshire Police move to National Police Air Service, the charity will need to fund the full cost of providing the air ambulance alone, about £2.5m annually. To find out more about the new helicopter visit our website:







How to get the best from your appointment: top tips

- 1. Ask yourself: how important is it that I am seen quickly? Would I be better waiting for an appointment with a particular GP? (If you have a long-term condition, you will probably benefit from seeing a GP who knows you.)
- 2. Don't be put off by a GP who runs late. They may be spending needed time with patients. One day you may appreciate them running late for you.
- 3. It's tempting to bring a list of unrelated problems but consider what's achievable in the time available. Four problems in 10 minutes? That's just 150 seconds each. It is often better to come back again and spend more time on a problem, rather than squeeze as many as you can into one appointment.
- 4. Before you see the GP, work out in your own mind what you're worried about, and highlight any particular concerns. Consider preparing short notes, including how you would describe your symptoms.
- 5. Get to the point. Don't beat about the bush and don't keep important issues until the end.
- 6. Wear accessible clothing if you are likely to need to undress for examination.
- 7. Make sure you understand what happens next. If you are unsure ask to go through the plan again.


The club will hold its AGM on Tuesday 4 February at 7.30pm in the Rattlebone Inn, all club members and anyone interested in joining are welcome.
