2017/18 Precept

At the January meeting, the Parish Council approved the precept for 2017/8 of £37.19 for Band D, an increase of 2% on last year. The precept is the parish component of the total council tax. The increase was kept to the minimum to allow the council to break even. In view of an expected increase in inflation as a result of the devaluation of sterling, this is a very modest uplift. The net receipt to the council only increased from £26,518 to 26,966 (1.7%) because the grant from Wiltshire Council has ended. The precept is used for regular parish expenditure. Reserves for special projects are separate.

Stephen Gray

Sherston residents who have been here for some time will be sorry to hear of the death of Stephen Gray on Friday 20 January. He was eighty-five years old.

With his wife Shirley, Stephen moved to the village in 1966, and set up Grays Garage in Church Street. The garage had formerly been owned by the Graves family, so it went from Graves Garage to Grays Garage! On top of the workshop, the Grays developed the business with a retail shop, where the shoe shop is now. That part of the premises had been a Morris car show room. Stephen and Shirley became heavily involved in breakdown recovery work for national organisations such as the AA and RAC.

The couple brought up two children in the village: Paul and Sue. Paul now runs the business.

Stephen was touched by tragedy when Shirley died at the age of fifty-six early in 1990, and Sue at the age of forty-two in 2004.

Stephen left Sherston in 1993, when he retired. He moved to Congresbury, and married Jackie, who survives him.

The funeral will be on Thursday 9 February, 2.00pm, at St Andrew's Church, Station Road, Congresbury BS49 5DX, followed by burial.

Winter Pressures



Pharmacists are experts in many areas of healthcare and can also offer advice on a wide range of conditions and common illnesses such as coughs, colds and stomach upsets. GPs should always be the

first port of call for most medical problems - unless it is a serious or life-threatening emergency and then A&E is the right place to go.

Between 31 December 2016 and 8 January 2017, just over 5,000 people attended A&E departments at Royal United Hospital, Bath, Great Western Hospital in Swindon and Salisbury District Hospital, yet only 33% of those people actually needed urgent or emergency treatment.

Over the last month, people have attended A&E departments with minor ailments that are not serious or life-threatening, including:

- coughs, colds and sore throats,
- toothache,
- sickness and diarrhoea,
- excessive alcohol consumption,

- broken finger nails.

With increased pressure across the system people are also asked to:

- cancel unwanted medical appointments, so that others who need them can be seen more quickly;
- offer to drive a family member or friend home from hospital;
- keep a well-stocked medicine cabinet to be able to treat yourself at home for minor illnesses;
 and
- make sure elderly relatives are warm and have supplies in case of bad weather

Peter Jenkins, Chair of Wiltshire CCG adds: 'We need patients to take responsibility for making the right decision about where to go for healthcare advice. Every year the NHS makes the same plea to the public and every year we continue to see inappropriate A&E attendances rise. We prepare for increases in attendance over the winter, because we expect that to happen, however when patients are turning up to A&E when they don't need to be there it adds significant pressure to an already challenging situation.'



Malmesbury League of Friends donates £25,000 to Julia's House

Malmesbury League of Friends (MLOF) has made a donation of £25,000 to Julia's House, which is raising funds to complete the first children's hospice in Wiltshire.

With no children's hospice currently based in the county, local families caring for children with lifethreatening or life-limiting illnesses currently do not have access to the level of support, either at home or in a hospice, they urgently need.

Julia's House has had a children's hospice in Dorset for more than 13 years and the charity's nurses and carers have also been providing a home-care service to families in Wiltshire for three years.

The new facility in Devizes, which is on schedule to open in this spring, will be a homely, welcoming place for families to visit, but also a central base from which to operate a comprehensive, countywide service throughout Wiltshire, including the Malmesbury area. With funding required to equip and staff the new Devizes hospice, donations are still badly needed; only 5% of the total annual funding comes from government sources.

Ian Wadley, Wiltshire Fundraising Manager for Julia's House, said: 'This is a wonderfully generous donation for which we are immensely grateful. It will make a huge difference to the care we are able to provide for local children and their families. Everybody at Julia's House is sincerely thankful to MLOF'. Robin Clark, MLOF's chairman, said: 'We are delighted to support this appeal. We know of two local families who are already being helped by Julia's House dedicated staff and there will surely be more in the future.'

Julia's House is currently supporting more than 30 families with expert care in their own homes across Wiltshire. MLOF provides funds to help local people with specific medical or care needs, which are not otherwise available from other sources. Typically, it provides badly needed items of equipment for use at the Malmesbury Primary Care Centre and Athelstan House Care Home.

Walk on the wild side

Thinking of spring?

It's below zero outside but the plants and animals are starting to stir, with snowdrops in flower and some birds getting ready to nest. Herons, for example, start to breed in colonies in February and we are fortunate that there is a heronry at Lower Moor Farm near Oaksey with a great hide to watch from and there is a good chance you might see an otter or two.

February is typically the time of year when frogs breed and they will deposit a raft of spawn containing around 2,000 eggs. Frogs need to be two/three years old to breed.

National Nest Box Week is from 14 to 21 February and it's the time to clean out or install new nest boxes as many birds take a little while to select a nest box. It's important to feed your local birds over the winter especially when it's been really cold like this one. Interestingly, research has shown that if you keep your birdfeeders going through the breeding season the birds that nest nearby are much less likely to raise a brood than those further away. This is due to predators, such as jackdaws, being attracted to the food and, even if they can't get any, they hang around and raid local nests. If you do have birdfeeders please do give them a good wash in hot soapy water on a regular basis as birdfeeders have been identified as a

way of spreading infections between birds.

Our winter visitors are here in good numbers. There are some good sized flocks of redwings and fieldfares over from northern Europe and they will be off in March.


