## **Floods**

Malmesbury and the Villages Community Area Partnership (MVCAP) set up a website just before Christmas focused upon preparing and responding to flooding, prompted by serious flooding in Malmesbury and the surrounding villages. The aim of the website is to collect together local knowledge and information about what to do, who to contact, and where to go for things such as pumps, sand bags, cleaning services etc. The website can be seen at malmesburyfloodinfo.weebly.com/. It has proved very popular especially as it provides details from the Environment Agency regarding local

flood warnings and river levels.

Following the setting up of the flood info site several people suggested that there should be a Facebook group to go alongside it specifically dedicated to flooding in the area which would allow up to date information to be made available as a particular situation develops. This has now been set up and can be found at www.facebook.com/ groups/222243707910354/ Within days of going live the group's membership stood at over 200 people and it has already proved to be a very valuable tool in coordinating the local delivery of free sandbags.

# Operation Christmas Child

Pupils carry their boxes out through the school gate on Friday 16 November and walk to the British Schoolroom.

After an assembly taken by Reverend Phil Daniels the entire primary school plus staff and parents then settled down to watch a three minute DVD of the toy-filled shoeboxes being joyfully opened in a variety of the 104 countries in which they are now annually received. By January 2013 'Operation Christmas Child' – now one of the largest Global Children's Charities – expects to have sent more than 100 Million shoebox gifts since it was founded in Wrexham in 1990.

Supplemented by deliveries from Luckington Playgroup, Westonbirt School and Rosehill School, plus many individuals, over 300 colourful boxes were eventually awaiting transportation from the British Schoolroom to Melksham Warehouse (via a checking/packing centre at Chippenham United Reform Church). He was finally laid to rest in Westminster Abbey.

Lynda kept us amused with tales of Victorian customs and recipes of those times. Vast quantities of food were eaten by the better off at Christmas. Large turkeys were often taken to the local baker to be cooked. Shops were open late even on Christmas Day.

# Telling Tales 2 - Exhibition by Bath Textile Artists

The 11 members of the group have chosen 'Telling Tales' as their theme, and have interpreted it in as many different ways.

These range from looking at the symbols that our ancestors used to write down their own stories and using these as pattern and design shapes, to the inspiration derived from a found collection of old postcards. Two members have delved into children's stories and their rich imagery, another into stone circles and their mystical meanings. Another has taken the journey of fleece to fabric as a theme and others have been inspired by the City of Bristol itself – its rich history from Cabot's Matthew to today's vibrant cultural dockside. The patterns of footpaths crossing the landscape, the story of seeds and their distribution, the narratives which clothes hold within them – all of these themes have yielded surprising personal interpretations.

The members of this lively group work in colour and texture, fibre and fabric, exploring the vast field which is textile art today. Felt-making, hand and machine embroidery, weaving, painting on fabric, and work in two and three dimensions are all included. Anyone visiting this exhibition is sure to be entranced by its variety and quality – make sure not to miss it.

## Emergency planning

Following the recent floods thought is being given to how the parish can best cope should a local emergency situation occur. This wouldn't just cover flooding but could include heavy snow and very serious road accidents. To assist in this process Wiltshire Council has set up a special emergency planning exercise on Wednesday 30 January which covers the Malmesbury community area.

The exercise will begin at 7.30pm and end at 9.00pm. This will provide an opportunity for residents of the parish who would like to help out in a crisis situation to get together in the parish in a venue which has easy access to a telephone or good mobile coverage. The exercise is a paper one and will consist of a series of envelopes (which will be sent in advance) containing a developing scenario that the group will be asked to open at specified times. Response to the issues can then be phoned through to a member of the Wiltshire Council emergency planning team.

The whole purpose is to learn throughout the scenario and reflect at the end what we need to do in future. This could be the opportunity to help produce an emergency plan for the parish.






Full audience participation was encouraged and the upbeat songs and great dancing put a modern twist on the traditional pantomime.

# Walk on the wild side by Geoff Carrs

#### Wild side resolutions

With 2013 just starting, it's a great time to think about New Year resolutions. While it's easy to think of many resolutions for yourself (must get fit, go on a diet, grow more hair etc.) how about one or two to help local wildlife, and may help you get a bit fitter, such as:

- Taking your children/grandchildren out walking (or even just watching your bird feeders) and have a little competition as to how many different birds they can identify. There are lots of easy to use guides from the RSPB and Wiltshire Wildlife Trust - some simple identification cards or guides you can download.
- Ask your local school if they would be interested in Wiltshire Wildlife Trust visiting to run a workshop.
- For adults, how about getting a copy of the Sherston Walks Guide (available from the Post Office) and walk some of the footpaths? Take your time, ideally with some binoculars, and it's amazing what you can see deer, foxes, hares, kestrels, little egrets, lapwings, badgers (maybe not at this time of year), kingfishers etc.
- Visit some of the great local wildlife reserves easy to find on the web. Maybe even help out as a volunteer at the Cotswold Water Park.
- Keep your bird feeders topped up and, when it's freezing, make sure there is water available for the birds.

2012 was a very mixed year for local wildlife primarily due to the very wet late spring, summer and autumn. This resulted in some quite odd sightings such as a young hedgehog being found wandering around the village in late November. Luckily it was taken in, fed and given to a local wildlife rescue centre to keep over the winter and build its strength. On a personal note both writing this column together with my blog (sherstonwildlife.wordpress.com) has made me take time to better understand the fantastic wildlife we have almost literally on our doorstep.

Looking forward to 2013 is really exciting. Hopefully the spring and summer will be warmer and drier to encourage all the birds and insects which didn't thrive in 2012. A number of scarce birds and animals were seen in or around the village including red kites and otters and, with good weather many of the butterflies and insect-eating birds will make a great recovery.


# Neighbourhood Plan

Sherston Parish Council has decided to develop a Neighbourhood Plan which will provide a legal basis for residents to determine the future of our community over the next twenty to thirty years. The project is led by Sherston Parish Council which oversees a steering group which includes local councillors, residents, and other local community interest groups. The Sherston Neighbourhood Plan will cover the whole administrative area of Sherston Parish Council (see Map).

The Steering Group has been working on the plan since about February 2012.

A Neighbourhood Plan Workshop was held on 17th July 2012, to which all of the village was invited, the purpose of which was to give local residents the opportunity to comment on and set out their views, concerns and establish their own aspirations for the village and to suggest how these hopes and issues can be met. A copy of the Workshop Report is available for you to have a look should you wish to do so at on the Parish Council's web site - www.sherston.org.uk

Following on from that Workshop, the Steering Group has now produced a list of aspirations and a series of objectives that it is hoped the Neighbourhood Plan will tackle in due course. These are:

### Objective 1:

The Plan will support the provision of facilities considered important for a vibrant community by:

- Protecting those facilities already in place;
- Supporting the provision of a new enhanced GP surgery;
- Facilitating the provision of additional facilities for the elderly, pre-school, and young people living within the village.

### Objective 2:

The Plan will ensure that all future development in the village:

- Respects the high quality of the local environment by employing the use of building materials in sympathy with the Cotswold AONB;
- Is of the highest quality of design, utilising wherever possible traditional styles and proportions;
- Safeguards those parts of the settlement that have been identified as being worthy of protection from development because of their landscape quality, ecological importance or local significance.

### Objective 3:

The Plan will facilitate opportunities for new and existing businesses and social enterprise that benefit the community and support the delivery of advanced

fibre connectivity to all parts of the village by:

- Supporting the creation of new business premises in appropriate locations;
- Resisting the change of use of existing business premises to alternative uses (except where there is a clear benefit to the community from allowing such);
- Encouraging the approved provider of high speed broadband to install advanced connections to the network throughout the village.

### Objective 4:

The Plan will provide for a limited amount of housing to meet an identified local need. It will do this through:

- Allowing small scale development in selected locations, to include houses for sale on the open market, affordable social rented and shared equity housing, and sheltered elderly persons accommodation;
- Ensuring that all such development includes a mix of house types capable of meeting the identified local need;
- Considering the redevelopment of existing brown field development opportunities first;
- Supporting the provision of a replacement dwelling for the local vicar in an appropriate location.



### Objective 5:

The Plan will seek to provide for the existing and future leisure, recreational, sporting, community and social needs of the village by:

- Ensuring that certain existing important open land and other green spaces within and adjoining the village are retained and/or enhanced, or that suitable replacement facilities are provided as part of any agreed redevelopment proposals;
- Ensuring that sufficient additional areas of open space are created within all new developments;
- Identifying and securing a site for the provision of additional burials within the village;
- Ensuring that existing sports and leisure facilities are retained and wherever possible enhanced.
- Supporting the provision of new build sports, leisure and recreational facilities in and around the village in appropriate locations.

### Objective 6:

The Plan will facilitate measures for managing traffic in and around the village by:

- Ensuring that sufficient on site parking is provided in all new developments sufficient to meet current and likely future car ownership and use;
- Encouraging measures which lead to a reduction in traffic volumes, movement and speed throughout the village and provide safer journeys for both pedestrians and motorists alike.
- Encouraging greater use of public transport, cycling and walking.

### Objective 7:

The Plan will encourage the sympathetic management of the countryside surrounding the village so as to retain and/or enhance it's high quality, improve biodiversity and provide other longer term benefits to the local community by:

- Considering the creation of a community garden and/or orchard;
- Identifying and safeguarding any sites identified in the locality that are considered to be of significant ecological or landscape quality.

### Objective 8:

The Plan will encourage a move towards a low carbon economy which includes local food production and the generation of renewable energy by:

- Identifying and allocating additional land within the plan area for allotments;
- Encouraging the introduction of appropriate alternative energy sources (specifically solar, wood fuel, ground and air source heat systems) for use within existing and all new development within and around the village.

## What next?

The next step in the plan making process is to consider how, where and what forms of development would be appropriate within the Neighbourhood Plan area (in an attempt to meet some or all of these defined objectives), or indeed to identify those parts of the plan area which it is considered necessary to protect from development.

This is what Sherston village looks like now



### What will it look like in 30 years time?

The steering group is beginning to discuss the geography of a future Sherston taking into account these aspirations and objectives. But we need your help to achieve this.


The steering group needs to hear the views of local residents and other interested parties to ensure that whatever decisions are made take into account the views of the entire community.

So, before taking this discussion any further, we plan to arrange an event to which everybody will be invited in early February to give them the opportunity to see the work completed so far and to help determine the range of options to be considered.

Separate discussions will in the meantime be held with various interest groups and, more specifically, with the young (primarily via the Scout Group), the elderly (primarily via the Seniors Club and Probus) and other specific interest groups (e.g. the W.I.) with a view to canvassing the opinion of as many interested parties as possible.

Further meetings and exhibitions will be held over the coming months as the plan progresses. The current intention is to try to get a draft plan ready for submission to Wiltshire Council in the spring. Once submitted to Wiltshire Council it has to be the subject of a six week formal consultation period after which it has to be considered by an independent inspector who will be tasked with determining whether the plan as submitted is in conformity with national and local planning policy and meets all of the necessary environmental criteria. Only then, if considered acceptable, will the plan be put to a community referendum, it being the residents of Sherston that will have to decide whether to accept and adopt the plan for the purpose of determining future planning applications etc throughout the neighbourhood plan area.




themed to match that of the event, and pre-Ball parties abounded. And they were not to be disappointed!






