Add in some hula-hoop workshops, a circus skills tent, samba drumming, build your own pizza, crafts and creativity and even belly dancing and it was a pretty full programme!

One of the nicest aspects of the weekend is the involvement of pretty much all generations of the village. There was the seniors' preview with free tea, cakes and entertainment for the village's senior citizens. At the other end of the spectrum, the school's

played to a packed audience on the main stage followed by some great bands for everyone else in between.

Sherston wins Gold for its community spirit

The strength of our village community received national recognition in June when the Friends of Sherston School (FSS) received a gold award in a prestigious competition for the 'Pop Up Village' event.

Kirsty Strachan, who came up with the innovative idea as part of a fundraising brainstorm with the FSS, was amazed at how it caught people's imaginations last September. Over 50 people from the community

took up the invitation to run a POP, and raised an amazing £4,000, with £2,000 going to the school to pay for a shed full of playtime toys.

And of course it wasn't only a Sherston first, but a world first! This was recognised by PTA-UK, the


national charity supporting Parent Teacher Associations, which holds a competition every year to reward PTAs for their work. The POP event was named the South of England winner in the Community Links category, and FSS went through to the UK final.

Sherston's FSS was, quite rightly, pipped to the post for the national award by an amazing PTA that set up a holiday club for disabled children. But there was just one point between us, and FSS was one of only two PTAs to be 'highly commended'. We were given an additional £150 in prize money, bringing our total win to £650 – and every penny will benefit the children at Sherston School.

This national achievement was only made possible because we live in a village which came together to support the children growing up here. So this award is a huge 'thank you' to you all.

I would like to use this small article to reassure you that Wiltshire Police are patrolling your village, along with myself, Pcso Durry Maule and supporting units. We make it a priority to attend the village of Sherston as much as possible and continue to patrol in cars and carry out regular foot patrols.

We have, I'm afraid to mention and as many of you know, been targeted again with shed break-ins and catalytic converter thefts. This appears to be a regional trend with all surrounding counties suffering the same sort of crime. Please continue to lock all items away with regards to the shed breaks and stay vigilant with regards to suspicious vehicles or persons in the area. I would like to use this opportunity to remind everyone that there is a summer drink-drive campaign being conducted by Wiltshire Police and this will involve roadside breath tests being carried out in Sherston and surrounding areas.

Drink-driving in the rural areas is still a problem so if you are concerned with regards to people you know doing this, please drop me a line. I am happy to speak to the drivers concerned (discreetly). Being caught drink-driving is a life-changing experience and I have found and believe that speaking with suspected drivers and warning them they are likely to be targeted results in a much more positive outcome for all parties concerned. I understand that people drink and drive for all sorts of reasons, eg they live too far from their pub, they are having working lunches, they are stressed at home or their football team has just lost on penalties again, the list is endless. There is however no valid excuse and I would rather intervene with the people concerned early to prevent a lifechanging situation.

Highlighting a messy problem



One of the few things that provokes a consistent and strong response from the village is the issue of dog fouling. There are a number of areas in Sherston that are particularly badly affected, including the footpaths running between the Tartars and Easton Town Farm and between Sandpits Lane and Manor Close. However, all the pavements and roads in the village, including the High Street, can be affected.

During the months of May and June a few members of the parish council regularly patrolled the village and 'highlighted' any dog mess with fluorescent yellow spray paint. During this two-month period some areas noticeably improved, while it was clear that bad weather resulted in an increase in dog owners failing to pick up after their pets. It was also obvious from studying the individual piles (we took our patrols very seriously) that on the two footpaths particularly badly affected it was the result of one or two dog owners who persistently never pick up after their pet. One daily walk produces one unpleasant pile, which soon becomes a major problem when that owner uses the same narrow footpath day after day.

We did meet many dog owners on our patrols who were picking up after pets, which was great, and it is disappointing that the majority of responsible dog owners in the village are implicated in the bad behaviour of one or two individuals. The parish council will write to dog owners who are failing to pick up after their pet, but the difficulty is identifying the culprits. We need villagers to let us know who these individuals are so that we can contact them in the first instance, or ask the Dog Warden to follow up.

Wiltshire Council have introduced an 'Any council litter bin will do' campaign, which means that any public litter bin, even if it is not specifically for dog mess, can be used to dispose of bagged dog mess, so there is no excuse not to pick up after a dog and dispose of the bag in an appropriate bin.

We subsequently suffered further leaks due to the increase in pressure and had to have the leaky pipe excavated in the surgery while patients were being tended to. We apologise for any inconvenience

to our patients. But we must also pay tribute to our staff who valiantly carried on through the drilling, with the associated noise and dust, to keep the surgery working throughout.

There will be further works to make good all the damage and re-carpet the affected areas. We will try to do as much of this as possible outside surgery hours.

Road Closures Norton to Hullavington C1

Thursday 10 July between 9.30am and 3.30pm: Road closed at the railway bridge between Norton and Hullavington to enable Network Rail to carry out a bridge inspection. The alternative route suggested is: Via C1 Norton Road (unaffected length) – C27 towards Sherston – C86 Fosseway – C86 Alderton Road – C72 The Street, Grittleton – C33 The Street, Hullavington – C1 Norton Road (unaffected length) and vice versa. The closure will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

Boules Day Car Parking: 12 July

Boules Day is fast approaching and so here is a reminder of the parking arrangements as per last year:

The recreation ground will be available to residents (with permits) who have been asked to move their cars from the High Street and the diversionary roads. Stall holders with permits and disabled visitors may also park on the recreation ground.

Permits will be issued to residents nearer the time. The ATC will be managing the car parks as usual so please display your permits clearly.

The High Street is officially closed until 9.00pm.

The sports field at Knockdown Road and Stretchline at Brook Hill will be available for visitors' / teams' car parking.

Walk on the wild side -Our river of life

We are so very fortunate in Sherston to have not just one but one and half rivers (if you count the two streams that have a confluence near Stretchline as half...) and they provide so many important elements to our local wildlife. Not only does the river have habitats for animals and plants that depend on water such as crayfish and willows and herons and kingfishers, but the fact that we have a water table which is just below the surface means we have verdant plant growth around us.

Like many ecosystems the river, with the right management, can recover from all kinds of problems such as the major pollution the Sherston Avon suffered from in 1998.

Rivers can be an enormous resource and it's something we should really look after - while we may enjoy the benefit of a vibrant and healthy river system, the people downstream also appreciate it. Wouldn't it be great if we had otters around the village!

And to illustrate how wildlife can re-generate the picture shows a dead trout I found about 20 yards away from the river - and the round thing beneath the fish is a pound coin! I suspect a heron had caught it and it was so big it couldn't swallow it (I should have taken it home

This year, so far, has been fantastic for nature. The warm late spring and summer has allowed birds to raise large broods and insects to breed at a fantastic rate. While we don't always appreciate the insects, the birds do. If you happen to go down to Grove Wood you may see large mixed flock of blue tits, long-tailed tits, great tits and even march tits - what a fantastic sight.

Finally a date for the diary - WildSherston in 2015 will be on the 16 May. The village hall booked - just a few logistics to sort out now! If you have any ideas or suggestions, or want to help please let me know.

Mythical Maze Summer Reading Challenge from 12 July in Wiltshire libraries

This year the national Summer Reading Challenge for four to 11 year olds will run in Wiltshire libraries from 12 July to 6 September, and the theme will be 'Mythical Maze'. The challenge is simple, for children to read six books over the summer, tell us about the books and collect 'rewards' to mark their progress. Incentives this year include a neon green wristband, scratch and sniff stickers, and a medal plus certificate on completion.

Mythical Maze is not a competition, but a fun personal challenge to encourage children to read more and use libraries more. Last year 9,330 Wiltshire children joined the challenge, with 5,803 reading all six books and 38,441 books being read in total. Families love the challenge and last year 96% of the participants said that by taking part in the challenge their reading had improved a little or a lot.

Children's reading can 'dip' during the long summer holidays, and The Reading Agency's annual Summer Reading Challenge helps get 750,000 children into libraries to maintain their reading skills and confidence. It's free, it's fun and it really can make a difference to a child's love of reading - because everything changes when we read.

Funding Awards for Young Musicians

Applications are currently being accepted for the Awards for Young Musicians scheme. Grants of between £200 and £2,000 are available to give talented five- to 17-year-olds the opportunity to experience high-quality music tuition or contribute towards their musical life.

Applicants will need to show evidence of financial need; have ideally achieved a distinction in their last music exam or, if they haven't taken exams, show evidence of this level of ability; and be recommended by their music teacher.


