Sherston School – a Sporting Success story!

It has been a summer of sporting success at the village primary school.

The cricket team, some of whom also play for the U11s at Sherston Magna Cricket Club, has won the Malmesbury Primary Schools Kwik Cricket tournament for the third year in a row, beating 12 other schools. Coached by Nick Bowditch, the school's headteacher, they now go on to the county finals in Trowbridge, where a win would be a fitting farewell to Nick who retires in July after an impressive 24 years of leadership.



Meanwhile, there have been individual success stories this month from James Hulme, Willa Gibb, Alex Laddle and Maisie Laddle.

James represented Great Britain in the World Series Biathle competition in Pisa, where he ran in the lunchtime heat. He came 4th out of 108 athletes in the U15 event, no small achievement.

Willa Gibb won the county U13 High Jump competition at Tidworth, competing against girls two years her senior. She also won the silver medal in the U13 70 metre hurdles.

Alex and Maisie Laddle were chosen to represent Avon County and won their regional athletics competition.

The school does its utmost to encourage emerging sporting talent, with its own gymnastics team, hockey, rugby and running clubs. The successful football and netball teams were both victorious in the Small Schools Tournament held in Seagry in May.

Tennis, fencing and Kwik cricket are on offer as afterschool clubs with private providers at a reasonable cost. The tennis players, coached by Dawn Riley in the

school hall and on the village courts, won the Mid-Wiltshire area tournament, also in May, and go through to the county final in Marlborough in July.

Sherston school sports day, held in June, is far more about working together to win, than



individual success, as each child who wins gains points for their team colour. This year the Yellow team came first. The Friends of Sherston School ran a successful raffle as part of its efforts to raise £10,000 to extend the fitness trail equipment on the school field, and make it a complete circuit, just like the equipment on the rec which is much used and loved by village children. Our aim is to keep them as active as possible at break time! Thank you to all the local businesses who donated prizes; Sherston Post Office and Stores, Tucks, Apples and Pairs, Whatley Manor, The Carpenters Arms, The Angel, and the science centre, @Bristol. We made nearly £300!



FSS Olympic Day took place on Sunday 14 June, transforming the rec into a sea of mini sports events. It aims to give as many primary school children as possible a taste of real competition, as the three highest scorers in each age group win a gold, silver or bronze medal. This year around 120 children had the chance to try a mini version of 'real' sports, including the sprint, hurdles and long jump. Many thanks to the huge number of parents who gave up their time to cut the grass, mark out the events, and run the day, and to Jason at the Rattlebone for his support with the refreshments. The small organising team of dads and mums is really proud that Olympic Day, which was started to celebrate London 2012, has successfully completed its fourth year. So here's to Rio 2016, and keeping the legacy of the Olympics alive at Sherston School!

Walk on the wild side Project SHRIMP

One of the key goals of the WildSherston event held last May was to create a project to improve our local natural environment. One of the organisations that attended WildSherston was the Bristol and Avon River Trust (BART). BART is a community-led organisation that aims to deliver education, land- and river-based management advice and practical river restoration work across the Bristol Avon Catchment. You can find out more about them on their website – www.bristolavonriverstrust.org. BART is only a small charity but it has already successfully completed several habitat enhancement and river restoration projects and is really keen to encourage people to develop a sense of ownership of our waterways by working with communities on stretches of their local rivers.

Over the past few months we have been in discussion with BART, together with some local landowners, about project(s) to improve our part of the Avon. Harriet Alvis, who you may remember used to live in the village, is now the Project Officer for BART. Harriet is a biologist, first inspired to work on rivers by seeing the Environment Agency sampling down at Forlorn, and is excited to be part of a project to improve the river in the village!

The SHRIMP project (SHerston River IMProvement) will work with local volunteers with the aim of improving a popular section of river close to the village, running at the foot of Grove Wood, and

will also be creating a wildflower meadow. We are able to do this thanks to grants from Wessex Water, the People's Postcode Lottery, and money raised from the WildSherston event last year and the local farmers.

The river already supports small populations of fish such as brown trout and bullhead. However, low flows, particularly during the summer, are insufficient to deal with sediment deposited after the higher flows following heavy rainfall. This sediment has resulted in gravels being smothered, conditions detrimental to spawning trout and to habitats for invertebrates.

The project will succeed if local people want to help restore the river banks and help make improvements to the river for the benefit of both people and wildlife. We have already seen evidence of otters, kingfishers and water voles in the area and the work will help secure their future. (It was Harriet who first spotted the otter spraint that prompted us to put cameras in the river.)

We will be at the Boules Festival talking about our project as well as trying to raise some funds and hoping to find people who wish to sponsor their own wildflower plug patch which will help create a community wildflower meadow. You can donate on the day or through our website (www.bristolavonriverstrust.org) if this is easier.

SHRIMP will need a number of volunteers to complete both the in-stream river improvements and the wildflower meadow. Neighbourhood Watch and Sherston Thefts

As many of you will know there have been a spait of thefts in Sherston, mainly from sheds and gardens, although there was also a burglary from a house.

This is just a reminder to be extra careful when looking after your possessions. A few tips.

Make sure you have plenty of outside lights. These are very cheap now and with the economy bulbs they do not use a lot of electricity- only a few pence if left on for hours. Although they can sometimes be destroyed by the thieves they are a deterrent.

Put a curtain up at the windows of outside sheds. Ikea have some very cheap ones that let daylight through and then thieves cannot look in and see tools.

Put padlocks on gates to back entrances. These are easy to cut but again they are a deterrent. If you do not want to carry an extra key a number combination can be used, usually a very simple number which you can remember.

It is a shame that in a village like Sherston we can no longer leaves doors and cars open, but it is now a fact that we have to be extra careful. If you are old or fairly immobile and need to let neighbours have access to your house in case you need them there are little security boxes that can be put on the outside of he house with a key inside. These can only be accessed by anybody who knows the code. Also leave a key with a neighbour in case it is necessary for somebody who does not know the code to get to you. A lot of people gave me their details for my Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. At present there are quite a few new people in the village who may not have been here when this was done. If you are not on this scheme please let me have your details so that I can include you.



Consideration for the Cliff

Soon it will be summer and many people will want to spend time on the Cliff, however access to the Cliff is a privilege but not a right. It is not public land, and we are grateful that the current landowner allows this access, but we must treat the Cliff with care and consideration and ensure that the surrounding fields are treated with respect because continued misuse may result in the loss of the Cliff as an area we all have the chance to enjoy.

A limited number of people using the Cliff are not being considerate and leaving rubbish, such as cans and glass bottles, lighting fires and not clearing up their dogs' poo.

Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections, so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly – 'bag it and bin it'. Make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people. More than this, though, is that many of the fields that are regularly used by the community are actually not public access and used to grow hay and silage, so rubbish and dog poo badly affect the quality of this feed.



NOT TO BE USED BY THE PUBLIC

PERMITTED PUBLIC USE

It is clear that some owners release their dogs from their leads, once on the Cliff, and allow the dogs to roam freely, making no attempt to control either their behaviour or pick up their poo.

It is not acceptable to light fires or have a BBQ on any area of the Cliff or surrounding fields and any incidents of fires or BBQs are likely to make the owner reconsider their agreement for permitted access to the Cliff.

You are encouraged to only use the area highlighted in light grey in the map : the field running from the gate on Sopworth Lane to the Gate at the bottom of Brook Hill, opposite Stretchline, and the banks of the Avon at the bottom. The areas in dark

grey and hatched are fields that are not to be used by the public and are used to grow hay and silage or to graze livestock and in these areas only the public footpaths can be used (Sherston 21 and 22).

When on a footpath it is not acceptable to wander off the path, particularly into the wider field. Please remember to keep to the path, leave no rubbish and pick up after your dog. There are bins at each of the gates to the Cliff, so please use them for rubbish and bagged dog poo.

Please read and follow the Countryside Code: reproduced overleaf. New signs will be placed on the usual entrances to the Cliff encouraging users to use the land appropriately.

The Countryside Code

Respect other people

Consider the local community and other people enjoying the outdoors

- Respect the needs of local people and visitors alike for example, don't block gateways, driveways or other paths with your vehicle.
- When riding a bike or driving a vehicle, slow down or stop for horses, walkers and farm animals and give them plenty of room. By law, cyclists must give way to walkers and horse–riders on bridleways.
- Co-operate with people at work in the countryside. For example, keep out of the way when farm animals are being gathered or moved and follow directions from the farmer.
- Busy traffic on small country roads can be unpleasant and dangerous to local people, visitors and wildlife so slow down and where possible, leave your vehicle at home, consider sharing lifts and use alternatives such as public transport or cycling. For public transport information, phone Traveline on 0871 200 22 33 or visit Traveline.

Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths unless wider access is available

- A farmer will normally close gates to keep farm animals in, but may sometimes leave them open so the animals can reach food and water. Leave gates as you find them or follow instructions on signs. When in a group, make sure the last person knows how to leave the gates.
- Follow paths unless wider access is available, such as on open country or registered common land (known as "Open Access" land).
- If you think a sign is illegal or misleading such as a 'Private No Entry' sign on a public path, contact the local authority.
- Leave machinery and farm animals alone don't interfere with animals even if you think they're in distress. Try to alert the farmer instead.
- Use gates, stiles or gaps in field boundaries if you can climbing over walls, hedges and fences can damage them and increase the risk of farm animals escaping.
- Our heritage matters to all of us be careful not to disturb ruins and historic sites.

Protect the natural environment

Leave no trace of your visit and take your litter home

- Protecting the natural environment means taking special care not to damage, destroy or remove features such as rocks, plants and trees. They provide homes and food for wildlife, and add to everybody's enjoyment of the countryside.
- Litter and leftover food doesn't just spoil the beauty of the countryside, it can be dangerous to wildlife and farm animals so take your litter home with you.

Dropping litter and dumping rubbish are criminal offences.

• Fires can be as devastating to wildlife and habitats as they are to people and property – so be careful with naked flames and cigarettes at any time of the year. Sometimes, controlled fires are used to manage vegetation, particularly on heaths and moors between 1st October and 15th April, but if a fire appears to be unattended then report it by calling 999.

Keep dogs under effective control

• When you take your dog into the outdoors, always ensure it does not disturb wildlife, farm animals, horses or other people by keeping it under effective control. This means that you:

Keep your dog on a lead, or

keep it in sight at all times, be aware of what it's doing and be confident it will return to you. promptly on command.

Ensure it does not stray off the path or area where you have a right of access.

• Special dog rules may apply in particular situations, so always look out for local signs. For example:

Dogs may be banned from certain areas that people use, or there may be restrictions, byelaws or control orders limiting where they can go.

The access rights that normally apply to open country and registered common land (known as 'Open Access' land) require dogs to be kept on a short lead between 1 March and 31 July, to help protect ground nesting birds, and all year round near farm animals.

At the coast, there may also be some local restrictions to require dogs to be kept on a short lead during the bird breeding season, and to prevent disturbance to flocks of resting and feeding birds during other times of year.

- It's always good practice (and a legal requirement on 'Open Access' land) to keep your dog on a lead around farm animals and horses, for your own safety and for the welfare of the animals. A farmer may shoot a dog which is attacking or chasing farm animals without being liable to compensate the dog's owner. Further information.
- However, if cattle or horses chase you and your dog, it is safer to let your dog off the lead don't risk getting hurt by trying to protect it. Your dog will be much safer if you let it run away from a farm animal in these circumstances and so will you.
- Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections, so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly 'bag it and bin it'. Make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people.

Sherston Sixes and Open Day Sunday 5 July




Bishop values our school


