Parish Council Update on North Legacy

The North Legacy working group are going to recommend the following approach to the parish council at the next meeting on 12 July.

We will undertake the proposed redevelopment of the playground equipment, subject to reaching agreement on terms with the contractor. However we will drop the proposed shelter, and include a new set of goalposts.

For the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) we will consult more widely before deciding what to do. We would love to hear from the potential users, probably younger teens, with their views; since they don't always read Cliffhanger please could you pass the message on!

We will probably hold a public meeting for people to express their views.

For the balance we are going to follow a clearly defined process as follows:

Any organisation wanting to apply for funds needs to submit an application to the Parish Clerk by 1 September 2018. The council will then evaluate these as outlined below and announce final decisions on 1 October.

The council members will score each application on the basis of

- Capital nature of the application (is it to provide something new and not just offsetting running expenses?)
- Direct benefit to as many children as possible, for as long as possible
- Viability of the proposal (is there reasonable evidence that it has been carefully planned and is likely to be a success?)
- Likelihood of attracting matched funding if appropriate
- Whether the project could be funded by other sources.

Offers may be made subject to conditions.

The council will ensure that the process is open and fair; inevitably not everyone will agree with the final decisions but they will know that everything has been 'done properly'.

Dementia Awareness: Seven small actions




As I write this, we are just at the end of Dementia Awareness Week. Lots of things going on all over the country telling people about dementia – what it is, how it feels for people living with dementia and how those without it can understand and help. Brilliant!

Sadly, dementia isn't confined to one week per year, it's every day and so I thought I would share something I saw published by the Alzheimer's Society called "Seven Small Actions. One Big Difference". These are seven actions that came up most often in their research among people affected by dementia. They are simple actions we can all take in our everyday lives which, while they might seem small, will have a big impact. The more we do them, the more they will become the norm, and the more people with dementia will be able to carry on living the lives they want to.

- 1. Talk to me. Don't be worried about talking to me. I'm still me.
- 2. Listen to me. Take time to listen and involve me in the conversation. I can still teach you a thing or
- 3. Include me. Keep on inviting me out. Friends still mean the world to me.
- 4. Ask if I need help. If I seem confused, ask if I need help. These little things help me stay independent.
- 5. Be patient. Be patient with me and I'll show you how I can still do things, it just might take me longer than it used to.
- 6. Ask me about my dementia. Don't be afraid to ask me questions. When you take the time to understand my dementia, I know there's someone on my side.
- 7. Help my carer too. Support my partner and others who care for me. My dementia affects them too.

WI Report



Sherston WI greeted an old friend at their June meeting when Pam Baldry, who had been Deputy Head at Sherston School some years ago, came back to speak to us about glass - a social history of glass through the 20th century.

Pam brought a large collection of glass items to illustrate the journey through the century. These ranged from ribbed bottles brought in to hold poisonous liquids - thus making them easily distinguishable from other bottles - to eye baths, an essential requirement where members of the household were working in factories and other manual trades; from containers for hat pins to bowls for hair 'brushings'; from glass jelly moulds to cocktail glasses. We heard how the quality and volume of glass within the house was an indicator of social status.

There was a fair bit of reminiscing from members of the audience as items we all knew and loved were used to highlight Pam's talk. We discovered the impact of the two World Wars on both the quality and volume of production; how Pyrex dishes were advertised to appeal to the post WW1 market where families who were once comfortably off were now having to manage with little or no help and how, as the economy improved post-WW2, we began to see corn on the cob, avocado and sundae dishes.

The challenges of developing and stabilising the colours to produce coloured glass were highlighted and we were all very pleased to know that circa 1950 the use of uranium in the production of bright green glass was banned!

Members had brought a number of glass items for the monthly competition and Pam very kindly talked us through all of those, from scent bottles to a nappy dish and a small flat glass dish for sweets, nuts, etc.

Our next meeting is on Thursday 5 July when Katharine Brooke-Mackenzie will be speaking to us on 'Having the guts to be healthy', not specifically on what we should or shouldn't eat but how to keep ourselves healthy. Our August meeting has a literary theme as we hear from Paul Evans on 'Poems and Monologues'.

What to do about Horsefly Bites

Horsefly bites are painful. Because of the way they do their damage, horsefly bites can be more trouble than bites from other bugs. Compared with other insect bites, horsefly bites are particularly painful and slow to heal. This is because the bite is:

- A cut type of wound, rather than a small puncture hole
- The mouthparts of the horsefly use a scissor-like action to create a wound in our skin
- The fly 'mops up' the bleed after cutting through the skin
- The fly anchors to the skin while drinking the blood, with the help of small hooks along its mouthparts

The bite in the skin itself is:

- Painful and may be itchy
- Usually red and surrounded by a raised area of skin, called a weal or hive

Healing can take longer than with other types of insect bite and the wounds are more prone to getting infected.

There is no special treatment for horsefly bites but the advice for home care includes:

- Not scratching the wound as this is likely to make it worse and risk infection
- Cleaning the bitten skin with plain warm water using a clean cloth or cotton wool
- Easing the pain and reducing swelling with a cold compress or ice pack held over the bite for 10 minutes
- Not using any other remedies aside from plain water



Vinegar or bicarbonate of soda are unlikely to help. The horsefly will also not leave behind any mouthpart of stinger when they bite people.

Medical attention is not needed unless the wound gets infected. In the rare cases of a severe allergy soon after a bite, people should call for an ambulance.

GPs and Dentists

We would like to remind patients that GPs do not deal with dental problems as these should be dealt with by qualified dentists.

If you need dental treatment in an emergency

- Call your dentist: some practices offer appointments at short notice
- If you don't have a dentist, find one using NHS 111
- Look up urgent care services that provide dental treatment

If you need to see a dentist out of hours

- Call your dentist: their answerphone may advise where to get out-of-hours treatment
- Call NHS 111 to find an out-of-hours dental service near you.

Don't contact your GP, as they won't be able to offer emergency or out-of-hours dental care.

If you're in pain while waiting to see a dentist, take painkillers. NHS 111 can also offer other self -care advice.

Over the Badminton jumps without a horse?

The local Rotary Club of the South Cotswolds is again organising its Badminton Horseless Team Event – a fun-run over the world-famous Badminton three-day event course.

This annual event, which has been organised and hosted by the Rotary Club of the South Cotswolds since its inception, is now in its 35th year. It is held by invitation of the Duke of Beaufort and is held on his estate, Badminton Park. The all-terrain course takes the runners and canicrossers (runners with dogs) along country tracks in sight of the deer herds, and through fields and woods.

The event is an opportunity for runners to experience the unique surroundings of Badminton Park and try out (or go round!) many of the familiar obstacles on the three-day event course. The event raises money for Rotary Charities and allows runners to seek their own sponsorship for their own charities. Over the years the event has raised many hundreds of thousands of pounds for charitable causes through entry fees and sponsorship.

This year's event is on Sunday 30 September. Registration starts at 8.30am (online pre-registration is available and gets you free car parking; car parking is £5 on the day); the race itself starts at 10.00am. Adult entries are £15; junior (aged 15 or under) entries are £10.




News from Holy Cross Church

Right from the start of his time here, he has supported Becky's work in the schools and churches, and as his ministry has grown he has extended our work amongst young people through Toast and other events. In particular, the Luckington open youth group and the Malmesbury School Christian Union have been great successes under Joel's leadership. Please come to one of his farewell events to thank him for all he has done and to bless him as he moves to become an employed Youth Worker at Fishponds Baptist Church.

We are praying that another youthwork trainee will be allocated to us, and are working with two organisations to find a volunteer. It is recognised that the Gauzebrook Group provides an excellent training and wide experience, but a lot of the potential trainees want to work in the cities.

Becky's work is funded from a variety of sources: grant making trusts, local charities such as Anne Brayne, regular giving by individuals, parish donations, and fundraising. One of our most significant fund-raising efforts is the Gauzebrook Gallivant. About 20 walkers completed the course around the nine churches of our group, with others joining us for particular stages and appreciating some excellent catering along the way. In contrast to last year, the weather was kind, and an early start on the 12 May meant that the weeds had not really got going, so the paths were clear! Over £2000 was raised in the end, and we are very grateful to Steve Ellis of Gemini Outdoors for organising the event, and Stanton Manor Hotel for welcoming the walkers at the end.

Another significant event in July is the ordination of Rev'd Elveen Mead as priest in Bristol Cathedral at 10.30am on Sunday 1st July. A group are going from our parishes, and you are very welcome to join them. For those who are unable to travel that far, there will be a 10.30 am Holy Communion service in Alderton that Sunday. In the afternoon, at 4.00pm, there will be a celebratory tea in Stanton Village Hall to which all are invited. Please bring something to share. 



A year with me will make a lifetime of difference to a blind or partially sighted person.




