A landslide victory at Sherston School!



While the country voted in the General Election, children at Sherston Church of England Primary School opened their own poll, to vote for something that will have a major impact on their day-to-day lives: some new playground equipment!

The school has grown over the last 10 years, since moving from Sherston High Street to its current modern building. The original fitness trail installed when it was built now needs extending. The award-winning Friends of Sherston School (FSS) has committed to raising £10,000, and with such a big spend, felt that it was important to ask the whole school.

Pupils and staff had to choose between two smaller pieces of equipment, or one larger one, including artificial turf. They were given official voting forms which were posted in a homemade ballot box. The turnout was an impressive 99% and the results were revealed in the next day's assembly, following an independent count: 74% voted for the two pieces of equipment.

The FSS, which won the community category of a national competition last year for the Pop Up Village event, will shortly reveal how much money has been raised so far this year. There will no doubt be further fundraising to do, but it's hoped that once the equipment is in place, it will provide a fantastic legacy for the next 10 years – and beyond!

Walk on the wild side

Do you know your neighbours?

Sometimes it's surprising who lives next door! You think you know who your neighbours are and you get a big surprise.





One group of animals we don't see much of here are reptiles, although there are two species that live around the village, namely the grass snake and the slow worm (see pictures, both of which were taken in the village. Grass snakes are completely harmless although can emit a horrible smell if they are threatened and play dead. They are reasonably common but are hard to spot even though they often live in rough pasture, along the edges of streams and in gardens. They can get up to a metre long and have a distinctive yellow and black collar. The slow worm is actually a legless lizard and is much more metallic and can live for up to 35 years. Curiously, I recently saw a crow scavenging next to a bush on the Cliff and it found a slow worm. It promptly flew off with it presumably to feed its chicks.

One surprising local resident recently discovered is an otter. Harriet Alvis (ex Sherston resident) is now the Project Officer at the Bristol and Avon River Trust (BART) and was carrying out some river sampling when she came across what she thought was some otter spraint or droppings. Following confirmation based on some pictures, some wildlife cameras were set up along the river a couple of weeks ago by Nic Fisher and Nick Holland. Within a couple of days, the somewhat grainy picture of a female otter was taken much to everyone's amazement, given that (as far as we know) otters hadn't been seen here for many years. They are very secretive and typically nocturnal so it's



not surprising they hadn't been seen and they may have been here for quite some time given they have been filmed in Malmesbury and one was seen on the road in Easton Gray. Although the otter hasn't been seen since, Nick has some great film of a Kingfisher eating a fish – it's on the village Facebook site as is the film of the otter.

Along the river, there are a few water voles (aka Ratty in Wind in the Willows) with their typical holes and lawns. The females graze the area at one side of a hole so it's much shorter than the surrounding area – hence being called a lawn. Water Voles are getting scarcer and scarcer so we are lucky to have some living here.

All of this excitement has led to discussions with BART and various people in the village about developing the work that was started with Grove Wood and extending it to other sites and environments. Local landowners and farmers are being very supportive. Things are still at the planning stage about what can be done to improve the river and some of the adjoining water meadows and we aim to have a stand on Boules Day (11 July) to share our plans. If anyone is interested in helping on the stand or afterwards, when the real fun starts, please do let me know.

On 8 and 9 May, three Sherston institutions combined to put on a show in the Village Hall, representing Sherston in the First World War. Sherston Community Choir (SHoCC) provided the music, Sherston Drama Group the acting, and Sherston Women's Institute the refreshments. Brian Cook stepped up to conduct the choir in songs of the time, accompanied by Sue Hammond on piano and Ian Bookless on melodeon, with the audience joining in enthusiastically for the choruses. Richard Skeffington wrote a script connecting the musical numbers into a story, featuring Sherston Parish Council (Clive Renton, Richard Warren, Mark Andrews and Riaan Van Rooyen) and the ladies knitting circle (Vee Skeffington, Sue Ormiston, Georgina Evans, Christine Massey, Stella Thacker and Immy Cambridge - not all of whom could knit!).

The audience was alternately amused and moved as the story unfolded. The knitting circle read letters from the front line and from conscientious objectors. Christine Massey wrote and performed a poem about her young son going to war which had the audience in tears. Neil Forster shared reminiscences of meeting a veteran of the Gallipoli landings and recited Rupert Brooke's poem The Soldier.



Five loaves and two fishes project, St. Paul's Bristol

This is a project that has been organised by the Community of the Sisters of the Church in St Paul's Bristol for many years. The sisters provide food and support to those who are living in vulnerable conditions and who are in need of help in the Bristol area. Each Sunday afternoon the project is open to anyone who comes to ask for food. This is supported by a team of volunteers who give out tins of food in carrier bags to those who come to the door of the sisters' house. No one is turned away, and all are greeted with respect and kindness.

The tins of food and other items, such as bedding and clothing, are provided by many churches in the Diocese of Bristol. We also have the advantage of being part of the Fareshare scheme in Bristol where food is contributed from local supermarkets for us to collect each week.

However, Sherston has been a great supporter of the project for several years. Each year people generously give money for us to buy tinned food which is distributed to those in need, especially at Christmas time. I would like to thank you all for this ongoing support. It means so much to many who receive the food each week and who can also have a change of bedding or clothing.

Over Christmas 2014 a grand total of £224.08 was raised in many ways to buy tins of food, soap, shampoo and packet soups. Thank you once again to

We were very pleased to be able to host two Year 5 medical students again this spring. They were with us for two weeks, during which time they saw a number of our patients and conducted some home visits. We feel that this is a very important part of their training which could not be done without the co-operation of our patients and we are very grateful to those who agreed to be seen by them.

We are also pleased to report that both Charlotte and Ain have now passed their final exams. The decline in popularity of General Practice amongst medical students is well documented and will potentially cause real problems for the National Health Service. 

3rd Batt Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment)

Died aged 21 Wednesday 16th June 1915

Remembered with Honour

Weymouth Cemetery

YOUNG SOLDIERS DEATH

To Sgt George Rice and Mrs Rice of Court Street, Sherston, has come a sad bereavement by the death of their older son, Pte Reginald Herbert Rice, 3rd Wilts Regiment, who passed away on Wednesday week at Weymouth at the early age of 21 years.

Young Rice, who was a painter employed on Sir George Holford's estate at Westonbirt, enlisted through Sgt H Young at Malmesbury, on March 25th. He was a well set up, robust young man and an accomplished athlete. He took a keen interest in football and often played for Sherston. From Devizes he was transferred, soon after he enlisted, to Weymouth for training. He was bent on becoming an efficient soldier and soon won the praise of his superiors for his smartness at drill. By his comrades and the non-commissioned officers of his company he was well liked and, indeed, was popular wherever he was known. He had progressed with his training as a soldier and was about to undergo his musketry course preparatory to joining a draft for the front. But this was not to be for, on Monday the 14th inst, he was seized with illness and death ensued as stated, two days later from cerebral meningitis. His father served in the Wilts Regiment some years ago and, when the present war was started, rejoined for instructional purposes for the period of the war. He had the melancholy satisfaction of being near his son when he was taken. He received sincere sympathy from all officers from Lord Heytesbury, officer commanding, downwards – with most of whom he had served before in the South African campaign. To Mrs Rice the news of her boy's death came as a sad blow for, when she had last seen him, he was in the full vigour of good health. Pte Rice was buried at Weymouth Cemetery on Friday with full military honours. It had been found impossible to bring the body to Sherston, although preparations had been made for burial there. The deceased's comrades sent beautiful floral tributes. The only relative present at the burial was the stricken father. One of the bearers was Sgt F Reakes who is in the same company as the deceased and was formally police sergeant at Sherston and, latterly, at Minety. The utmost sympathy for Sgt Rice and Mrs Rice in their bereavement.

Cricket

On a glorious summer's day ... somewhere in the world, Sherston Magna started their league season on a very grey, cold May day at Pinkney Park.

Sherston lost the toss and were put into bat. With nine overs gone, Sherston were 39-3, but then up stepped Will Matthews and Chris Lovell, with what must be a club record fourth wicket partnership of 267! Will played an unbelievable innings reaching 188, smashing the club record by 51 runs! It was one of the best innings most at Pinkney Park had ever seen. Chris supported him very well at the other end and finished 60 not out.

Will unfortunately got out with one ball remaining trying to score two sixes from the last two balls to reach the 200 mark, he was slightly disappointed, but it did mean the team and all watching could give him the round of applause his innings deserved. So Sherston Magna ended up on a massive 308-4 from 40 overs.

After a good start to the bowling attack by Andy Pegg (2-25) and Simon Hulance (1-21), the opposition were also 39-3. But a special innings like Will's can only happen once in a game and James Kutchera bowled brilliantly straight and also troubled the honours board with 5-17 (four of them bowled). Williamstrip finished all out for 106 which meant a mighty win of 202 runs.

In contrast, the game at Oakridge on 10 May could not have been closer. Again, it was a two jumper day, again Sherston lost the toss and again Sherston were asked to bat first. Sherston's openers put on 30-odd before they both were back in the pavilion. This left Chris Lovell and James Harmer to rebuild. The pitch was very different from the week before and Lovell and captain Harmer found scoring tough. Lovell departed for a dogged 16. Bringing Matt Goodwin to the crease, Harmer and Goodwin put together a positive fourth wicket partnership before the captain was eventually out for 60. Ollie Moore and Goodwin then had a very enterprising final few overs, with Sherston finishing their 40 overs on a very respectable 180; with Goodwin finishing 50 not out.

Sherston started their defence of the total knowing that Oakridge's batting was not too deep so early wickets would have Sherston very much in control. With a very strong wind and an unfamiliar slope the Sherston bowlers struggled early on. There were a few half chances which did not go to hand and some might say Oakridge had more than their fair share of luck. With Oakridge without loss on 140, Sherston heads started to drop slightly. Ollie Moore was then asked to come back on to bowl and dismissed Oakridge's Smith for 91 (in Martin Smith's last seven-league innings he has now scored 621 runs at an average of 310.5). The wicket brought renewed belief and Andy Pegg (2-27) took a couple of further wickets. But with Pegg having completed his 10 overs and Oakridge needing 18 from the final three overs with wickets in hand, the captain



was looking for someone to step up to take Sherston over the line. Charlie Green, one of the clubs 'senior pros' was happy to take on the responsibility. The game came down to the last ball, with Oakridge needing four to win. The field was set deep as Green (2-32) ran into bowl, there was a clean strike down the ground which Moore chased and prevented crossing boundary and returned the ball to the bowler's end, Oakridge were coming back for the third, to tie the game. Green collected the ball with the batsman not even in the frame, but he did not trust his legs to cover the couple of yards to take off the bails. So Charlie opted for a diving throw which HIT and Sherston won the game by one run!

THE ANCIENT ORDER OF SHERSTON MANGOLD HURLERS

June is a magic month for members of the order. With their precious seeds sown in April young succulent leaves of the mighty mangold romp away in the early summer sunshine. By the time of the solstice the plants are burgeoning with leaves magically glistening in the dew as dawn breaks on this most magical day. Many a member has heard the chorus of mangold leaves slowly unfurling to greet the sun at its zenith. Heady days indeed.

Mangold leaves are a great delicacy and are as edible as spinach or chard. There is of course a profusion of local recipes available in the now sadly out of print 'Mangold Reflections' by L. Jenkins of this parish published by the Rutabaga Press in 1962. A new recipe has however recently been discovered by the Order's intrepid archivist Cilla Liddington although who first penned it still remains a mystery. It certainly reflects the cosmopolitan nature of gastronomy in modern times. Cilla has has naturally tried the recipe and it seems likely that it will soon appear on the lunch menu at Sherston School alongside such favourites as Jock Walker's Mangold Lasagne and Penny Foster's infamous Mangold Muffins. So here it is -

Mangold Dal

Serves 2

1 red onion, finely chopped.

3 garlic cloves, finely chopped

1 tbsp olive oil

250g red lentils

Up to 500ml of vegetable stock – you may not need all of it

½ -1 tsp mild curry powder, to taste

3 handfuls of baby mangold leaves

Sauté the onions and garlic in the olive oil until the onion has softened.

Add the lentils with a little of the vegetable stock and simmer. As the liquid begins to reduce add more stock and keep this going until the lentils are soft and just beginning to get broken down.

Add the curry powder and mix thoroughly.

To finish and with the dal on a very low heat add the baby mangold leaves and sir until they begin to wilt. Serve and enjoy!


