Once in a thousand years!

After six years of planning instigated by Sherston 1016 member Noel Banks (of Viking ancestry), get ready to celebrate the 1000th anniversary of the battle of Sherston on 25 June. The battle is noted in the Anglo Saxon Chronicles as being fought after midsummer and in Danish texts as taking place the day after St John's Day - 25 June!

It is recorded as being one of several battles, the previous being at Penselwood near Gillingham, Somerset.

Tradition has it that John Rattlebone fought at the battle of Sherston and was severely wounded, but picking up a stone tile, clamped the tile to his side and fought on, slaughtering many Danes.

John Rattlebone is remembered in Sherston as a local hero, as in the Rattlebone Inn, also John Rattlebone appears on the Sherston primary school badge and the Sherston Scouts have a Rattlebone group. The local fundraising organisation, Sherston 1016, takes its name from the battle. He would have fought for Edmund Ironside, the King of the Saxons, against Canute, the King of the Danes.

The battle is said to have taken place over two days and was inconclusive with both armies calling off the battle after much bloodshed on both sides. The events on the Rec and the Village Hall are free of charge due to the sterling efforts of many people through local fund-raising events and support from the Parish Council and Malmesbury Area Board. Sale of memorabilia will help cover extra costs such as First Aid cover, flags, fireworks, straw bales etc. - so please support the event by buying a coin (or three) or jigsaw to commemorate the 1000th anniversary of the Battle of Sherston and they would make ideal gifts for your family and friends!

Busy Hands announces closure

It is with great sadness that the Busy Hands Committee has decided unanimously that Sherston Busy Hands Pre-school will close. The last day will be Friday 15 July.

This decision was not taken lightly but reached after much heart-searching and research, and ratified at an Extraordinary General Meeting last month. There are a number of reasons why Busy Hands cannot continue, the main one is that it is not financially viable. In addition, the demands on staff have increased enormously over recent years, in particular the amount of paperwork. The support that the volunteer committee can offer falls far short of the current requirements; the staff should have access to a more qualified and, ideally, paid management structure.

Busy Hands Pre-school has long served children in preparing them for their transition to school. It has been supported and managed by a long line of committed parents and residents of Sherston and has been in operation since the 1970s.

The volunteer nature of these committees has posed a huge challenge to those with the unenviable task of being next in line to manage and sustain the running of the preschool, as well as to staff. During the last few years, it has been increasingly difficult to secure a chair and committee for the start of the September term.

When the Government introduced 15 hours' free funding for all three- and four-year-olds in 2010, it effectively ended the informal playschool nature of the setting and ultimately marked the start of expenditure

significantly – and increasingly – exceeding income each year. It is widely publicised that this funding falls short of the true cost of providing care, an issue that has unfortunately led to the demise of many village preschools. Busy Hands is not an isolated case. Wiltshire Council has had to accept inadequate funding as the major contributing factor for the closure of many similarly structured preschools in the local area.

Fundraising has always been a key priority for the Busy Hands committee. However, since the introduction of the free funding, any fundraising has wholly contributed to the operating costs of the setting. This year's fundraising efforts have been particularly successful, drawing in over 5k. Yet this still was not enough, with a forecasted 9k operating loss for the end of this school year.

The current committee feels strongly that there is definitely a place for a preschool in Sherston. However, any future preschool would need to be based on a completely different structure. With this in mind, there is an opportunity to explore the development of a potential business model, so if you have an idea that you are willing to put forward, or would be happy to help or support in any way, then please contact Saara Sharman (on saara.sharman@gmail.com or 07739 552336), who is keen to coordinate an initial meeting of minds.

In the meantime, it is the committee's utmost priority to ensure that Busy Hands continues to deliver the best possible care for the children right up until the last day.



Cliff Road – Silver Street parking problems



As the number of car owners for each household increases, the difficulty of finding a place to park near the house becomes ever harder. This is an issue for all of the streets in Sherston, but is a particular problem in Cliff Road and Silver Street. Inconsiderate parking means that refuse trucks for household waste, recycling and green waste are struggling to access these roads. Also, access for emergency vehicles is difficult or impossible which will result in a delay in the ambulance or fire engine accessing an emergency situation. The problem is particularly bad at the corner of Cliff Road and Silver Street and along Silver Street, which is not







wide enough to allow cars to park on both sides, and it is often tricky for even the postman to drive down these roads due to cars parked awkwardly. Unfortunately, it is just not possible for every car owner to park their car on the street close to their home and to still ensure access.

This is an ongoing problem and, if residents are unable to park with consideration, the parish council will have to enforce parking with road markings, police action, a distant 'village car park' and perhaps allocated resident parking spots, with no parking allowed outside these allocated spots.

Tickets, on sale from Sherston Post Office from mid May, are £10 to include a glass of wine. Proceeds to the church.



Walk on the wild side Different perspectives



We tend to walk around with the same perspective on our environment – we look up and down maybe 15 degrees and only absorb what we are familiar with, so we tend not to actually see that much. I was in London a few years ago when Antony Gormley (of the Angel of the North fame) placed some 30 human-sized statues on the top of buildings around Charing Cross. This very simple, but challenging, set of installations got lots of people looking at the tops of the buildings and the architecture that's up there. It's quite amazing but most people don't look up!!

I have tended to focus on birds and butterflies, and found I needed to look for one or the other when I am out – it's hard to keep shifting the distance you are looking at on a regular basis (at least for me).

Having seen lots of masonry bees in the garden, building their extended colony of single burrows, I decided this summer was the time to find out more (story for a later date) so I bought a macro lens for my camera – one where you get very detailed photos of small things. When you start to explore the small world that exists all around us, nature reveals incredible complexity and beauty and colours (see photos – except for the colour bit!). One picture is of the centre of a cornflower, one of a shield bug emerging from a dandelion, and a 7mm fly – just look at the detail on its feet.

So here's a challenge: get something from your garden – a flower or leaf or insect or even a slug – and draw it! The action of drawing will make you look

at the flower etc in great detail and, while the results may not win a prize, the process of discovery is such a joy. If anyone does this, please let me know.

Finally, come along to the village hall on 23 June (Euro referendum day!) to enjoy a couple of Wild Sherston talks. Starting at 7.30pm, we have a couple of talks arranged: The 100 birds of Sherston by the Wiltshire Ornithological Society (did you know there are 100 species of birds around the village?); and a talk from Butterfly Conservation on our local butterflies and moths. There will also be an update by the Bristol Avon River Trust on the ongoing work around the village to improve the river ... and it's free!! Geoff Carss geoff_carss@hotmail.com or 840995




