
Bell ringing Sunday 10 June: 2.00pm-3.30pm




Hay fever

Hay fever affects millions of people in the UK and is mainly caused by pollen, and Wiltshire Clinical Commissioning Group is offering advice on how to minimise the symptoms for people who suffer from the condition.

Many of us will be spending more time outdoors with the arrival of spring, either in our gardens or local parks, and sufferers will soon start to feel the effects of itchy, red or watery eyes, a runny or blocked nose, sneezing fits, an itchy throat, mouth, nose and ears or a cough.

You can buy antihistamines cheaply from local pharmacies or supermarkets and doctors advise that this is often the best option. Other ways to reduce the effects of hay fever include:







- Wearing wraparound sunglasses when outdoors to protect the eyes
- Showering and changing your clothes after being outdoors will help stop the spread of pollen through your home
- Putting a small amount of petroleum jelly in your nose helps to trap pollen grains
- Keeping an eye on the weather forecasts and staying indoors to avoid going out when the pollen count is high

Private 35647 Arthur George Jobbins

2nd/5th Batt King's Own Royal Lancashire Regiment

Who died aged 27 on 9th June 1918

Son of John and Matilda Jobbins and husband of Florence Jobbins, Court Street, Sherston, Wiltshire

Remembered with Honour, Hamburg Cemetery, Hamburg, Germany

Arthur George Jobbins died of his wounds as a prisoner of war.

The King's Own Regiment was heavily involved in the Battle of Lyles in April - May 1918 when they attempted to hold up the German advance to the North of Arras.

It is likely that Arthur was wounded in one of these attacks and had to be left behind. He would have been taken into captivity at one of the numerous prison camps in Germany where he died.

After the war the cemeteries associated with these camps were consolidated and Arthur's body would have been moved to Hamburg where there are 708 such burials, along with 1,466 burials from the Second World War.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 9th June.

All these options would be subject to design, land rights, planning consent for the extension, including access and parking and agreement for funding.

We are very proud of our Scout Hut -it is in a great location for Scouting and Guiding Activities and the extension and refurbishment should ensure that the young people of Sherston continue to gain skills for life from a thriving and strong Scout Group and Guiding units.



Would you like to see a preschool back in Sherston?


It's been almost 18 months since we last updated you so we wanted to tell you more about our work to date and the current proposed preschool offering. We are a small committee of volunteers working towards providing a preschool setting in Sherston following the closure of Busy Hands back in 2016.

The information in this article was presented at the Annual Parish Meeting on Thursday 17 May in the village hall.

Our group has been running for about two years, and to date we have carried out a number of detailed activities to understand the demand from the village, type of services required and the best way to set up and run a long-term, sustainable, outstanding quality preschool service for the village and surrounding areas.

Preschool Offering

Sherston is a large vibrant village with a significant number of children and young families, and despite its many facilities, is currently lacking a preschool. Preschool education boosts social and educational capabilities, emotional wellbeing and sets children up for a lifetime of learning... therefore investing in the future population of Sherston.



What we aspire to provide...

- Purpose built facility for early years education of children of preschool age (from two to five years)
- Daily core hours of 9.00am 3.00pm
- Breakfast, after school and holiday clubs available to preschool and primary school age children, providing full 'wrap around' care
- Aiming for Outstanding Ofsted accreditation through an established early years provider
- Links in both relationship and proximity to Sherston C of E School

Village Support

You may remember we conducted a survey in January 2017 to ascertain village support for this project, and gain feedback and ideas as to what people wanted from a preschool setting. We received 112 responses, with 97.6% in support of getting a preschool back into Sherston. Despite this we always welcome new support, comments and feedback (please see the end of this article for details).

The Building and Setting

Over the last two years we have weighed up and investigated several options and locations in the



village in order to get this project off the ground, but sadly none came to fruition. We were just about to hang up our hats when approached by the 1st Sherston Scout Group with the idea of a possible collaboration on the Penny Mead site, adjacent or adjoining the existing Scout Hut (subject to all the necessary permissions of course).

In collaborating with the Scouts, we would have access to the additional space in the hut, for the hours that they do not use it, and they would have the option to be able to use the preschool space in the evenings when it is vacant. This would make for an excellent usage of the building throughout. Between the two settings, this would see approximately 180 children a week through its doors, from the ages of two to 18 years.

It is a great location for a preschool due to its proximity to open space, and to the school. In our survey, when asked what were the most important aspects to its users — outside space was rated as number 2 (after experienced staff).

Running the service

Over the last two years we have also been assessing various different options as to how to run a preschool and concluded that the most professional and sustainable way forward would be to use an already established childcare provider rather than a voluntary committee led approach.



On that basis we approached local nursery providers to assess their interest in such a project and are very pleased to have reached an agreement in principle with Pumpkins Nursery to provide a preschool facility in Sherston with wrap around care for primary aged children, once a suitable building from which to run could be provided.

Pumpkins is already well established in the local area with settings providing pre school education and nursery care in the villages of Badminton and Tormarton. They also run the Breakfast and After School Club at Trinity School in Acton Turville. Not only is Pumpkins well known and well respected in the local area it has also achieved 'outstanding' ratings from Ofsted in all three of its settings and we consider them to have the knowledge and experience to deliver a successful service for Sherston.

Funding

We are intending to apply to the Parish Council/ North Fund Legacy, to go some way to funding the bricks and mortar of a new Sherston Preschool, without which returning a preschool to Sherston will be sadly unviable. We will then fundraise for any shortfall. This project will provide a lasting legacy for the young people of Sherston, and bring back a service which Sherston had lost, therefore investing in the future population of Sherston.

We have been seeking designs for the build, which will of course be subject to the usual planning applications. We will be working in earnest with the Scout and Guiding Associations, the Parish Council, and Wiltshire Council in order to try and achieve these, and then also with Pumpkins to gain a detailed agreement for the day-to-day running of the project.
