



The services will take place at 8.00pm on Monday 25 March in Sherston, on Tuesday 26 in Norton and on Wednesday 27 in Hullavington. 1934: Flight to India

Lady Blanche Douglas, sider eater of the Duke of Beaufort, and Flying-Officer-Ogden, who, while on a flight to India, were forced down jesterday between Basea and Bushire. Lady Blanche only took up by ing last summer.

Micky left the RAF in 1934, as a Flying Officer, to join the Bristol & Wessex Flying Club at Whitchurch as an Assistant Instructor and subsequently left in November 1934 to fly to India with Lady Blanche Scott-Douglas. This was reported in Flight International magazine. After returning from India, he joined Bristol Aeroplane Company at Filton in 1935, initially as an instructor in the Flying School which Bristol had run since the First World War, and from 1939 as a test pilot.

His first pupil was Lady Blanche Scott-Douglas, the sister of the Duke of Beaufort, who asked Micky to be her co-pilot for a flight to India to visit her friend, the Maharajah of Cooch-Behar, an Eastern



Himalayan mountain kingdom. They set off on 20 November 1934 in her new Miles M2F Hawk Major G-ACWY via Kent, France, Corsica, Tunisa, Libya, Cairo, Palestine, and onto Baghdad, following the route of the Australia Race, which had begun a week earlier.

Unfortunately, they had engine trouble climbing out of Bushire and force-landed in the desert in Persia where they were marooned for 10 days, receiving hospitality from local tribes.

After leaving Bushire, they started climbing for Bandar Abbas but oil started spurting into the cockpit and they climbed higher. Eventually, at 8000ft, the pressure gauge went to zero and they had to shut off the engine. They were fortunate in finding themselves a long sandy valley, which proved itself to be the perfect aerodrome. In Lady Blanche's words: 'this was my first real forced landing and was lucky to have such confidence in Micky's ability to bring us down safely that I never had a moment's anxiety'. After a week of frantic anxiety back in England by Lady Blanche's mother, the flyers were found, after Micky and Lady Blanche sent a note to Bushire to the British Resident by a messenger who had to walk 80 miles through a very flooded countryside.

On the ground, the flyers discover the problem and what needed to be done and then realised that they were surrounded by about 100 'natives', a good many of whom were armed to the teeth with rifles

and knives in their belts, a roughish lot, most of them pockmarked, all of them dirty, and scantily clothed ...

Suffice to say their ordeal was to last for about 10 more days before the rescue party arrived with more oil, and took Lady Blanche back to Bushire through some very flooded countryside. Micky got the plane's engine going and, once the flood water had subsided, flew the plane out to Bushire!

After 36 hours' rest, they continued their journey to Bandar Abbas where the plane tipped over on landing and damaged the airscrew. Rather than waiting, the couple took a considerable risk and decided to fly on to Jask, where they waited for a new propeller to be flown in from Karachi via KLM.

Another problem awaited at Jask. Fuel had been laid down by Shell for the Australia race a month before. As the petrol was being emptied from the jerrycan into the aircraft, Micky noticed that it was frothing and suspected that the fuel had been spiked with water. The Shell agent had to suck out all the fuel and replace it with fuel that was genuine.

As they approached Karachi over the sea, the oil leak re-occurred but they were just able to make it to the airfield at Drigh Road.

They then stayed in Karachi with Micky's brother at Lloyds Bank and then travelled on to Bombay and then to Delhi, via Agra, and to Calcutta and onto Cooch Behar where, amongst other things, they did a tiger shoot on elephants.

My father recalled that the field they took off from in Cooch Behar for the return to England was a little short and had tall trees at the perimeter, so he instructed the people on the ground to hold the tail of the aircraft while they ran the engine to full throttle. They only just cleared the trees!

They returned safely to England in February 1935.

Lady Blanche lived for many years at Luckington, her local airfield was a fiied adjoining Reevers Hill, Sherston, which is still known by many as "The Flying Field".


New competition record for 1016 Pancakes Photos Elanna Witt & Paul Ormiston

Sherston Neighbourhood Plan Strategic Environmental Assessment – Scoping Report | We have been advised by Wiltshire Co

As reported in a previous issue of The Cliffhanger, work has now started on the preparation of the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan which will, if approved, provide a legal basis for residents to determine the future of our community over the next 20 to 30 years.

The project is led by Sherston Parish Council which oversees a steering group that includes local councillors, residents and other local community interest groups. The Sherston Neighbourhood Plan covers the whole administrative area of Sherston Parish Council. The Steering Group has been working on the plan since about February 2012.

As a necessary part of this process, we are required to undertake a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) – to assess the likely environmental impact of any policies and proposals that are put forward in the plan. The first stage of the SEA process is to prepare what is termed a Scoping Report. This initial stage requires us to gather evidence about what is happening in our neighbourhood plan area. This provides evidence to inform the SEA and uses information that is already being gathered in support of the emerging neighbourhood plan. Is Your Chocolate Easter Bunny Good or Bad?

Easter is on the horizon and many people are looking forward if not to a chocolate fest, at least indulging in one of the UK's favourite treats: chocolate.

Now, most people know of the bad things about eating chocolate, but did you know that there are also possible health benefits?

So here goes (good is a +, bad is a -):

- Dark chocolate has flavonoids which act as antioxidants. These can help protect the body from free radicals which can cause damage to the heart and blood vessels +
- Flavanoids also produce nitric oxide, which can reduce blood pressure +
- Chocolate, especially milk and white chocolate, is packed with fat and sugar leading to weight gain, raised blood pressure and diabetes -
- Chocolate stimulates endorphin production, which gives a feeling of pleasure +
- Unfortunately its role as an aphrodisiac is not proven –

• It also contains the obromine, caffeine and other stimulants, which could disturb sleep and provoke migraine in someone who is susceptible –

- In studies, chocolate has been found to be superior to many over-the-counter medicines in helping sooth a cough +
- Due to its different fat types, dark chocolate has been shown to reduce LDL cholesterol (low density, bad cholesterol) +
- The amount of dark chocolate needed to confer health benefits is only small - researchers used 100g (one small bar) daily so eating more than this may well outweigh the positives –
- The positive health benefits have only been found for high-quality dark chocolate: -milk and white chocolate were not shown to have any -
- Dark chocolate contains serotonin a chemical substance used in antidepressants +
- Eating chocolate does not give you spots +

Much of this research has been in small studies, and some of the long-term benefits, such as reduction in heart disease, are still not proven. However, the general consensus amongst the experts is:

- Eat dark, not milk or white, the higher the cocoa content the better

Malmesbury Rural Neighbourhood Policing Team

For those who have not seen a recent Wiltshire Police newsletter, I would like to introduce myself as your neighbourhood police officer.

I have been fortunate to have worked in the area for a number of years alongside some very experienced and now retired local officers. I have recently returned to Malmesbury, after a spell in Swindon, to fill the role previously carried out by PC Steve Humphries. I am working alongside Pcso Durry Maule, who many of you know and will have seen around your village.

In 2012 the rural area was hit with a number of dwelling burglaries at the end of the summer causing desperate upset for a number of people. I am pleased to report that, following operations run alongside neighbouring forces, two persons were arrested and charged with these offences.

Despite this positive result, it is understood that these rare incidents do make residents uneasy and therefore we will continue to regularly patrol your village and maintain a strong visible presence.

At the end of last year consultations were held locally and, from the results gathered from the public, Malmesbury Police along with partner agencies have set the Policing Priorities for the first quarter of 2013. The consultations highlighted strong concerns regarding speeding vehicles and other driver-related incidents, including drivers driving whilst on a mobile phone, drink driving and general anti social driving. Therefore increased speed checks and general patrols will be carried out, with the intention of reducing the above problems.

Please be aware that this means there will be a visible presence of police carrying out speed and vehicle checks in your area. 
Sherston Living Churchyard
