No entry at Willesley



The Sherston parish council and Wiltshire Highways are concerned about the possibility of a serious accident at the 'No Entry' junction from Willesley to the A433. A recent meter count recorded 51 vehicles illegally accessing the road in one week, of which 46 were cars and 5 were classed as trucks (3 axles or more). This is about seven vehicles a day, indicating a major problem.

Whilst the Highways department will improve the signage, all drivers, including locals, should be aware that accessing the A433 at this junction is illegal and extremely dangerous. Visibility in the direction of Tetbury is very limited. There have been two minor accidents in the last six months and it can only be a matter of time before there is a much more serious accident. Please obey the 'No entry'/ sign.


Scouts learn to pull


Think Big with O2 – funding for community youth projects

Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service – Safety reminder about domestic appliances

Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service is reminding people to take care when using domestic appliances.

Letting tumble dryers, washing machines or dishwashers run unattended - either overnight or while you're out of the house - can be dangerous, as fires can easily start if a fault develops and the appliance overheats. A family from the Chippenham area recently had a lucky escape when their tumble dryer caught fire after being left to run overnight.

Domestic appliances are often kept downstairs in a house, so leaving them running when you go to bed creates a real risk that you could be trapped upstairs if a fire were to start. It is also vital to have working smoke detectors, and to test them every week - that

The Fire & Rescue Service's advice is to:

- make sure there is at least one smoke alarm on every level of your home;
- fit smoke alarms on landings, in hallways, and near bedrooms. They can also be beneficial in rooms with electric heaters or other items of potential risk;
- test your smoke alarms regularly by pushing the button - ideally on a weekly basis;
- check that your smoke alarms are no more than 10 years old, and replace if necessary; and
- make sure that any elderly or vulnerable relatives or neighbours also have working smoke alarms.

In addition, the Service recommends having carbon monoxide alarms fitted in your home, and these should also be checked regularly.

Re-ordering of Holy Cross Sherston

Thanks to a generous donation from the Mrs.W Godfrey-Payton Trust the formal process of obtaining a faculty (Church planning permission), has begun to improve facilities at Sherston Church, consisting of:

- 1) Taking out the remaining pews in the north aisle,
- 2) A new storage area in place of the temporary pine cupboard and curtain and replacing with a sympathetically designed oak screened area,
- 3) A new oak cupboard in the north transept for flower arrangers and cleaners
- 4) A servery with cupboards and concealed basin and taps on the north wall adjacent to the existing kitchen door.
- 5) Oak flooring throughout the north aisle.

The faculty notice and plans can be viewed in the church.

It must be stressed that these proposals affect only the north aisle, ie coffee shop area. These proposals will not affect the nave, chancel, sanctuary or Lady chapel. We are assured that during the alterations normal church services will be unaffected and there will be minimal disruption to the coffee shop. These new facilities will give us a greater flexibility with children's work, social gatherings, exhibitions and concerts and informal services.

Can you help?

Can you spare a little time during the week to befriend someone who may be housebound and lonely? Could you step in to support someone who has just come out of hospital? I have been asked by Age UK and Carer Support Wiltshire to do a bit of advertising for them. Annie and Jane's contact details are below, or call me, Ellen, on 07557 922020 for an informal chat.

Volunteers needed in this area for our Home from Hospital Service This service is being offered to older people who have been discharged from hospital and are worried about how they will manage when they return home. Volunteers will provide short-term support for four to eight weeks, assisting the service user to regain the independence they had before the admission to hospital. An example of this would be doing someone's shopping for the first two weeks, and then accompanying them on a shopping trip on the third week. Annie and Jane, the Discharge Support Caseworkers, will support volunteers every step of the way.

Would this type of role suit your skills and experience?

This role would suit somebody warm and friendly, who is a good listener and sensitive to older people's needs, and who has their own car and is happy to drive within their locality.

How much time and commitment is involved?

Usually between one to two hours for each person visited, perhaps twice a week.

What training is provided? The Home from Hospital volunteer induction training programme takes four hours. For further information please contact Annie Fiducia or Jane Harber on 01380 727767.

The Great War in Wiltshire, February 1915

Taken from the Wiltshire & Swindon History Centre Newsletter, Wiltshire Monthly Intelligencer, Issue 395, February 2015

Many Wiltshire businesses were making materials and supplies for the armed forces during the war. After the war, and especially in the 1930s, many such businessmen were regarded as profiteers who used the war to line their own pockets and often picked up a title at the same time. This was not the case with most Wiltshire industries although the extra work was doubtless most welcome and provided much employment, particularly for women who replaced men serving their country. Some of the businesses, other than those involved in munitions work, were:

Kemp and Hewitt of Trowbridge made cloth to provide uniforms for British, Belgian and French officers' uniforms.

McCall Bros. of Trowbridge made cloth for the governments of Great Britain, South Africa, France, Belgium, Italy, USA and Japan.

Palmer & MacKay of Trowbridge made Bedford Cords, Cavalry Twill and Khaki Whipcords for the British Army and cloth for many other countries including, by the end of the war, over 150 miles of Silver Grey Flannel for the Indian Army.

Nestlé & Anglo-Swiss Condensed Milk Co. of Staverton was supplying tins of condensed milk to the British Army.

J. Avons & Sons of Trowbridge supplied brushes to war depots for sweeping, cleaning boots, horse brushing, and small ones for cleaning officers' buttons.

Jefferies, glovers of Westbury made trench mittens on a large scale for the British Army.

In Swindon a committee had been formed to collect fruit and vegetables for despatch to a salvage depot at Paddington to keep the men of the Navy healthy. Farmers and landowners from the surrounding area supplied much of this free and in the Borough itself housewives contributed vegetables from their purchases in a large bin at the market hall. School also held 'potato days' and 'vegetable days' when children brought items from their father's allotment or the home larder/ Nearly 80 tons of fruit and vegetables were sent from Swindon in the first four months and in 1915 the Swindon Committee was the best and most regular contributor to the scheme out of 170 in the country





Many popular travel destinations require you to have travel vaccinations. It can take up to six months to complete a schedule for some of these vaccinations depending on where you are going and what you are doing. The earlier you come to the surgery for travel advice, the better. Please complete a travel questionnaire, one for each member of the family who is travelling, at least eight weeks prior to travel. This will give the nurse enough time to assess your needs and for you to be vaccinated if required. If you are travelling with less than two weeks' notice, it is possible that we will be unable to meet your appointment needs and you may have to attend a private travel clinic who will charge for all vaccines. Currently some of the vaccines you can have at the surgery are free.





Speed restriction for Sherston approved



Back in March 2014 residents contributed suggestions for 20 mph zones within Sherston. The parish council presented a proposal to restrict vehicle speeds to 20 mph along Court Street to the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) at the Malmesbury Area Board and the observant among you will have noticed wires ('Metro-count') across a range of Sherston roads in late November last year. These wires were assessing the speeds at six locations around the village.

As a result of this assessment Wiltshire Highways have proposed a scheme that would see an area from the 30 mph speed limit sign on Knockdown Road, bounded by Sandpits Lane and Knockdown Road-Court Street, and the B4040 (would remain at 30 mph) and all roads between (Manor Close, Northend Gardens and Green Lane) limited to 20 mph.

The scheme would include a number of engineering features and up to 11 signs in the 20 mph zone.

However Wiltshire Council is shortly to propose that all schools in the county will be equipped with electronic 20 mph signs, which will only be activated during term time, and will create 20 mph zones, for arrival and departure from schools, in the roads next to schools.

The parish council will need to consult the community on both schemes, so please look out for information on how to have your say in the coming issues of the Cliffhanger. Spring at Sevington Victorian School

If you've got visitors coming to stay, then you might like to bring them to Sevington Victorian School. It's a delightful little village school which has survived untouched since Edwardian times. You can still see the original teacher's high desk and chair, the long pupils' benches, the oil lamp and the books and objects she used to teach her little school back in Victorian times.

Until recently it was only open to primary schools, who bring their pupils to take part in historical reenactments of a Victorian school day. But last year we began opening it to the public and this year we kick off with a children's egg hunt on Easter Sunday (2.30-4.30pm), complete with traditional Easter activities, including egg rolling, decorating eggs and an egg hunt (£1 per child).

After that, we will be open every Sunday afternoon from 17 May to 13 September. There's a chance to look at the schoolroom and meet Miss Squire the school teacher – if her many duties permit. Homemade tea is served in the schoolhouse parlour, and there's an opportunity to look at the kitchen, with its cast iron range, and walk in the little Victorian garden. The furnishings both of the schoolroom and the teacher's house are guaranteed to bring back memories and prompt a round of reminiscences.

Access is easy with parking available just outside the school. There are some steps but visitors with limited mobility generally find them manageable, given time and a helping arm.

Children are very welcome and Victorian costumes and toys are available for those who enjoy getting into role.


