Neighbourhood Plan - we've got lift off



Last month's Cliffhanger article summarised the various stages of the Neighbourhood Plan process. We are pleased to inform you that we have now launched the Consultation Stage (Stage 1 as described in that article).

The consultation period started on 22 February at 12.00 noon and runs until 12.00 noon on 9 April.

Letters were sent out last week to all of the Statutory Consultees and landowners directly affected by these proposals advising that the draft plan had been published and inviting comments.

A Press Notice was at the same time displayed on the Sherston Parish Council and Sherston What's Occurring Facebook pages. This is published again below in this Cliffhanger Article for your information.

The Sherston Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group is pleased to invite the community to review the first draft of the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan.

The Sherston Neighbourhood Plan is the culmination of around six years' hard work.

At the heart of the plan are 11 policies which seek to deal with the following key issues:

- 1. The protection of a wide range of existing community services and facilities and business premises;
- 2. The protection of certain specific identified open spaces and open areas in and around the village;
- 3. Securing the delivery of good quality high speed broadband throughout the plan area;
- 4. Allocating sufficient land to meet the future housing and community needs of the village;
- 5. Seeking to secure safe and inclusive access between the proposed new GP surgery, the Primary School and the village centre;
- 6. The protection and enhancement of existing sports facilities in and around the village.

The policies contained within the draft plan reflect the views of the community obtained over the last few years at a succession of workshops and other public events, as well as through a number of questionnaire surveys. The policies set out in the draft plan are not final. The Steering Group is keen to hear the views of local residents, businesses and other interested parties on the draft plan before the plan is finalised.

The consultation period will run from 22 February until 9 April. The Neighbourhood Plan Regulations require the consultation period to run for a minimum of six weeks and all comments received during this time period have to be taken into account when finalising the plan.

Two drop-in sessions have been arranged to provide an opportunity for local residents to discuss the draft plan. These will be held at the Village Hall on Saturday 3 and Saturday 17 March – from 10.00am to 12.30pm. All welcome.

Power Cuts

Many of you may have suffered, like us, from some recent power cuts. Unfortunately, during the time our power was off, our telephones were unavailable. We apologise for any inconvenience this may have caused. We have looked at a number of solutions to this problem but, without spending huge amounts of money to provide generators, which may never be needed again and cannot be practically accommodated, there is very little we can do about temporary, short-term power cuts.

As always, the advice, if there is a medical emergency, is to call 999. For less urgent medical advice, there is the NHS 111 service which is free to call from landlines and mobile phones, and available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

New Appointment System

Our new appointment system was trialled during an exceptionally busy time with a national flu epidemic and was the busiest time in NHS history this winter. It involves doctors speaking to all patients wishing to see a doctor urgently on the day. It has taken some time for us all to get used to and there is some patient resistance to giving any details to our medical receptionists. The new system is being carefully monitored and reviewed each week when small changes can be made to the clinics. The doctors feel that it has helped us through an extremely busy period, but there is still some way to go in directing patients to the most appropriate service, which in some cases could be to the local pharmacy for overthe-counter medicines or advice. Waiting times for routine appointments are now up to four weeks and this again is a national situation.

Private 27311 Gabriel Wicks

6th Batt King's Shropshire Light Infantry Who died aged 19 on Sunday 31st March 1918 Son of James Wicks and Anne Elizabeth née Neal

Remembered with Honour, Pozières Memorial, France

On 31 March 1918, the day Gabriel was killed, the 6th King's Light Infantry was responsible for stopping the German advance for a short time and causing them severe casualties.

As the fighting in the area continued for many days, there was little chance to recover the bodies of the dead. Most were left until the autumn by which time identification was impossible.

The Pozières memorial stands in the centre of the 1916 Somme battlefield and includes 14,000 names of the men who sacrificed their young lives there.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 31st March.

How Gabriel came home

Eighty-three years ago, when the Stone Memorial was commissioned to remember the Sherston men lost in the Great War, Gabriel Wicks' name was omitted.

It had been decided in 1920 to repair the church lych gate and this was thought an ideal opportunity to provide a place to include a war memorial. The then vicar would probably have put a notice in the local newspaper appealing for families to contact him with names of the missing.

Maybe Gabriel's family was no longer living in Sherston or perhaps they did not read the request. In any case Gabriel, along with several others, had never been remembered here

When the book 'Heroes All' (from which this is extracted) was being planned, the parish council received an email from David Whithorn who was about to publish his own book Bringing Uncle Albert Home - the story of his research into the death of his great uncle at the Battle of the Somme.

Here began the strange series of events that led to Gabriel being at long last remembered alongside his friends and comrades.

David Whithorn's email related that he had visited a second-hand shop in Marlborough and bought an old photograph of a soldier in the Wiltshire Regiment. He discovered the man was Arthur Jobbins from Sherston



who had been killed in 1918. Mr Whithorn visited Sherston the next week and provided a copy of the photograph for the 'Heroes All'. He also kindly offered to help with the research.

It was then discovered there were 13 more men missing from the memorial stone, all of whom were either living or had been born in Sherston.

Mr Whithorn had planned a visit to France and offered to photograph some of the memorials where the Sherston men were commemorated for the book. One of them was Gabriel's at Pozières.

Mr Whithorn found the memorial and was standing reading the names when a laminated paper blew past his feet. He picked it up with the intension of returning it to the colonnade nearby where people had laid tributes. He looked at the sheet and read 'Pte Gabriel Wicks died 31st March 1918'. There was even a photograph of Gabriel in uniform.

Almost unbelieving, he read on and discovered the address of a school in St Albans, Herts, along with the name of a teacher.

As soon as he returned home Mr Whithorn contacted the school and spoke to the teacher involved. He was told that, for the last few years, she had taken her sixth year students to the battlefield sites of France to learn about the horrors of the Great War and to understand the poetry written about that time. A national newspaper had heard about her trips and, for their 2001 Remembrance Day tribute, decided to send a reporter with the school to write a feature for the paper.

An elderly lady living in Swindon read the article and contacted the teacher telling her that her great uncle Gabriel Wicks had been killed at the Somme and, although she had never known him, her mother had always spoken of him. They even shared the same birthday. The lady asked whether, the next time the teacher went to France, she would try and find Gabriel's memorial and say a prayer for him. She sent a photograph to the school of Gabriel.

At this point, the teacher thought it would be a wonderful idea for the school unofficially to adopt Gabriel as their soldier so that, during future visits, the pupils would have their own soldier to focus on.

The teacher and her pupils went to Pozières in November 2002. They stood and said a prayer for Gabriel and left the laminated paper with his photograph on the colonnade from where, six months later, it would blow in front of David Whithorn who was looking for his name amongst 14,000 mentioned.

If ever a man wanted to be remembered after 83 years it was Gabriel Wicks whose name is now finally added to Sherston's memorial.



News from Holy Cross Church

March is an exciting month, with a lot going on. Mothering Sunday services are always popular, and our special service in Holy Cross will be at 9.30am on Sunday 11 March. This will be followed (for any who can stay) by the annual meeting, which is a chance to hear about the events of the last year and make plans for the future.

Palm Sunday is on 25 March. During the week there will be Compline on Monday in Hullavington at 9.00pm and Wednesday in SSQ at 8.00pm. A new venture this year is a joint Lent Group Celebration service on the Tuesday of Holy Week at 7.30pm in Luckington. Members of the different denominations in Sherston have been meeting together throughout Lent, and our final session will take a new approach: gathering into one large group to hear from one another and worship as one community.

On Maundy Thursday there will be a communion service followed by an optional vigil in Holy Cross Church from about 9.00pm. Good Friday, 30 March, traditionally includes a Children's Workshop and this year it will be held in Holy Cross church from 11.00am. Following on from these workshops, there will be a reflective service called The Last Hour at Hullavington and a family-style service at Sherston Holy Cross, both at 2.00pm, after which we'd encourage everyone to join in journeying to Luckington for a service at 3.15pm in the car park, then drinks and hot cross buns afterwards.

Holy Saturday on 31 March includes 'Stations of the Cross' in the Congregational Church in Sherston at 10.00am. Finally, on Easter Day itself we are very grateful to the members of the ministry team and retired priests who are making it possible to have a service in every church in the benefice. There are flyers in every church giving more details about the Lent, Holy Week and Easter services, so do please take one for yourself and anyone you know who might be interested.

Please put Saturday 12 May in your diary as the date for the next Gauzebrook Gallivant. Last year this sponsored walk raised almost £2,000 for the children's and youth work carried out in our churches by Becky and Joel. This is part of a very impressive £5,000 raised locally by parochial, business and individual donations, which supplemented the grants we apply for from charities. Thank you to everyone who supports the children's ministry in this way.

The dogs are trained to assist individuals, managing complex lifethreatening conditions. With their amazing sense of smell the dogs identify minute odour changes prior to a medical emergency and alert the person to take appropriate action. Some are also trained to sense the changes in urine odour to diagnose cancer in a laboratory environment. It was an amazing and enlightening afternoon.





The Great British Spring Clean has just taken place and I have no doubt that all the volunteers who give up their time to pick up litter must get extremely irritated when their good work is 'trashed' by the thoughtless. Wiltshire Council spends £2.5m a year picking litter; that figure would be far higher were it not for the local community efforts. The Council would far rather the £2.5m be spent on filling potholes and resurfacing roads.




