Badminton House Plant Fair and Gardens

Badminton House will play host to the first Badminton Plant Fair on Saturday 18 May at 11.00am to 5.00pm. Many local nurseries, selling a wide variety of plants, including annuals, perennials and vegetables will attend and visitors will also be able to walk around the gardens. The Old Royal Ship Pub from Luckington will be serving a variety of lunch and teatime refreshments and the cost of entry will be £5 per person on the gate , children under 16 free.

Designed by Russell Page and Francois Goffinet, the Badminton gardens combine formality and structure with a wonderful sense of openness. The Duke and Duchess of Beaufort are passionate about plants and have made their mark on the garden's many different aspects, which include a formal south garden, a large walled garden and many other smaller treasures.

With its formal design and informal planting, the main gardens wrap around the elegant Badminton

House. The south garden is geometric in style, including 16 box beds filled with roses. These are flanked by large borders, the shell garden, a white bed and the peony and pool beds.

Badminton also boasts two magnificent conservatories on the east front of the house and in one of these grows the very spectacular climbing geranium 'Millfield Gem'. The elegant Orangery overlooks the 'swimming pond' with its central fountain and just beyond is the dog pool – which, despite the elegant planting around it, is just that.

There is also a large and productive walled garden which provides cuts flowers and plenty of produce for the house and the kitchens.




Moon Walk 2013

Once again, as I'm sure you will not be surprised to hear, there have been few new signs of life in the churchyard due to the very low temperatures. The early flowers are struggling out slowly, but some are damaged by frost. I have not yet heard a chiffchaff, the sound of whose song when it returns from the south I always think of as the first real sign of spring. I heard a report on the radio of waxwings, winter bird visitors, being seen at the same time as sand martins, arriving to nest. Their insect food must be in desperately short supply and they may not be able to raise young successfully in the very short season they use. Barn owls have been found starving or dead, due to the effect of the cold on the number of field voles which they rely on to eat

All this means that wildlife needs all the help it can get so we will be meeting again in the churchyard on Saturday 11 May 2.00pm to 4.00pm. Some of those who volunteer have suggested that a weekday would be a better time for them to help, so look out for a change of timing

Walk on the wild side

Wanted: Trees – dead or alive

The natural environment around the village is heavily managed by farmers, estate owners, gardeners, the church, etc and it's generally quite tidy, with trees typically in hedgerows and along field boundaries. The environment has suffered from some 'natural' issues, however, such as Dutch Elm disease which killed some 25 million trees in the UK in the 1980s (and we could be faced with ash trees dying through a new disease appearing at the moment). When trees growing in hedgerows die, they are both cut down AND not replaced which means we end up with empty hedgerows like the ones on the road towards Norton where there are no trees at all for some long sections.

Many birds, insects, fungi, lichen and plants rely on tree-lined field boundaries to survive. Some recent research by the Butterfly Conservation found that, while farmers setting aside the edges of their fields to wildlife increased bird populations, the moth population increased only if the hedgerows near the field edge contained trees. Bear in mind that blue tits eat some 35 billion caterpillars a year so we need lots of moths to sustain blue tits alone.



In Grove Wood there are a couple of pairs of nuthatches (see picture) which need holes to nest in. If they find a hole with an entrance that is too large they will use mud to line the edges of the hole to make it smaller – just big enough for them to squeeze through. This hopefully stops other birds, such as magpies and sparrowhawks raiding the nest. On the cliff there are some stock doves (a bit like a wood pigeon but quite drab with no white marks) which also need holes in trees to nest in.

We used to have lesser spotted woodpeckers in the area but they are locally extinct as there is little standing dead wood, ie dead trees left to rot and fall over. We see them as a hazard – birds see them as a home! (There are, however, some lesser spotted woodpeckers not too far away in the Braydon Forest, north of Brinkworth.)

There are a couple of things we can do. Firstly, more native trees could be planted in hedgerows. They could, for example, be marked with a coloured post



to avoid hedge cutters chopping them in the autumn. A couple of local farmers have expressed an interest in doing this as it helps the environment but doesn't affect the crops. Secondly, we should leave dead trees standing where at all possible. We do have the need to make things tidy – but wildlife needs it messy. If you have some hedgerows that could do with more trees let me know and I am sure we can get some planted next winter.

Dawn Chorus walk

With spring in full flow the birds are starting to sing particularly just after dawn. The Dawn Chorus Walk will leave outside Stretchline (on the Luckington Road) at 4.15am on Saturday 4 May. It will still be dark and possibly cold so bring warm clothing, stout shoes and a torch. See an aspect of Sherston you have never appreciated! Any questions call Geoff Carss on 840995. PIGS! (The Paths Improvement Grant Scheme)

Do you have an idea to improve access to the countryside or to create new links between settlements in your area?

The Paths Improvement Grants Scheme (PIGS) aims to help local people make innovative improvements to countryside access in their area. We can also help with bids to external organisations, so additional funding may also be available.

Ten schemes were funded in 2012, including:

- Surfacing a footpath link within the village of Burbage. The route was previously muddy and uneven so very difficult to use. The surfacing means the route can now easily be used to access local services without the need for walking boots, including by parents pushing buggies from the local school
- Replacing over 60 stiles in a number of parishes in the south-east of the county. A partnership with Wiltshire Council's Southern Area Board and local volunteers is replacing the stiles with gates, making key routes more accessible.
- Repairing rather than replacing a small, attractive stone bridge in Sutton Mandeville. Instead of using an off-the-shelf wooden bridge, the stone bridge has been repaired by the parish council, which has helped to preserve the individual character of the footpath.
