# Open for business

Friday 18 April was something of a red letter day for Sherston as the Rattlebone Inn reopened after the fire in March and both local railway bridges were finally completed after 6 months work.

The Rattlebone's reopening so soon was frankly remarkable and all credit must go to everyone

involved in bringing back the pub to the village. Whilst the roof repairs will take many months the pub itself is fully operational in all departments and has benefitted from complete redecoration to the bars and restaurant.

Network Rail's replacement of the Fosse Bridge and the Badminton Overbridge between Luckington and Acton Turville caused much consternation since work commenced last September with continuing delays on what should have been a 3 month job. A lot of local businesses had to face months of reduced turnover as well as residents suffering expense in

time and fuel costs in following the diversion routes many of which couldn't cope with the volume of traffic and were severely damaged. Let's hope that the whole saga has taught Network Rail some lessons in project management and communication with local communities

It started with the arrival of two stereotypical English holidaymakers, sisters spinster Fiona and the bossy Agatha, who disturbed the peace of Mrs Hubbock and the Brigadier. The married couple spent their time trying to avoid audacious Agatha's activities, creeping around the lobby; but hawk-eyed Hepworth never lets them pass. The actors tell the tale







of the missing Fiona and their calamitous attempts at finding her, while Whittle continues to get it all wrong. When Fiona does make it back, via a winetasting, it appears that Mario has at long last found his wonderful woman.

Tessa was the first to spot James Hulme's talent for running – James, who is in year 5, competed in the British Schools National Biathlon Championships recently and came second in his run heat and 25th overall out of the 140 who took part.

Sherston has always encouraged sporting activities and other successes include Harriet and Emma (Year 6 and 5) who both achieved their one mile swimming badges recently – in under an hour – and who did a 5km fourperson swimathon for Sport Relief on 23 March.

In addition, Louis Thomas (Year 6) has been asked to play for the Swindon Wildcats U11 Ice Hockey Team! Louis started playing ice hockey in May 2013, at the Swindon Link Centre. Louis had shown an interest since the age of eight when he went to watch the Swindon Wildcats.

In February Louis was asked to join a six-week trial for the Swindon Wildcats Academy. He said, 'The trials were much harder than I'd expected but it was so much fun. My first tournament is in Sheffield in July – I'm really looking forward to it.'

On 9 April the Sherston School Equestrian squad competed at the Malmesbury School-run Show Jumping at Summerhouse Equestrian Centre. The competitions were qualifiers for the NSEA County Championships held at Bury Farm in Buckinghamshire on 26 April. Schools from Avon, Gloucestershire and Wiltshire were competing with the top team and top



individual from each county going through to the championships.

The Sherston School team consisted of Milly Harvey (10) on Baygo, Flora Harant-Lambert (10) on Bruno, Poppy Slade (10) on Rainy and Lucy Peevers (10) on Wizz (kindly lent to Lucy by Willa Gibb while Lucy's pony was sadly in horsepital). In the 70cm class the team managed three double clears and came fourth overall amongst all the counties and were the top team from Wiltshire. So the team will be heading off to Buckinghamshire on 26 April to compete at the championships representing both Sherston School and Wiltshire county.

Another feather in Sherston Schools cap - Eliza Gibb, formerly of Sherston School and now at Malmesbury, was the best Wiltshire individual in the 70cm class and so will also be going to the Championships to represent Malmesbury School and Wiltshire County as an individual.

# Wiltshire Core Strategy Consultation

A consultation has been launched on proposed modifications to a plan which sets out how Wiltshire will grow and develop over the coming years.

Last summer the Wiltshire Core Strategy, which has been developed with communities over the last five years, was scrutinised at public hearing sessions, as part of its examination by an independent government inspector. As a result, the council and the inspector have put forward modifications to some aspects of the plan and local people, businesses and organisations are being asked to comment on these.

The proposed changes include the inspector's modifications to the standalone renewable energy installations policy, in relation to wind turbines and the removal of the saved eastern Westbury bypass policy.

The inspector also proposed increasing the housing numbers in the draft Wiltshire Core Strategy from 37,000 to 42,000. Officers have assessed and identified which areas could accommodate and deliver extra housing and further details are included in the proposed modifications and forms part of the consultation.

### Walk on the wild side

A wildlife extravaganza

After some nine months of planning, Wild Sherston is about to arrive. Inspired by lots of people wanting to know more about our local wildlife, the event has something for everyone - for more details, see the article on page 3 or the Wild Sherston website, www. wildsherston.com.

Hopefully, this will be a celebration of our birds, rivers, plants, etc, with many groups in the village participating, such as the school, church, Grove Wood team, along with many environment-related organisations, such as Wiltshire Wildlife Trust.

Please do come along to the various talks. Kelvin Boot's talk on Friday night (16 May) should prove to be particularly interesting as he is talking about his life as a naturalist in many parts of the world. Tickets are on sale at the post office.

This time of year is wonderful with the first chicks fledging. There are young mistle thrush in Grove Wood and at least two broods of mallard ducklings along the river and, as for the rooks nesting next to the church, it's a bit messy!

Spring is almost over with the bluebells almost finished and most of the trees in leaf. The spring butterflies are flying with both those that overwinter as adults, such as the brimstone, and those that overwinter as pupae and then hatch in the spring, such as the orange tip, around in good numbers.

It promises to be a good year for insects. Ladybirds are around in good numbers so far which will be crucial in keeping the aphids in check. The wet start to the year, together with the mild winter, means that there is a large aphid population already so lots for the ladybirds to eat (did you know there are 600 species of aphid in the country). Last summer ladybirds were very scarce and so far this year I have already seen ten times as many as I did the whole of last year. If we get a good summer this could be a bumper year for all kinds of insects – good and bad.

I hope you are able to join us at Wild Sherston. Tickets and further information will be available at the market in the village hall on 10 May.

## Great War Centenary

As part of Sherston's Great War Project all residents are being encouraged to provide information regarding their relatives who took part during the war either on active service or on the home front. Some fascinating recollections are already coming to light such as this piece recently received from John Hillier

#### THE GREAT WAR 1914-1918 SHERSTON YOUNG FARMER TAKES HIS HORSES TO WAR

My late Uncle Harold Bonner when living at Common Wood Farm, Sherston took not only himself but his two heavy horses and their cart to serve in this war. He thankfully returned alive but with a permanently stiffened leg.

Soon after he returned, marrying my father's sister thus becoming my uncle.

As a young man it was a Christmas tradition for us all to spend an evening together as a family at Lower Farm.

His experiences of this war were never mentioned until the last year of his life. He took me aside and said John that was a scary horrible war I had to take heavy loads of live ammunition from a depot closer to the frontline with my cart. 'Jerry' was frequently shooting at us, apart from giving me this gammy leg he never got me!

My aunt and he farmed at 'Model Dairy' in Noble Street, believe it or not, there were no fewer than 5 tiny herds of dairy cows in the village itself in those days, each having to be milked by hand, it taking anything from 5 to 12 minutes to milk one, depending on the quantity of milk they gave also whether they were considered easy or tough.

After a few years they moved to Reeds Farm, Malmesbury where they farmed its 48 acres. Uncle Harold Bonner became a well-loved figure in the town, prominent in its livestock market held fortnightly in Cross Hayes, where he would arrive with great resolve on his single pedal bike. A fixed foot rest for his "gammy leg" a leather strap providing the uplift on the good one around his ankle.

Amazingly he became captain of the town's cricket club, apparently a good batsman with a permanent 'runner'. When Reeds Farm was built on, the town honoured him then as a Town Councillor by naming an area of his former farm 'Bonners Close'.

### Mini-recycling sites


The success of Wiltshire's kerbside collection of plastic bottles, cardboard, paper, cans, textiles, glass bottles and garden waste has led to a review of the county's mini-recycling sites.

Since the introduction of the new kerbside collections, there has been a sharp fall in the amount of waste being taken to mini-recycling sites, such as those in car parks. As a result, the remaining 126 mini-recycling sites in Wiltshire will be removed. The money saved by reducing this service duplication will be ploughed back into vital council services.

Households across Wiltshire recycled more than 68,000 tonnes last year through the kerbside collections, including garden waste. Of this, 36,000 tonnes came from the black box and blue-lidded bin collections meaning the smaller recycling sites in the county are now used very little – less than 3,000 tonnes is expected to be collected through the minirecycling sites this year.

Signs informing people about the proposed changes will be displayed from early April, and the sites will close from 5 May. Recycling bins will be removed from the site by the end of May.

Any households without a blue-lidded plastic bottle and cardboard bin or a black recycling box, can obtain one by contacting the council on 0300





456 0102 or by visiting Wiltshire Council website at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/newbinform.

Households can have up to two black recycling boxes for recycling paper, glass, cans and textiles. On occasions where households have more recyclables than can fit into two black boxes, the council asks that the extra materials are separated out into carrier bags and placed out for collection alongside the black box (mixed materials may not be collected). Anyone who feels they do not have space for extra bins or boxes can contact the council to discuss alternatives.

Residents who do not currently receive a garden waste collection can also opt-in to this free service by contacting the council or visiting the Wiltshire Council website www.wiltshire.gov.uk

# Castle Combe bike ride




The first friendly fixtures of the season took place at Chipping Sodbury on Easter Saturday with a defeat by five wickets.


