History Lecture – Edmund Ironside



IRONSIDES – v – VIKINGS

King Edmund – v - King Knut by David McDermott, Lecturer in Early Medieval History at Winchester University

Come along to discover some of the background of the Battle of Sherston 1016.

Compared to some other Anglo-Saxon kings, there are very few sources for the life and reign of King Edmund Ironside. He was the third son of King AEthelred 'the Unready' and his first wife AElfgifu. When Edmund's older brother Athelstan died in 1014, Edmund became AEthelred's obvious successor. When Edmund became king, England was already under renewed attacks from the Vikings and the loyalties of the nobles were divided.

Edmund was a brave and able general, a determined soldier but also he could be headstrong. He went against his father's wishes by removing Aldgyth, the widow of the powerful nobleman Sigeferth, from confinement in Malmesbury and marrying her. Edmund and Aldgyth had two sons, Edward and Edmund, probably twins.

England had been free of the Romans for 550 years but by 1016 was only 50 years from the Norman invasion. The religion of Anglo-Saxon England was Roman Catholic and the official language of the Church was Latin. However, the majority of the population was illiterate and spoke only Old English, similar to Frisian today.


Sherston Open Gardens Weekend: 20/21 June

Get ready for Summer! Fun in the Sun

Fun in the Sun is a fun activity programme for children, delivered by Wiltshire Council's Sports Development team, and provides regular sports sessions for young people in rural locations across the county. Sports provided change on a week-byweek basis but will include football, dodgeball, tag rugby, tennis, rounders, athletics and team activities. Fun in the Sun is suitable for children aged between five and 11 years and they must bring with them a completed consent form (a form can be collected and completed at their first session of attendance). Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis, and we suggest that children bring with them a hat and water bottle if it's sunny. If there is the possibility of wet weather, please encourage children to bring along a waterproof coat.

The Sherston sessions start on the Recreation Ground, on Wednesday 29 July and on the following Wednesdays 5, 12 and 19 August, from 10.00am to 11.30am. The parish council is supporting the scheme not only by allowing the use of the recreation ground but also by hiring the scout hut to provide toilet and changing facilities, as well as indoor space should the weather prove unsuitable.

In Depth – A healthy diet could cut the risk of Alzheimer's disease

There is so much in the news these days about dementia and Alzheimer's and an array of advice about what you should do. This is a short extract from the NHS Choices website that suggests that, according to a new study reported by the Mail Online, 'A new diet could more than halve a person's risk of developing Alzheimer's disease'.

Researchers looked at the effects of three diets on the risk of developing Alzheimer's disease. These were:

a standard Mediterranean-type diet;

the Dietary Approach to Stop Hypertension diet

(DASH) – designed to reduce blood pressure; and the Mediterranean-DASH Intervention for Neurodegenerative Delay (MIND) – this combines elements of the Mediterranean diet and the DASH diet.

The study found older people whose usual diet was close to any one of these three healthy diets were less likely to develop Alzheimer's disease than those eating less healthily.

The researchers say they found the greatest effect from the MIND diet, which is rich in green leafy vegetables, wholegrains, nuts and berries, even if people didn't follow it closely. Participants who did stick rigorously to the MIND diet were 52% less likely to be diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

This large observational study can't show that the diets protected against Alzheimer's, only that there seems to be a link between eating a healthy diet and a lower risk of getting Alzheimer's disease. The three diets weren't compared directly, so we can't be sure which one is best.




