Strangles – Cliff paths still closed

EMERGENCY CLOSURE OF ALL FOOTPATHS OVER THE CLIFF

With immediate effect all access to the Cliff and the hill opposite has been halted

Due to an outbreak of Strangles, a serious respiratory tract infection for horses, footpaths Sherston 21 and 22 have been closed to reduce the spread of infection.

The footpath from Sopworth Lane to Stretchline and the footpath from the 30 mph signs to up over the hill (opposite the Cliff) are closed. Please do not walk along the river west of Brook Hill.

Please do not walk in this area until further notice

Footpath 22 north from Sopworth Lane to the Water tower is open and footpaths on the Grove Wood side of the B4040 are open.

The local outbreak of strangles has resulted in the death of one horse and another horse is now ill. To reduce the likely spread of the disease, it is important that the paths on the Cliff (22 south and 21) remain closed and unused.

Strangles is one of the most common equine diseases in the UK. It is a highly contagious infection of the upper respiratory tract caused by the bacteria Streptococcus equinus. A range of bacteria from the same family causes illnesses such as sore throats, scarlet fever and sinusitis in humans, although the disease does not transfer between horse and human.

A horse with strangles will have a runny nose, and painful abscesses may develop on the sides of the head and inside throat, which may cause difficulty eating or extending the head, due to the discomfort in the throat, hence the name strangles.

Strangles is mainly spread between horses by direct contact or shared environments, such as water troughs, with discharge from any draining abscesses being highly infectious. It can also be transferred via a third party, such as people's hands or clothing, or tack and yard equipment. The strangles bacteria will not be blown far in the wind, unlike some viruses (such as foot and mouth), but it is possible that walkers will pick up the virus from one field and transfer it to another field and for this reason paths close to an affected yard are closed.

Sherston's 'Clean for the Queen' will take place on Sunday 10 July, ahead of Boules Day (Saturday 16 July) to ensure the village is tidy for this major event. Litter-picking equipment will be available for free and we are looking for groups to volunteer to help with the 'Clean'. Sherston Velo 1016 – 2016 Solstice Challenge

Now an annual tradition for Sherston Velo, on the weekend closest to the summer solstice riders set out on a challenge that aims to take full advantage of the longest day of the year. Previous years have seen progressively longer rides, with double and even triple centuries tumbling. This year sees something a little different to commemorate a very special year for the village. On 18 June, the Velo will be grouping up and leaving the village with a mass start at 10.16am (ie 1016), with an aim to complete a lap of Wiltshire (around 140 miles) and return by 8.16pm (ie 2016) the same evening for some fun and games at the Rattlebone. There are different rides for all club members, from 20 miles up to the full distance. The 140-mile route is by no means compulsory and each group will reform with the other members to ensure a mass finish at 20.16. 

Neil Forster A Remarkable Life

Members of Sherston PROBUS will remember the talks that Neil gave about his life and times. Such was the variety and richness of his biography that by the end of three talks he had only managed to get to his 60th year! Those of us who were privileged to hear him were treated to remarkable stories and anecdotes covering the time before he came to Sherston. It is very difficult to précis such a history, but in brief:-

He won a scholarship to the Byam Shaw Art School and then set up in London with a studio-cumapartment in London, becoming friends with many of the Chelsea set. He supplemented his income with work as a bartender. In 1966 he went to the south of France to launch the opening of a friend's gallery there, staying on for a year, largely as the guest of various friends. He then led a peripatetic life travelling from one commission to another; Spain, France, Ireland, America, Kuwait, Norfolk before he found 'home' in Sherston. It was here he married Penny Mitchell, in the leap year of 2000, asking her to pop the question to him!

He also came to know the Prince of Wales and stayed regularly in Scotland on painting tutorials, passing on his knowledge and techniques. A bond, through art, developed into a strong and caring relationship; the Prince of Wales taking a close interest in Neil's work and welfare.

It is said that Neil was one of the finest animal painters of his time and it is true he carved out a special niche for himself. 'I can't think,' says Chris Beetles, whose gallery represented him for several years, 'of any more talented pastel portraitist, either of people or of animals, since the Second World War. His gifts were sublime'.



We were all aware we had a very special talent in our midst but it was not so much his art that



attracted our attention. It was his very presence. He was everyone's friend; he greeted people with a personal warmth that was irresistible. This greeting would usually start with a massive hug which made the recipient feel that he or she was the most important person in Neil's life. After the hug, there would be engaging conversation, humour, laughter and perhaps if you were lucky an anecdote or two from his colourful life.

However, more than this was the work he did on behalf of the village. There was Sherston Magna Cricket Club (SMCC), which he almost single-handedly revived. He kept wicket, batted and fielded with skill and enthusiasm, characteristics which he would pass on to the many young players he coached after he retired from playing. His coaching concentrated on the ethics, good manners and sportsmanship of the game of cricket as much as on the technique. He continued to be an ardent supporter of the club and nothing gave him greater pleasure than seeing 'one of his boys' perform. Talking of performance those of you who were there, will not forget his participation in the 'Smile Out Loud' evening where he enthralled the audience with his stories and played a major role in an event which raised much needed seed money to ensure the installation of nets at Pinkney Park. He kept a close association with SMCC and in 2014 was elected President.

He participated in all village activities with enthusiasm. He was an omnipresent figure on Boules day and a keen supporter of those involved in its organisation and promotion. Mangold Hurling, Sherston Probus, the Arts Festival and other activities which benefited the community were all on his agenda. He was often asked to provide one of his paintings for auction to support a good cause and he was always generous in his gift.

Through all the changes of his life, the one constant was people's affection for him. His friends and acquaintances loved him for his company and he will be greatly missed by all of us. He would be pleased to know that we are there to support Penny in what is a very difficult time for her.



Walk on the wild side Spring is everywhere



Swallows and house martins have arrived, chiffchaffs are singing having just arrived from West Africa (that's one in the picture taken near Grove Wood) and everything is frothing with spring. A chiffchaff weighs just seven grams - the same as a pound coin - and flies all that way. Isn't that quite an amazing feat?! The swifts should be here soon - for me it's the iconic summer bird with small flocks shrieking up and down the High Street.

After keeping an eye out for a couple of years, I have finally seen water voles in the river near Grove

Wood. Usually they are so fast and disappear with a splash before you see them but this time I saw them swimming down the river. Kingfishers are back and very active.

For the past few weeks, I have had a camera trap out in gardens and along the river to see if the otter is around. As yet it hasn't been spotted but lots of other birds and animals are around, such as the muntjac deer in the photo. The Chinese Reeve's muntiac been introduced to this country, with a population being released from Woburn Abbey in

the 1920s. They have spread to such an extent that they could be the most common deer in England.

Finally - an antidote to the European Vote on the 23 June!! – there will be a number of talks in the village hall at 7.30pm from Butterfly Conservation, Wiltshire Ornithological Society and the Bristol Avon River Trust on many aspects of our local wildlife and natural environment. You can vote in the small hall and pop round to the big hall for something quite different and everyone is welcome - even if you are an 'innie' or an 'outie'!!





At the Sign of The Crippled Harlequin

A Thriller by Norman Robbins

In early April, audiences in the village hall were captivated by Sherston Drama Group's staging of the Norman Robbins' thriller At the Sign of the Crippled Harlequin. Debut director Finlay Evans, mentored by Kirstie Blair, marshalled his cast so skilfully in this difficult play that several audience members commented that the play reached a new high level of professionalism for SDG productions (which are already high, of course). The play centred round Peak Lodge, a small guesthouse owned by the Lockwood family. Georgina Evans as Sally Lockwood gave a convincing portrait of a decent woman trying to make ends meet, while newcomer Geoff Colvin was spot-on as her husband Bryan, desperately trying to keep the guesthouse going and keep his wife's spirits up, while humouring the guests. And what a set of guests! All of them had some hidden issue which was revealed as the play progressed. Youngest actor Sarah Cowell radiated tranquillity as the oldest character, Marjory Pike, but was dramatically killed at the end of Act I. Sue Ormiston applied her usual skill to the largest part, Pamela Seaton, a jolly middleaged rambler who turns out to be a jewel thief on







the side. Her partner in crime, the highly-strung Isobel Clarke (Sue Lehrer), turned up unexpectedly, and the bickering between the two was a joy to listen to. Nicola Pearce-Smith, new to Sherston though an experienced actress, employed a superb Sheffield accent in her portrait of Joan Reece, the sharptongued skank with terrible taste in clothes, while Mark Andrews had fun as flashy, boastful, profane husband Lionel. Finally, Drama Group veteran Andi Hunte effectively portrayed the mentally unstable Derek, bringing the play to its dramatic conclusion. Richard Warren prompted, but not very often; Ewan Blair set up the lights and Paul Ormiston operated them and the sound system; Dawn Jago supervised make-up; Sue Ormiston painted a superb portrait of Jemmy Junkins, the harlequin of the title; and the cast between them constructed the outstanding set. The support team – too numerous to mention here (but still much appreciated) - ran front of house. Look out for another play at the same time next year. But before that it's the pantomime – the dates are 26-29 October – watch this space for announcements!


