Private 26322 William Evans

6th Batt Duke of Edinburgh's Wiltshire Regiment

Who died aged 31

Friday 11th May 1917

Son of E and W D Evans of Sherston and husband of E G Evans, Brook Hill, Sherston

Remembered with Honour, Lijssenhoek Cemetery, Poperinghe, West Flanders, Belgium

Died of Wounds

Pte W Evans, Wilts Regiment, son of Mr William Evans, shoemaker, of Sherston, has died of wounds in France, the sad event occurring on May 11th. He leaves a widow and three children. Mrs Evans is a daughter of Mr William Walker, The Common, Minety. The late Pte Evans was, before he joined the army, gardener to Admiral and the Hon Mrs R R Neeld, Twatly House, and lived at the lodge. His father, who was born in Italy, was one of the first of the Wiltshire Volunteers and a pioneer in the movement. For many years he served as a sergeant and did much for the Volunteers as any man. Even now he takes a keen interest in Volunteering and, whenever he has the opportunity, delights in watching a parade. Much sympathy is felt for the widow and children as well as for Mr W Evans. North Withs Herald, 18 May 1917.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 11 May.

BIOLAGE

Defibrillator Access Codes

You should find (in this copy of Cliffhanger) a small tag with the access code for all three defibrillators (Sherston, Pinkney and Willesley).

Normally the cabinets are locked to prevent vandalism and theft, and the ambulance service give out the code when necessary. However they have now decided not to to give out the code to any incident more that 200m from the defibrillator; their worry is that someone may drive to collect it and, while distressed, cause an accident. This recently resulted in it not being available for an incident at the school (fortunately a false alarm).

The council's view is that since the majority of people here live some distance from a defibrillator, they are useless unless they are available to everyone, and so as a compromise between security and availability we're providing each household with a tag. The ambulance service are happy for us to do this - so perhaps they are more worried about who takes responsibility if something does happen!

We must therefore stress that by using the tag for the access code, if anyone decides to drive to collect a defibrillator they take responsibility for that decision.

Remember the key step is to dial 999 first and follow the responders instructions. If needed a second person (if available) should fetch the defibrillator.

We are also looking at setting up a telephone system that will call an available neighbour to come and help if there is only one person with the casualty.

Temporary Closure of: B4040 (Part) Brook Hill / High Street / Church Street / Easton Town, Sherston (Ref: TTRO 4797) 12-18 May

Notice is hereby given that Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic:

B4040 (Part) Brook Hill / High Street / Church Street / Easton Town, Sherston; from a point approximately 70m west of its junction with Grove Road in a northeasterly direction for a distance of approximately 2.2km (to a point adjacent to Pinkney Mill, Pinkney).

To enable: Wiltshire Council to carry out carriageway reconstruction, surface dressing and road markings.

Alternative route: via B4040 Luckington Road / Sherston Road / The Street – Acton Turville – C71 – A46 – A433 – B4014 (Malmesbury) – C68 Tetbury Hill / Gloucester Road – B4040 Bristol Road / Bransdown Hill / Easton Town (unaffected length) and vice versa.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order which previously came into operation on 6 February will now recommence on 12 May and it is anticipated that the closure will be required daily between the hours of 7.00am and 6.00pm until 18 May 2017. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works. The Order has a maximum duration of 18 months.

Walk on the wild side

Spring is in full song with many trees in leaf and meadows ready for grazing. The swallows have arrived in number and the swifts should be here in about three weeks. Locally, we get three species of these aerial masters, the third being the house martin, which should arrive in the next week or so (assuming the weather doesn't turn too cold as the forecast suggests).

The swift is the largest, with long swept-back wings, is all black and shrieks as it flies, often in small flocks. The swallow has a white chest and belly, with a red face and two long streaming tail feathers (see picture), while the house martin has a white rump and no red face and a short tail.



We get other migrants passing through from west and east Africa to travel further north such as the ring ouzel and the osprey. The latter has been seen many times at the fishing lakes at Great Somerford which are kind of a service station on their journey that only serves fish! We may well see them over the village.

Another returning migrant is the hobby – the smallest falcon in the UK which is incredibly agile in the air. Its prey is dragonflies and house martins. The

area around the Cliff in Sherston is a good place to see one later in the summer when there are lots of house martins flying around. A random but interesting fact is that the Latin name for the hobby is Falco subbuteo (in the same way we humans are homo sapiens). In 1947, when Peter Adolph was inventing a new game of table football, he wanted to call it hobby but was advised by the Patent Office it was too generic. Being a committed birdwatcher, he looked up the Latin name of the hobby and the rest is history – that's a good pub quiz question!

One bird we may see in the village for the first time in the next few years is the hoopoe. It's becoming more common in England as our summers get warmer and it was seen in Castle Coombe a couple of years ago. It's a very distinctive bird especially the head (see picture).



Finally - as mentioned in the last edition - I will be running a dawn chorus walk around the village on Saturday 29 April at 5.00am - weather permitting! Meet outside the Tolsey Surgery with wellies, warm clothes and a torch! We will be walking along the Cliff and maybe into Grove Wood and should finish by 6.30am. Wildlife in Wiltshire Churchyards and Cemeteries - Annual Seminar and Bishop's Award

Those people throughout Wiltshire who work to make their local churchyards and burial grounds places where wildlife can flourish will be holding their Annual Seminar on Saturday 13 May at All Saints Church, Broad Chalke in the south of Wiltshire from 10.00am to 3.30pm

As well as looking at the work which is being carried out in Broad Chalke churchyard, visitors will hear two speakers. The Right Reverend Nicholas Holtham, Bishop of Salisbury, who is the Church of England's lead bishop for environmental affairs, will talk on 'The Living Churchyard, the Environment and the Living Churchyard'. He will also present annual awards to the churchyards which are part of the Wiltshire project. Sherston is one and you can see our award certificates on display in the porch at Holy Cross. 
This year's proud winner of the junior competition was James Hulme, with a very good time of 1'28'. Alex Moriarty was second, with a time of 1'48'. The







So put it in the diary – Saturday June 3rd at 'The Old Rifle Range – Sherston' and 'Keep The Faith'!!



WI Report



A history of Scorranstone

Sherston WI enjoyed a talk on the history of Sherston given by Cilla Liddington, a native of the village whose family has lived here for many generations. Scorranstone meaning 'bright and shining stone' was the original name and the village has been traced to the 9th century. Expansion of the village took place in the late 12th century and sometime before 1241 it was given borough status and a Tuesday weekly market was granted to a Matthew Bezill. A terrible fire in the winter of 1510 destroyed the main street of the village when the houses would have been timber framed with thatched roofs and the nearest water supply at the bottom of Brook Hill.

The first houses to be rebuilt were Balcony House and Church House which housed the poor of the village. Cilla told us many fascinating facts backed up by old photographs and pictures and there was a lot of reminiscing at WI that evening.

At the meeting on 4th May we will be hearing about Julia's House in Devizes, the first children's hospice to be built in Wiltshire and to which SHoCC gave their carol singing collection in December.

The June meeting has a speaker whose talk is entitled 'Dragons and Rescue Dogs.' Debi Evans is an author of children's books. We are always pleased to welcome visitors to our meetings and would ask you to pay £3.50 which will include some refreshments.

Managing Demand in General Practice

We are finding it more and more difficult to manage the demand for appointments in General Practice, and this is not just here in Sherston, but nationwide. It is estimated that over 90% of all NHS contacts take place in primary care. Whilst there are conflicting views about what is causing the increasing workloads for GPs, the solutions are few and far between. What can we do to help ensure that appointments are used in the most appropriate way? At least part of the solution may be in reducing avoidable demand for GP appointments.

Research carried out by the New NHS Alliance shows that significant numbers of patients could have been directed to others in the practice, such as the nurse; could have used self-care without clinical




