## Sherston Footpaths

Sherston is a great place for country walks, and a number of good ones can be found online at sherstonwalks.org.uk or in the walks book (available from the Post Office). However, not everyone finds it easy to climb over stiles, be it because of reduced mobility or the accompaniment of younger children. Therefore the Sherston Footpath Group have ensured that one route is stile-free. We managed to get a grant of £500 from Wiltshire Council Malmesbury Area Board, and matched it with funds from group members and the Parish Council. This has been used to replace the four

stiles on the Commonwood Lane walk with two each of kissing and self-closing gates that are much easier to use. The overall walk is about four miles of reasonably flat ground along lanes and across fields - give it a go!

Many thanks to Cllr John Thompson, Footpaths Officer Steve Leonard, the two farmers on whose land the gates are, and members of the footpath committee for their efforts in supporting this.

## WI Report



At our meeting on 5 April, we heard from Mark Kitchen of Team Rubicon UK. Team Rubicon originated in the USA to utilise the skills of armed forces veterans to assist in national disasters – floods, hurricanes, etc – and, as this assistance widened to include international disasters, other teams were established. The UK operation was set up in 2015. Members of the teams now include first responders, such as paramedics, as well as ex-service personnel.

Mark talked specifically about Hurricane Irma, the largest ever Atlantic hurricane, which hit the Caribbean in September 2017, and how Team Rubicon helped in the British Virgin Islands. Using slides to remind us of the devastation the weather caused to that island, he described it as looking like a war zone and how the local inhabitants were, understandably, totally shell-shocked. This added to the complexity of getting decisions made by the local government as to how the charities and other teams who had flown in could most usefully help the islands begin to recover. Team Rubicon were assigned responsibility to get school premises up and running to allow some semblance of normality to return for the children and, in turn, the parents. The challenges in doing this were not simply

the heat and the humidity of the working environment but also of harnessing the skills of the local population and volunteers to utilise the materials available to create a safe and secure building for use as a school. Twentynine classrooms were created within a building and an astroturf sports field was also provided.

The challenge remains for the Caribbean islands affected by Hurricane Irma to remove all the debris resulting from the event, which may not be possible in all cases due to the extent of the damage, and to restore the natural environment and economy of the islands. Tourism, which is a factor in all the islands' economies, and particularly so for the British Virgin Islands where 96% of the GDP and 84% of the employment is directly attributable to tourism, is slowly beginning to recover.

Mark also explained that, although Team Rubicon's prime responsibility is to respond to disasters, if funds permit, they will also get involved in other specific operations. For example, they had assisted an American charity to build kitchen facilities in a Ugandan Refugee Settlement which allowed 22,000 children to get a hot meal every day. In return, the children all had to attend the schools in the Settlement which starts to provide hope for the future for them. Team Rubicon has also assisted in UK events, such as the flooding in Coverack.

Looking forward to 3 May, we will be hearing from Margaret and Gerald Hull on 'The Shell - ancient symbol and decorative feature within the English house and garden'. Please note this meeting will be in the village hall. On 7 June, Pam Baldry will be speaking to us about 'Glass'.

# Dire Easter weather brings on an evening of 'Dutch Courage' at The Angel

Maundy Thursday saw a group of 50 converge for the first of what is to be a series of food and drink tastings to be held at The Angel in conjunction with Balcony Wines. Given the wet weather, it was fitting that the theme for the first evening would be a gin tasting, gin having first come to the UK in the 1600s as the 'Dutch Courage' that our navel troops noted the Dutch sailors were taking for courage and its perceived warming properties!

Dave Nelson, Manager at The Angel, and Neil Perry and Paul Cuss of Balcony Cellars wanted to put on an evening of entertainment that set itself apart from the usual drink tastings. Paul Cuss and Phil Clark, Head Chef at The Angel, devised a menu of food to accompany each gin, with such pairings as Kirkuvagr (Kirk-u-vaar) from The Orkney Islands matched with shashimi with mooli, Tarquins from Cornwall with mackeral cerviche, and Garden Tiger Gin from Cirencester with duck croquettes with blood orange. Once the food disappeared at each serving, people had time to 'play' with the orange, lime, mint, strawberries and grapefruit at each table - trying out both the suggested pairings and their own pairings with each gin.

Neil Perry made a valiant attempt to call everyone to order to deliver some insight into each gin as it was



served. However, by the time the final gin for the night – Brennan & Brown Ginger Gin paired with lemon syllabub and ginger brandysnap – was being poured, the attention level had decreased somewhat in relation to the increasing decibel level in the room! Following all six tastings and a vote on the top three gins of the night, everyone had a chance to try some seconds of their favourite gins. The only pause thereafter was when Ella Moriarty drew the winners for the raffle – first prize being a magnum of Tarquins with a pair of specialist gin glasses.

There have been numerous enquiries as to whether we will be running another gin tasting and we are pleased to say that we have set aside Friday 25 May with reservations being taken at Balcony Cellars and The Angel. Numbers are strictly limited, however, so get your names down now. The bottom three gins from the vote will be substituted with fresh contenders for the title of Sherston's 'Gin of The Year'. The current leader, after the first tasting, is Garden Tiger made by Barney Wilczak in Stratton, Cirencester. We shall look to invite the winner to a special tasting and insight into the production of their gin sometime later this year.

The churches of the Gauzebrook Group will be collecting for Christian Aid again during this week, which has been going for more than 60 years and is the principal fundraiser for the charity. In Sherston, a band of volunteers will be posting red collection envelopes through your door and coming back to collect them later in the week. Please receive the collectors kindly and give what you can.

It may seem that this is an outdated way of collecting donations; I can remember when there were several door-to-door collections in the village each year, but they seem to have fallen out of fashion. The many gifts people give, however small they may be, add up to several thousand pounds each year in our area. This amount will enable Christian Aid to carry out significant work for their #StandTogether campaign, designed to help some of the world's poorest people to build homes that will withstand the extremes of violent weather, such as hurricanes.

After recent revelations about misconduct by charity workers, you may question whether Christian Aid is a cause to which you should donate. In an open letter, which you can read on Christian Aid's website, Martin Birch, Chief Operating Officer of Christian Aid said: 'We cannot let the actions of a few individuals stop us from reaching out to those most in need.' If people stop donating, it isn't the charities that suffer but the desperately poor people who are helped by them.

Jesus called on his followers to 'love God and love your neighbour'. This verse from the New Testament sums up what Christian Aid is all about: 'Let us love, not in word or speech but in truth and action' (1 John 3:18). This month, we will be acting to show our love for our neighbours in the poorest parts of the world – please act with us.








# We have some exciting news for the Recreation Ground!




Sherston benefits from a wonderful playground at the Recreation Ground. Sadly, a number of items are very old and in constant need of repair. Over the past year, members of the Parish Council and the community have been putting together plans to replace, renew and expand our facility. Having taken advice from several play companies and engaged with the main likely users, we have, subject to obtaining the relevant permissions, finalised our plan and we are now in a position to share this with the village.

Sherston is in a very unique fortunate position of having been given a large sum of money from the estate of Mrs North to be spent on benefiting the young people of the village. It has been left to the Parish Council to determine how this is done. Accordingly, the Council has resolved, in accordance with the Norths' wishes, to use this money for the benefit of the youth of Sherston and to use it on capital projects that create a lasting legacy for all the young people of Sherston. The Council has resolved to invest around 50% of this fund (up to £150,000) in this project because it is entirely open to all, having huge benefits for the whole community whether that is two year olds, teenagers, school children, disabled children, able children, and of course their families too. This will give us a fully inclusive, central village space that will benefit every child of the village now and for many years to come.

#### So what will change?

 The timber trail, net climber, basket swing and zip wire will remain as they are - they are newer items and in a good state of repair.



- The existing tower units, swings, seesaw and springer will be removed. We will be replacing these with fabulous new units.
- We will also be adding some exciting new items that have a wealth of 'play value' that will challenge and stimulate our youngsters.
- We will add some more seating, so parents, grandparents and carers have somewhere to have picnics or rest up while the children are entertaining themselves.
- We will also be installing
   a Multi Use Games Arena
   toward the opposite side
   of the Recreation Ground.
   The Arena will be marked
   out for football, netball and
   basketball. It will allow our
   youngsters and teenagers the
   opportunity to learn new
   games, make new friends and
   develop their skills.
- The Arena will be flanked by some grass banks (around 0.7m high) for playing, picnics, or spectating, and there will also be a shelter for taking cover.

The Recreation Ground is a wonderful open green space that we are lucky to have. Although this proposal will include a tarmac surface in the Arena, it is important to say this area represents less than 4% of the total Recreation Ground area. This area will create a more usable space on the Recreation Ground for ball games.

The plans are truly amazing, and we are excited to present them to the village. We will have the plans on display in the village hall on Sunday 13 May from 2.00pm until 4.00pm and again at the Annual Parish Meeting on Thursday 17 May in the village hall at 7.30pm. Please come along and see them.
