Healthy Schools Plus award for Sherston!



Sherston Primary School has been officially recognised for its outstanding work to encourage children to look after their physical and mental health.

The Healthy Schools Plus awards scheme is a threeyear government initiative funded by NHS Wiltshire. It requires schools to identify key issues for health and wellbeing, and implement a programme of improvement to meet targets.

Tackling childhood obesity was one of the themes chosen by the school. The aim was to increase the number of children bringing in a healthy packed lunch. There has been a well-documented revolution in the quality of school dinners, instigated by Jamie Oliver's campaign 'Feed me Better' back in 2005. But the Government's new guidelines, introduced in 2006, don't cover food brought in from home. In 2010, research by The Children's Food Trust found that packed lunches are often high in sugar, salt and fat.

The approach by some schools is to 'police' packed lunches. Packets of crisps are removed and a note is left for parents, to remind them that crisps aren't allowed under the school's healthy eating policy. At Sherston, staff have tried to get the message across in a different way, by educating and encouraging children to make good choices, and by making healthy eating fun.

Lara Farahar, who teaches Year 4, asked the children to complete a survey on what was in their packed lunches. She then ran a competition for pupils who designed and labelled a picture of a nutritionally balanced packed lunch. Rosie Shephard was the successful winner for her entry; a ham salad sandwich made with wholemeal bread, raw vegetables, fresh fruit with yoghurt, and water to drink. Lara made salads with Year 5 which they took around the school for other pupils to try. She also worked with Busy Hands Pre School, with the aim of reaching younger children soon to join the primary school. Two years later, the numbers of pupils bringing in a healthy lunch had almost doubled.

The school caterers – ABM – have been fully supportive of the initiative. Recently they ran a successful bread-making workshop and taught children how to make wholemeal bread without sugar or salt.

They've run food days from around the world, so when the focus was Australia, children had the opportunity to make dampers and taste different fruits.

The Healthy Schools Plus programme is about far more than just healthy eating. It's about keeping children safe, and improving mental health and wellbeing.

Suzanne Price, the reception class teaching assistant, is also the school's leader in First Aid. As part of the scheme, pupils from Year 5 and above are given the opportunity to do First Aid Training. The course consists of practical scenarios which teach children to deal with someone who is ill or involved in an accident. They also learn how to look after a casualty,



put someone in the recovery position, and deal with choking and asthma attacks.

Those taking part achieved a 100% pass rate, and some pupils have furthered their skills by entering the St John Ambulance Young First Aider competition, a national event open to all schools.

To improve pupil's wellbeing, there is now a chillout zone in the Environment area, where pupils can find some peace, away from the busy playground, and have quiet time. Some classes have set up their own reflective areas as part of Religious Education.

With its targets exceeded, the staff are eager to ensure that all children joining the school benefit from the programme. And barely having paused for breath, the team are thinking of ideas for the next level of achievement. The Silver award. Watch this space.

The Story of Sherston's first BIG ART installation...

Sherston's first BIG ART project appeared at the British School Room during the Sherston Arts Festival: the peg village. There was one simple aim: to encourage children to get involved in art. And they did, with 75 beautiful artworks, over 100 pegs and a wonderful model village!



Our first stop was Sherston Brownies who were invited to make some of the buildings. Over three weeks, they glued, got messy with papier-mâché and painted everything from stables to a roman temple. They approached the project with amazing enthusiasm every week and it was a real lesson in just going for it. They added lots of fun along the way - even building a swimming pool in the school (what do you think FSS!?!).

Next stop was Busy Hands Pre School who created their own little mini village in the Busy Hands Close which you may have seen in the post office window during POP. The preschoolers loved making the buildings and peg people - showing lots of imagination to make their own little world.

We also paid a visit to SherstonToddlers - even if you can't hold a paintbrush, you can still create art. We provided the planes and they provided the colour; lots of aeroplanes and a lovely hanger to store them all in Sherston's first airport!

The Sherston Craft Group completed the village with structural trees and gardens. Each one was an individual work of art created with wire and tissue paper. With details such as lawn mowers, pretty gardens and fruit, it really brought the village together beautifully.





But who could we ask to fill the village? We wanted to get as many children involved as possible so we gave each pupil at Sherston Primary School a peg person and a few scraps of material to hopefully spark their imagination. The pegs were interpreted in so many amazing ways - from knights to pandas and everything else in between. We loved that each one had its own personality, bringing the village to life. Thank you to James Pyle & Co estate agents for sponsoring the whole project and enabling us to distribute over 200 peg people. Thank you also to Mrs John Matthews for providing the art prizes.

With a few final touches (and a lot of green paint), the peg village was filled and there you have it – Sherston's first BIG ART project. A real collaborative work of art!

Thank you to every young person who contributed their time and fantastic creativity to this project and also to those who entered their wonderful artwork.

Finally, well done to all the Sherston Arts Festival winners: Martha Dennis, Lottie Ravenhill, James Hulme, Amelia Fuller, Dylan Daybell, Solomon Pitt, Honor Llewellen Palmer, Bess Porch, Darcy Bishop More, Grace Strachan, Ben and Amalie Gray, Ava Bekarian and Digby Munson. Congratulations must also go to William Hulme for his roller-skating dog picture - the first young artist ever to sell a painting at the festival!

Sherston Arts Festival 2013

This year's Arts Festival started with the Preview Evening in the church, with a record number of paintings and artworks submitted to the Art Exhibition and stunning flower displays on the theme of 'Best of British'. The Festival was opened by the Rev. Hugh Thomson Glover, a painter himself, who was vicar of Sherston from 1976 to 1993 and a founder of both the Arts Festival and the Boules competition in the 1980s.

The first weekend saw a host of activities from jewellery-making and the Young Musicians' Concert to the visit by Clydebuilt Puppet Theatre with Peter and the Wolf – a great way to spend a wet Sunday afternoon with the children. The Scarecrow Trail, with a bumper number of 29 scarecrows, suffered a little in the inclement weather, but still attracted over 70 families over the first weekend. European cinema A new course for wea in Sherston starts this month

This introduction to the language of film aims to help the development of knowledge and critical skills better to understand how films work.

The significance of the different elements of filmmaking will be considered through a survey of European cinema from its origins at the end of the 19th century to the present.

Key movements explored will include Surrealism; French Poetic Realism; Italian Neo-realism, etc. It will encompass the work of many notable European directors as well as British directors working in the UK. Students will learn about what constitutes cinematic 'style' and how the making and interpretation of films is informed by specific social and historical contexts.

The course also aims to explain how film-making has developed as an industry and as an art form in Europe over the past 100 years. It will consider questions like 'Are European films different from American films?', and 'How important is cinema to European culture?'

Each session will incorporate visual presentations including the screening of clips from films to support the study and discussion of specific topics.

Walk on the wild side

Something quizzical...

We are now into the full flow of autumn with long queues at Westonbirt. The deciduous trees drop their leaves as a response to shorter days and less sun so the 'cost' to the tree of maintaining its leaves is greater than the benefit it receives. The tree forms a layer of dead cells (called an Abscission layer) at the base of each leaf so it drops off. The leaves fall to the ground and start to make compost for following years while the tree shuts down for the winter ready for the spring.

The birds are also changing their behaviour now that they have finished their post-breeding moult. Many of the birds that stay here over the winter go into a full moult once the last chicks have fledged so during September they tend to skulk amongst the bushes keeping out of the way of predators as they can't fly as well. They grow a new set of wing and body feathers ready for the winter. Birds that are very territorial during the summer, such as great tits, become very social during the winter.

Recent research on winter flocks of great tits has shown that individual behaviours affect their social lives. A project in Oxfordshire was able to identify great tits that were bold and those that were shy. The birds were electronically tagged and introduced into a new environment with sunflower feeders (which could read the tags). They found the bold birds tended to associate with other bold birds, while the shy birds also

If you see a flock of great tits (which can be up to 40 individuals) have a guess if they are a bold group or a shy one. Bear in mind that we have five different species of tit around the village - the great and blue tits, which you will regularly see on the bird feeders, coal tits, which may occasionally appear, long tail tits, which tend to stay out in the countryside in flocks of 10-20 and the scarce march tit (which I have seen in Grove Wood - see picture).

The plans for Wild Sherston are in hand, set for 17 and 18 May 2014, with Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, Butterfly Conservation and the Wiltshire Ornithological Society, amongst others, participating.



Finally, the second contribution to the Sherston Museum of Slightly Odd Things has arrived (following the rabbit skull a couple of months ago) the identification of which forms the first ever quiz in the column. In September, Pat Smith, who lives in Wood Close, found her curly garden hose had been chewed through. As you can see from the picture (with a lens cover to give a sense of scale), something has gone to some effort to chew it to bits. Any insights as to what may have caused this, please let me know (geoff_carss@hotmail.com or 840995) - the prize is a mention in next month's edition!. 


Community Transport Meeting

Meanwhile Busy Hands also have their plans firmly rooted in nature as they finish their new outdoor area which will now include new fencing, forest school tools, a tree hideaway, murals and a mud pie kitchen. Toddlers will be using the donations to reinvigorate the experiences on offer, including two new toddler height craft tables and a play kitchen - plus the donation will secure their future for the next few years. Each of these investments will really add to every child in Sherston's future and they will continue to add value for many years to come. No longer a liability

'Ancient laws could land you with a hefty bill to repair your local church – and the clergy are racing to claim their cash', read a rather alarming headline in the Sunday Times last year.

This headline referred to Chancel Repair Liability (CRL), an ancient law which gives churches the right to call upon certain landowners to contribute towards the repair of the chancel of a church. Usually this will be their local church, but that is not always the case. You may have been told by your mortgage provider that you must take out insurance against CRL.

In a long legal case which ended in 2003, a family in Warwickshire had to sell their farm house to pay CRL and years of legal bills. Although they lost their case against CRL, it brought about a change in the law. Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) were given ten years to find out about the CRL position in their parishes and decide what to do about it. By 13 October 2013, to be eligible to collect CRL in the future, PCCs had to register land affected by CRL with the Land Registry.

Sherston PCC has spent well over a year researching the situation as far as Holy Cross Church is concerned. We discovered that a considerable amount of land and property in Sherston, Alderton and Willesley carries CRL for Holy Cross Church (as I mentioned above, land can have CRL for a church which is not its local one).

The important thing to say immediately, if you hadn't already guessed it from the headline of this article, is that Sherston PCC has decided not to register and enforce CRL against affected land. So your local clergy are not 'racing to claim their cash' as the newspaper journalist said.

The PCC has had to build a detailed case to support this decision and many of these details will probably not be of general interest. We would like everyone to know, however, that an important factor in our decision has been the knowledge that Holy Cross Church is already very well-supported by the local community. The appeal for the new roof a couple of years ago brought an overwhelming response and our more recent stewardship campaign has now put the church finances back on a steadier footing. We very much appreciate the voluntary support we already enjoy and would like our good relationship with the local community to continue.

Just one final note of caution if this issue involves you personally. Although any possibility of CRL relating to Holy Cross Church has now been removed from local property owners, the PCC cannot offer a complete guarantee that there may not be CRL relating to another church on land and property in the local area. This is a very remote possibility, but please don't do anything based only on what you have read in this article. If in doubt you would need to take advice elsewhere.

It is a time both to remember the dead and injured of past wars and to support those who currently serve in our armed forces. In previous years several of our parish services have been attended by a contingent from Buckley Barracks. However, with the cuts to the armed services and the high commitments the forces sustain, we are finding that many of the personnel who are in the UK are on well-earned leave at this time and therefore Sherston is unlikely to receive a detachment. Of course, whether they are present or absent the armed forces personnel and their families will be no less in our prayers and thoughts.

Could you represent local people on the Malmesbury's Community Campus?


Local people have a chance to plan how their services could be delivered in the future in the Malmesbury Community area, as first steps are taken towards a community campus.
