'Your outline displays an understanding and appreciation of the importance of international learning as an integral part of the curriculum and school ethos.'


In summary it concluded, 'Once again, congratulations on the work you have done so far and best wishes for your continued success in the future. Well done.'



Ebola:

Ebola has seen plenty of news coverage in recent months, below is brief overview of the outbreak.

The Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) is caused by an infection from the Ebola Virus. Transmission of this virus from one human to another is most often through direct contact (e.g. via broken skin) with the blood, sweat, or other bodily fluid of an infected person. In this sense, Ebola is transmitted in much the same way as HIV. Airborne transmission, for instance via coughing or breathing, has not yet been proven in the natural environment. According to the NHS, the risk Ebola poses to the UK population remains 'very low.' When

dealing with unusual infectious diseases, the advantage that the UK and other Western countries have is a series of robust and well-tested systems in place to deal with any outbreaks. These systems allow for effective and safe control of outbreaks that countries in poorer regions lack the resources to combat. The virus is not spread as easily as some would have us believe, and even if it does reach the UK, the chances of a serious outbreak are extremely small. If you suspect you may have Ebola, ask yourself: are you showing symptoms of headache, vomiting, diarrhoea or fever? Have you recently been to a high risk area, or have you been in direct contact with someone diagnosed with Ebola? If so, call NHS 111 or contact your GP (do not come into the surgery) and you may be referred for appropriate screening if you are considered to be at risk.



Sherston Neighbourhood Plan

As reported in last month's Cliffhanger, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group organised an exhibition and two workshops held over the weekend of 20 and 21 September in the village hall to inform local residents about the progress being made in preparing the Neighbourhood Plan and more particularly to seek views on a wide range of topics that are intended to be dealt with in the emerging plan. The event was attended by over 100 people. questionnaires were handed out to all of those who came – seeking views on a series of issues relevant to the emerging plan.

As noted in that report, a copy of all of the exhibition material and related information was placed on the Sherston website http://www.sherston.org.uk/ as well as being put on display in both the Church and GP Surgery - together with further copies of the two questionnaires - with an invitation to all of those interested in the emerging plan to have a look at the various ideas and options that were being considered and to return the completed questionnaires by 12.00noon on 11 October.

A preliminary analysis of the returned questionnaires has now been completed (see below). These will be

further considered by the Steering Group with the intention of bringing forward a further (revised) set of proposals and options for consideration by the village in the next few weeks. This is in part necessitated by the fact that one of the sites that had been put forward as a potential option site (i.e. Site 17 – the land at Easton Town – which had been identified as either a possible housing site or a site for a relocated GP surgery) has now been withdrawn from the equation by the landowners. This means that one or two other option sites may now have to be considered.

It is recognised by the Steering Group that we have not as yet managed to catch the interest of the entire community in preparing this Neighbourhood Plan and that we clearly need to do more to ensure that the views of as many people as possible are taken into account before the plan is finalised. To this end it has been decided that a further round of informal consultation will be undertaken on some of the emerging ideas and options as they begin to get firmed up — which will include use of a variety of social media — before any decisions are made on what is actually included in the plan. This next round will start in early December.

There was virtually no support for a proposal to identify land for a Community Orchard. The response to the question re the possible provision of land for additional allotments was pretty balanced. The Steering Group will now have to consider which if any of these "ideas" it wishes to take forwards as formal proposals in the Neighbourhood Plan.

A number of possible options are likely to be put forward – with specific sites identified for each of the options together with their potential benefits and shortcomings.

COMMENT: There was a good level of support for the idea that, should the football field not be identified for redevelopment then the land to the west (Site 3) should be safeguarded to allow for its future expansion/improvement.

As noted above, all of the above information will now be reviewed by the Steering Group and a further set of revised proposals, taking into account the noted change of circumstance (most notably the removal of Site 17 from the equation together with a number of other matters that have since come to light), will be tabled for consideration by the village – most probably through the next edition of the Sherston Cliffhanger.

Walk on the wild side -Of irruptions and hazy days

For the more experienced (i.e. older) amongst us, cast your mind back to your childhood going on summer days out with your parents. I have vivid recollections of the windscreen getting covered in squashed insects leaving smears and all kinds of marks on the front of the car which my father would spend ages trying to clean off. I also seem to recollect you could buy plastic covers to go over the front of the car to stop the paintwork being damaged... (OK – where is he going with this one..)

The point being that we simply don't get the number of insects we used to and, as a consequence, there isn't as much for food for insectivores (shrews, swallows, blackcaps etc) — so we don't have as many insect predators as we used to — so we don't have as many higher level predators such as birds of prey and stoats. (This is what's known in ecological circles at trophic layers.). Given a chance, nature can recover quite quickly from population declines but in reality nearly all our countryside is quite heavily managed especially when you compare it to rural France or Poland where there is still lots of messy and unimproved bits as there isn't as much pressure on farmers.

The more long-term deeper concern is that our children will see a lack of insects as normal.

On a more positive note the autumn bird migration will be almost complete in November with the usual suspects here in good numbers such as fieldfares and redwings. Many other continental birds such as starlings, jays, wood pigeons and goldfinches will have arrived. In some years the number arriving is quite incredible. For example in November 2010 some 161,000 wood pigeons flew over a site in Dorset in one day! (This wasn't a typo.). In 2014 some 50,000 swallows also flew over a site in Dorset in one day and in 2011 some 10,000 goldfinches flew over a site in Kent in one day.

Sometimes these large numbers are due to the shortage of food for the birds in their summer grounds, or having a couple of successful years breeding when the numbers of individuals can significantly increase. This is known as an irruption and in some years some unusual birds can arrive here such as three years ago when we had lots of waxwings in the apple tree next to the village school.

If this winter proves to be a cold one and, just having completed a great breeding season for most birds, we may get all sorts of strange immigrants in the village.


