
The competition was open to all independent shops that also run a post office. Judges assessed customer service, range of stock, involvement within the community and a mystery shopper.

Remembrance Sunday: 8 November



SHERSTON REMEMBERS 1914 - 1918

To commemorate the centenary of the start of the First World War, last year Sherston's Service of Remembrance was held in the open for the first time. Estimates put the attendance in excess of 600 and the ceremony was considered a success by the village.

Accordingly, it is proposed to hold the ceremony in the open, in front of the lych gate, again this year following a similar format, with everyone in position by 10.45am. The service will start at 10.55am with the two minutes silence at 11.00am. Representatives of the churches in Sherston will be taking the service. In addition to the regular wreath layers, there will be an opportunity to lay a wreath or floral tribute in memory of anyone who has died in any conflict or during military service.

The Sherston service includes Easton Grey and the names of their fallen are read out during the service so everyone from Easton Grey is invited.

A limited number of chairs will be available for those who cannot stand. Those with wheelchairs and mobility scooters should use them.

Church Street will be closed to vehicular traffic from 10.00am until 12.00noon, diversions will be in place along Sandpits Lane, Green Lane, and Court Street. Additional parking if required will be available at the Rec.

Emergency planning

The Sherston parish council emergency response planning committee has completed the development of an emergency response plan for Sherston that covers a range of events including flooding, severe snow, pandemic flu, a prolonged loss of utilities, an animal health incident and an unspecified major disaster. Jill Cainey is the emergency response coordinator and will be responsible for leading and managing any response to a major incident. In the event of an incident, a committee will be formed, drawn from members of the community best placed to provide support and advice. This committee will liaise with authorities and emergency services and manage any response.

There is a new addition to the back page of the Cliffhanger – a section that details the contact details of the emergency response coordinator and some useful information. If the telephone system and mobile network fails then information will be available at the village hall, which would be the coordination centre during any incident.

Villagers have always rallied round when there has been a problem and this will continue, but if there needs to be any coordination then the parish council will take on this role and would ask that if you think you can help when a disaster strikes then please contact the coordinator.



What's in a name?



When we first looked at the Old Chapel on Cliff Road (the previous home of Sherston Congregational Church), it was love at first sight. Could we afford it, self-build it, get permission for a family home and keep the glory and history of the building alive? It was a risk, but we took it!

Planning permission has finally been granted, so it's all systems go now! Having said that, we are self-building, so it may take us some time longer than a team of builders – and apologies in advance to any locals who may be interrupted from time to time due to deliveries, etc.




