You don't have to struggle this winter



Having to choose between things like heating your home and putting food on the table is something many people take for granted, but sadly this is something that the Warm and Safe Wiltshire advice service comes across regularly. We want to help residents across Wiltshire to be warmer, safer and healthier in their homes this winter. If you're at all worried, get in touch with Warm and Safe Wiltshire to see how we can help.

Rachel Kent, Public Health Specialist explains: 'Far too often, I come across residents who are struggling to make ends meet and will often save some money by not switching on the heating or letting other bills build up. The Warm and Safe Wiltshire advice service is determined to give people the help and support they need to ensure food is on the table and they're not worried about having the heating on when it's cold. There are some really great services available at the moment which could really help with keeping on top of bills and ensuring your home is warm, safe and comfortable this winter.'

The Warm Home Discount is £140 rebate on your electricity or gas bill and is offered to people with low incomes, in receipt of benefits, elderly or disabled or young children. The eligibility criteria varies between supplier so check your eligibility with Warm and Safe Wiltshire and don't delay as the discount is provided on a first come, first served basis.

Would you be at risk if there was a power cut? Perhaps you use electricity for medical equipment or you're not as steady on your feet as you once were. If this is the case, Scottish and Southern Energy Network (SSEN) offer a free Priority Services Register that will ensure that your home is prioritised in the

event of a power cut. SSEN will also let you know about planned interruptions, advice on how to be prepared for a power cut, what to do if one happens and, if necessary, provide a cold weather crisis pack. You can sign up to the PSR on our website: www. warmandsafewiltshire.org.uk/psr

Living in a cold home can be bad for your health. Consistently low temperatures in your home may exacerbate existing health issues and make it harder for you to recover from illnesses. Insulation and heating improvements are one of the best ways of making your home warmer, as well as lowering your energy bills. In some cases, there is funding available to help you pay for the work.

Warm and Safe Wiltshire can help with understanding your heating system and energy bills, switching energy suppliers and a comprehensive home fire safety check where eligible. The service can also advise on possible benefit entitlement and available grants. Energy advice can be given through home visits as well as over the phone.

Don't let your oil storage cost you and the environment

Many people who rely on oil-fired heating will be filling up their tanks at this time of year and it is especially important that in doing so they do not get more than they bargained for.

Unfortunately, oil storage tanks and pipe work of all types does not last forever and will, on rare occasions, fail leading to a significant loss of oil. Quite often this occurs at the time fresh oil is added, due to a combination of a fragile aged tank structure and the weight of additional oil.

To reduce the likelihood of this, tanks and pipe work should be visually inspected regularly. If you are unsure of their condition, they can be tested by an oil heating specialist in order to avoid failure and an oil spill.


Whilst oil spills should be covered by buildings/ home insurance, they are time-consuming and can lead to a loss of the use of a person's home while works are undertaken to treat affected areas which can include the ground, watercourses and indoor air. The image right, illustrates how lost oil can spread and affect the environment and potentially people through oil vapour into a building.

Where an oil leak is suspected, the short-term health effects of oil vapour entering a building, such as sore eyes and throat, can be avoided through immediate, thorough ventilation of the building in question. Acting swiftly to contact insurers should enable an oil spill to be dealt with quickly as any delay in time inevitably allows the extent of oil lost to spread. Your drinking water supplier must also be notified where a leak is suspected as drinking water may be affected and associated pipe work may require replacement with a protected supply pipe.

Public Protection can visit premises to assess whether any indoor oil vapour impact is apparent as part of the initial stages of dealing with an oil spill; after which insurers and their consultants should lead on clean-up and reinstatement.



Peaks and Troughs



Peaks and Troughs tells the story of when I, at the age of 23, with my wife and twins and younger brother, bought a hill farm in North Wales called Dyffryn. We knew nothing about farming, but imagined ourselves living healthy life, breathing the mountain air, leaning over the

farmyard gate with sheep grazing in the fields as the sun set over the Irish Sea. As you can tell, we were complete romantics. Gradually we learnt about our new life through hard graft and a series of calamitous mistakes but were determined not to give in, nor take ourselves too seriously, as we tried to harden up to the tasks that faced us.

For years after leaving Dyffryn, I 'dined out' on the ludicrous stories of our life there and people kept telling me I had to write the book. Finally – about six years ago – I decided to do it, even though I knew I was taking on as big a challenge as buying Dyffryn in the first place. Those years in the 1970s were really an end of an era, when sons drifted away from the

land, no longer wanting to follow their fathers trying to scrape a living in the harsh landscape of North Wales. We met and worked with the last generation of Welsh hill farmers and that way of life is now lived by only a



few. And of course, just as funny and infuriating as our neighbours were the animals we lived with.

So, not surprisingly, the central characters in most of the stories are those animals that got us into farcical situations, usually the pigs who took over our lives. One sorry tale has become known as 'the WH Smith incident'. I was driving an Austin A60 van into Caernarvon on a hot summer's day with eight porkers in the back, taking them to the abattoir. Stuck in a traffic jam, I wound down the passenger-side window and one of the porkers jumped to freedom over my shoulder and ran down the road, disappearing into WH Smiths. I eventually retrieved it after it had demolished a box of crayons and a book by Enid Blyton. I had to pay costs.

It took five years to write this book, a challenge that I thought at times would get the better of me. But I hope the stories of our struggle to survive and the 'alternative lifestyle' that evolved into its own self-sufficiency lift the spirits.

So far we have had several interesting and entertaining presentations by some of the most skilled and highly regarded photographers in the south west region. We have also managed to squeeze in the first of our monthly competitions, which was judged by Prof. Bob Ryan, joint author of a stimulating new book entitled 'The Master Photographer – From Good to Great'.





Bob's views on photography are always stimulating and constructive, so our competition entrants were delighted to hear him say that he'd noticed a great improvement in the quality of our images since his last visit to us, which was about two years ago. One of the shots he selected for an award was the portrait illustrating this month's article. It was taken with just the available light coming through a sitting-room window. It shows just what can be achieved with careful placement of a subject and control of a camera's shutter speed and aperture.

Looking ahead to November and the other end of the lighting spectrum, photographing fireworks is something many people like to try, but find difficult to capture. Here's a tip from one of our members: Try setting your camera on manual focus and focusing on something in the distance before the fireworks start. Set the shutter speed to between a half and a sixth of a second and try to stay still. You might be impressed by what you can achieve!
