Garden bonfires, composting and recycling

Garden bonfires can annoy neighbours and produce smoke and smells. Wiltshire Council encourage as much garden waste as possible to be composted and they also provide a Garden Waste Service which is collected fortnightly at the cost of £48 per year. However, there are are no byelaws restricting bonfires in Wiltshire and if anyone has to burn material that cannot be collected or composted, it is advisable to follow these simple guidelines.

- Warn your neighbours.
- Ideally burn later in the evening.
- Only burn dry material.
- Never burn household rubbish.
- Avoid lighting a fire in unsuitable weather conditions.
- Keep your fire away from trees, fences and buildings.
- Never use oil or petrol.
- Never leave a fire unattended or leave it smouldering put it out.

Centenary of the Armistice: Remembrance Sunday

Sunday 11 November

The lychgate of Sherston churchyard is our village war memorial and this is the focus of our Act of Remembrance. It is nearly five years since Sherston's annual Service of Remembrance was moved to an outdoor ceremony in Church Street, to allow larger numbers of villagers to honour those whose names are recorded on the War Memorial. In 2014, we marked the start of the Great War when 700 stood in silence in Church Street to remember the fallen of that terrible war and other conflicts. We hope that a similar number from Sherston and Easton Grey will attend this year's Service of Remembrance, particularly as it falls on 11 November and it coincides with the centenary of the Armistice.

We ask that members of the public take their places by 10.45 am.

Church Street will be closed from 10.00am until noon with an alternative route via Sandpits Lane, Green Lane and Court Street. In order for the parade of uniformed organisations to pass safely from the Scout and Guide HQ, there will be an additional rolling road closure for a few minutes between 10.30am and 10.45am for Green Lane, Court Street, Cliff Road, Silver Street and the High Street, and 11.30am after the end of the service from Church Street to High Street. This will result in minor delays while the parade passes.

All cars and other vehicles will need to be removed from Church Street during the period of the road closure for the Remembrance Day service. Please help to create maximum space for those attending by moving cars away from this area before 9.00am on Sunday morning. Thank you for your understanding and we look forward to many of you joining this time of Remembrance on 11 November.

Private 241826 Alfred Clark

1st/8th Batt Worcestershire Regiment

Who died aged 23 on Monday 4th November 1918

Son of Alfred and Mary Clark, High Street, Sherston, Wiltshire

Remembered with Honour, Landrecies British Cemetery, Landrecies, Nord, France

Alfred Clark fell in action in the Battle of the Sambre, one of the final battles of the Great War.

The 1st and 8th Worcestershire formed up during the night of 4 to 5 November in the assembly trenches outside Le Faux. In the mist at 4.15am all were ready for attack on the town of Landrecies.

Before the attack, machine gun fire opened up along the line of the attack in addition to the artillery bombardment. This was not only to harass the enemy but also to mask the advance of two tanks ready to spearhead the attack.

The attack was a complete success. Landrecies was captured and secured along with an entire field hospital and many prisoners.

In the afternoon, the 1st and 8th Worcestershire re-formed and defended the western outskirts of the town, the Germans being in full retreat. Alfred Clark was killed along with three other ranks and four officers.

Another officer taking part in the attack lost his life that day crossing the Sambre River. He was the war poet Wilfred Owen.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung from 8.50am on 4 November.

Although the Garrison battalion was made up of men unfit for active service, things got so desperate at the front in 1918 that such regiments would have been combed to pick out men suitable to serve with the Labour Corps.

William Cairns died the day after Armistice Day.

25 Years as a GP in Sherston - a reflection

It seems unbelievable that we arrived in Sherston 25 years ago, with a one year old and two cats, to start work as the new salaried GP on the 18 October 1993. Things were very different then; John Heathcock had been a single-handed doctor using just the downstairs of the Tolsey building, with the Sherston computer software company using the top floor. I started working in what is now the nurse's treatment room as my office - there was barely room between my desk and the bed, and Dr Heathcock was in the room which now houses all the notes and our staff room.

One year later - we had our first computer system installed, until then it was all handwritten notes, but it still took a year or two before we had printed prescriptions. Amazing anyone got the correct medicines with my handwriting! Our dispensary staff were still mixing up some medicines by hand - there are plenty of patients who remember with fondness Dr Heathcock's 'pick me up' full of vitamins, and were most put out when we stopped supplying it .

A year later we moved into the top half of the building, Sherston Software moved to the Angel (shortly after it closed as a public house) and baby number 2 had arrived. This proved particularly difficult as Dr Heathcock and I were still doing a one night and one weekend in three covering Yatton Keynell, Sutton Benger and the Chippenham police station.

Since then, the practice has expanded, embracing new technology, changes of politicians, introduction of CQC, introduction of the out-of-hours service, fundholding, cluster grouping, personal medical services, to name but a few.

However, some things never change and I remain immensely proud that we have maintained a $\ensuremath{\mathsf{GP}}$



service to the local community and a dispensing service that means we truly are local healthcare providers.

Some of the original staff that were there when I started are still working alongside us at the practice, Lucia Bridgeman and Sue Alexander, as well as Sally Bishop and Lisa Neal who works upstairs so perhaps not a face you are familiar with.

All four of my children have been through nursery, primary and secondary education locally, and how lucky am I to have spent (nearly) half my life living and working in this lovely village?

I can't promise another 25 years personally, but here's to the future of local General Practice, and thank you to all our patients who support us in that future.


Midcounties Co-operative opens Sherston store

The children have had to apply their learning about forces in science, as well as working cooperatively in a team. The children came up with many different designs, from heavily padded cases to parachutes made from carrier bags. The first





round of testing resulted in several egg casualties but by the second round of testing, many more eggs survived!

Here are some of the comments from the children: 'Bigger, flatter things fall more slowly. You have to make it padded with something light like bubble wrap.' 'The more layers used, the heavier it was and it would fall faster and have more impact.'




The day the Life Bus came to school




