Come join us in celebrating your village firework display on Saturday 5 November

Sherston's spectacular bonfire and fireworks event falls on the actual day this year!

The evening starts at 6.30pm at Lower Farm, Easton Town, thanks to the continuing generosity of the Hillier family.

There will also be a barbecue as well as soft drinks and hot soup. Sparklers are not permitted at the display for safety and insurance reasons, but safe light-sabres and light-ropes will be on sale. Dedicated first aiders will be on site.

The existing members of Sherston 1016 are pleased to welcome some new volunteers this year, and are grateful for their support in making the event possible. As a result of our training, Pains Fireworks underwrite our event insurance.

Entrance charges (non-refundable) are £6 per adult and £3.50 per child on the gate, or £15 for an advance family ticket for two adults and up to three children, available from Sherston Post Office Stores.

This is excellent value-for-money for everyone in the village, who get to see a quality display of over £1500 worth of fireworks.

Please wear sensible footwear, with wellingtons

being preferable, especially if it's wet underfoot. It's also advisable to wear older clothes, just in case you spill tomato ketchup down your front! It's not a high-fashion event, and, after all, you'll be in a farmer's field!

Please note that there is no car parking available on site or on the road approaching the field. All profits from the event go towards worthy local causes.

Please take any combustible material you may have to the site during the week leading up to the Saturday and put it over the wall into the bonfire field, which is on the right as you approach the farm buildings.

There's one very important quality to note about Sherston's event: safety. We buy a professional pack of fireworks from Pains Fireworks near Salisbury. The firing team from Sherston 1016 attends an annual day's training session to catch up on the latest developments and safety features for displays, as well as the latest directives from the Health and Safety Executive.

The prime consideration of all our fireworks operators is always the safety of our spectators and of our fellow operators.

Road Closures

B4040 Pinkney: 10 October, 7.00pm-midnight

B4040 (Part), Pinkney; From its junction with C27 Tetbury Road (Tetbury crossroad in Sherston) to its junction with Bransdown Hill (the crossroad just before the 50mph sign leaving Pinkney). For one night only, to repair potholes.

Appropriate use of guns

Over the summer, there was an incident involving the inappropriate use of a gun, which nearly resulted in two people playing tennis being shot.

Not all guns need to be licensed, but all guns must be used in a safe manner; this includes thinking carefully about target practice and where your shots might go if you miss your target.

The law makes no distinction between air rifles and more powerful guns for which you need a licence: they are all classed as firearms and must be used in a

safe and responsible manner.

It is an offence to fire an air rifle pellet beyond the land where you have permission to shoot, unless the person holding the shooting rights of the neighbouring land has given you permission. Where someone under 14 is shooting, both the young person and the supervising adult can be prosecuted.

It is also against the law to discharge any firearm (including air rifles) within 50 feet of the centre of a highway (which consists of or comprises a carriageway) If a user of the highway is injured, interrupted or endangered, the shooter (and supervisor) could be prosecuted. These offences could be committed, for example, when someone is shooting in their garden close to a public highway and the pellets ricochet onto the highway injuring someone.

If you do want to practise on your own premises, you must have an effective backstop to halt the pellet/bullet. This may be an adequate soft soil bank, without stones, or a brick wall on which an old piece of carpet can be hung to prevent ricochets. Do not use chipboard, plywood or any thick composite material with a polished surface, as there is a risk of ricochet.

The British Association for Shooting and Conservation have the following 'Golden Rules':

- Always know where the muzzle of your air rifle is pointing and NEVER point it in an unsafe direction.
- The safe conduct of air rifle shooting must meet the standards described in this code, show respect for the countryside, due regard to health and safety and consideration for others.
- Before you shoot, make sure that a safe backstop is present to capture the pellet.
- Consider live quarry; do not shoot beyond the bounds of your ability. Do not take chance shots.
- REMEMBER ignorance of the law is no excuse. If in doubt, always ask.

Following the incident in Sherston, the police were called, and the gun was confiscated and destroyed.

china clay from South Devon, fine alluvial sand from West Dorset and granite from Cornwall. Their kiln holds up to 3,000 pieces, takes two days to reach the required temperature and then an agonising wait of four days to cool down!

War grave of Walter Palmer

Private 24173 Herbert Neal

8th attached 1st Battalion Duke of Edinburgh's Wiltshire Regiment

Died Sunday 15 October 1916 Remembered with Honour,

Contay British Cemetery, Contay, Somme, France

Herbert Neal was killed during the final action in the Battle of the Somme.

At this stage the ground conditions were dreadful and this and the carnage gave this battle its terrible reputation.

In the first weeks of October, the 1st Wiltshire Regiment was in trenches beyond the destroyed village of Thiepval. Herbert was probably a specialist in bombing or was a gunner as he had been temporarily attached to the 1st Wiltshire who were likely to be short of such expertise for their next time in the front line

In fact they had a relatively quiet tour - spending time at the front, support and reserve lines aiding other units in the area.

However, retaliatory shellfire, sniping and other attacks still caused casualties among the Wiltshires. It is not known when Herbert received his wounds but he would have been taken back down the lines and would have died of his injuries while cared for by the 49th and 9th casualty clearing stations then located in the village of Contay. There are 1,133 such burials in this cemetery.

The bells of Holy Cross Church will be rung at 11.45am on 15 October.

Malmesbury Community Trust

The Malmesbury Community Trust is a registered charity that was originally set up privately with significant help from the former Wiltshire County Council and Malmesbury Town Council. It built on the pioneering work of the Barnes Trust – a council trust which administered the money bequeathed by the late Mr C H Barnes. Mr Barnes, a Malmesbury man, died in 1978. His trustees raised further money for many local purposes, including the first minibus for the disabled. After complying with lengthy legal requirements, the residue from the trust funds formed the opening balance of the new charity – Malmesbury Community Trust.

The trust is administered by nine trustees and the Clerk to the Trustees. The trustees meet normally four times a year to discuss policy and consider bids for grants from the charity.

The aim of the charity is to allocate sums of money from the charity to those in need in Malmesbury and the surrounding villages, including Sherston.

The funds are intended, primarily, to benefit the elderly according to the following priorities:


Priority 1: A life-threatening emergency. In such case the clerk and two trustees can agree an immediate grant up to £500.

Walk on the wild side

In today's world, with lots of transportation and travel, all kinds of animals and plants get shipped to places they would never get to without human 'help'. Sometimes this adds to the ecosystem, with birds such as little owls and scorpions adding interest to our fauna.

Most plants and animals don't survive as it's too cold or wet, etc while some thrive and cause all kinds of problems. Examples include Himalayan balsam infesting river banks, grey squirrels pushing out our native red squirrels and the American crayfish killing our native crayfish. Tetbury made the headlines this week with the first Asian hornet discovered in the UK.

The Asian hornet (Vespa velutina), which is up to 2.5cm (1in) long, is now common across Europe after being accidentally introduced to France in 2004 in a shipment of pottery from China – and now it's here, although Defra are trying to locate the nest and eradicate it before it gets established. While its sting is only as bad as a bee, the real danger is to our honey bees as the hornet can cause serious damage to colonies.

Moving on to migrants that we do expect, it's almost time for the redwings and fieldfares to arrive from Scandinavia and Russia. These are quite similar

to song thrushes and tend to live in flocks in open countryside; we get lots around the village.

Our swifts have long gone while our house martins and swallows are leaving about now. In the past few weeks, the numbers of these birds around the village and along the Cliff, catching insects on the wing, has been remarkable. On some days, there have been hundreds!!

These birds have declined in part due to drought in north and west Africa during migration, but also due to a lack of nesting sites. House martins and swallows can make a real mess so, understandably, not everyone enjoys having them. The city of Oxford has just announced a project to become the first 'Swift City' in the UK by putting up lots of nest boxes in places where no-one minds. Could Sherston become the first 'Swift Village'? It can be if we want it to be? Let me know ...

The need for providing nesting sites for birds was brought home to me recently talking to someone from the Owl and Hawk Conservancy. Apparently, 85% of barn owls in the UK nest in nest boxes; only 15% nest in hollows in trees, etc. Little wonder there are only 5,000 pairs left. There are a few barn owl boxes around the village – maybe we should put up more ...




