#### How it works

The editing, advertising, artwork and distribution are provided by a small army of about 30 village volunteers.

Submitted articles are edited for spelling, date format and comprehension. The articles are then reviewed for relevance and the edition is artworked.



Once proofed and approved, the final artwork is sent to a local printer for production. The printed copies are then sorted and distributed to the volunteer 'deliverers' who drop them through your door.

If you are not already aware, we are pleased to confirm that from Monday 1 October, the new owners of the shop and Post Office will be The Midcounties Cooperative Society who we feel are ideal to take good care of our business for the foreseeable future and indeed improve the overall service provided.

Whilst similar in name, the locally owned Midcounties Co-operative Society should not be confused with the Co-operative Group - they are completely separate organisations.

Please note that to allow for a Post Office audit, a full stock check and essential changes to be put in place, the shop and Post Office will be closed on Monday 1 October and Tuesday 2 October.

We will be open as usual up to 5.00 pm on Sunday 30 September when we will shut our doors for the last time; the business will then re-open under the new ownership of the Midcounties Co-operative Society on Wednesday 3 October at 9.00 am.

It has been a fantastic experience since we took over the shop and Post Office 14 years ago way back in November 2004; from our early days of fear and trepidation having never run a business before; to making the major decision to risk all and putting everything on the line to take the business to the Old School (which was seven years ago!) before finally seeing both the shop and Post Office fulfilling all our dreams by providing a comprehensive service to the village and receiving recognition of such by receiving a number of prestigious awards.

None of the above would have been possible without the tremendous support we have received from everyone over the years which gave us the continued motivation and confidence to try out new things and re-invest to provide improved facilities. 

Who died aged 19 on 14th October 1918 Son of Daniel Niblett Neal and Ann Neal of Willesley, Wiltshire

Remembered with Honour, Sherston Magna Parish Church

#### Military Funeral

The funeral of Pte Daniel Niblett Neal, Royal Berks Regt son of Mr Daniel Neal of Willesley, at Sherston on Saturday, was a military one and was witnessed by one of the largest crowds seen in Sherston for some time.

At the corner where the Tetbury Road joins Easton Town the cortège was met by a party of volunteers from the Malmesbury Detachment, first VB Wilts (Duke of Edinburgh's) Regt who, with reversed arms, marched preceding the hearse to Sherston parish church.

The clergy officiating in the church and at the graveside were the Rev Alan Leslie (vicar) and the Rev T Puxly (Westonbirt). The surpliced choir attended and the hymns sung in the church were Soldiers of our Christ Below and Peace Perfect Peace.

As the coffin, which was covered by the Union Jack, was borne out of the church the organist played Oh Rest in the Lord. When the grave side service was concluded the firing party, which was commanded by Segt T H Sandy, fired three volleys over the open grave and presented arms when buglers Bailey and Prior sounded the Last Post.

The mourners included Mr and Mrs D Neal (parents), Mr E Neal (brother), Miss Jane Neal, Miss Evaline Neal, Miss Mabel Neal, Miss Freda Neal, Miss Alma Neal, Miss Gurtrude Neal - all sisters. Miss G Merchant, Sherston, and Mrs Neal, Sopworth, aunts. Mr and Mrs Merchant, uncle and aunt. Mrs Tavender, Didmarton. Miss G Clifford and Miss Elsie Clifford, cousins, Mr J J Minett and others.

A large number of floral tributes were sent. Much sympathy is felt for the parents in the loss of their

young son. He was only 19 and was the second of the family to give his life for his country. Pte Algernon D Neal, Gloucester Regt, died aged 21 in hospital at Bristol early in the war. Most of the several sisters of the deceased had been engaged in war work. Three of them joined the WAAC on the day of his death and another has won a brassard with the VAD.

Young Daniel Neal was a brave boy and volunteered with a good heart. "I am bowled out". he said. "It is a good cause". Although many soldiers from Sherston and district have been killed in the war, Pte Neal was the first to be brought home for burial with military honours.

Who died aged 32 on Monday 21st October 1918 Son of John and Susan Clark, Tan House, Tanners Hill, Sherston, Wiltshire and husband of Annie Clark

Remembered with Honour, Kezelberg Military Cemetery, Wevelgem, West Flanders, Belgium

Oliver Clark died in the final advance from the Ypres salient towards the Belgo-German border.

As a member of the cavalry unit, he would have been in the front of any advance. The cemetery lies just outside the town of Menin that had been behind German lines for nearly all the war.





## Dorothy House Hospice Tea Party: Sunday 28 October





## WI Report



This month our W.I. speaker was Roger Heafield who spoke about the Wiltshire Air Ambulance. Roger started with a short history lesson telling us that the first Air Ambulance in the UK, a small airplane, started in 1933 in The Orkneys, with the first helicopter being in Cornwall in 1988. The first air ambulance in Wiltshire started in 1990 when a police helicopter, which had been monitoring activities at Stonehenge, spotted an accident on the way back to their base and stopped to see if they could help. They had to remove the seats from the helicopter to accommodate the patient for transport to hospital. For a while the Air Ambulance used the police helicopters but they eventually had to purchase their own vehicle. The helicopter contains more equipment than a land ambulance and, as well as the pilot, has two paramedics who are trained to critical care standard. Their HEMS Bell 429 helicopter can fly anywhere in Wiltshire in 11 minutes and is available 19 hours a day for 365 days a year. In 2017 the helicopter answered 875 call-outs, and when speed can mean the difference between life and death it plays an important role in the ambulance service. The cost of running the service is £3,250,000 a year and, with no government funding, all the money needed has to be raised by the generosity of the people and businesses of Wiltshire.

Our October meeting will be a lunch at The Angel to celebrate our W.I. 'birthday' and, on 1 November, our speaker will be Barry Edwards who will talk about the Early History of Penguin Books, this will be in the British School Room at 2:30pm. New members and visitors are always welcome.

Sherston's bonfire and fireworks extravaganza will be back next month. At 6.30pm on Saturday 8 November, freshly-barbecued sausages and burgers, hot soup and cold drinks will greet the crowds at Lower Farm.

The welcome line-up will also include a motley crew of guys made by the youngsters, there will be prizes for the best ones. Entries should be taken to the field during the day on the Saturday.

'As fireworks and insurance become more expensive, we're only able to keep ticket prices at a reasonable level due to the generous donations from local businesses,' said Richard Langley of organisers Sherston 1016.

John Hillier is, of course, loaning his land. And Stedman Nicholas, of Bear Necessities at Pinkney Park Dairy Farm, is sponsoring the hire of a skip to dispose of rubbish harmful to cattle.

In the week leading up to the Saturday, combustible material should be put over the wall into the bonfire field which is on the right as you approach the farm buildings.

Sparklers are not allowed for safety reasons but light-ropes will be on sale.

Entrance charges on the gate remain £5 per adult and £3 per child. An advance family ticket for two adults and three children costs £12 from Sherston Post Office.



Lorries rumbling over vulnerable bridges into narrow streets and cavalier drivers on hand-held mobiles continue to plague Sherston.

These were among several traffic matters raised at last month's parish council meeting.

Others included:

- speeding through the village on the B4040
- drivers, especially HGV drivers, using C roads as 'rat runs'
- illegal parking at junctions particularly on Noble Street, Church Street and Court Street and the need to improve the Give Way system in Church Street at The Rattlebone.

'Although some of this is particular to Sherston, much of it's common to villages along the B4040 in the Malmesbury area,' said Sherston Parish Council vice-chairman Martin Rea.

'Perhaps it would be better to tackle it as a whole rather than piecemeal village by village.

'This is a chance for the new Wiltshire Council to prove its effectiveness.'

From April next year, the five district councils, including North Wiltshire, will disappear and the county will be run by one, unitary, council called Wiltshire Council.

In a pilot scheme, a Malmesbury area board will be set up to tackle local issues. It will have the power to bring together the new council's services and other agencies including the police and health services.

Project manager Miranda Gilmour said: 'One of the tasks will be to test how the authority can work more efficiently to solve 'sticky issues' that have failed to be properly solved over a number of years.'

'Sherston traffic is certainly a 'sticky issue' said Mr Rea. 'Let's hope the pilot Malmesbury area board can free it up.'



## Patience Urged On Planning

Patience is urged over planning complaints.

Residents who report suspected breaches of planning law are waiting too long for an outcome, say Sherston parish councillors.

The parish council is only a consultative body for planning purposes but forwards all complaints to the planning enforcement team at North Wiltshire District Council.

They then decide whether a planning breach has occurred and, if so, what action to take.

'Currently this process can take some considerable time which is frustrating not only to those who raised the original issue but also to members of the parish council,' said vice chairman Martin Rea.

'It's hoped this will improve considerably under the new unitary authority.'







## Old thoughts giving new inspiration

Great thoughts don't need to be new to have modern relevance or give contemporary inspiration. One conceived about 150 years ago by American philosopher, poet and writer Henry David Thoreau proves this as effectively as any: 'It's not what you look at that matters, it's what you see.' It is also a good companion to this photograph taken by John Jennings of Tetbury Camera Club.

While it's doubtful that the members of Tetbury Camera Club had philosophy on their mind when travelling around the county,

sharing ideas and techniques, on their recent summer location shoots, they do like to come back with shots that look individual and different. That often means looking at the places they are visiting from a new angle or with a fresh eye.

Finding something different to shoot is part of the fun and satisfaction to be found in modern photography. Cameras are now more versatile than ever and creatively using the technology available makes photography today not just stimulating but also challenging. The picture shown here is a good example of that. John took it on a recent visit to Cirencester, when virtually



all of the group found an interesting facet of the town that they hadn't spotted before. To most photographers, the church of St John the Baptist is a heavyweight example of gothic religious architecture. Its position and scale mean that it isn't the easiest place to photograph or depict. John found a fresh way to demonstrate part of its scale by shooting for the sky and, in doing so, he has demonstrated just how apt Thoreau's words can be if you want to photograph a challenging subject in the 21st century. Bear them in mind if you

are ever out with your own camera and wondering how to produce an interesting souvenir of what you are seeing around you.

Grittleton Village Hall: Wednesday 31 October As a commemoration of the ending of WW1: Journey's End [12A]

Spring 1918 near St Quentin, France. The war has already dragged out for nearly four years, with millions killed; it will grind on for more than a half-year longer, snuffing out countless lives as it does. The film escorts us into the battle zone following fresh-faced Second Lieutenant Raleigh (Asa Butterfield), who could have done his service in a safer place but instead has gone to some trouble to get assigned to the command of Captain Stanhope (Sam Claflin). Before the war, Stanhope was a senior boy at Raleigh's school and enamoured of his sister; the three spent happy holidays together. 


