# It's POP time!

Running from 20 to 22 September in houses and gardens around Sherston, the world's first POP up village weekend is almost upon us – and we would love you to come along and be part of it.

With nearly 40 'shops' and experiences for the whole family to enjoy, it will certainly be a jampacked weekend, inleuding many 'only in Sherston' moments. After all, where else can you try on a tutu at the fancy dress shop, learn how to use a defibrillator, hurl a mangold followed by a swift milkshake before a Horrible Histories experience!

Full details of all the POP ups are available at www. thepopupvillage.com. Take a look at the Visitors Guide to POP and click on the links for full details of each POP. The majority of POPs will run for three hours in different time slots so it's good to plan your day in advance.

The weekend will kick off with an after-school POP up cinema at Sherston School. Later that night the Latin Quarter will open its doors down at Strongs Close for tapas and salsa (this is a ticketed event).

Saturday morning sees a Hobbs House Bakery demonstration at the Carpenters Arms as well as POP up Save a Life, offering guidance on using the newly installed defibrillators in and around Sherston. It is also the start of the Tin Box Treasure trail for all ages (Sherston's answer to geo caching). Joey Ross will be taking professional children's photographs at The Photo Café. Then maybe you can pop in to POP up Pony, Micro Orienteering, Rosie's Homemade lemonade stand, Grace and Kitty's Scottish tablet POP, The Beauty Room@Sherston, The Beauty Room@Sherston Colours, POP it on Fancy Dress, Abracadrama, Cakes 'r' Us, Salad Dressings POP, a mangold hurl demonstration (complete with mangold delicacies and memorabilia), POP up Poppy, The Vintage Book Shop, make a dap bag at Sew Crafty, the Horrible Histories experience at Holy Cross, the Dizzy Cow Milkshake Bar and join a knitting bee. Then get your dancing shoes on for our local legends, The Sherston Village People, down at the Rattlebone for our free gig on Saturday night.

PAUSE, take a breath, that's just Saturday!

On Sunday morning we have the Grove Road Toybox, a lovely children's storyteller, Reduce Reuse and Recycle and the Scrap modelling workshop. The afternoon brings Rejuvenape's handmade gift POP, Dolly's Dress Designs (so sweet, children can come and design clothes for their favourite toy and Kathy



will make them), the Truly Scrumptious Sweetie Shop complete with naughty oompa loompas (Alice, Izzie and Eliza), Brook Hill Burgers and more from The Beauty Room@Sherston. The Rattlebone will be hosting a Chilli Eating competition - who will take Sherston's first chilli eating crown? Then dig out your bike for a trip to the Old School Tea Rooms down at Easton Grey or take afternoon tea at the B&B at Carriers' Farm, with a choice of tea, dainty sandwiches, cakes and home-baked scones. Follow that with a POP up footy match or a visit to Arrangements to Go for demonstrations and tips on creating simple flower arrangements and the Easton Town Curry takeaway and the world's first POP up village weekend is complete!

There will also be a list on the post office notice board showing details on all the POPs along with availability on pre-booked POPS.

Download your POP map on our website or pick one up from the post office or Tucks farm shop from September. They will also be available on Saturday and Sunday of the POP weekend from a small marquee on the High Street where the Brownies will be on hand to help visitors.

Everyone involved is volunteering and all profits go to Sherston Primary School, Busy Hands Pre-School and Sherston Toddlers. Thank you in advance to everyone running a POP. The event has only turned out to be so eclectically cool thanks to all your great ideas.

We hope that you will join us at one or more of the POPs over the weekend for a truly 'only in Sherston' experience.

# Major road closures

Road closures in our area connected with the electrification of the railway line to South Wales, which began at the end of last month with work to the Badminton Overbridge between Luckington and Acton Turville, really begin to take a grip this month. The Badminton Overbridge will be closed from 26 August, as well as the Fosse Bridge from 2 September, with both not due to reopen until 23 December. Diversionary routes will be in operation.

The parish council has met with representatives of Network Rail to express particular concerns with the diversion route for Badminton Overbridge which takes traffic past Sherston school. Network Rail has taken steps to minimise the impact on the school and its pupils, but the situation is being closely monitored.

## Defribrillator

At the time of writing the first defibrillator has been installed in Sherston by the gates into the village hall and a second in Pinkney (near the junction just a few yards down the road towards the bridge). Willesley are deciding where to mount theirs. Hopefully by the time you read this all will be up and running.

In the event of someone having a heart attack, the first thing to do is to dial 999 for an ambulance. The ambulance service will then give you the opening code. (It is an insurance requirement that access is via the emergency services.) You always need to push the 'C' button first to ensure the lock is clear.

The first thing to is to give the usual First Aid responses - mouth-to-mouth if needed, and CPR.

The defibrillator should then be attached to the patient using the pads connected to it; there is also a protected switch to use if the patient is younger than eight. Then press the 'on' button and follow the instructions.

We have arranged two courses to take place during POP weekend, on Saturday 21 September in the village hall; one from 10.00am to 11.30am and one from 11.30am to 1.00pm. Please let the parish clerk know (email clerk@sherston.org.uk) if you wish to attend (and which one) so we have some idea of numbers.

Wiltshire Council is undertaking a major review of bus services in our area and have now put its proposals out to consultation until the 7 October. From the look of it, only minor changes are planned on the Malmesbury - Yate service, No 41, which serves Sherston, but there are others that could impact those travelling on from Malmesbury. In addition, the weekly shopping buses on Wednesday to Bath and Friday to Chippenham, which pick up in Sherston, seem to be being cut completely.

#### Report of August meeting

We met on a very warm evening for our August meeting. It was lovely to have the doors open in the village hall.

Our speaker was Rose Woodley from the charity 'Hope for Tomorrow'. Many of us had not heard of it, so we were pleased she could explain its purpose. The charity builds and maintains mobile chemotherapy units—providing them to the NHS to operate with their highly trained staff.

The units can travel to set locations and can treat up to 20 cancer patients a day. The object is to help families cope with cancer and bring treatment closer to home. This should reduce travel, waiting times and the stresses and strains of busy hospitals. They have provided four vehicles in rural counties in southern England with more planned. By the end of 2013, 6,000 patients will have been treated with chemotherapy and radiotherapy in these units. We all agreed that this is a very worthwhile project, especially in rural areas.

After refreshments, our President informed us of forthcoming events and projects.

We are visiting The Yellow Hat Tribe gallery at Chipping Norton and afterwards Bourton-on-the-Water on 12 September. Two members enjoyed a Golf Taster Session at Melksham in May. There is another opportunity in October at Broome Manor, Swindon. Members are also visiting the Palace of Westminster and some going to a Bridge Lunch in November. A Jewellery course is also planned for October. We will be having a Table Top sale on 9 November in the village hall. Tables are £10, sellers arrive at 9.00am, open 10.00am.



# Walk on the wild side

We are almost full!

In the UK our bird population reaches its maximum in September when most of the birds hatched this year are still here, together with their parents. When the autumn migrants start to arrive, such as redwings and fieldfares, it's estimated that there will be around 400 million birds here, with some 84 million pairs of breeding birds during the summer. That may sound like a large number but, given we have some 62 million people living in the UK, that's just over one pair of breeding birds per person and about 6.5 birds each in the autumn.

The top 20 most common birds in the UK make up 75% of the total numbers (and I am excluding the chicken here ...) and some may surprise you. Our most common bird, with some 8.5 million pairs, is the wren. This tiny bird is quite hard to spot as it skulks around bushes and undergrowth. There are a few in Grove Wood, as well as in many gardens. The robin – many people's favourite – is the second most common bird with 6.7 million pairs, with the chaffinch following behind with some 6.2 million pairs, although I must admit I haven't seen many chaffinches this year. Other birds on the list include the wood pigeon (of which we have more than our fair share), house sparrow (of which there are some good populations around the village, notably on the High Street), blackbird, blue tit, great tit, dunnock and willow warbler. While many people may not be familiar with the latter two, they do occur in reasonable numbers locally. The remaining birds on the list are the pheasant, starling, greenfinch, jackdaw (another species we have lots of) and the chiffchaff.

Many of these birds have declined in numbers over the past 50 years for a variety of reasons, some of which we can do something about, others are much harder. Some birds, such as house sparrows, are limited by their ability to find a suitable nesting location with modern houses not having any suitable spaces. House sparrows are social nesters so they need a number of next boxes together or, even better, a large





one segmented into smaller sections. You can put up special nest boxes under your eaves for house martins and swifts, among others. Barn owls can also suffer from a lack of suitable nesting sites. Some birds, such as the tree sparrows on Salisbury Plain, have been helped with large scale winter feeding through local farmers providing the poor-quality seed at the end of a seed bin for feeding. Other birds, particularly migratory ones such as chiffchaffs and swifts, have problems finding good transit sites during their migrations.

Last week, we had a visit from quite an unusual butterfly - the clouded yellow (the picture doesn't work quite as well in black and white). It's an uncommon summer migrant to the UK and we had a pair flying along The Cliff. Butterfly Conservation advised that this reflects that the plant life there is really good quality!

The Sherston Museum of Natural History received its first (and only) exhibit. A few weeks ago a half decomposed body of a largish animal was found in the river and its skull was kept and cleaned up and passed to me for identification. It's a long time since I had to identify bones (I used to work as a palaeontologist) and it was really fascinating, for me at least, as to how similar a rat skull is to a rabbit or hare. There are some amazing resources on the web! The skull came from a rabbit and it's being exhibited on my window sill. Thank you to Graham and Caroline.

# Sherston Living Churchyard

It's a few months since I have reported on what is going on in the churchyard and that is because the work of the Community Payback (CP) team there is having two effects that make the volunteers of the Living Churchyard group much less vital than they have been in the past. Firstly, the task of cutting the grass is being admirably done by the CP team and their efforts have attracted quite a few favourable comments, as the churchyard is probably tidier than it has been for quite a few years. Secondly, it's proving difficult to coordinate a regime of wildlife management with the need to provide work for what is often a large number of CP workers, as the PCC agreed to do when arranging for them to work in the churchyard. That is not to say that all efforts to encourage wildlife in the churchyard have been abandoned. It is just that the need for regular monthly work sessions by volunteers has gone.

There are still several areas in the churchyard where grass has been allowed to grow long so that hay meadow flowers can bloom, attract and support insects and set seed. The very poor soil on the sites at the east end of the church, where three large

If you stand next to one of these patches on a warm day you will see that they are buzzing with a huge variety of insects

The area at the front of the churchyard below the copper beech tree continues to be managed for spring flowers, but as the canopy of the tree gets thicker summer flowers are being shaded out. Sadly, there has been no sign of the pyramidal orchid for the last two years and I think this is due to the changing environment in that area

If you are interested in this work in the churchyard you might want to attend the Wiltshire Living Churchyards Annual Seminar on Saturday 12 October at St Katherine's Church, Savernake. This is taking place later in the year than usual so that it can focus on fungi which should be appearing in October and are often found in churchyards. Please contact me if you are interested in this event or if you would like to know anything else about the churchyard, but for once I am not asking for volunteers to come and work!

# TREEtalk

#### September 2013

Grove Wood work resumes next month for the fifth season – quite extraordinary how time flies! The Sunday morning gang, nobly forgetting any thought of a Sunday lie-in, will be back in business. We hope new people will join us for a morning of exercise, fresh air and a natter over soup at the bonfire.

Now that all four sections of the wood have been coppiced and cleared once, we have to wait for a year before re-starting the whole process. However, there's plenty to do in the meantime. Some of the activities planned include the creation of a small dam to raise the river bank slightly for our visiting kingfishers, planting more snowdrops in the green along the bank, removing brambles and weeds along the river, grafting an ancient and rare crab apple tree that has been there for donkey's years and planting some of the 100 saplings that we received from the Woodland Trust in 2011. Homes have also to be found for some of the native trees being grown by the children in their nursery at school. We want to carry out a new botanical survey as new plants keep appearing now that light levels have increased throughout the

coppiced wood. This year, so many people commented on the bluebells and wood anemones flowering together to form a stunning carpet of colour in the late spring. We also hope that the Cotswold Rangers, who have proved such a tremendous source of advice and practical help over the years, will provide more bat and bird boxes.

Elsewhere in the village, we're taking advantage of the High Street improvements to introduce a few of our own. A flowering hawthorn (pretty spring blossom and good autumn colour) will be planted opposite the Old School, replacing the gingko tree that will be moved to the Recreation ground to join the Jubilee trees. The gingko deserves a rest after several hits by motorists. The hawthorn, by contrast is a more robust specimen. Sadly, the false acacia in front of the Tolsey is now beyond saving and we hope to replace it with an ornamental pear tree, conservation area regulations permitting. The other false acacia on the opposite pavement will be treated to some judicious tree surgery and should hopefully perk up.

Remember we are always ready to welcome new volunteers to the Grove Wood gang. It would be great to see new faces when we meet up for the first session from 10.00am on Sunday 6 October.

#### Shingles Vaccination for those aged 70 and 79

Most of us had chickenpox when we were young and some may not be aware that they've had it. If you did have it, then the virus that caused it can stay in our bodies for the rest of our lives without our knowing it is there. Sometimes, however, the virus reactivates when we're older and causes a disease called shingles. So shingles isn't like other infectious diseases because you don't catch it from someone else.

Shingles can be very painful and tends to affect people more commonly as they get older. And the older you are, the worse it can be. For some, the pain can last for many years.

There is now a vaccine that can reduce your risk






of getting shingles or reduce the severity of its symptoms should you develop the disease.

The new shingles vaccination programme is for all people aged 70 on 1 September 2013. People under 70 years of age will get the vaccine in the year following their 70th birthday. People aged 79 will also be offered the vaccine in a catch-up programme. If you're under 70 and have a history of getting shingles, speak to your GP. People aged 80 and over will not get the shingles vaccination because the vaccine is less effective as people get older.

You don't need to do anything as you will receive an invitation.

# THE ANCIENT ORDER OF SHERSTON MANGOLD HURLERS

Whilst members around the parish continue to quiver in anticipation as to a possible public Hurl next month the Order's Archivist Cilla Liddington has been earnestly following up rumours of a long forgotten allotment regulation which may assist produce a locally grown crop in future years.

There is no doubt that when Sherston Parish Council came into existence following the Local Government Act of 1894 Mangold Hurling was in a 'golden age' of popularity and influence. It is said that with the Ancient Order having so many members on the Council in its early years many pro mangold resolutions were passed without opposition or indeed discussion. One of these seems to have been a requirement that every parish allotment holder puts down a minimum of 3/28ths of their plot exclusively for the production of mangolds for the Hurl. With the triangle of land between Green Lane, Sandpits Lane and Knockdown Road once being all used as allotments this must have produced an enormous amount of mangolds for many a hurl both in Sherston and surrounding parishes.

The Order will now be entering into discussions with both the parish council and John Knight, the spokesperson for the current allotment holders, as regards reimposing this long ignored regulation. Furthermore the Order is putting forward a suggestion to the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group for a community mangold field to be an integral part of the final plan. Surely if a community orchard is to be included so should a mangold field?

On a lighter note there seems to be an element of competition entering the mysterious world of mangold recipes particularly muffins. A number of cooks are said to be experimenting with an array of ingredients including chocolate whilst Helen Moody of Amanda's Bistro in Malmesbury is determined to increase the range of culinary delight with her marvellously moist mangold quiche which is indeed a sight to behold let alone taste.
