



The coming of fast fibre



Over the summer some large green cabinets have appeared throughout Sherston. These cabinets are the start of the installation of optical fibre in the village to deliver fast fibre broadband. While the green cabinets are a tantalising hint of what is to come there is much additional work required, including the installation of another cabinet alongside each of the green cabinets (a Digital Subscriber Line Access Multiplexer (DSLAM) box) and the actual arrival of the optical fibre line in the village, before the village will be 'connected'. It may also take 6-12 months for providers to contact residents to offer access to the fast fibre broadband, so while a fast internet connection is on the way, it might take a bit longer for us to be able to download huge files in less than a blink of an eye!

Malmesbury community minibus needs more users



The Malmesbury Community minibus needs more local groups to use it, to ensure it remains viable.

Purchased in 2009 with the help of donations from a number of local organisations including the Malmesbury League of Friends and Malmesbury Carnival, the minibus has been used regularly by many local groups.

But Stan and Judy Paginton, who run the minibus, say that more groups need to use it to ensure its continuing viability.

The minibus is available for hire at any time by any recognised bona fide local group, but not individuals, on a daily or weekly basis at an inclusive charge of just 85p per mile for youth groups and 95p per mile for adult groups. It can be taken to any destination in the UK, but not overseas.

The 17-seater minibus is equipped to accommodate two wheelchairs, with an electric lift. All seats have fitted seat belts.

Mr Paginton said 'With rising costs of servicing and meeting safety regulations, we badly need more groups to use it. We are especially keen to encourage use by groups of young people. At present we have a good team of drivers, but more are always welcome.'

There are seven hospices in the UK run by the Sue Ryder Foundation so named after the founder, Baroness Sue Ryder who was inspired by the plight of refugees in post-war Europe and who devoted her life to relieving suffering, principally through the homes that now bear her name. Leckhampton Court is a beautiful mediaeval manor house dating back to 1320 and built by the Giffard family.

Quick Facts

Wiltshire Air Ambulance (WAA) Charitable Trust is a registered charity providing an essential helicopter emergency medical service (HEMS) throughout the county. The ceremonial county of Wiltshire and Swindon has a population of 684,000.

For over 20 years the helicopter and crew have attended just over 15,000 missions involving medical emergencies and accidents, ranging from serious sports injuries to multiple vehicle collisions.

The charity does not receive any central government funding, but relies almost entirely on the generosity of the public and businesses in the local community.

From 2015 it will cost the charity £2.5m a year to keep the air ambulance operational, including support functions. That's £6,850 a day.

WAA attend, on average, 2-3 potentially life-saving missions a day.

The new Bell 429 is the first of its type to operate as an air ambulance in the UK. It is one of the most advanced light twin helicopters ever developed, offering exceptional flight performance, low operating cost and proven reliability.

The aircraft has a top speed of 156 knots (180mph) and a cruising speed of 150 knots (173mph).

The air ambulance can reach anywhere in the county within 11 minutes.

The new helicopter carries the registration G-WLTS and the call sign Helimed22.

WAA attends incidents not just in Wiltshire but in neighbouring counties as well. 12% are outside the county, equally WAA is supported by neighbouring air ambulances.

WAA carry three crew on board, one pilot and two clinical staff.

WAA attend all kinds of incidents, from road traffic collisions to horse-riding accidents, child-related emergencies to sporting and cycling injuries. The Air Ambulance also attends medical emergencies such as heart attacks and strokes.

Wiltshire Air Ambulance is very proud to have the patronage of HRH The Duchess of Cornwall.

News from Holy Cross Church

I wonder how many readers of the Cliffhanger used to come to church regularly but now rarely do so? I wonder how many of them might be willing to give it a try again if they had the right invitation? If that's you, or someone you know, the opportunity is here: during September we'll have a Back to Church Sunday. The services will be at the usual times, and designed to be comfortable for anyone who is returning. In particular, the 9.30am at Holy Cross Sherston on 13 September will be a special Back to Church Sunday service. There will also be a picnic afterwards for anyone who wishes to come along. We guarantee the hymns will be well known! Do invite anyone you know who might be open to a welcome back, and do come along yourself.

In fact, the idea of Back to Church Sunday has evolved into 'A Season of Invitation', which recognises that between the summer holidays and Christmas there are monthly special services which have a much broader appeal, including Remembrance and Carol Services. Of course, the first of these is Harvest on 4 October at 6.00 pm with Supper (all Age at 9.30am).

This means it will be a great time to welcome our ordinand on placement, Lynne Godfrey. As Lynne normally worships in St Peter's Chippenham, our multi-parish rural benefice will be a contrasting experience for her. She will be around on Sundays and for some midweek events between 25 September and 20 October, so do make her welcome.

Not many people realise it, but we have some projects in our Group which are virtually unique in rural churches. Little Lights is truly pioneering in combining a group for 0-5 year olds with an activity based exploration of the Christian faith. There are many toddler groups elsewhere, and some end with a story or song or prayer, but the friendly integrated approach of Little Lights is truly special. It happens every Thursday from 10.30am to 11.30am in Hullavington church, during term time.

So I'm glad to report that Becky's funding appeal continues to make progress. More WEA Art, Literature and Music courses in Sherston

After a very successful programme last year three popular tutors return to Sherston to offer Worker's Educational Association (WEA) Art, Literature and Music courses in the British School Room. With WEA courses being discontinued in Hullavington, Sherston is the only location in the Malmesbury area for courses from the UK's largest voluntary provider of adult education. The WEA has over 500 branches in the UK offering 9,500 part-time courses to 74,000 students each year in England and Scotland and supported by 2,000 tutors and 3,000 volunteers.

Unveiling of the beautifully restored Cliff Road Chapel balcony clock (dating from the 1830's)

A celebration breakfast, followed by a ceremonial unveiling of the newly restored Old Chapel Balcony Clock, was held on Sunday morning on 9 August. Members and friends of Sherston Congregational Chapel met in 'The British School Room' (which is now legally 'The New Chapel') to hear of its history.

The face of the clock has – J. W. Gantlett - Sherston imprinted upon it. John Wadham Gantlett was the first clockmaker in Cliff Road (Back Street) born 1801 in Somerford he is listed in a directory as a Watch and Clockmaker of Great Sherston 1830. By 1851 he was living in Calne and was buried there in 1870. (A second watchmaker in Cliff Road was Zachariah Satteley 1820 – 1897).

Mr Graham Smith (Sherston born and bred) spent hours lovingly restoring the 170+ year old clock, mounting it on a bespoke plinth strong enough to take its great weight, but allowing access to the back for servicing and also to the frontal

Get your Free Flu Vaccinations at the surgery!

Our flu clinics start on Saturday 3 October with an Adult (over 18) drop in clinic.

Any patient aged 65 years of age or over is advised to have a free flu vaccine at the surgery and should come to one of our flu clinics. We will not be writing to patients over 65 years of age who have previously been invited.

All 'at risk' patients, including children, will receive a letter inviting them to have a flu vaccination. If you receive a letter, please come to the surgery to one of the flu clinics to have your free vaccination.

Patients eligible for flu vaccination are those:

- aged 65 years and over
- aged six months to under 65 in clinical risk groups
- pregnant women
- all children aged two to six years on 31 August 2015 (including any children in school years 1 and 2)
- in long-stay residential care homes
- carers

Walk on the wild side -

They are out there.... just need to find them

As you read this, the first piece of work on Project SHRIMP (SHerston River Improvement Project) should have been completed with a few hundred flowering plants planted on the water meadows between Stretchline and Grove Wood. This should show results next year as the native flowers start to bloom over the summer although in practice it may take two to three years before things really look great and there may be more planting next year.

In early October the work on the river begins. This will involve narrowing the width and speeding up the water flow to ensure it doesn't get clogged up like it is now. The riverbanks will be rebuilt in places to encourage water voles in larger numbers. If you fancy some physical work, probably getting quite wet in the process, please let Harriet or I know.

Last week I was fortunate to attend a talk given by Dr Andy Musgrove who shared the '1,000 species in one square kilometre project' he carried out in 2013. As you may surmise from the title, he set himself a target of identify 1,000 living species in a 1 kilometre square around his home and it included insects, trees, flowering plants, slugs, lichen, fish etc etc – basically plants not being included unless they were more than two metres outside a garden and everything must be identified to the species level. In some cases this will be easy (birds, butterflies,

everything! There were some rules such as garden

trees etc) but some groups will be more challenging such as bees, grasses and lichen. Apparently there are some 300 species of dandelions!! We may be able to call on experts from time to time.

A one kilometre square centred in the High Street would include the river, the cliff, the church yard (always a great place for wildlife) as well as meadows and gardens. All records will be submitted to the Biological Records Centre for Wiltshire.

If anyone is interested in getting involved please let me know. You really don't need any expertise - just a curiosity – maybe just for one group of plants or animals (bats, beetles, fungi, trees etc) and it would run throughout 2016. There are lots of great resources on the web to help.

BUS SERVICES

Last year Wiltshire Council spent £4.65 million on supported bus services.

These are non commercial services that would not be operated without a council subsidy, and account for around 50% of total bus mileage in the county. Of this funding, 43% is spent on 'regular rural' services. These typically operate between two market towns (e.g. Malmesbury - Cirencester, Shaftesbury - Salisbury), although their main function is to provide a service from the intermediate villages to either or both of the two towns. They currently provide at least 4 journeys every weekday in each direction, often running two hourly or sometimes more often in each direction. Town services (for example in Devizes, Trowbridge, Melksham, Warminster etc.) account for the next highest proportion of spend, followed by any non-commercial strategic network inter-urban services, evening services, infrequent rural services (mainly shoppers buses running only on certain days of the week), and Sunday services.

COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY TRANSPORT SCHEMES

In 2014/15 the Council spent £381,000 supporting community and voluntary transport schemes. There are 15 community minibus groups receiving annual grants, most operating one or two minibuses and providing specialised services in their area for particular groups who are unable to use ordinary bus services. Some other groups are village-based "community buses" and provide a range of services within their village and to nearby towns.

There are currently over 40 Link schemes which, over many years, now cover 98% of rural households in the county, providing transport (in the volunteers' own car) and other 'good neighbour' assistance to those living in their area who need it. Community Transport South Wilts also operate a social car scheme in the Salisbury city area which provides a similar function.

The Wheels to Work scheme operates countywide, and seeks external funding to supplement the relatively small contribution from the council. Its capacity to assist young people needing help with access to work, training and education depends on the success of these bids for external funding as well as continued support from the council
