Sherston Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Date – 16 May 2019

Last month we reported the fact that the Independent Examiner appointed to consider the draft plan had concluded that 'the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions' and had recommended to Wiltshire Council that, subject to modifications, 'it should proceed to Referendum'.

Following full consideration of the Examiner's Report and recommendations, Wiltshire Council has now issued a 'Decision Statement' confirming that the Neighbourhood Plan can proceed to Referendum (subject to certain limited modifications being made to ensure that it is compliant with the 'basic conditions').

A copy of the Examiner's Report and this Decision Statement have been placed on the Sherston PC website (see NHP Stage 4). Hard copies of both are available in the GP Surgery and the church.

The required modifications have now been made to the plan and returned to Wiltshire Council. Wiltshire Council has now therefore confirmed the arrangements for the Referendum. This is to be held on Thursday 16 May 2019.

The question that is likely to be asked in the Referendum will be:

'Do you want Wiltshire Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Sherston to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood plan area?'

You will be entitled to vote in the Referendum if you meet the eligibility criteria to vote in a local election and of course live in the Parish. The Village Hall will as usual be the 'polling station'. Postal and proxy votes can be submitted, provided that you make the necessary application within the requisite timescale. Google 'Sherston Neighbourhood Plan Referendum 16th May' and follow the link.

Wiltshire Council will be publishing further details of the Referendum and voting requirements in due course.

If the majority of those who vote in this Referendum are in favour of the neighbourhood plan, then Wiltshire Council will be obliged to formally 'make' (adopt) the plan within eight weeks. After this future planning applications made within the Parish will have to be assessed against the requirements of the adopted plan.

As a reminder the plan contains policies that seek to:

 Protect a wide range of existing community services, facilities and business premises.

- Protect certain important open spaces and open areas within and around the village.
- Provide a site for the provision of a replacement GP surgery.
- Provide land to meet the future housing needs of the village – including a mixture of both affordable and general housing.
- Provide additional space for future burials.
- Provide a site for a new/replacement vicarage.
- Support the upgrading or replacement of the existing sheltered accommodation at Anthony Close.
- Support improvements to the access routes between the proposed new GP surgery site and the village centre.
- Protect existing open-air sports facilities whilst creating the opportunity for the future possible expansion of the Football Field.
- Support the provision of new/replacement changing rooms and club facilities at the Football Field

Full details of the Referendum arrangements and the contents of the neighbourhood plan, on which you are being asked to vote, will be set out in next month's Cliffhanger.

11.00am-12.00noon: Mini Orange/Green (Year 4 to Year 6), £66 for members £77 non members for 11-week term.


12.00noon-1.00pm: Yellow Ball Junior Coaching (Year 7 and above), £66 for members £77 non members for 11-week term.


Tetbury Art Society Spring Exhibition

The Thomas Hobbes of Malmesbury Society


The Thomas Hobbes of Malmesbury Society (THoMS) was set up to promote the discussion of the ideas of Thomas Hobbes. In doing so, we hope that we shall make more people in Malmesbury aware of their most famous son, who by general consensus is England's preeminent political philosopher. In the course of time, we aim to be instrumental in the funding of a Hobbes prize at Malmesbury School and to make Malmesbury a destination point for all Hobbes scholars.

The centrepiece of our activities, besides the Hobbes supper at the end of November, is the Thomas Hobbes of Malmesbury Day, which this year is on Saturday 1 June. This whole-day event has two parts: a symposium and a concert. The symposium takes place in The Old Bell Hotel and the concert in the Julia and Hans Rausing Building (formerly, the Moravian Church).

Rausing Building (formerly, the Moravian Church). The theme of this year's symposium is Hobbes, Machiavelli and Italy, and the speakers are world leaders in Hobbes studies: Professor Quentin Skinner, the doyen in the field; Dr Raffaella Santi from the University of Urbino in Italy; and Dr Luc Foisneau who wrote his doctorate on Hobbes and is Director of Research at the CNRS (The National Centre for Scientific Research) in Paris.

The Hobbes Day will end with a concert of 17th century English and Italian baroque music performed by a young trio from the ensemble Music for Awhile under the artistic directorship of Professor Margaret Faultless in the refurbished Moravian Church.

Hobbes visited Italy on three occasions when he met leading social thinkers of the 17th century, including Galileo. The musicians





have chosen works by English and Italian composers some of whom Hobbes, himself a lute player, would have known. Their choices range from Monteverdi, Castello and Fontana to music by John Dowland (who may have been at Chatsworth when Hobbes lived there) and Handel.
