## Sherston Boules Festival: Back with a bang!

With almost 150 teams competing (including Juniors and Colts), in heat that exceeded 24 degrees from the early morning, the main competition was won by TIP who comprehensively beat Never Mind the Boules Ocks (who were best local team). Never Mind etc were Russ Moores, Dan Pritchett and captained by Nick Brock. TIP were Clive de Silva (captain) from Bristol, Phil Bradshaw (currently national champion in both men's doubles and mixed doubles) from Cardiff and Sherston's own brilliant junior, Alex Moriarty.

The Plate turned out to be a great competition and resulted in a win for Boules à la Blows captained by Nick Blows, with his son Charlie and Rob Farahar. They beat Steve Smith's Imperial Officers Club (of Bath) in an enthralling match - 13-11.

There were also problem-solving activities. In small groups, Guides were given two short bamboo sticks, some string, a plastic jug and clothes pegs, and had to work out how to empty the water from one bucket to another without getting too close and without touching the bucket with their hands!



They had a great evening out and about around the village learning the basics of photography with Sherston's Tea Smart, trying out the rule of thirds and taking close-ups, as well as photographing movement – such as jumping together. 

The Sherston Old School Community Interest Company (SOSCIC) has recently donated £20,000 to the Village Hall Committee towards the cost of undertaking their current extensions and alterations to the building, with the promise of up to a further £30,000 should it be required to complete this work.

The Board decided that it was entirely appropriate for The Old School Project, which is owned and managed by the village, to help pay for this work. We are delighted to see that construction work is well under way and hopefully it will be completed in the next few months.

Two plaques will shortly be fixed to the Old School building. The first of these is in memory of John Knight, who sadly passed away just over a year ago, to commemorate his incredible commitment to The Old School Project.

#### Sherston Shrews - after-school Forest School for years 1-6

The Sherston Shrews group of children have, just like our little mammal friends, been extremely active over the past couple of months, participating in fun outdoor activities on the village hall field.

We've studied ants, considered their characteristics and how they can teach us many key skills. We observed that the ants were hardworking, good at planning and organising, were persistent and great at teamwork, just as we try to be when playing various games! However, the Shrews were dismayed to see that the ants were gathering and taking underground, tiny plastic pellets that were all over the field. We discovered that these were used as insulation in the old front porch and had escaped when it was demolished. The children's interest led to learning through fun games and challenges about how such plastic pollution can end up in our oceans. They were very determined to collect as many as they could to be disposed of properly.

We also took part in The Wildlife Trusts' '30 Days Wild' challenge in June. Our 'Random acts of Wildness' included learning wildlife yoga moves which we practised each session, barefoot walking known as 'earthing', learning about birds, how to be hedgehog aware, investigating the bugs and wild plants around us and constructing a 'log pile palace' to encourage increased numbers of beneficial insects to the area.

The final session caused much excitement, as the





children also developed problem-solving and risk-management skills, whittling suitable sticks for toasting snacks over a campfire.
