#### Look after your NHS! By Dr Pip Pettit

My task on a monthly basis is to check to see how many appointments have been missed at the surgery. This month, sadly, it has been more than average and with Christmas coming, which is a time patients often DNA (Do Not Attend ) as lives get busy, we would like to remind everyone how much this actually COSTS your NHS!

From NHS statistics 2 Jan 2019: Each appointment costs an average of £30, the total cost to the NHS being more than £216million on top of the disruption for staff and fellow patients that would pay for ... the annual salary of 2,325 full time GPs! www.bbc.co.uk/ news/health-46732626

So just for the Tolsey surgery, last month, 64 missed GP and nurse appointments equates to nearly £2,000 per month. Add this statistic to the hours in our dispensary wasted due to 269 medications that were

prescribed and dispensed by our staff during May to August and were then not collected by patients, equating to over £600, and you can see that overall the impact on our NHS is enormous.

Don't be one of the statistics burdening our NHS, please cancel your appointment via our cancellation phone line if it is no longer needed, do not order drugs you do not need, and if you have a prescription waiting, please come and collect it on time.

#### Equipment

Our porch has become an unwelcome depository for patient equipment. We are now having it removed by the Council at our own expense, once it is clear please DO NOT bring/deposit/offer equipment to the surgery.

As much as we would like it to be, patient-specific equipment is not recyclable, nor can we get it back to the hospital or A&E where it came from. This includes crutches and leg braces (our most recent acquisitions). Clogging up the porch leaves nowhere for our wheelchair users and pushchairs. Thank you for your consideration with this ongoing problem.

#### Influenza Campaign 2019

The season is now upon us (highest levels of influenza seen November to February) and by the time this article is published, hopefully most of you will have attended either our drop-in or booked Flu Clinics. However, if you have not, it is not too late.

We always have enough vaccines for all our 'At Risk' patients and will have one for you.

Why risk the devastating effects of flu when a simple vaccine can prevent the worst effects? Please do book via reception for a vaccine appointment.

# Why are there buckets in the church?



Do you remember signing a stone tile in 2010 when the church launched its appeal to replace the roof? You'll be glad to know that the main roof is still in great shape and should be for many years to come. However, the roof over the south aisle, which covers the Lady Chapel and the vestry, has reached the end of its life. Our architect tells us that it can no longer be repaired and needs to be replaced. He has recommended that the porch roof be replaced at the same time, to save the extra costs of re-erecting scaffolding. Those who were in church at the start of the Arts Festival would have seen buckets and cloths, not only in the vestry, where we've had trouble for some time, but also over the altar in the Lady Chapel and elsewhere.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is responsible for keeping the church in good repair and must now work out how to raise at least £50,000 needed for this work. Looking after an ancient building is a neverending task and the PCC, made up of volunteers, has to ensure there is money for the regular bills like electricity, water, heating oil, insurance and routine maintenance, as well as major repairs. We are lucky in having some generous regular donors, but we need YOUR help in paying this huge amount. We know that the church building is highly valued in Sherston. Over 100 volunteers help to make it a special place by cleaning, arranging flowers or helping with Coffee Shop or Stay and Play toddlers group, to mention just some of their work. It is a venue for events like the Arts Festival, concerts and talks and part of the village's heritage - perhaps you have had your child baptised or you were married here or attended the funeral of a loved one.

The Cliffhanger team has generously agreed to distribute donation envelopes with the February 2020 edition of the magazine, so we're hoping that you will respond generously to keep our beautiful ancient building watertight and safe for us and for future generations.

# The Lost Chapel of Pinkney

In January, Wiltshire Buildings Record (WBR) was asked to investigate a stone-lined shaft and tunnel that was recently discovered in the grounds of Pinkney Park Farm. The tunnel led from the farm down to the River Avon and was very likely used during dairying at the farm in the 18th century. However, during examination, an adjacent building appeared to be of great age, and rather older than the mid-17th century farmhouse that it is a part of. This early range was noted by Historic England to have two excessively thick walls of approximately 90cm, inconsistent with the attached farmhouse and walls that were aligned east-west.

Research by WBR in the Wiltshire and Swindon Archives led to the conclusion that it could be the former free chapel of Sherston Pinkney, the site of which is unrecorded. An estate chapel was known to have been funded by a wealthy patron and possibly originally located close to an early 'capital messuage' for the manor of Sherston Pinkney.

Wiltshire Collections by Aubrey & Jackson published in 1862 states: 'Sherston Pinkeney had formerly a Free Chapel of its own dedicated to St. John the Baptist. The building has been long destroyed: and the site seems to have been forgotten.' Phillipps' Wiltshire Institutions written by Sir Thomas Phillipps and published in 1825 dates the chapel to 1300 or earlier, with the first incumbent being one William Pykarel, whose patron was Walter Pykarel. It is likely that the chapel of Sherston Pinkney was an estate chapel, constructed and maintained for the benefit of the lord of the manor of Sherston Pinkney and his tenantry. Private chapels, despite attempts by the bishops to limit them, flourished in fairly large numbers up to the Reformation. Often the chapel was attached to the 'capital messuage' within the manor but not always. In the case of the chapel at Sherston Pinkney, it appears it was originally detached.

The chapel seems to have been abandoned around 1640, coinciding with the Civil War and the rise of anticlericalism. Alternatively, since the Reformation, endowed revenues for the benefit of the chapel may have reduced, resulting in the slow decline of the chapel and eventual closure. If we are correct in our assumptions, the former chapel at Pinkney, far from being demolished, was put to a new use. It became incorporated into the 17th century farmstead, then became attached as a range to the farmhouse in the 18th century, the walls being raised twice to accommodate its new functions. The chapel has had several uses after its closure in the mid-17th



century, including as a kitchen, dairy with cheese room over, store room, barn and more recently as a reception room. Today, its thick external walls with signs of many alterations and its large fireplace bear testament to its early history. A footnote to this history was added in August when falling hay bales demolished a wall on the main road in Pinkney, revealing fragments of carved stones thought to be part of statuary depicting Christ in Judgement or Majesty. Had these come from the abandoned chapel?



Regretfully, I have to announce that Balcony House Cellars Wine Shop, at The Old School, will be closing at the end of this year.

From humble beginnings 10 years ago, with two pallets of imported wine in the dining room at Balcony House, we were the second tenant to move into The Old School development. The staff and I have had a wonderful time building the business and advising customers, not only from Sherston but also weekend visitors from across the UK, France, South Africa, USA and only yesterday another Australian.

We have tried to differentiate ourselves but, after a couple of difficult trading years, find ourselves yet another High Street casualty. Competition is fierce and margins tight, not only from the supermarkets, who have moved ever closer to Sherston, but increasingly from online competition.

With a family base in South West France, I decided 12 years ago to become an 'expert' in the wines from the regions, searching out excellent producers not readily available in the UK and importing directly with a vision of slowly growing the business in Sherston to it becoming my retirement business. I have June Godwin from Sherston Wines to thank for her assistance in the early days; it's not often you

But, like any village concern, if enough support is not there then the outcome is inevitable. One needs turnover to survive.

My thanks to all my customers, many of whom have become more than just a face at a checkout. And to the staff over the years – in particular, Andrew Jarvis, Charlie Green, Freddy Smith and Paul Cuss who prepared some wonderful food for our 'Thirsty Thursday' Club. Finally, my thanks to The Angel and David with whom we held some memorable wine and food tastings, in particular the series of Gin Tastings. Personally, I am now taking a break from the wine business, though I am being encouraged by some of you to start an online offering, we'll see.

I have stock to sell and it is the season of goodwill, so from Friday 6 December we shall be offering a sale across all our product lines as follows. Some of the fixtures and fittings are for sale as well.

- Gins and spirits 25% off, eg Garden Tiger £38 reduced to £29.
- Non-vintage wines 30% off, a few reduced by 50%.

Director Sue Lehrer once again brought together an energetic, naturally funny troupe to brighten a soggy November weekend. Complete with flying carpet, creative set design, and plenty of heart and soul, this year's panto saw Charlie Blows cast as the eponymous Aladdin.



Charlie nailed his principal boy's teenage mooning over unattainable Princess Jasmine, played with poise and spirit by Rosie Shephard, while Richard Warren pulled off the role of Emperor in his inimitable style. Never has casting a South African villain been more apt!

Abanazar was aided by hopeless henchmen Feng



and Shui, a dippy double-act played by Kirstie Blair and Mandi Bailey-Turner. Watching their farcical interactions, it was clear the pair enjoy as many laughs offstage as on, while Fearn Blair gave a comically jaded performance as Slave of the Ring. And what is Aladdin without its genie? Beautifully adorned, Tahiti Van Rooyen played the reluctant Genie of the Lamp, who was notably unflappable despite her husband's best efforts to engage her in some 'domestic' improvisation!

The show's youngest cast members made up a robust chorus with tireless energy and big smiles, executing some truly superb choreography by Sarah Scherer and Helen Fisk that made clever use of props such as UV lights and parasols.

The action throughout was punctuated by brief but on-point deadpan appearances from PCs 27 and 39, played by real-life best mates Barnaby Blows and Ollie Finch.

Over the course of the last year, Craig Henry has lost the ability to walk, been addicted to opiate pain killers, had spinal surgery, suffered depression and spent 34 nights living inside a hospital. Craig, who is from Sherston, has experienced a journey through public and private healthcare systems and has noted it all down in a new book.

What started as a twinge in his leg, turned into paralysing him and confining Craig to a hospital bed. The world inside the plain walls of healthcare institutions are a bizarre one, from patients smoking inside the ward to people being told they have days left to live in an amplified fishbowl of pain, confusion and fear. The Cared For gives an insight into the NHS and private healthcare systems from the perspective of the hospital bed and through a patient's vision.

Whilst recovering from his spinal operation, Craig began writing his book at home in Sherston. Having witnessed the mounting pressure on the NHS, he wanted the story to do something positive. In this, he has chosen to donate 50% of proceeds of the book to the hospital ward that took such excellent care of him in a hope that the money can help future patient care in that hospital.


# Helping Unpaid Carers in Wiltshire Return to the Work

Carer Support Wiltshire (CSW) has launched a new programme that will help unpaid carers in Wiltshire who want to return to work.

Many people give up work when a loved one becomes ill in order to care for them. It can be challenging to return to work once they are ready to go back - carers often feel their skills have become out of date and they lack confidence.

Funding was awarded to the Wiltshire charity by the government and the Returners Fund website is now live at carersbacktowork.co.uk. #### Time for Carers Appeal 2019/20

Carer Support Wiltshire (CSW), the charity that supports the unpaid carers in our communities, is currently running an appeal to raise £30,000 to spend on carers.


There are an estimated 47,500 carers in Wiltshire. A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who could not always manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.


It can be an incredibly rewarding thing to do for someone, but can take its toll as well. 40% of carers say they haven't had a day off in over a year, while 25% haven't had a day off in over five years. The effect of not getting a rest from caring is shattering, with carers describing being close to breaking point, desperate for some time to themselves, to sleep, recuperate and see friends and family.

Regular breaks have been proven to combat burnout and stress and money raised by the appeal will directly pay for breaks for carers. Last year's appeal helped over 80 carers take the time they needed to improve their health and wellbeing. It paid for respite care, theatre tickets, yoga classes, counselling sessions and much more


Claire, a carer who looks after her mother who has dementia, said: 'It wasn't even about being given the money to go away - it was about being seen and valued as a carer and given the recognition and support that enabled me to carry on.'


