
No dogs allowed!

Sherston Remembrance Service 2022



Blue skies and warm weather boded well for the 2022 Remembrance service, the first full event since 2018. Leading up to 11 o'clock, 630 people assembled in Church Street for Sherston's ninth outside Remembrance service. We welcomed back a full contingent of 90 Squadron Royal Logistic Corps, from Buckley Barracks, commanded by Major Alex Nicholas, and Sherston's uniformed youth organisations returned in good spirits. Before the service, the Sherston Band of Ringers started proceedings by ringing half muffled as the Union Flag flew over the tower. The Rector, Revd Adam Beaumont, led the service assisted by Pastor Andrew Williams-Tarling of the Congregational Church and Revd Janet Evans of the Methodist Church. Roger Whitehouse, the verger, carried the cross.





After the two-minute silence, Air Commodore Paul Rose recited The Exhortation, and Captain Henry Jodrell and Amélie Méheust read the names of servicemen of Easton Grey and Sherston who died in past conflicts. Private Fryer of 9 Regt RLC recited the Kohima Epitaph.

The address was given by the Rector Revd Adam Beaumont and prayers were said by Pastor Andrew Williams-Tarling and Revd Janet Evans. At the end of the service, 90 Sqn RLC followed by the youth organisations marched past and Councillor Tanya Burgess took the salute.





HEALS 'Big Give' Christmas Challenge 2022

As temperatures drop to a more normal level, many local households will be regretting the passing of our 'Indian Summer'.

This is a time of struggle for many families working out how to afford Christmas. Pensioners starting to debate with themselves about 'heating or eating'. At HEALS, we know all about these conversations. They are happening daily in our office in Malmesbury Town Hall.

As a local community social welfare charity, HEALS is here to help in any way that we can. We are already the largest issuer of Foodbank vouchers. Our part-time staff work long hours to help people to sort out their debts, press landlords to do necessary repairs, help replace essential household equipment, and help vulnerable people (many with physical and mental challenges) to get the support they deserve. These demands are growing fast. We fear that need is going to accelerate very rapidly in the New Year.

We have expanded our winter welfare programme to bring a little more festive cheer to those who are struggling in addition to growing our Hardship Fund. Already the number of families on our HEALS Pantomime trip is up 50%. So is the number of children being provided with a new toy and Christmas goodies this year compared to last.

The same pattern is emerging at the other end of the age spectrum.

This is the sixth year of our Christmas Community

Lunch. The number of diners have grown year on year. This year, over 150 elderly people have been invited. The largest number ever. We also know that for many, this is their main Christmas celebration - and we will make it the best one possible!

None of this is possible without our army of volunteers, generous sponsors and donors who give at every level. But we know we have to do more as we face up to the growing need in our community.

In response, HEALS has stepped up its work. In July, we launched our Community Fridge and Freezer to ensure that perfectly good supermarket food from the Co-op and Aldi did not go to landfill but rather fed local people. For our Christmas Challenge, we found new sponsors to pledge £2,000 which will be doubled by national funding to create a £4,000 war chest.
