New Play Park Official Opening: Saturday 16 February

The Parish Council would like to invite the Parishioners of Sherston Parish to the official opening of the new play park at the recreational ground on Saturday 16 February at 11.00am.

Children of Sherston can now swing away till their hearts' delight now that the refurbishment of the play area has been completed. Funding for the makeover, which included the installation of several pieces of new play equipment and resurfacing, came from funds from Mr and Mrs North's legacy which was left to the Parish Council to spend on the youth of the Parish. Further funding was obtained from a successful grant application to the National Lottery.

Visitors to the play area can now enjoy two new play towers, a tornado carousel, a rota roka, a vippey seesaw, a nexus free rider, the viper, the scorpion, trampolines and several new swings with different types of seats.

New safety surfacing has also been installed, along with new seating to enable the parishioners of Sherston to sit down, relax and watch the children enjoy the new asset to the parish. If that wasn't enough, new goal posts will add further enjoyment to those who wish to practise their football skills.

Cyber security

At the Malmesbury Area Board on Tuesday 8 January there was a presentation on cyber security by the South West Police Regional Cyber Crime Unit and the Wiltshire Police Digital Investigations and Intelligence Unit. It is part of a strategy to help protect people and businesses from cyber crimes such as identity theft, ransoms and frauds.

The basic messages were that simple precautions work. Basics include using passwords that are hard to guess, never clicking on an attachment or link in an email from an unknown person, don't be rushed by messages that say you need to act very quickly (particular one from your bank), and check that the website address you see is what you expect. Simplebut could save you a lot of money!



Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

Temporary Closure of: Commonwood Lane (Part), Thompsons Hill (Part), Tanners Hill, and Noble Street (Part), Sherston (Ref: TTRO 5759)

Notice is hereby given that Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic:



Phase 1

Commonwood Lane (Part), Sherston; from its junction with the C93 to its Junction with Thompsons Hill:

Phase 2

Thompson Hill (Part), Sherston; from its junction with Commonwood Lane to its junction with Tanners Hill;

Phase 3

Tanners Hill, Sherston; from its junction with Thompson Hill to its junction with Grove Road;

Phase 4

Noble Street (Part) Sherston; from its junction with Grove Road to its junction with B4040 Church Street.

To enable: Bristol Water to carry out trunk main renovation works. Phase 1 and Phase 2

Alternative route: via Thompson Hill (unaffected length) – Bustlers Hill – C93 –Commonwood Lane (unaffected length) and vice versa.

Phase 3 and Phase 4

Alternative route: via B4040 – Easton Town – Foxley Road – Bustler Hill – Tanners Hill

(unaffected length) – Noble Street (unaffected length) and vice versa.

The closures and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation on 11 February and the closures will run consecutively until 11 June. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible, although delays are

likely due to the nature of the works. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months.


Catching up with Beech class
