

## Saving Sherston's swifts



As part of the Sustainable Sherston initiative, we would like people in the village to consider installing suitable nest boxes in appropriate locations.

We are fortunate to have a number of swifts that nest in the village. Not to be confused with house martins or swallows, swifts are bigger, fly faster with long, sickle-shaped wings, are dark, sooty brown and fly up and down the High Street in the summer shrieking away – hence the traditional name of 'Devil Screechers'. They are the iconic birds of a beautiful summer's day.

Between 1995 and 2016, we lost over half of all the swifts breeding in the UK in part due to loss of suitable nesting sites. Unlike house martins and swallows, swifts nest in crevices and holes and don't build the mud cup nests that the other birds do. This means you don't get the mess on your window frames or patio!

An ideal location for a box or boxes is four to five metres off the ground, under an eave, away from trees and facing north-east or north-west so they are out of the sun and prevailing wind and rain. As they are social nesting birds, you should have at least three boxes reasonably close together.

Swifts are communal nesters and are very loyal to their nest site. They only spend three to four months in the village and overwinter in Africa, flying 22,000 kilometres (14,000 miles) every year between Equatorial and Southern Africa. When they fledge, the youngsters spend the next two to three years on the wing never landing. They sleep and mate while flying!!

There are a number of ways of getting started:

Buy nest boxes either completed or as a kit from numerous places in the UK – you could even install a CCTV camera and see what's happening!! If you need help installing them, let us know and we can help.

If you have some basic woodworking skills and maybe don't have a suitable location to install them, then you could volunteer to build one or (ideally) more nest boxes. There are many designs available on the internet. If you need some materials let us know and we can help.

If you have a suitable location, as detailed above, and are willing to have some installed we can source the nest boxes from the kind people who have volunteered to make them, and we can install them!

Couple of key points – swifts arrive in May, so everything needs to be ready by the end of March. As mentioned, they are loyal to their traditional sites so, to encourage them to consider new ones, you should play a recording of swift calls when they appear. You can download a suitable sound file from a number of locations. To minimise any disturbance to neighbours, you can play the calls at specific times.

If we can get 20 new locations in or near the village to install the boxes that would be fantastic, and we can make a direct contribution to conserving this beautiful bird. Please do think about this!

The lockdown may impact what we can do and when – but in the meantime anyone with a bit of spare marine ply and some carpentry skills can knock out a few boxes! There is lots of advice available on the internet such as the RSPB or swift-conservation. org



It's been just over a year since Sustainable Sherston, a local climate and biodiversity group, was set up to accelerate action on climate change and biodiversity loss in the local area. Since then, we've held events, worked on proposals for a community orchard and a new cycle route, and encouraged Sherston Parish Council to become carbon neutral by 2030. Here's a wrap up of what we've been working on over the past year.

#### Physical and Virtual Events

Our first major event was Professor David Waltham's talk on the 10 Tonne Carbon Diet, which attracted over 80 people to the British School Room and showed us that there was lots of interest in sustainability in Sherston. Months later, we held an online talk and discussion with Isabel Losada, a writer and journalist, who spoke about her latest book, The Joyful Environmentalist - How to Practise Without Preaching, and offered some helpful tips on how to incorporate more environmentally friendly behaviours into our daily lives.

#### **Making Sherston Greener**

We have been developing the idea for a Community Orchard in the Village Hall field, in collaboration with the Village Hall Committee. We have been awarded a grant for the trees and will be ordering them soon, with a view to planting in March (Covid-19 restrictions permitting). We have also canvassed opinion in Eastern Square on the subject of planting more trees, which has been overwhelmingly positive, and will submit plans soon.

#### Making Cycling Safer

We looked at local transport links and have also proposed an official cycle route between Sherston and Malmesbury, using the Foxley Road. This is



designed to better support the increased use of this route which was seen during the first lockdown. This proposal has been approved by Wiltshire Council Highways Department and we hope this will progress as soon as council resources are freed up from Covid-19 support tasks.

#### Carbon Neutral by 2030

On the lobbying side, Sherston Parish Council has now approved a motion to become a carbon neutral organisation by 2030 and to help the rest of the parish in this target as well. A working group is being set up to do a carbon audit of the council. We have also responded to concerns about the poor quality of the water in the Sherston Avon which has resulted in a new Parish Council Working Group to discuss this further with Wessex Water and the Environment Agency.

#### Supporting Our Wildlife

We are promoting a scheme for installing swift boxes to encourage more of our summer visitors to nest in the village (see page 3), and have plans to put in place a produce sharing table by the allotments (a Go-Fresh Shelter).

During 2020, it was difficult to make progress at the pace we wanted to due to the pandemic. That being said, we have been working on a number of initiatives that we are looking forward to getting off the ground later this year. 

# How replacing the church's south aisle and porch roofs revealed a mystery from the past

When rain started to come through the roof on the south side of our church, we knew that major repairs would be needed. What we did not know was that the work would reveal a mystery from the church's past that is yet to be solved. The project to replace the leaking roofs on the porch and south aisle, which can be clearly seen in the aerial photograph, is now finished apart from some final details

With the help of our church architect, the Fabric Committee of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) accepted an estimate for the work from a local business, West Country Tiling, and work was due to start in early 2020. An appeal for funds to the whole village, via the Cliffhanger, resulted in a response of amazing generosity. We would like to thank everyone again for their kind gifts. We also received support from a variety of national and local grant-making bodies and so the work could go ahead

The beginning of the Covid-19 lockdown in March 2020 meant that work could not start as planned. When West Country Tiling was eventually able to begin, progress was much slower than usual due to coronavirus restrictions and also more repair was needed than had initially been thought. Some large roof timbers needed replacing and, interestingly, work revealed that a previously unknown serious fire had damaged part of the roof perhaps as much as 200

years ago. When access to the Wiltshire and Swindon History Centre in Chippenham is once again available, it may be possible to discover what actually happened to cause the fire damage. For now it remains a mystery. The original roofing material was reused to recover the roof, after being melted down and recast in a process unchanged since the medieval period

The work on the roof was substantially completed by 10 August 2020 and, although there are still some minor items to be completed, the church is now watertight. An alarm system with remote monitoring has been added to ensure the security of the church. Inside, the areas below the roof replacement will be redecorated.

Unfortunately, the church, along with many other buildings in the village, was struck by lightning in the electrical storm of August 2020. This caused serious damage to many electrical systems, including lighting, central heating control, sound, clock and organ. Even the lightning conductor itself was damaged and had to be replaced. Repairs are still under way but are covered by the church's insurance. The work caused by this incident has been considerable, particularly coming so soon after the roof project. This gives some idea of the amount of effort put in by the voluntary PCC Fabric Committee to keep our village church in good condition.

At present, in common with all religious buildings, the church building remains largely closed. Although

we have held some socially distanced services, we are not permitted to hold any social activities inside. We were able to hold our usual Open Gardens event, in September rather than the usual June, but teas were served in the churchyard rather than inside, taking full advantage of the very fine weather. The various community activities held in church before the pandemic such as Coffee Shop and carer and toddler group are on hold, but we do now have a building that is watertight and fit for the many and varied uses we want to put it to. We hope and pray that these will be resumed as soon as possible and that we will, before too long, be able to offer social as well as spiritual activities to you all

Holy Cross Church is proud to be an integral part of the village community. Most recently we were able to offer the final scene in the village Advent Trail outside, as well as several Christmas services inside the building. The whole church and churchyard reflect the history and the present life of many people in Sherston. We know from our Visitors' Book that many people with local connections come from near and far to find their family history, perhaps in a grave in the churchyard or in a memory of their wedding or their child's baptism in the church. If you have a connection like this, please consider including a gift to our parish church in your will. Your legacy, large or small, can make a big difference in helping us to secure the future of the church building and the work of the church for future generations. Thanks to the help of so many, we have been able to take an enormous step in securing an important part of our village's heritage, its parish



## A Jaunt through the Years

Another excerpt from the late George Stephens' recollections and stories of bygone life in Sherston that he compiled in 1995.

Our bread issue was a much simpler affair (than water supply detailed in the last extract) as there was always a baker in the village. The main bakery was at the brow of Brook Hill. The baker's name in the 1920s was Thomas Elsip, in later years it was Frank Thompson, now we have no baker, but bread can be bought from either of two grocers. In the 1930s, '40s and '50s, there were two bakers, Thompsons and Jack Vining, who ran the bakehouse from his premises near The Tolsey. Both bakers were renowned for their 'Lardy cakes', bread was delivered from both establishments.

If one was in need of a doctor, then it was for Doctor William Ratcliffe Tollerton that you sent. A visit from him to your home would cost about five shillings, a large sum of money in those days. Many people finding themselves ill, could not afford that kind of money, so he was only called in extreme circumstances, often too late. Like most medical men, they were a kindly profession, and would do what they could for a smaller fee, or be paid in kind, vegetables, fruit or anything else, a load of manure in one case!

There were two pharmacists in our village, Duncan Neale (he was also a veterinary surgeon) and the other, who displayed above his doorway: 'T. Neale & Sons. Manufacturing Analytical & Dispensing Chemist. Veterinary Surgeon and Chemical Works'. One can only wonder at the size of notice board required to carry all that!

In addition to our church (The Church of the Holy Cross), there were also four chapels. The Congregational at the end of Back Street (now Cliff Road), The Baptist (now demolished) and The Primitive Methodist, both in Back Lane (now Grove Road). There was also, many years ago, a strict Baptist Chapel in Church Street, the rear of these premises being in Gaston Lane.

On the subject of social gatherings, we always had our share of public houses, as did most villages. There were seven in Sherston at the turn of the century, in addition to several beer retailers. The seven pubs were: The Old Swan, The Angel, The Forresters Arms, The Bell (all four in the High Street), The New Inn (opposite the Church) and The Rattlebone (on the corner of Church Street and Noble Street) which dates back (as an inn) to the sixteenth century. Last but not least, The Carpenters Arms, affectionately known as 'The Carps', in Easton Town.

This old pub was under threat of closure for several years, so a petition was organised and sent to the head of the brewery, Colonel Whitbread who lived at Farleaze, about two miles from Sherston. It was finally reprieved, and after extensive renovations, was allowed to remain open, it is now a very popular pub *(currently an Indian restaurant)*. The Bell is now a butchers shop *(now a private house)*. The Old Swan circa 1700, was

closed in the 1920s. The landlord of The Swan, at the time of closing, was one Samuel Goodfield, bearded, fat and jolly, so it was said. The Angel was always a popular inn, the landlord in the 1920s was Ralph Goulding, later on and during my teenage years it was Jack Amos, he was a popular landlord who liked a bit of fun, but would not tolerate bad behaviour.

After the end of the 1939-45 war, the motor car became a much desired form of transport. Everyone saved a small amount of their wages to try and buy a car. More often than not it would be a second-hand model, but whatever the condition, cars began to put in an appearance.

Petrol was three shillings a gallon (15p), road tax about two pounds. So suddenly Sherston people were on the move, driving out for pleasure and also for their shopping. As a result of this, village pubs and shops suffered. The first pub to close was The Forresters Arms followed shortly by The New Inn, The Rattlebone closed in 1977, but was soon reopened as an antique shop, with part as a private dwelling house. But in a year or two it was again sold, this time as a public house and restaurant. Because of scandal and lack of business, The Angel has recently closed permanently as a public house, and is now a software company (now cafe and B&B). So today (1995) only The Rattlebone and The Carpenters Arms remains of the seven original public houses.




