Toilet Twinning - flushing away poverty one toilet at a time!

Toilet Twinning is a water sanitation initiative - 2.3 billion people worldwide do not have somewhere safe to go to the toilet. At the Lite-Bite lunches held during Lent this year at the home of Rev Susan Harvey, participants gave what they could to The Toilet Twinning Charity. We were delighted to find that we had sufficient funds to provide not only one but two toilets to villages where there had been no toilet before. Mabilabo in Mzimba, Malawi now has latrine number 90600 with a palm roof and the other latrine number 40219 is in Pujehun in Sierra Leone. We have been given framed photographs of the latrines and these are proudly on view in the two toilets at Holy Cross Church. Take a look when next in the church! You too could help fund a project – just £60 will provide a toilet in the country of your choice.

Reporting highways problems to Wiltshire Council


At the last Parish Council meeting, we were informed that Wiltshire Council has some budget available to sort out highways problems like potholes; we were encouraged to report any issues on the highways, using the Wiltshire Council website or the corresponding app, which you can download to your mobile phone.

The website can be found at: www.wiltshire.gov. uk/mywiltshire-online-reporting. You can track the progress of your issue if you are registered on the website; to do this, you will need to click on 'Register' and input an email address and password. Once you are registered, you then navigate back to the screen below and click on 'Report'.




If you do not want to register, you can raise an issue anonymously, by just clicking on 'Report' and following the instructions below in the same way.


You should now see this screen.



Click on 'Report It' in the green block on the left-hand side.



Click on subject that you want to report. If it's a pothole, for instance, you need to click on 'Highway Issues' and then on 'Potholes'.



You can then enter the date, the location of the pothole using a local area map and you can also upload a photograph. A service issue number is supplied to you so that you can track progress against the issue you have raised, assuming you have registered.

I'm a Scout, get me out of here!







School Days - news from Sherston Primary School

Science Week













Sherston School's Science Week opened with an outof-this-world experience when a mobile planetarium was set up in the hall. All the children - from Oak class to Sycamore class - went on a space adventure, learning about the sun, moon and stars. as well as the planets. In addition, Oak class went on an undersea adventure, Willow found themselves in the middle of a tornado and Sycamore visited a space station.

Following a successful Sports Day on Tuesday (see last month's Cliffhanger), Dr Beggs and some Yr 9 students from Malmesbury Secondary School came to investigate the science of sport. Oak, Ash and Birch learnt all about the heart and became red blood cells being pumped around the body. Beech, Chestnut, Willow and Sycamore then investigated the effects of exercise on the heart.

A number of professionals, parents and representatives from local businesses, who work in scientific fields also visited our school to talk to the children about their jobs.

Back in their classrooms, the children completed a number of scientific and engineering challenges created by The James Dyson Foundation. They made lava lamps, water bombs and even tornadoes!

Our week ended with Andrea, a Dyson engineer, sharing a 'wow' moment in our assembly and a vlog of scientific experiments that children completed at home and at Malmesbury School. It was a fabulous end to another fantastic week at Sherston Primary School!

World Environment Day

We were delighted to have Libby Bowles come and talk to the children last month about the environment and the use of single-use plastics. The children were really inspired by her and it has made us reflect on some of our use of plastic in school. Later in the year we will be considering some of the plastics involved in Christmas (glitter and plastic cracker toys) - watch this space for more information ... In the meantime, Y2 worked with Libby to make beeswax wraps and design posters to warn people about the dangers of single-use plastics.

'Libby Bowles visited our school to talk about helping the environment because it is World Environment Day. She showed us what happens to animals in the sea when humans use single-use plastics and she told us about using alternatives for clingfilm, plastic bags and plastic straws. Libby made a bamboo bike and she is cycling around the world to warn children about the dangers of plastic. So far she has spoken to about 12,000 children and we can all do something to help.'

WI Report



In May, several members and some visitors had a great day out at the garden of Pam Lewis in Marston near Devizes. Pam is not only an amazing gardener with great knowledge, but also a very amusing speaker and a cook and preserves maker. After a tour of the garden, we had a delicious lunch that Pam had made, ably assisted by her sister, followed by a demonstration of flower arranging which Pam made look so easy. Several members came home with beautiful arrangements that Pam kindly donated to our raffle.

At the June meeting, members heard how little Mary Monro had known about her father until her mother gave her his papers and diaries from when he was a POW. Through his diaries and his service record, Mary has pieced together an amazing story and she published a book entitled 'Stranger in my Heart' last year. Her father fought in Hong Kong in WW2 and was taken prisoner by the Japanese. He escaped across China. He talked very little about his experience and died when Mary was only 18. She felt she needed to find out what her father had gone through, in order to 'connect with him'.

She started her research using the diaries and other documents that she was able to get access to. She then organised a trip to China to follow the route her father had taken when he escaped. He had taken a zigzag route of 1,200 miles travelling north across China. He was with two others who had escaped with him. His escape started on 1 February 1942, when he and two others built a raft and swam away from the camp, fearing reprisals for those left behind. They headed north to Waichow and then travelled in a very overcrowded truck to Shaoguan. He finally reached Chongqung, where there were allied forces. Mary's father later fought in the mountains or Burma in 1944, from where he returned home. However, he still sought adventure after the war, mountain climbing wth Sherpa Tenzing. Mary illustrated her talk with maps and pictures and read extracts from

her father's diaries. A very interesting talk and one which was most appropriate as it was given in the anniversary of D-Day. A minute's silence was held to mark this.

At the beginning of June, it was the NFWI Annual Meeting, held this year in Bournemouth, when the keynote speaker was Lord Bradley, Chair of the Care Not Custody Coalition, of which the WI is the founder member. In the afternoon, the speaker was the broadcaster Maggie Philbin, founder and CEO of TeenTech, which helps young teenagers see the wide range of career possibilities in science, engineering and technology. One of the inspiring moments of the day is always when some 4,000 members sing 'Jerusalem'.

Closer to home, members and visitors will be enjoying a coffee morning at the home of a member on a Sunday morning in June and we shall be joining with members from Hawksbury Upton for a game of skittles. On 4 July we shall be doing some Indian block printing at our evening meeting with Clare Walsh and then in August we shall be hearing about how life-saving blood is delivered by the Freewheelers. Malmesbury League of Friends buys new equipment for Primary Care Centre

Malmesbury League of Friends (MLOF) has presented the Malmesbury outpatients physiotherapy department at Malmesbury Primary Care Centre (MPCC) with new equipment costing just under £5,000.

The new physiotherapy equipment, which includes two exercise bikes, one rowing machine, a set of rubber-coated dumbbells with storage rack, and a weights exercise bench, will enable the department to offer improved facilities to MPCC patients .

The department provides around 850 treatment sessions and assesses some 300 patient referrals each month.

John Cooper, the Physiotherapy Team Leader, said: 'We are extremely grateful to MLOF for their generous donation, which will enable us to offer improved treatments to an ever-growing number of patients, covering a broad range of medical conditions.'

David Hide, MLOF chairman, said: 'We are delighted to have been able to support this request, which will enable more patients who need these treatments to benefit from them and more quickly.'




It's finally here – the 2019 Sherston Boules Festival

Photo-Synthesis: A celebration of Westonbirt's Human History

To celebrate the Forestry Commission's centenary year, Westonbirt Arboretum is launching a special trail to celebrate the Arboretum's human history.

Earlier this year, Westonbirt asked members of the local community to send in photos of themselves, their friends and family at Westonbirt, that conjure happy memories or interesting stories. These stories and photographs have now been used to create a trail through the trees that celebrates the landscape's human history and all the Arboretum has meant to the community over the years.

'Having asked the public for photos, many happy and moving stories poured in from members of our local community. It was wonderful to hear what the Arboretum has meant to so many people over the years.


'We are eager to continue to receive submissions from the community over the summer, so if anyone has a photograph that they would like to share on the online gallery please do send it into us.'






