# **Sherston Boules 2022**



Village life. Outdoors. Fresh air, music and dancing. Sunshine, warm beer, Pimm's and French treats.

Catching up with old friends, and new ones.

Fierce competition and old rivalries. Tea, cakes and duck races.

If you've missed all this since the last festival three years ago, then keep 16-17 July free, and save the flyer inside this month's Cliffhanger.

Entries for the competition are now closed, but there's plenty to come along for - a high street full of things to do, see, and listen to, food tents, live music, entertainment for the kids, and as always the drama that comes with the fierce competition that is Sherston Boules Day. Be part of it. Support our local businesses and charities. Think about helping to sweep up on Saturday as the matches finish. Then on Sunday put your wellies on ready for the legendary duck race to Mill Cottage.

Sherston Boules - back for 2022 - with extra shiny boules and super-yellow ducks.

#### Full rundown:

We kick off Boules week with the Senior Tea Party at 2.30pm on Tuesday the 12 July. There will be live entertainment and music over at the British School Room. Visitors £5, members £3.

Wednesday will see the Rattlebone host 'Une Soirée Française' a three-course French-inspired dinner!

The Cricket Club will be hosting a small cricket festival aimed at all the family on the Thursday evening, alongside a bar and BBQ - with a chance for everyone to get involved and have a good time.

Saturday it all kicks off at 8.20am with the church bells ringing to signal the start of play at 8.30am for the first boules matches to begin. Then, throughout the day, we have some incredible live acts from Jerri Hart and The Bonsais and - new to Boules 2022 - the incredibly Talented Tannoy Tag Team. From 10.00am, you'll hear your favourite local voices over the tannoy with the latest on match start times, results, entertainment, celebrity visits, lost keys/dogs/children, everything from starters orders to last orders at the bar. And in between you'll be entertained with

the legendary Boules playlist. If you want to find them or have an announcement to make, they'll be based at Boules HQ on the day. Thanks to everyone who's volunteered to keep the tannoy show running this Boules Day: Adam, Alec, Graeme, Mandi, Kev and Rupert.

Not forgetting our brilliant KidZone, this year featuring the always popular bouncy castle alongside an exciting assault course and a tug of war starting at noon. Photoshoots will also be happening between 12.00noon and 2.00pm, and many more exciting activities for all ages.

Then Sunday we are back out on the river once again to watch the duck race, starting around 2.30pm after the blessing of the ducks at 2.15pm. This year, we would encourage you to bring your own chairs and blankets along to enjoy the cakes and teas afterwards, as there will be a limited number of tables and chairs reserved for the disabled.

#### Sustainability

This year, we have a limited edition sustainable Boules Day cup. A cup you can use throughout the day and take home with you to remember the occasion! Alongside our reusable cups, this year our medals will also be sustainable! Created by the team at Eilmer's Bazaar, wooden bespoke medals will help celebrate the winners and runners-up of our boules competitions! Crafted locally, with minimal carbon footprint, out of a regenerative wood material, these are a fantastic addition to our collection.

Free water stations will also be dotted around the village during Saturday to keep everyone hydrated. Look out for these outside The Angel, at the Sustainable Sherston Stall, and at the Village Hall. Please bring your own cup, water bottle or flask to help reduce single-use plastic!

- always keep dogs under control and in sight, especially when livestock is nearby
- dog poo bag it and bin it any public waste bin will do
- care for nature do not cause damage or disturbance

- enjoy your visit, have fun, make a memory
- criminal damage and threatening behaviour will not be tolerated, and farmers and land managers are advised to contact the police to report any such incidents



# Rotary Club Closure

It is with great sadness that we report that the local Rotary Club of the South Cotswolds closed with effect from 30 June. The club was chartered in June 1967 and had as its first President Charles Nicholls, the popular manager of Lloyds Bank in Tetbury, who continued to be an active member of the club until his death in December 2020 aged 96.

The club was based on the two towns of Malmesbury and Tetbury, historically great local rivals! Initially the club met weekly with one week in Tetbury and the other week in Malmesbury. Over the years it has met in a number of locations including the Kings Arms in Malmesbury, the Horse Guards at Brokenborough, the Mayfield at Crudwell and finally the Old Royal Ship at Luckington.

Throughout its 55-year history the club has carried out numerous activities raising hundreds of thousands of pounds for both local and national charities. In addition to its fundraising events, community service projects were carried out. A key one for Malmesbury was the annual Santa Sleigh which toured streets in Malmesbury and in a number of the surrounding villages. The most notable for Tetbury was the annual 'Fireworks Spectacular' last held in November 2019. This provided a safe environment for people to enjoy a superb pyrotechnic display at an affordable cost (far cheaper and more spectacular than buying the usual family box of fireworks!). It was visited one year by a certain Mrs Diana Wales and her two sons from nearby Highgrove.

One of the main fundraising events organised by the club was the annual 'fun run' in Badminton Park. This started in 1984 and was originally conceived as a team event - hence its original name 'Horseless Team Event' (abbreviated to HTE) where teams ran over a five-mile or nine-mile course which included some of the obstacles used in the Badminton Horse Trials. Over the years it raised hundreds of thousands of pounds for good causes including the local charity 'Hope for Tomorrow'. It also provided useful activity for the Malmesbury and Tetbury ATCs to demonstrate their communications skills in providing radio cover throughout the park. Among the celebrities who opened the event was the Olympic Gold Medal runner Sally Gunnell. For many years it regularly attracted over a thousand entrants, but over time with the increased popularity of half marathons and park runs it became harder to attract such a large numbers of participants and to raise large amounts of money for charity. In recent years the HTE was opened to a separate category of 'cani-cross' runners where runners harness themselves to one or more dogs to help pull them round the course which proved increasingly popular and attracted entrants from as far away as Kent.

The club also - through the wider Rotary movement - engaged in International Activities. Old tools were collected for the 'Tools for Self Reliance' project in Africa, computers were procured to be sent to South Africa and the Sight Savers initiative was strongly supported with millions of eye patches supplied. More locally, the club made significant contributions to the Brighter Futures project to provide radiotherapy facilities at the Great Western Hospital and to the Life Education Centre mobile classroom that visits many of the primary schools in Malmesbury and the surrounding villages.

When the club was originally chartered most of the members were in their 40s but as with all organisations the members get older and unfortunately we were not able to attract new younger members in sufficient numbers to continue.
