# surgery update

#### Background

Following a referendum held on 16 May 2019, 92.6% of our residents voted in support of the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan. This plan formally became part of the Wiltshire Council Plan as of 19 May 2019.

The full plan detail can be found on the Parish Council website under the 'what we do' tab at the top of the home page.





In summary, the plan supported a mixed-use development, with up to 45 homes (40% of which would be affordable) and land set aside for a new GP surgery, a preschool facility and the future expansion of Sherston Primary School.

# Current status of the Sopworth Road Development

The developers, Acorn Development, submitted an initial planning application in the last quarter of 2020. This was later withdrawn as it was thought that a significant proportion of the application would not be supported by Wiltshire Council or residents. Acorn Development subsequently submitted a preplanning application, having worked directly with individual planners within Wiltshire Planning to give any application the best possible chance of being approved. The pre-planning application was submitted on 19 February 2023 but Wiltshire Council has yet to respond, despite the developers chasing on numerous occasions. This lack of response has been escalated to our Wiltshire Councillor, Martin Smith, by the Parish Council. We are currently awaiting an update.

# What's happening with the proposed new surgery building?

There seems to be an understanding in the village that the Parish Council is solely responsible for driving and implementing the surgery new build; this is not the case. It is a joint venture between the NHS, the Parish Council and the developers. The Parish Council's commitment was to ensure that land was set aside in the Neighbourhood Plan and retained for the purposes of a surgery. We also need the NHS (NHS Estates), the Integrated Care Board (ICB) and local Primary Care Network (which includes six other GP practices) to agree to the plans.

That said, we have not been resting on our laurels, and have been heavily involved driving meetings with Wiltshire Council, Acorn Development and representatives from the Tolsey Surgery in an attempt to 'get things moving' for our residents, as well as Martin Smith (Wiltshire Councillor) having previously engaged James Gray (MP) and the Wiltshire Council cabinet member for planning and the Integrated Care Board (NHS) to push things forward.

#### So, what are the issues?

It has been fully acknowledged by all that the current surgery building does not meet the needs of the local population or the requirements for modern healthcare, hence the provision in the Neighbourhood Plan for a new surgery. Against this backdrop, the surgery team have been pushing hard and consistently to get the situation addressed, but continue to struggle to get support from the NHS to drive the new surgery proposal forwards. The implications of the facility not being fit for purpose are evident to all:

- · Patient accessibility issues
- · Patient privacy and accommodation issues
- Patient queuing at both the dispensary and reception
- Inability to service the volume of phone calls effectively from the growing patient base (one receptionist)
- · Cramped working conditions for the surgery team
- · Lack of storage or service development space
- No space for the team to have breaks/lunch or adequate toilet facilities
- General run-down nature of the building Continued on page 3

# Fox hunting concerns





A small number of residents have contacted the Parish Council with concerns about the activities of the Beaufort Hunt in our parish. Issues relate to fox hounds entering private gardens and the Parish Council's sports field, obstruction by the hounds and horses on the public highway, and alleged illegal hunting.

Whilst we appreciate the concerns raised, unfortunately the Parish Council has no jurisdiction with respect to the hunt unless it is impacting Parishowned land. The recently reported sighting of fox hounds on the sports field will be raised with the Beaufort Hunt directly, given no dogs are allowed on that land for health and safety reasons.

If residents have concerns and are able to evidence issues relating to dangerous obstruction of the highway, trespass on their own land, or illegal hunting, please contact Wiltshire Police's Rural

#### Surgery update continued



Whilst this has been acknowledged, the surgery team are really struggling with several moving pieces that are outside their control. The key blocker is how the surgery will be funded – the delay to the application for funding has been aggravated by the hoops the surgery team are needing to jump through to even apply for the funding via NHS Estates, not least of which was the whole application process changing mid-application. Having already completed one application process, the surgery team had to start afresh to submit a further application to the ICB which can approve funding requests. The team have also had to obtain agreement from their local Primary Care Network for North Wiltshire.

It's worth noting that the surgery team are working very hard, and doing what they can under very difficult circumstances, having in effect outgrown the size of the practice (both in terms of building size/set-up and

patient demand). The team are as frustrated as we are, if not more so, given that, under the current circumstances, they are not able to offer the quality of care they would like to or the enhanced level of care they would propose if they had the benefit of a new larger building facility.

# What are we, the Parish Council doing about it?

As a result of further delays, we have asked that Wiltshire Councillor Martin Smith re-escalate this situation to both James Gray (MP) and the Wiltshire Council cabinet member for planning and the ICB (NHS). We will ask them to come and look at the challenging environment the surgery team are having to work in to put it into perspective, and to attend a meeting in the village hall with both the surgery, ICB representation and you the residents to explain why this is so problematic to move forward.

# Sherston preschool building



Why is the former preschool building on the Recreation Ground still vacant?



First, a little bit of history on the Recreation Ground on which the preschool is built. The Recreation Ground itself was left in Trust to the village by the Stroud Brewery under the governance of a Trust Deed back in 1934 for the purposes of recreation. This Trust was managed by the original trustees until 1964 when the trustee responsibility passed to the Parish Council with the original requirement of the Trust remaining unchanged.

Background to the preschool

Following the closure of the previous village preschool, Busy Hands, in the Village Hall, there was significant pressure on the Parish Council at the time to work with residents to help set up a new provision for parents in the village. A service provider was identified and a decision was taken to fund the build of a purpose-built facility on the Recreation Ground, which subsequently opened its doors in November 2019.

#### Why is the building now vacant?

Unfortunately, the provider decided to close the business and vacated the building in July last year. Since then, a suitable replacement has not been found and a significant void remains in our community.

So, what are the next steps?

The Parish Council absolutely recognises the importance of a preschool within the community. Furthermore, as trustees, we appreciate the importance of fulfilling the original intention of the generous donation nearly a century ago.

It is extremely important to ensure we act in the best interest of the beneficiaries, as well as the residents of the parish. Fortunately, these are one and the same. The Parish Council unanimously agrees that the preschool is pivotal in a modern-day society and a key feature of what makes Sherston exceptional.

That said, given the current climate, challenges with funding, recruiting and retaining staff, both the Parish Council and Wiltshire Council have struggled to identify a provider who is able to take it on.

School, the Grove Wood team, Sherston Gardening Club, to name a few. The building blocks are already in place. We just need to expand the vision.



# Stepping out for MIND



The Cotswold Way Ultra Challenge takes place on 24-25 June - a 100km loop from Circncester to Wotton-Under-Edge and back again over two days.

Last October, my dear mum passed away. My brother, father and I had spent the previous six months caring for her following a second stroke and we were all with her when she died.

In January, I got an email from my brother entitled 'I had a mad New Year's idea ...' and the seed was sown. A sponsored walk – a distance we both thought twice about even though we have been 'walkers' all our lives. A chance to walk and talk – a thing my mother was very good at – to remember, to grieve, to heal, to challenge ourselves and to celebrate a life well-lived.

Mum was a very generous, loving, warm and kind soul. She grew up in Clevedon and moved back there with my father, 60 years later, to be closer to her children and grandchildren. She was a 'doer' and cared greatly about others, both those she knew-friends and family - but also complete strangers. She cared for many people in her life in many ways, both physically and mentally. So, in Mum's memory I am raising money for the charity MIND.

Mental health is something we all struggle with at times. Sometimes it is stress, sometimes depression or anxiety or loneliness. Sometimes, there are deeper issues. But it is still something we struggle to talk about. That's why I think charities like MIND are so important in raising awareness and giving support to those who are struggling.

MIND works locally and nationally to provide advice and support to empower anyone experiencing a mental health problem. It campaigns to improve services, raise awareness and promote understanding.

We have done a lot of walking in the past few months, gradually building up our distances and, by the time you read this, we will have done our first 40km in a day. We both have achy backs and bits that hurt and crunch where they have never done before. But we have covered some beautiful countryside and a lot of memories, which have both been very healing. The journey has started.


