A new pre-school for Sherston ... coming soon!

We are excited to announce that planning has now been submitted for the new Sherston Pre-school.

You will be aware of the North Legacy announced in June 2016, some of which was apportioned to the recently completed playground scheme (see Cliffhanger April 2018). Following a bid process, including a presentation at an open meeting of the Parish Council, we have been lucky enough to have been awarded £140K. We have been fundraising for the remaining projected costs and, whilst our fundraising is still ongoing, we are at a point where we can now proceed with this project.

The building will be owned by the Parish Council and we are delighted to announce that it will be run by Pumpkins nursery, which has a track record of outstanding Ofsted ratings and a wealth of experience from its existing provisions in Badminton, Tormarton and Acton Turville.

The Pre-school is expected to offer the village:


- A purpose-built facility offering early years education for children of pre-school age, from two to five years. Flexible hours from 8.00am until 6.00pm to accommodate working parents.
- Wrap-around care service for school-aged children from Sherston C of E Primary School, including breakfast and after-school care.
- A pre-school feeder provision for Sherston C of E Primary School.
- An additional space for the various Scout organisations to utilise when the provision is not in use, such as the evenings.

Since we started working on the project nearly three years ago, a vast amount of research has been completed on the possible locations for the preschool. Both existing buildings and possible land for a build around the village were considered. In conjunction with the Parish Council and the Scout Group, we identified the location next to the Scout Hut on the recreation ground. We feel excited about what this location has to offer – proximity to the school, green space, and the heart of the village.

There will be no change to the new play equipment, but it is likely that we will need to re-locate the older rope climbing frame if planning permission is achieved - the cost of this is included in our budget. We are including provision for fencing to secure the hardstanding area outside the pre-school from the green itself as a safety precaution due to the potential for cars to be turning in this space.

From a shortlist of three, we have awarded the design and build to a specialist company – TG Escapes. This company has extensive experience in educational buildings and, through them, we have now submitted a planning application for a wooden, eco-style build with an enclosed play area. It will tap into existing services from the Scout hut, which will keep build costs down.





We are hoping to be up and running ready for an opening date of September 2019.

We still cannot treat or cure colds, viral sore throats, or symptoms such as decreased hearing or lack of taste following colds - time and patience are what are needed.

New Year, New Staff

We are very pleased to welcome Ann into our dispensary. She is an experienced dispenser, having worked in a local dispensing chemist for the last three years. As well as caring for her grandparents, she runs the local bingo nights twice a week, so will know her numbers!

We are grateful for your forbearance in the necessary closure of the dispensary during working hours whilst we have been so short staffed. However, this should be back to normal once Ann has been settled in fully.

Collecting prescriptions

If you are collecting a prescription on someone else's behalf, even if it is a relative, please make sure we have their permission for you to do so. Furthermore, if you are not sure what you are collecting, or what has been ordered, our dispensers cannot disclose this information due to patient confidentiality, so please do not ask. This can be overcome if we have explicit consent from the patient that this information can be shared.

If your friend/relative is on the automatic repeat system, please let the dispensers know so the collection can be ready for the following month.

Improved Access

We have joined up with local North Wiltshire practices to help the Improved Access government initiative to increase GP hours. In practice, this means you may request a late (up to 8.00pm) or weekend appointment, but it may be with one of our partner practices, which include Malmesbury, Cricklade and Wootton Bassett. Curry POP thanks!

A cold, dark, wet and windy night at the end of January felt like the perfect night for a takeaway curry. As it turns out - most of the village thought so too!

Emma Whatley created the Curry Pop-up as she was keen to raise money for Sherston Primary school and do something a bit different in the village. Having previously run the Smokehouse at POP and created the delicious food for the Brush Up the Bogs nights at the village hall, Emma was on board with the massive quantities needed.

Weeks of planning went into all the details of how to cook huge quantities of rice (baked rice in several ovens around the village with rice runs!), sourcing coconut milk in litres and working out how many onions to chop!

The scale and scores on the doors are mind boggling with the team filling 540 foil trays, frying 180 parathas, opening 75 tins of tomatoes, chopping 64 chillies and 14kg of onions (ouch!), baking 20kg of rice, dicing 12kg of beef and 22kg of chicken and popping in over 60 chilli bombs. Sherston you like it spicy!

With a massive 74 hours of chopping, frying and stirring, the fantastic team served 180 covers in three short hours (with most people turning up at the same time!). There are so many people to thank, including the 10 children who served and did paratha runs, Emma's dad, Jeff (who got slightly broken but recovered), Mike Whatley for rice and planning, Julie Gaffney for surviving the heat of the kitchen, Lisa Priest for her calmness, Sally Clayton for frying off-site unexpectedly, Dave Shephard (who had only turned up for a bit of set-up) for speedy kitchen work, Graeme Strachan for posters, expert chopping at short notice, and paratha multi-tasking, Alan and Harry Hetherington for, would you believe it, Bohemian Rhapsody on sitar, the Evelyns for stepping in with gas and enthusiasm, the MacLeods for extra beer runs and getting stuck in, Mary Owen for coming to buy curry and stepping in to serve, all the rice cookers, everyone at the British School Room for supporting this event and finally to everyone who came to buy a

curry. We cannot thank you enough for being patient! What a brilliant village we live in. The pop raised over £800 for the school. With one final but very important thanks... Emma Whatley you are a total legend for standing up to do it, pulling it all together and making absolutely delicious food. Thank you!

Curry POP Baked Rice Recipe (4 people)

Pop 200g Basmati Rice into a dish. Add 400ml of water and a pinch of salt. Cover with foil and bake in the oven for 40-50mins at 180c until dry and fluffy.

Malai murgh recipe

1.2kg chicken breast cut into pieces

60ml veg oil

90g finely chopped onions

4 tsp finely chopped garlic

4 tsp finely chopped root ginger

8 green cardamom pods

12 whole cloves

1 cinnamon stick

2 tbsp ground almonds

300ml coconut milk

1/4 tsp turmeric

1/2 tsp red pepper

2tsp salt

4 tbsp cream

coriander leaves to garnish

Cook onions, garlic and ginger until onions are pale and limp. Add cardamom, cloves and cinnamon and cook until the spices are slightly puffed and begin to brown.

Add the almond powder and cook, stirring rapidly for two minutes. Reduce heat and add chicken in one layer. Cool on a low heat until the chicken turns a pale white.

Add the coconut milk and remaining spices, bring to the boil then reduce the heat and simmer, covered, until the chicken pieces are tender (about 30 mins). Check often to ensure the sauce is not evaporating too quickly. When ready to serve, stir in cream and garnish with coriander.

This dish tastes better if made several hours in advance.



Sherston Neighbourhood Plan: The Final Steps heading towards a referendum

Can you believe it? It is almost exactly seven years since the Steering Group was formed and work started on preparing the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan. Seven years of hard work but we are nearly there. Thank you for your patience.

A report in the September 2018 Cliffhanger explained that, before the draft plan could be adopted, it had to be formally submitted to Wiltshire Council so that the council could carry out any necessary further consultations and make arrangements for an independent examination prior to a public vote on whether the plan should be adopted and used to determine future planning applications in the Parish.

The draft plan was duly submitted to Wiltshire Council later that month. The final consultation period ran from 1 October to 12 November 2018 after which a copy of the plan, together with a copy of all of the comments received during the publicity period, were sent to the appointed independent Examiner.

The examiner published his report at the end of January, a copy of of which can be found on the Sherston Parish Council website (see NHP Stage 4). We are pleased to inform you that the examiner concluded that, 'the Sherston Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions and I recommend to Wiltshire Council that, subject to modifications, it should proceed to Referendum'. The examiner's report and recommendations will now be formally considered by Wiltshire Council, which has until the 11 March to publish a 'decision statement' (ie a decision on the examiner's recommendations as to whether to proceed to referendum). Once the decision statement has been issued, Wiltshire Council has to make arrangements to hold a referendum within 56 working days.

On the assumption that Wiltshire Council issues a positive decision on the examiner's recommendations – and we have no reason to believe otherwise given their clear support for the emerging plan – it is reasonable to expect that the plan will be put to a referendum in about June or July this year. As we say – we are nearly there! All the policies and proposals contained in the plan are as a result of considerable interaction and consultation with the village over the last seven years. Whilst the examiner has suggested modifying various policies to make them clearer and the document more useable, all the policies as set out in the draft plan essentially remain unchanged. A final updated version of the plan will be placed on the website as soon as we have received confirmation that Wiltshire Council has accepted the recommendations of the examiner and that the decision has been made to allow the plan to be put to referendum.

We will of course let you know as soon as soon as the decision statement has been received from Wiltshire Council and hopefully a date set for the Neighbourhood Plan Referendum (as opposed to any other possible referendum!).

Come and enjoy the pancake fun on Shrove Tuesday!

For those who aren't aware, Sherston has its own way of marking Shrove Tuesday and the beginning of Lent.

Instead of running down the street with frying pans, we just race to eat a plateful of delicious pancakes prepared by the chefs at the Rattlebone.

This year's event takes place on the evening of Shrove Tuesday, 5 March, from 7.30pm at the Rattlebone. Entries are welcomed on the night: there's no need to book.

The competition will take place in heats, with each competitor paying a £2 entry fee for the whole evening. Each entrant will have four delicious freshly-cooked pancakes to eat in the first heat. Entrants will have time to add lemon and sugar to their taste, then the clock will start, and the first heat will be under way. The winner of each heat will be the first to finish eating all the pancakes on their plate.

This is a really popular family event, with special heats for younger competitors, with fewer pancakes involved. The event will probably finish by 9.00pm approximately, depending on the number of competitors. These winners will then go on to the next heat, again with four pancakes each, and so on until the championship round. The winner will have their name engraved on a Sherston 1016 commemorative engraved frying pan!

Where possible, all ingredients are sourced locally, with eggs coming from Sherston Free Range Eggs and flour from Shipton Mill at Long Newnton. Both companies very kindly donate their products for the competition. All money raised goes to local good causes.

Sherston 1016 strongly advises all entrants not to eat a meal before coming to the competition!

News from Holy Cross Church

It's interesting to see what captures children's attention. At the moment in my house, astronomy is in, because someone went on a Beaver camp to the Bristol science museum ('We the Curious'). We now have a chart showing exactly what phase the moon is in on any day of the year. It tells me there's a full moon just before the Spring equinox, which means that the new moon of Easter is four weeks later. That means both Easter and Ash Wednesday are late this year: on 6 March, and there will be a service of Holy Communion at 7.30pm in Sherston, with the option of ashing for those who wish to receive it.

The week after Ash Wednesday, our Lent Groups begin. We have groups at various times and days, do look in the church for more information.

Mothering Sunday this year is on 31 March, which is a fifth Sunday of the month. We will have a Group Family Communion at 10.30am in Holy Cross Sherston. There will be an Adventure Church in Court House, Hullavington, at 3.00pm on Saturday 30 which will also have a Mothering Sunday theme-contact Becky Fisher for details.

Holy Week begins on 14 April with the usual service pattern for Palm Sunday. During the week there will be Compline on Monday in Hullavington at 9.00pm and Wednesday in SSQ at 8.00pm.

Our Lent Group Celebration service was much appreciated last year and we shall be repeating it on the Tuesday of Holy Week at 7.30pm in Luckington. Members of different denominations have been meeting together throughout Lent, and our final session will involve gathering into one large group to hear from one another and worship as one community. On Maundy Thursday there will be a communion service in Sherston, followed by an optional vigil in Holy Cross Church from about 9.00pm.

Firstly, being on the Electoral Roll gives you voting rights in church affairs — we can hardly complain about decisions made by the national church if we're not using our vote. Secondly, as Rector, I know that the clergy rely on the electoral rolls as a contact list. It's much harder for us to keep in touch if we haven't got your phone number or don't know where you live! Thirdly, a healthy electoral roll reflects the level of support that is out there in the community for the church. So I'd urge you to pick up a form from your local church and follow the instructions on how to fill it in and return it.
