# Boules pitches planned on the Pennymead Recreation Ground

It has long been the desire of the Boules Committee to provide, help finance and build some boules pitches in the centre of the village for everyone to use. As trustees of the Recreation Ground, the Parish Council has agreed to the construction of the pitches as they meet the trust's historical restrictions, namely that the land must be reserved for 'Recreational Use'. In addition, the Parish Council has offered financial support.

Wiltshire Council has been consulted and planning permission is not required as there is no major change of use and the trustees have control of the site.

The plan is to build three full-size pitches on the eastern side between the trees, in line with the boundary wall of the vicarage garden. The Boules Committee is planning to encourage young people to get involved with coaching seminars and matches. It also opens up the prospect of inter-village/town matches as the pitches will meet required competition standards.

Work is due to start mid-May in the hope that the pitches will be ready for use by Saturday 15 July (Boules Day).

## Monthly Soup Lunch

The monthly soup lunch is a joint initiative between Holy Cross Church, the Methodist Church and the Congregational Church in Sherston

Over that past six months, we have provided an opportunity for people to gather together on the first Monday of each month from 12.00noon-2.00pm to share a lunch of soup and pudding, as well as cake with a coffee.

These lunches, which have proved to be very successful, take place in the British School Room, and we have been able to support various charities from the generous donations given by people who have come to lunch.

A different charity is chosen each month. Amongst those chosen was one called Blonde Angels based in Yate and organised by women who support homeless men on the streets of Bristol. We were able to donate enough money for the charity to purchase 60 pairs of underpants, which of course are a vital piece of clothing if you have no access to washing or sleeping facilities.

We would welcome anyone who feels able to volunteer to make soup for lunch. Generally, we offer two options which involves several people making soup for 25 people who join us. However, if making a cake or a pudding is your speciality, please contact us so we can add you to either the soup or cake rota.

There will be a lunch on Monday 1 May from 12.00noon-2.00pm. You don't need to book - please just come along and you would be most welcome. However, we will be taking a break during the months of June, July and August and re-starting again on 4 September.



## Parish Farming How and why is farming changing?

Farming is at present undergoing a radical change. Since the 1947 Agricultural Act, farming has been subject to some form of external support for produce. By 2028, all area payments will have been phased out and farming will be subject to market forces. To replace the old direct payment, the Government, through the Rural Payments Agency (RPA), is introducing an Environmental Land Management (ELM) policy, along with continuing the Countryside Stewardship (CS) schemes. A large proportion of the ELM money is being restricted to larger projects and various grants, resulting in the ELM schemes for the majority being at a low rate and hardly covering costs incurred. Therefore, at present, a poor take-up.

What Countryside Stewardship (CS) schemes and how do they work?

CS agreements provide financial incentives for farmers to look after and improve the environment by:

- conserving and restoring wildlife habitats;
- managing flood risk;
- managing and creating woodland;
- preserving historical features and incentives for education; and
- keeping the character of the countryside.

Agreements are managed by the RPA. CS is made up of multiple grants; the main elements include: capital grants; higher tier; mid tier; and wildlife offers. The booklet covering the grants with all the rules and regulations is over 800 pages long!

What is the proposed ELM policy and how does it work?

The ELM schemes will have three elements to them:

- Sustainable Farming Incentives (SFI) will pay farmers to adapt and maintain sustainable farming practices. It's these rates that at present are not high enough to attract the majority.
- It now seems that the CS will continue in some from but targeting specific locations, features and habitats.



 Landscape Recovery will pay for bespoke, longterm, large-scale projects to enhance the natural environment, for example, allowing the sea back into low coastal regions in Norfolk and Suffolk.

#### Why are farmers concerned?

Worryingly, with absolutely no political encouragement to grow food, and with volatile markets and high inflation (Putin effect), many parish farms are going down the CS route to generate a stable income from their land. Under the various schemes, we are planting flower and nectar plots, sowing winter bird food areas, leaving land non-cropped for nine months for wildlife, planting margins and whole fields with grass for birds and insects. This will result in the parish producing approximately 500 tonnes fewer grains and seeds compared with 2020. If you multiply this reduction in production across the country, we could be heading for a problem feeding ourselves. Food security and self-sufficiency needs to be treated far more seriously. We should not be so reliant on imported food that we can grow. UK farming is highly regulated with the environment in mind and produces some of the safest food in the world. Food for thought!

#### With the above in mind, what will you see the local farmers up to in the next quarter?

The task for the spring is to fertilise the autumn planted crops (wheat, barley, oat and rape) and grass and to keep them healthy and free of fungal diseases. We plant some spring crops, namely malting barley, spring beans and maize, but the recent prolonged wet weather has stopped all land work which could effect our harvest prospects. As mentioned above, we will be planting CS options on at least 30% of parish land.

## Christian Aid Week: 14-20 May



Christian Aid Week (CAW) will be here very soon. Look out for the red envelope coming through your door or find details of other ways to give below. This year CAW is concentrating particularly on Malawi where food, fuel, fertiliser and school fees have doubled in price in the last 12 months. Families have been forced to pull their children out of school, denying them the education that could bring them a brighter future. Climate change is also making farming much more difficult with droughts, storms and floods. You may have seen reports of Tropical Cyclone Freddy which brought devastating floods to Malawi, also Mozambique and Zimbabwe, in March this year. Where people are already struggling, such natural disasters are extraordinarily difficult to recover from.

Closer to home, you may be thinking of the great need in Ukraine. Christian Aid is working there to help refugees. CA's work all over the world is carried out with local partners and relief organisations, such as Hungarian Interchurch Aid, Swiss Church Aid and the Lutheran World Federation. These organisations are helping to target CA help for Ukraine where it is particularly needed.

These are just two examples of the enormous and growing need in many parts of the world. We can help to ease this need by donating to the CAW appeal.

## So, who did bump off Barnaby?

The week after Easter, audiences flocked to the newly refurbished Village Hall to find out the answer to the question on everyone's lips – who bumped off Barnaby? Sherston Drama Group's latest production presented the answer to this mystery, alongside others such as 'who is this Barnaby chap anyway?' and 'why would anyone want to kill him?' The play is a murder mystery farce written by Rick Abbot - think Agatha Christie meets Knives Out and you're on the right lines.



Barnaby Folcey is one of several family members invited to a gathering at Marlgate Manor by Cordelia Luduc, played by Sheelagh Hudleston with a wonderful mixture of aristocracy and despair. Although his time on stage was short, Chris Fisk's portrayal of Barnaby was memorable, with brilliant timing and facial expressions. As Barnaby lies dying with a dagger sticking out his back, he scrawls B-A-R on a piece of paper, which perplexes the only others in the room, the dimwitted Dora (acted with loveable stupidity by Nic Pearce-Smith) and her fiancé, American Jeff (played by Graeme Strachan with an accent to rival Daniel Craig's). Dora and Jeff argue for several minutes about what this message could mean before it occurs to them to ask Barnaby - but by then of course he's dead.



The cast proceed to mull over what it all means – could B-A-R refer to someone's name (there are several possibilities), the fact that Magnolia the stroppy maid (played by Stella Thacker with an extraordinary amount of attitude) is sitting exams to become a member of the Bar or the fact that Cordelia is a Baroness? The plot thickens as people disappear and reappear (enabled by a masterpiece of rotating scenery), a picture fires gunshots, green poison is slipped into the sherry and Medkins the butler (played with authority by newcomer to the group Clive Whitehouse) struggles to control Magnolia.



It emerges that a financial agreement called a tontine is key to the plot, but while the existence of the tontine gives Barnaby a motive to murder almost everyone else, no-one has a good motive for murdering him. Other members of the tontine include Hollywood actress Cleo Barton (played with glamour by Andrea Sisson), the pernickety governess Miss Barnsdale (acted with suitable fastidiousness by Sue Ormiston) and the deaf Peeress Lady Barbara Fenwick (played by Mandi Bailey-Turner with a hilarious comic delivery). As the cast attempt to find all the lines of a limerick which will surely help to solve the mystery, the party gatecrasher Rosalind Barstow (played with perfect cattiness by Dawn Gibbings) helpfully dishes out





insults at every opportunity until a dramatic twist of events and a profound monologue brings the play to its hilarious conclusion.

As well as a selection of the Band's usual repertoire of classical, popular and original music, the programme will include a number of 'coronation specials', including Crown Imperial, originally composed by Sir William Walton for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth in 1953.

#### William Reddaway

William's talk focuses on an extraordinary 2,700 mile horse ride that he embarked upon as a retirement project between 10 May and 8 December 2013. In the course of this journey, William, from Cheltenham, raised money for two charities: the Family Holiday Association and the Wormwood Scrubs Pony Centre, both of which he continues to support.

Travelling by horse is a form of transport for which the infrastructure has essentially disappeared, thereby providing a variety of challenges for William and a wealth of stories to recount! We look forward to hearing about the adventures of William and Strider and how they overcame the obstacles they encountered.

#### Thursday 22 June: Experiences of a Puppy Raiser with Guide Dogs. Iain Lonsdale

Iain began working with Guide Dogs in 2001 as a puppy walker and followed this a year later by becoming a fundraiser. Since that time, he has provided basic training for 19 puppies and adopted the role of speaker for the charity.

During Iain's talk, he will give an outline of the history of Guide Dogs before moving on to discuss the phases in training puppies. An essential aim of the charity is to enable blind and partially 'the same freedom of movement as everyone else', and, with this in mind, Iain will explain the process of matching dogs and people in order that they can work together effectively. He will also provide information about approaches to retiring dogs and how Guide Dogs are funded. As always, members will have the opportunity to ask questions at the end of the talk.




